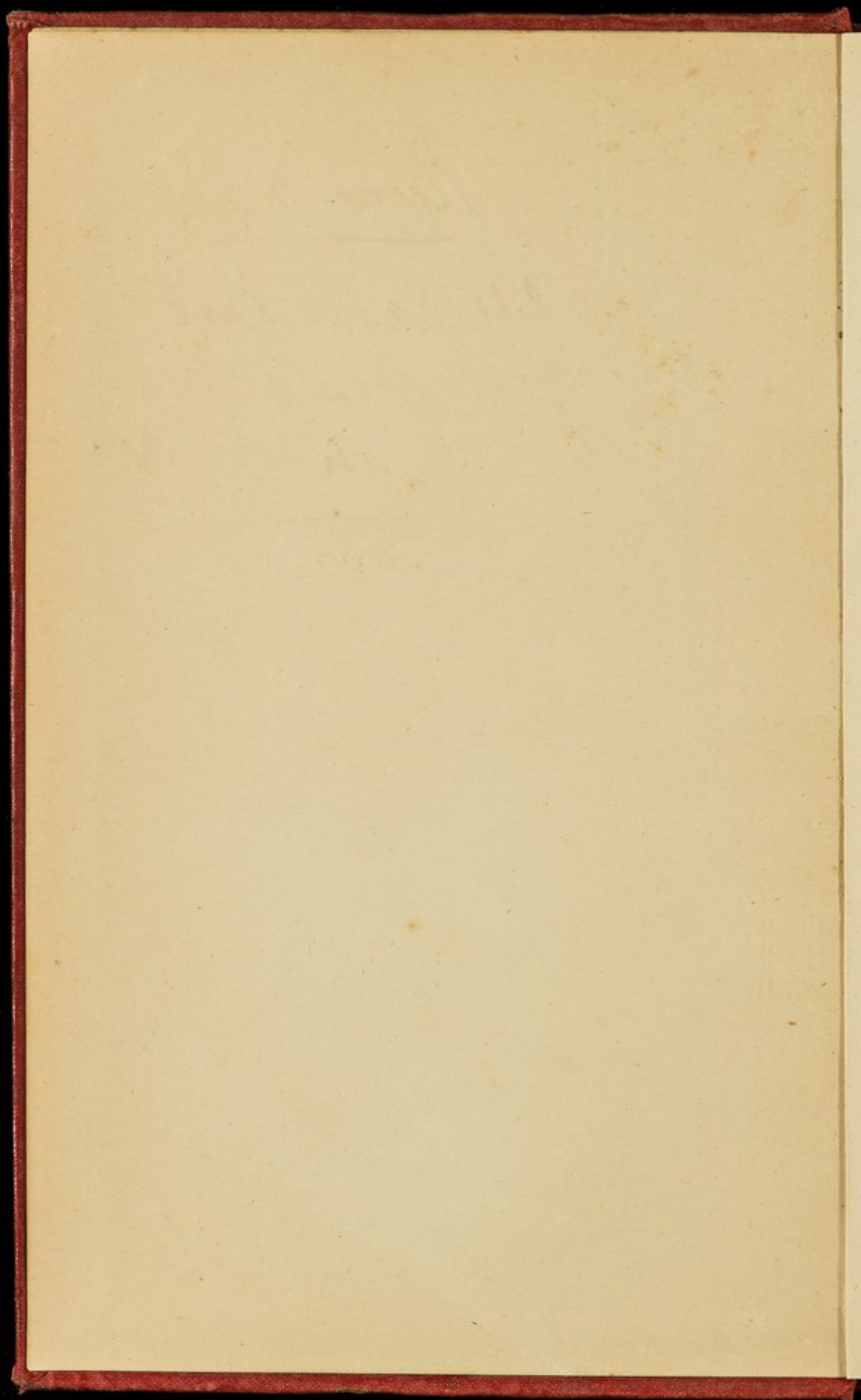

For the loss or damage of an inland parcel, for which a certificate of posting has been obtained (but not otherwise), compensation up to £2 will be given without payment of any fee.

INVESTMENTS IN GOVERNMENT STOCKS.

1. Any Depositor in a Post Office Savings Bank can purchase Government Stock at the current price in connection with his Savings Bank account. As small a sum as 1s. may now be invested in Stock, but the commission for any amount not exceeding £25 is 9d. The charge for amounts exceeding £25 and not exceeding £50 is 1s. 3d.; exceeding £50 and not exceeding £75 is 1s. 9d.; exceeding £75 and not exceeding £100 is 2s. 3d.; and exceeding £100 and not exceeding £200, 2s. 9d.

2. The dividends on Stock are placed to the Depositor's credit as they become due, and can be withdrawn in the same manner as ordinary deposits.

3. If a person wishes to sell any of the Stock which he has thus bought he can always do so at the current price of the day, and he will be charged the same commission for selling as for buying.

4. The amount of Government Stock which any one person can buy in a year must not exceed £200, and the whole amount which he can hold in such Stock must not exceed £500.

5. Although when a person has £200 deposited in the Post Office Savings Bank, including interest, he cannot invest his further savings in the Bank, he can allow the £200 to stay there, and instruct the Savings Bank Department to purchase for him Government Stock for any amount not exceeding £200 in any one year with his further savings until the maximum of £500 Stock has been reached. The total amount which he can save in the Post Office Savings Bank as ordinary deposits and in Government Stock is £700.

On the North American Continent four different times have been arranged by the railway companies. *Eastern* time is that of the 75th meridian, *Central* that of the 90th meridian, *Mountain* that of the 105th, and *Pacific* time that of the 120th meridian west of Greenwich. In Europe there are now three times:—the *West* group takes its time from Greenwich, the *Central* varies by one hour, and the *Oriental* by two hours. The Australasian Colonies have adopted a standard zone time, in which there is a difference of 2 hours between the east and west portions of Australia.

If in form of roll, length, 30 in.; diameter, 4 in.; weight, British Colonies and non-Union, 5 lbs; *Foreign* countries in Union, 4 lbs.

Letters, &c., for officers on board ships of war on the Pacific Station (North or South) are subject to the same rates of postage as ordinary correspondence for Chile.

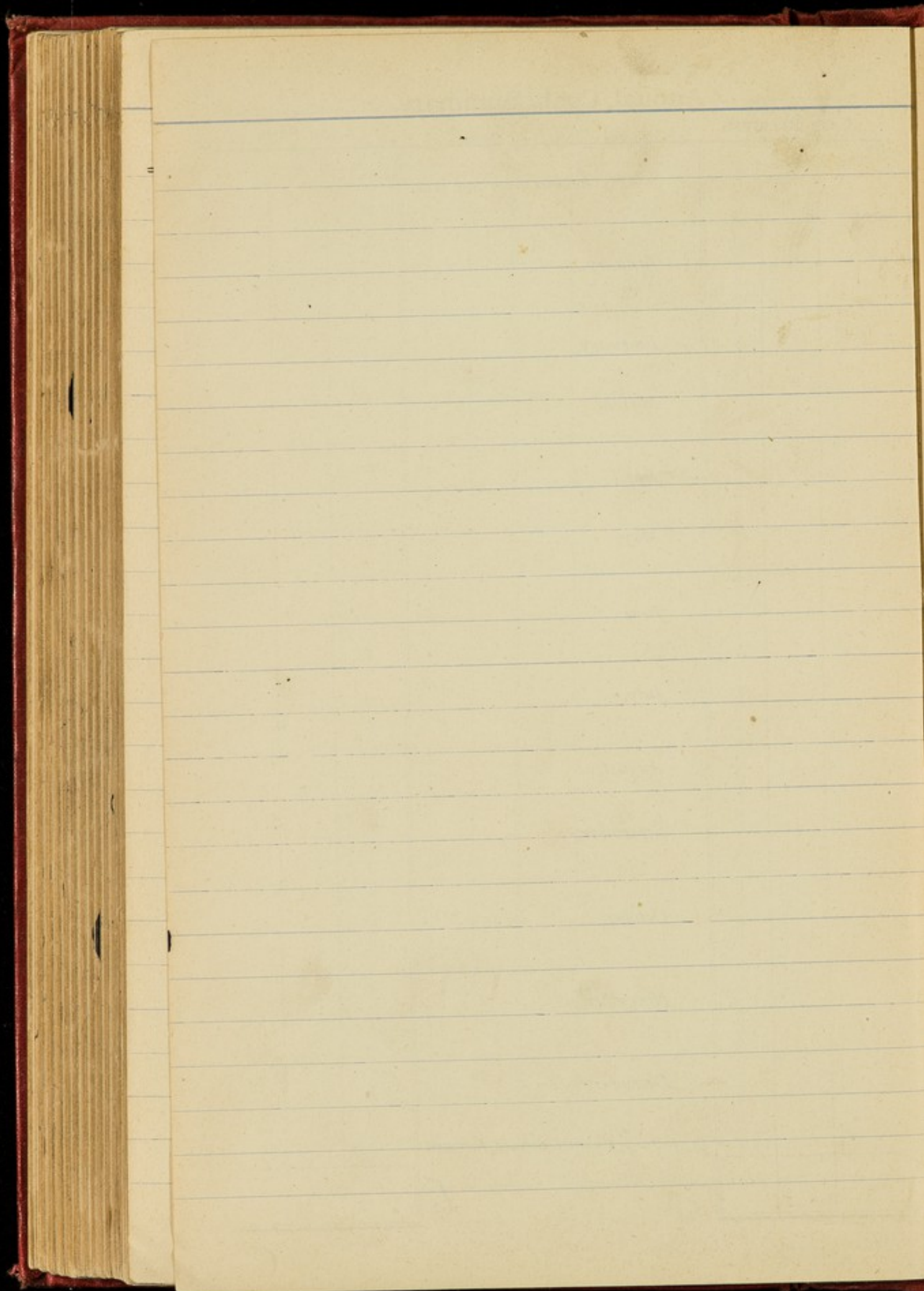

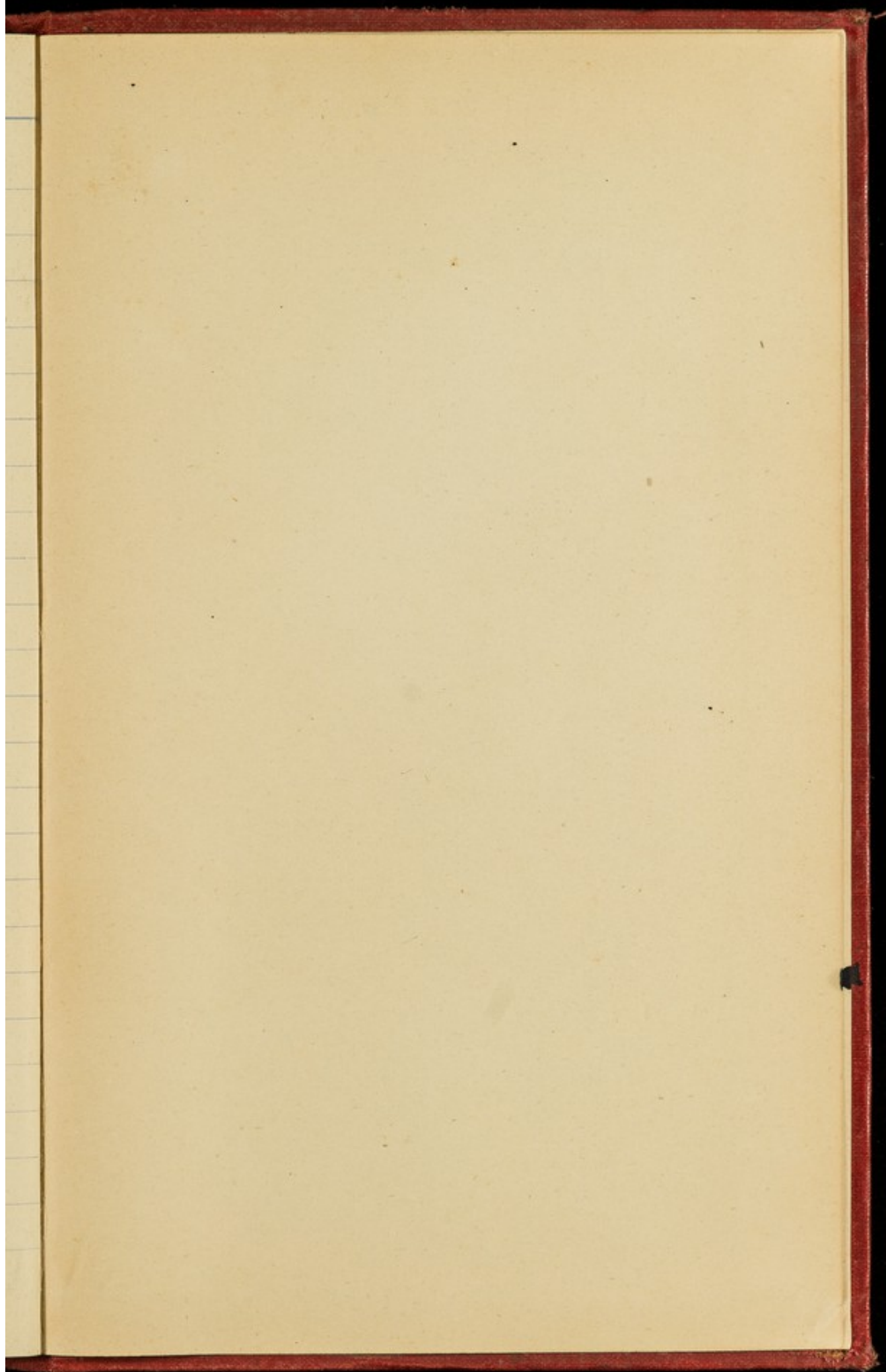
