My dear Langmore -

A peripatetic duty of the  
specious during the last few  
days has prevented an  
early reply to your note.

About a month ago  
the D. G. took occasion to  
discuss anew the subject  
with me - and the result  
has been a postponement  
of my retirement - for

some time at all events.

My plea last year was a  
covert one of overwork,  
- of this I have been disarmed  
by the appointment of Massey  
as my valuable Assistant,  
an ail pointed to induce  
me to hold on longer -  
and brought about so soon  
the opposition of the School  
Senate was made to your  
removal from the Professor-  
ship. - Thus stands my  
case, for the present, indefinite

as to time.

Be assured there is no  
man the Chief would prefer  
to yourself - whenever he  
may have again to recommend  
for the appointment,

Trust that I understood  
aright a few days ago  
an observation which I  
chanced to hear, that  
of the War Office having passed  
a Minute increasing the reverse  
of your present appointment  
by some considerable and

Special grant, of the nature  
of Lodging Allowance (extra);  
this may render the Professor-  
ship worthy of tenure  
for an interim somewhat  
longer.
