THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING of the Members and friends of the Association was held at Grosvenor Street, W., on Monday, February 6th, 1899 (by kind permission of Sir Samuel Wilks.) The Chair was taken by Sir Samuel Wilks, Bart., M.D., F.R.S. (President of the College of Physicians), who was supported amongst others by the Lord Bishop of Islington, the Venerable the Archdeacon of Essex, the Revs. H. Hawkins (Hon. Secretary), H. A. Cumberlege, F. H. A. Hawkins, Dr. H. Rayner (Chairman of the Council), Dr. G. H. Savage (Treasurer), Dr. Blandford, Dr. T. C. Shaw, Dr. Nicolson, C.B., Dr. Seward, Dr. Bower, Dr. Shuttleworth, Dr. Fletcher Beach, Dr. Mahomed, E. Parker Young, Esq., M.R.C.S., Messrs. F. D. Mocatta and S. J. Blackwell. There was a good attendance, and much interest was shown in the proceedings.

The Secretary (Mr. H. Thornhill Roxby) read several letters that had been received from friends, who for various reasons were unable to be present at the Meeting.

The Secretary then read the Report which was as follows:—

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

From January 1st, to December 31st, 1898.

The Council for the After-Care Association for Poor Persons discharged recovered from Asylums for the Insane have much pleasure in presenting their Annual Report for 1898.

They again thank all those by whose kind assistance the work of the Association has been carried on, and are glad to be able to report satisfactory work and progress during the past year. They once more repeat that the work undertaken by the Society can never be expected to become very popular in the strict sense of the word; nor can its progress be judged by comparing it with other charities, as its difficulties are very **much greater**. But there is scarcely any work more needed, and the Association is the only one in the country that offers special help to those poor people who have recovered from Insanity.

During the twelve months just passed there were 186 cases before the Council, as compared with 147 in the same period in 1897. This is by far the largest number ever brought under the notice of the Council in one year. Of these, 131 were women and 55 men. Cases have been assisted, as in the past, by being boarded out in cottages in the country, grants of money, clothing, and finding occupation, and in other ways as the Council have thought best. Some cases have had to be declined, as it was thought, after most careful consideration, that they would never be fit for the struggle of life again.

All these cases have been thoroughly investigated by an officer of the Association before being brought before the Council, and where possible, all employers are interviewed before the cases are placed in domestic service. As many as twelve or more visits have been made in connection with a case. This means a considerable expenditure of time and money, but the Council have been well repaid for this extra work and expenditure by the most satisfactory way in which a very large majority of the cases have retained the situations and other work found for them, the failures during the past year being comparatively few.

In addition to the above, several cases, both male and female, not coming under the rules of the Association, have been assisted in other channels. This, of course, also adds largely to the claims on the time of the Secretary, and the cost of postage. &c. But the Council consider the time and money well spent.

The boarding out of suitable Convalescents in Cottage Homes in the country has been continued with much success. Additional Cottage Homes where Convalescents can be received are much needed at the present time. The Homes are inspected by the Secretary before anyone is sent, and they are also visited by him at short intervals. These Homes are mostly situated in various parts of the South of England.

The number of Members of the Association have also largely increased. The total of subscriptions, donations, and contributions for maintenance in 1898 amount to £652 12s. 3d. In 1897 they were £561 7s. 9d. Much more financial aid is required if the work is to be extended.

During 1898 Sir W. Broadbent, Bt., M.D., has kindly become a Vice-President. Dr. Blandford, the Rev. H. C. Cumberlege, and Mrs. Ridpath have filled vacancies on the Council.

During the autumn of 1898 the Council decided to send particulars of the work of the Association to various Boards of Guardians in England and Wales, and ask them to give information of all cases discharged recovered, to their Workhouses from Asylums, so that an enquiry might be made into cases likely to be benefitted. Several Boards have consented to do so, but at present it is too early to form any estimate of the success of the application.

The Guardians of Clapham, Wandsworth, Paddington, and Fulham, all subscribed to the funds of the Association during the year. It is hoped many more may contribute in the future.

 [592.] Respectable servant from Essex County Asylum boarded out and afterwards found a suitable situation.
 [598.] A young orphan girl boarded out and trained for domestic service, suitable situation subsequently found for her.
 [591.] A girl from a Yorkshire Asylum after being under the care of the Association was re-started in life.
 [577.] A middle-aged woman from a London Asylum, in much reduced circumstances, assisted by grants of money and needlework.
 [609.] The wife of a policeman, who was unable to defray the whole expenses of change of air required by the poor woman. Was assisted by grant of money.
 [604.] A respectable widow woman sent into the country for a few weeks rest, and afterward re-started in life.
 [572.] A respectable widow woman, cigarette maker by trade, assisted by weekly grants of money until she was able to regain her work.
 [577.] This young woman, after being boarded out at the seaside, was placed in domestic service.
 [574.] A respectable girl from a Kent County Asylum, assisted by grant of money, and placed in suitable service.
 [589.] A girl deserted by her parents for many years. Boarded out at seaside and afterwards placed in suitable situation.
 [531.] A respectable orphan girl from a London Asylum after being boarded out at seaside for several weeks, was re-started in domestic service.
 [571.] A respectable girl from a Surrey County Asylum with undesirable home surroundings, was sent to one of the Society's Cottage Homes at the seaside, where she underwent a course of several weeks training for domestic service.
 [590.] This girl was boarded out in Kent. After a few weeks rest was again re-started in life.

- [43.] A poor man discharged recovered from a Country Asylum assisted by a grant of money.
 [20.] A minister from a Country Asylum assisted by a grant of money.
 [20.] A lad who had been in an Asylum since the age of seven, boarded out for several weeks and placed in suitable situation.
