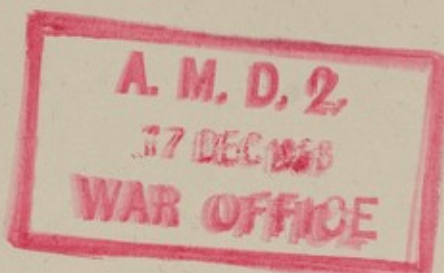

Sir,

I am commanded by the Army Council to acquaint you that the Advisory Board, Army Medical Service, has had under its consideration the question of the desirability of recognition of the Royal Army Medical College by the University of Cambridge.

2. Tropical Medicine, Military Surgery, Hygiene and Pathology are the four subjects for which Professors are appointed. The instruction is given to Officers of the Army only. In Tropical Medicine and Military Surgery the material for instruction is obtained in the Queen Alexandra Military Hospital, Grosvenor Road, S.W., which contains 220 beds, and modern Laboratories have been erected at the College for the teaching in Hygiene and Pathology.

3. The College has been admitted by the University of London as a School of the University in the Faculty of Medicine for Officers of the Royal Army Medical Corps, and the Advisory Board is of opinion that much advantage would accrue to the College, both to the teaching Staff, and to the Officers undergoing instruction if similar recognition

recognition by the University of Cambridge could be given. The period of study for which recognition is desired is only for short courses not exceeding six months.

4. The Army Council are much impressed by the importance of obtaining the highest teaching at the College and I am accordingly to ask that you will be so good as to lay this matter before the Senate of the University for their consideration.


