

He is a son of Andrew Maclean, a retired officer of the Army Medical Service, who, though over 90, is still hale and hearty. The Kaid's connection with the British Army is not generally known. In the sixties he purchased an ensigncy in the old 69th (now the 2nd Welsh Regiment), in which he obtained a company, and sold out at Gibraltar to take command of the Sultan of Morocco's Bodyguard. The King, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for India, has been pleased to approve the appointment of Sir Louis W. Dane, K.C.I.E., C.S.I., to be Lieutenant-Governor of the Punjab in succession to Sir Denzil Ibbetson, K.C.S.I., who has resigned owing to ill-health.

Sir Louis Dane, who was mentioned in The Standard last Monday as Sir Denzil Ibbetson's probable successor, served in the Punjab from 1876 to 1900, latterly as Chief Secretary to the provincial Government. On relinquishing that post, he had intended to retire from the Indian service, and had accepted a resident magistracy in Ireland; but returned to India on being offered by Lord Curzon the appointment of Political Resident in Kashmir. He succeeded Sir Hugh Barnes in January, 1903, as foreign secretary; and, in October, 1904, was sent on a mission to Kabul, where he negotiated a treaty with the Amir Habibulla, signed on March 21, 1905. Sir Louis, who is a son of the late Dr. R. M. Dane, C.B., Inspector-General of Hospitals, was born in 1856, and married, in 1882, a daughter of the late General Sir Francis Norman.

The King, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for India, has been pleased to approve the appointment of Sir Louis W. Dane, K.C.I.E., C.S.I., to be Lieutenant-Governor of the Punjab in succession to Sir Denzil Ibbetson, K.C.S.I., who has resigned owing to ill-health.

Sir Louis Dane, who was mentioned in The Standard last Monday as Sir Denzil Ibbetson's probable successor, served in the Punjab from 1878 to 1900, latterly as Chief Secretary to the provincial Government. On relinquishing that post, he had intended to retire from the Indian service, and had accepted a resident magistrate in Ireland; but returned to India on being offered by Lord Curzon the appointment of Political Resident in Kashmir. He succeeded Sir Hugh Barnes in January, 1903, as foreign secretary; and, in October, 1904, was sent on a mission to Kabul, where he negotiated a treaty with the Amir Habibulla, signed on March 21, 1905. Sir Louis, who is a son of the late Dr. R. M. Dane, C.B., Inspector-General of Hospitals, was born in 1856, and married, in 1882, a daughter of the late General Sir Francis Norman.

## KAID MACLEAN.

Sir Harry Aubrey De Vere Maclean, for such is his correct title, is a Highlander, a cadet of the Macleans of Drimmin. He is a son of Andrew Maclean, a retired officer of the Army Medical Service, who, though over 90, is still hale and hearty. The Kaid's connection with the British Army is not generally known. In the sixties he purchased an ensigncy in the old 69th (now the 2nd Welsh Regiment), in which he obtained a company, and sold out at Gibraltar to take command of the Sultan of Morocco's Bodyguard. He served in the 69th with the Huntington Field Force in the Red River Expedition of 1870, for which he wears the medal and clasp. The Kaid is responsible for the introduction of the Highland bagpipe into Morocco. He took over a piper from Scotland, who so enchanted the Sultan and the Moors that the Monarch established a band of pipers of his own. The Kaid is in his sixtieth year, is of middle height, has lost an eye, and was made a K.C.M.G. in 1901.

## HIS LETTERS TO MR. S. JOEL.

The first court of the Central Criminal Court was crowded on Saturday, when the trial was begun, before Mr. Justice Phillimore and a jury, of Franz von Veltheim (49), described in the calendar as an agent, on five counts of indictment for sending threatening letters to Mr. Solomon Barnato Joel demanding money with menaces. The case is one which has excited great interest in general, as well as in City financial circles, by reason of the standing of the persons concerned in the prosecution and defence. As a result there was a great demand for accommodation in court, the officials finding it necessary to issue tickets in order to prevent undue crowding. As it was, the court was filled in every part. The prosecutor (Mr. S. Joel) was present at the opening of the court, with a number of friends, and held a long and earnest conversation with Detective-Inspector Penton, who took the prisoner into custody under an extradition order from the City Police.



## THE SOUDAN.

The plan of campaign in the Soudan for August next is not likely to be so extensive as has been supposed in the service clubs, but it will be a first move towards an ultimate scheme for the reconquest of large portions of the Soudan. What is aimed at in the autumn is, it is understood, the establishment of a "scientific frontier," so that Egypt can never be threatened again by the Khalifa and his Dervishes. For this purpose the occupation of Dongola, Berber, and Kassala is contemplated. It has been said by some sanguine people that Dongola will be as easily occupied as Akasheh, but a different opinion is held by the Egyptian authorities, who believe the Khalifa will defend it with great determination. Therefore in the autumn a big force will have to strengthen the advance from Akasheh. Berber will either be attacked from Suakin or from Kassala. A flying column could reach Berber in a shorter time than from Suakin, and for this reason the attack on Berber will probably be made from Kassala. With Dongola and Berber cut off and Kassala well garrisoned, Khartoum and Omdurman might eventually be recovered.
