EDGAR WALLACE, THE FAMOUS NOVELIST AND PLAYWRIGHT, WAS SERVING IN THE MEDICAL STAFF CORPS IN SOUTH AFRICA WHEN THE R.A.M.C. WAS FORMED IN 1898.

IN 1899 HE BOUGHT HIMSELF OUT FOR £ 18 AND BECAME WAR CORRESPONDENT TO THE DAILY MAIL.
