## THE CALENDARS.

The *Jewish* is in accordance with the system arranged A.D. 358. The Calendar dates from the Creation, which is fixed as 3760 years and 3 months before the beginning of the Christian Era; the year is Luni-solar.

The *Mohammedan*, or era of the Hejira, dates from the day after Mahomet's flight from Mecca, which occurred on the night of July 15, 622 A.D. The months are Lunar.

The *Fasli* year was derived from a combination of the Hejira and Samvat years by the order of Akbar; it is Luni-solar. The *Bengali* year seems also to have been related at one time to the Hejira, but the fact of its being Solar made it lose 11 days each year.

The *Samvat* era dates from 57 B.C., and is Luni-solar. The months are divided into two fortnights—*sudi*, or bright, and *badi*, or dark. Each fortnight contains 15 tithis, which furnish the dates of the civil days given in our calendars.

Parcels weighing more than 440 tolas and not more than 800 tolas, limit of weight, must be registered.

**Telegraphic Money Orders, Inland.**—A fee for the issue of a telegraphic money order will be charged at the rate of commission on an ordinary inland money order for the same amount, added to a telegraph charge calculated at the rates for inland telegrams for the actual number of words used in the telegram advising the remittance, according as the telegram is to be sent as an "Express" or as an "Ordinary" message.

**Money Orders expressed in Rupees** up to the value of 600 rupees may be drawn on—Brit. E. Africa Protect. (incl. Uganda Protect.), Brit. N. Borneo (Jesselton), Ceylon, Corea (certain places), Federated Malay States, Formosa (certain places), German E. Africa, Hongkong (British Offices), Japan, Japanese Agencies in China and Manchuria, Mauritius, Sarawak, Seychelles, Siam, Somaliland Protect. (certain places), Straits Settlements (including Labuan), Zanzibar, Portuguese India (*Goa and Daman*).

Money Orders can also be drawn on the following Native States:—Chamba, Gwalior, Jhind, Nabha and Patiala; limit of value, 600 rupees. Inland rates of commission apply to these orders. Telegraphic Money Orders expressed in rupees may be exchanged with Ceylon. Limit of value is 600 rupees.

**Registration Fee.**—For each letter, post card, book or pattern packet, or parcel, to be registered, 2 annas.

**Acknowledgment Fee.**—For each article registered, 1 anna.

**Insurance.**—Registered letters, value-payable registered letters, registered parcels, and value-payable registered parcels may be insured up to the value of 500 Rs. in branch offices, and up to 2,000 Rs. in other offices; when the value insured does not exceed 50 rupees, 1 anna; for every additional 50 rupees or fraction, 1 anna.

**Value-Payable Fees.**—Amount specified for remittance to sender—The same rates of fees as for Ordinary Inland Money Orders.

**Money Orders** are issued at Hongkong and Shanghai. *Local Money Orders:* The commission to be charged on the issue of Money Orders payable in Hongkong and the Agencies in China will be one cent per dollar or fraction of a dollar, with a minimum charge of 5 cents. *Foreign Money Orders:* The commission to be charged will be one and a half cent per dollar on the amount (or equivalent of the amount) in dollars, with a minimum charge of 10 cents. The limit for a single Money Order is £40, \$100 gold, Mks. 800, Rs. 600, Yen 400 or \$400 Mex. Orders on the Countries drawn through the London Post Office are paid less the following discount, for which the remitter should allow. All such Orders must be expressed in British currency:—For sums not exceeding £5, 3d., and 3d. for each £5 or fraction of £5 additional.

## DON'T USE TOO DAMP FOR NEWLY WRITTEN INK.

**INSTRUCTIONS.**—For "Copying Ink" recently written thoroughly remove all superfluous moisture; when more than one copy is required, *take them separately*, making each succeeding one a little damper, and pressing longer. In this manner from four to six copies may be taken.

For "Copying Ink" which has been some days written, or copied before, or for "Non-Copying Ink," *damp well on both sides and press for a few minutes. One and sometimes two copies can be taken in this way.*

For Copying Type-written documents, it is advisable to use damping sheets instead of the brush.
