& Mustard seed of each a little; beat them altogether to a salve
& spread them on Leather, & apply them to both y^e hand-wrists
& let them ly on untill y^e are cured.

This medicine following cured a 3 daies Ague of Mr
Short hee had him 12 months & no medicine did
him good, & this cured him; hee took both a meate
after & had him againe; & hee took this medicine.
& it cured him if hee had him no more.

℞ A pint of Red driniger, & $\frac{1}{2}$ a pint of White wine vinegar
& 3 or 4 Spoonfulls of Sugar, mix them altogether, & drinke it

R Saffaparilla ℥ij, the roots of Saffaras ℥ij, Gaugirke
wood field ℥ij, Amomon ℥ij, Raisons ℥ij, Liquorish ℥ij, Grabi-
us, Goltfoot, botony, Maudlin, St Johns wort, of each a
handfull, Tormentill roots ℥ij, Burage, Longloss flowrd of
sack ℥ij, Red Sage, & Sanicle of sack 1 handfull, Anise seed
& Fenill seed of sack ℥ij; put all these into 6 quartes of fountain
water, & let them stand all night, next morning boyle it to the

Take of y^e Juice of Liquorish Emularumpand, roots plup^d
Aristologia & birth wort in powder, Mixke in powder or any
othere gum fit for it, & boyle yo^r Sugar to a thicknesse, and take it
of y^e fire and make them, yo^r may put in some Exorib diambra
and it is both Cordiall, & will give it a gallant smell.

Yo^r best way to prepare Emularumpand for to make Troaches
is to Slice them, & put them in water, and change yo^r water, once
in 24 hours, & at y^e daies end yo^r may boyle y^e roots soft & plup^d
them, & with 3 times of thoirs w^{ch} in Sugar, boyled to a thicknesse
make Troaches.

These Troaches let them melt in yo^r mouth & they
will cure any Cough or Colds, & yo^r may take a
little Conserve of Red: roses, now & then, but yo^r Con-
serve should be boyled, because it doth take y^e bind-
ing quality away, Yo^r may now & then take some
Exrops of Emularumpand, Coltsfoot & Affisops, or
Cons: of Red: roses 12 months old.

To make Troaches that infallible cures all Coughs
alsoe by holding one of them in y^e mouth as big as y^e
waxed be in Conserve of Red: roses before yo^r put it
into yo^r mouth, & the Conserve must be 12 months
old.

Take ʒiij of Marmalot of Quintob, & put ʒij of it
into a Skillet, & about ʒ or ʒss of Gumdragant
Cleere water, & let them stand w^{ch} of an hour, then put in
yo^r other 6 ounces of Quintob, & boyle them a little, and then do
these proceed following, (yo^r must not let y^e gum or marmalot
boyle at all, but yo^r must continually be stirring for if it
doth boyle it will not make Troaches) Emularumpand roots
in powder ʒij, Marthe Mallowes roots in powder ʒij, Saffron
ʒi, Cinomon ʒij, and Liquorish ʒij, all in very fine powder
Least Sugar 4th, (yo^r must melt yo^r Sugar first, with yo^r ʒij of
Marmalot & gumdragant water) yo^r may at some few ounces
of oyle of Cinomon to it, or any other Cordiall powder, And
then pour it out of yo^r Skillet hot, on a Table buttered, and
Clay it w^{ch} yo^r hand abroad if it doth not run, & then bake them

Against Coughs

To Make a rare Elixuary of Cureth all
Sorts of Coughs so admirably, except they
Come of y^e French pox.

℞ Marmalot of Quintes th, Enularum and roots ziii
and Marsh Mallores zxiij ; wash y^e roots & pound them, &
put them into a sufficient quantity of water & boyle them untill
they be soft, then plup them, & in y^e water they were boyled
in. yo^u may boyle it away to y^e thirtnesse of honey. & if yo^u
will yo^u may not boyle it away soe much. & soe to ridy paine
of y^e water above, yo^u must ad ^{2th} of very good Sugar, & melt
y^e Sugar & that y^e roots were boyled in together. It then put in
yo^u Marmalot & yo^u roots pluped, & boyle them a little, & when yo^u
take it off y^e fire, to ridy pound of y^e aforesaid matter, ad infine
powder 1-3 of Saffron, & Cinomon 1-3, & 1-3 of Liquorish
& incorporate them together and it is made.

And when yo^u give any of it, yo^u must ad a little
oyle of Sulpher to y^e Elixuary. yo^u may take
a Spoonfull at a tyme, viz. at 6 & 10 in the
morning; & at 4 & 9 at night.

℞ When yo^u take yo^u roots of from y^e fire, & goe soe to plup
them, yo^u may pour both roots & Liquore into y^e pluping
Liquor, & y^e water run through. It yo^u must alwaies stirre
yo^u roots when they doe boyle or else they will burne; & by

R of Green Cobana 12. th Cacus, Wormwood, Rue, Wallwort, Swastick, Centaury, Mandragora, Fenell, Ligo, Bay-leaue, Sweet Marjoram, Baiome, Nex, Penny-royall, Savine Sage, Broad-lime, & Southern-wood, Zestony, Sweet, Groundsell, Rosemary, & Politory of Spaine, of each 2 goodfulls; pound all yo^u herbs very small, & put all yo^u herbs into a great kettle, and put 24. of Lard to them, and boyle them 14. hours, stirring of them now and then; then strain them in yo^u hands, and afterwards in y^e press.

Black and White Hellebore of each 3th; pound all these to fine powder and seare them and when yo^u oylment is taken from y^e fire, put in all these powders and stire it untill it be cold.

Yo^u must put into yo^u oylment before yo^u take it of y^e fire 4. of y^e best Rozin powdered, and let it dissolve, and then take it of, pour it forth and put in yo^u powders.

Yo^u may ad these flowers to y^e first boyleing, Camomile, Rose-rome, White-Lillies, Melilot, and Eloe.

The best making this oylment is in May.
