About one or two months ago, you were so kind as to send me, as to other doctors, a charming historical booklet about "Antient Cymric Medicine," and afterwards the prospectus of your forthcoming Historical Medical Exhibition, to be held next spring.

I present you my heartiest wishes for the success of the exhibition and regret I shall not be able to go myself to England to visit and admire it as it will surely deserve, because everything connected with History in general and with Medicine History in particular, interests me very much. Unfortunately, I cannot help you myself to realise this fine project, unless a microscope from the end of XVIII or the beginning of XIX century might have some interest for you.

To enable you to judge, I am going to describe the instrument in a few words. It is ⁱⁿ a strong wooden box 8 x 5 x 2 inches, ~~and~~ one of the smaller sides ^{of which} is used as a stand for the microscope. A metallic rod with well made rack slides and is fixed in a groove in the small side of the box. At the superior extremity of the rod there are two metal discs. Upon the superior one, pierced in the middle, is screwed the tube with the ocular (which may be lengthened to obtain a larger enlargement). Under the inferior end of the tube put upon the superior disc, are the two grooves in which slide the double metallic plates carrying the lenses. A notch in the grooves stops the lense at the desired place. Upon the inferior disc, which slides upon the rack, is placed the preparation to be examined. The round hole at the centre of this washer or disc is made so as to receive 3 different small instruments: (1) a double metallic washer kept together by two small columns; the distance between the two plates can be regulated with a screw; it is used to prepare the substance to be examined; (2) A metallic tube to be adapted to the inferior disc, a fluted rod, whose large canule fits in a hole ad hoc in the disc and is used I think to work under water. (3) A strong lense which can be screwed instead of the tubes upon the superior disc. The inferior part of the lense is ordinarily protected by a screwed up metallic cover.

In the inferior part of the metallic rod, is a fluted rod that fits the double glass movable in all senses.

As already said, the lenses are six, ^{number} between two plates screwed together. Besides, there are still two other small instruments whose use I ignore. A disc resembling the one at the base of the tube and a rectangular groove. In the box itself, there is still room for pinches a small knife, etc. Everything is made with precision and even with a certain elegance.

If this microscope may interest you for your exhibition, I shall be glad to lend it to you, and I am waiting for your answer.

On next page is a small sketch to explain the parts of present description that might be obscure.
