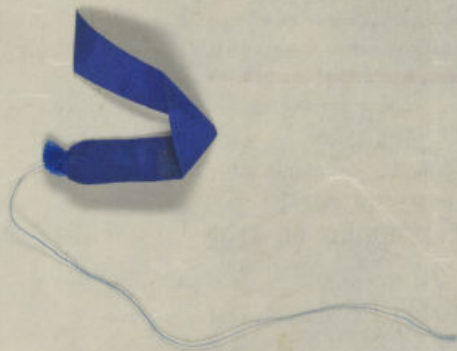

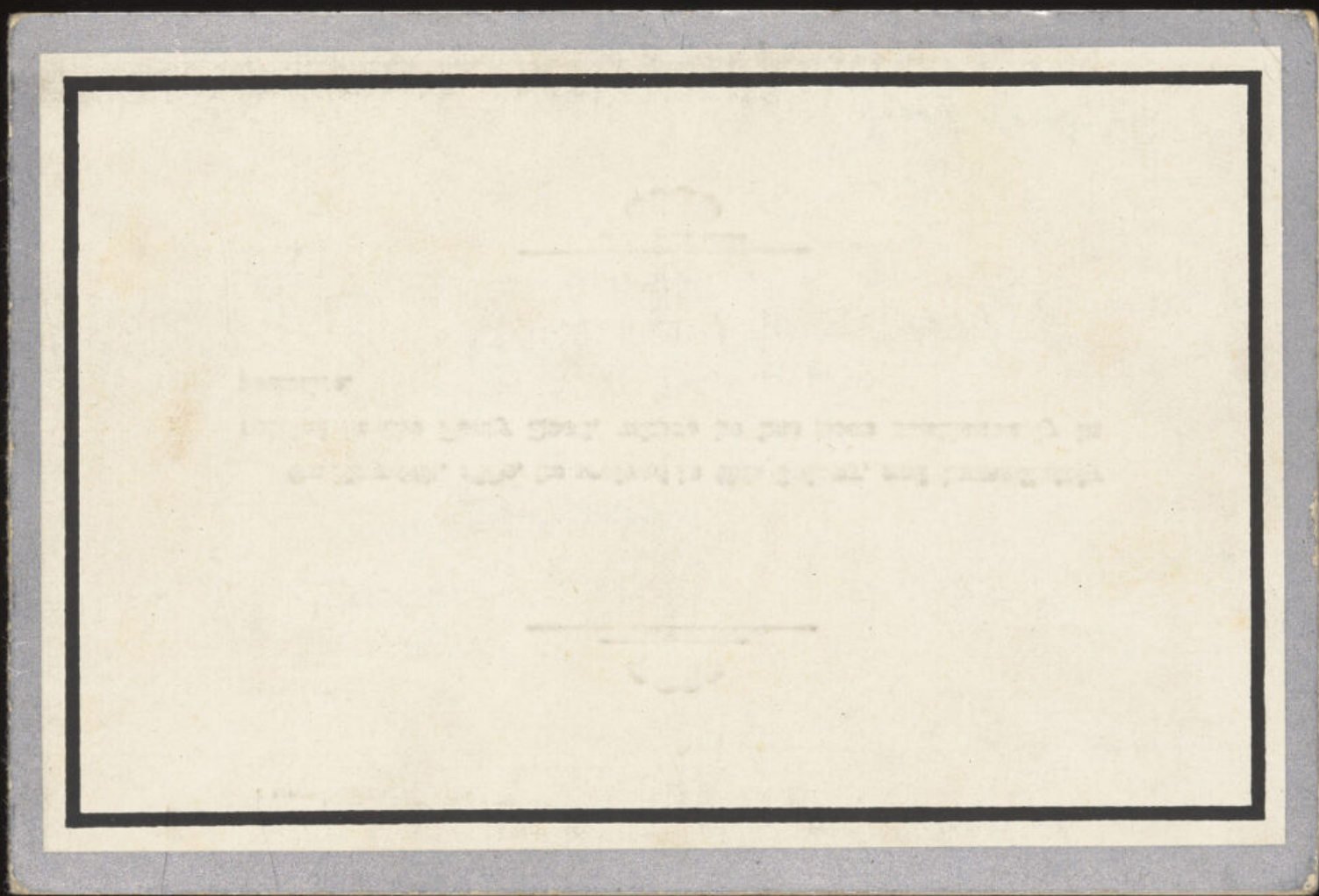

OBITUARY. Christchurch

DR. F. E. HUNT. Press

Very suddenly yesterday death removed from the ranks of the medical profession a gentleman who had gained the warm esteem of all with whom he came in contact, either in his professional or private capacity. Dr. F. E. Hunt, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., arrived in Christchurch in the year 1880, and settled on the Ferry road, establishing a wide practice, and becoming very popular in the very large district over which he daily drove. He was the son of Mr F. Knight Hunt, for many years editor of the London "Daily News." Dr. Hunt was educated at University College School, London, and Guy's Hospital, and afterwards practised at Sydenham, near London. He came out to New Zealand in the ship Edwin Fox, in 1880, and since then has practised his profession in this district. He was not a public man in the wide sense of the term, but associated himself with the different Friendly Societies, established for the benefit of members, and for a time was a member of the Heathcote Road Board. He was also a member of the Christchurch Hospital Board, in connection with which he did good service during his short term of office. He was instrumental in establishing the Medical Association, very soon after his arrival in the colony, and was the original secretary of the Christchurch branch. This Association has now been merged into the British Medical Association. Dr. Hunt was fifty-nine years of age at the time of his death, which resulted from an attack of influenza, by which he was seized about a week ago. He was a man most popular among his patients, and in the district, and the news of his death will be received with great regret. He leaves a widow, six sons and three daughters to mourn their loss. The funeral is to take place on Friday.

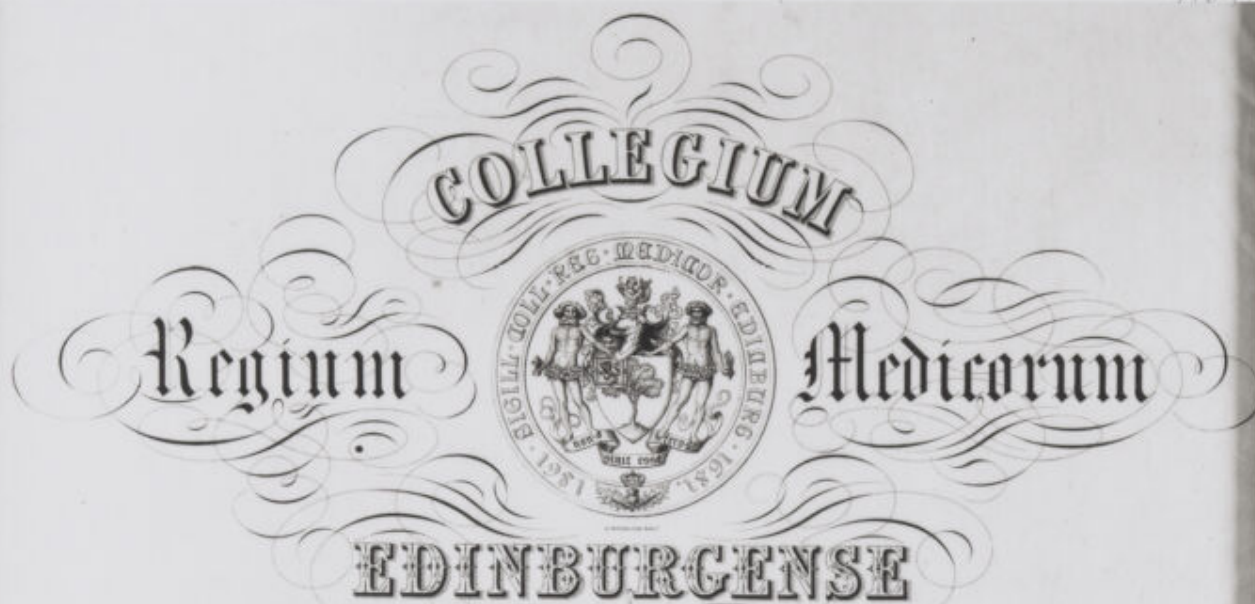
