But stories, especially Scotch stories, ^{have} have
a blithe content ^{and} ^{are} ^{very} ^{near} ^{about}
them that brings ^{now} ^a laugh now a tear to the

eye. & Now in the English language we
have stories from many countries. American
stories, have a ring of their own. a matter of fact
sounding often thought, which to English
ear, sounds ~~to~~ ~~as~~ ~~if~~ ~~it~~ ~~is~~ ~~peculiar.~~

Mark Twain works, are laughable & clever
with extreme ^{and} ^{mostly} ^{independent} ^{an} ^{analysis}

Scott's songs.

Scott's songs are not all in the Scotch
dialect. Burns wrote ~~about~~ ^{many} of his
songs in English. His letters are
now preserved as types of ^{perfect} English
pure composition. There is a famous
letter commencing my dear Clarendon
which is pronounced a perfect study
of English composition.

In the world it is a pity Burns was
not an Englishman. For Scotland
it was a blessing. It never again
stood so high has been mightier
than the word in Scotland. For he
has in Burns & Scott saved the nation
from what would have been the crown
