

September 1867. Penang.

Mon. 2  
Eyr. at 6. Walked with Mr. to Mr. Distant's  
who is living with Mr. John Launter. Found  
Sandy a little better. Took a fresh egg for  
him. 7. Walked home alone. had 2 slices  
of toast & butter. Saw the tables dusted. Took  
the bazaar account from our boy, and  
gave him the orders for the day. Then  
worked at my bead collar till 9:15.  
when I bathed & dressed. 9:30. Second  
breakfast. The Bengal Tailor brought  
my silk jacket to try on, but it did  
not fit me properly, so he had to take  
it home and alter it. Mr. is very busy  
having to go Court, this being the first day  
of the sessions. His dobie came. I sorted  
the clean things. 2. Tiffin. 3. Received a  
note from Farry. She was not feeling very  
well. I began answering it, as I had no-  
thing else particular to do. 4. The boy  
brought a hawker, as I had told him  
I wanted some beads. So I bought 1. Skein  
of transparent white beads + 2 of ruby co-  
loured beads at 3. a skein. 10 cents in all.

4:30. Just as I was going to lie down. Sarah Church came in her carriage, and wanted to see me, so I went down to see. She came to ask J.M.R. to go and see Robert Waller her brother, who was not very well - fever - &c. After having just the room tidy, I went to see M<sup>rs</sup> Distant, it being arranged, that as J.M.R. could not take me out for a drive on account of having so many patients to see, he would come and see M<sup>rs</sup> Distant, and then walk home with me. On my way to M<sup>rs</sup> D. I stopped, to speak to M<sup>rs</sup> James Prodyk, and children. Nellie gave me a piece of trimming for my bodices, which she had tatted, herself. I stayed a quarter of an hour, and then I went to M<sup>rs</sup> D's. took her 2 fresh eggs, and a biscuit for each of her children. J.M.R. came for me. we walked home, and had our dinner. Then we sang a few songs. Then I finished writing my letter to Perry, read the Bible, and at 10:30. went to bed.

Tues 3

Up at 6. Aunty Milania de Luz's birthday. I had promised Mary, Larry & Georgie to send their presents to Aunty, at 5:30. but when I got up, I changed my mind, and thought I had better take them myself, and go and see her. So at 6:30. I made our orderly carry the parcel, and J.W.K. walked with me, as far as Mr. Boyan's house, and then he went down Seath street, and I walked straight on with the orderly behind me. When I got to Aunty's, I found that Uncle Lawrence & Phoebe, had both forgotten it was her birthday, and that I was the second one to wish her "many happy returns of the day."

I had a cup of tea and a slice of toast and butter. Then I asked Phoebe to lend me her silk jacket, as it was very prettily trimmed, and I wanted the Bengal Sailor to copy it. 8:30. I walked home again, making our orderly carry the jacket. & took the Bazaar account from our boy, and gave him the orders

3 for the day. Then I worked a little at my bead collar.

9:15. bathed & dressed 9:30.  
Second breakfast. 11. Aunty and Phoebe came to see Mamma's porter bottled, they stayed till 3 o'clock. 1. M.M. went out. Mary Anthony came to see me, but she would not stop to tiffin, though it was all ready on the table. 2. M.M. came home, Mary went away, and we had tiffin. I asked Aunty, if she would have anything to eat and she said, she had been home, and brought Phoebe her tiffin from Uncle's house.

After that, I again worked at my bead collar, till 3:30. when I rested. 4. Received a nice long letter from Georgie. 11:30. got up. dressed. tried one song with the Juans. 5:30. M.M. was just going to take me to Aunty's when Mr. Magalhears came to speak to him, and before we could leave the house, Captain Mrs. Semon arrived. They were going to dine with us.

Mrs. Semon said she had

Wed 4 been up to the big hills this morning, and was feeling very tired. Mr. went out without me. We all sat out on the portico, till 7 when we had dinner. Then we had some music. At 10. Captain Lemon's wife went away. After seeing the doors and windows shut up, I came into my room, and answered Georgie's letter. Then I read the Bible, and at 10:30. went to bed.

Wed 4 Up at 6. It was drizzling a little, but I got up and dressed. Then walked with Mr. to see Mr. Distant, he left me at the gate to go to the General Hospital. Sandy was brought down after I went there. I had to wait some little time, before I could see Mr. Distant. I took her 2 fresh eggs, as I was not able to go and see her at all yesterday, and I forgot to send them by our boy. At 7:10. I went to see Mr. Waller (waiting) to thank her for the guava's she sent us yesterday evening, and I also asked her to tell Sarah, I would be happy to spend the day with her tomorrow.

Then I walked home. I had no occasion to use the umbrella, as it was not raining much, but I had not been home 5 minutes, when it began to pour. Took the bazaar account from our boy, and gave him the orders for the day. I had not felt very hungry, so forgot to eat anything. Took the account of beer, and porter, that we had consumed the night before. Worked at my bead collar. Read a little.

9:15. bathed. dressed. 10. Second breakfast. I had just begun to eat when J.B.K. came in. No one called. I mended my black grenadine cloak with silk, as the former silk, was getting rotten. Worked again at my bead collar and began threading the ruby beads.

1. J.B.K. went out. 2. home. tiffin. Then he sang some songs. 3:15. Mr. Earl came to fetch him, as they were both going on an inquest. to Ayer. Itam. I worked. 4. rested. dozed a little. 5. Got up.

Wed. Ordered the carriage, and went to see Aunty. Gave her a silver buckle from us as a birth day present. See Coign had not been able to finish it before. b. Left her and went to see Mr. Distant again. Mrs. J. Saunters house has a very bad stone at the gate, so I did not take the carriage, but ordered the syce to wait for me outside.

Just as I was coming away James J. B. K. so I told him I was going to the jetty for a little while to see Mr. Hogan. I went to the jetty and got into Mr. H's carriage & talked to her. She told me the newly married couple Mr. & Mrs. Alexandersen came down the hill this morning. At 7 I came home. Mr. Waller came, and we went down to dinner. After dinner I left the table and made myself comfortable in my room. J. B. K. brought C. Waller upstairs and they had a chat together. I answered Mary's letter, which I received this afternoon. Mr. Waller went away. I saw all the doors and windows shut. Read the

Bible. at 10. went to bed.

5 Up at 8. Walked with J.B.H. to Mrs. Distant. I went in, but J.B.H. walked on the<sup>r</sup> to General Hospital. Sandy was a little better. The children brought him some pictures from the Illustrated London News to look at, and he seemed very pleased. I gave him some sougee to drink while I was there.

Mrs. Distant has been suffering lately from a gum boil and toothache, and she was just going to sleep last night, when she heard someone cry out, "fire, fire." She jumped out of bed, her ayah Tam caught up Willie, the youngest girl, she been her favourite, and rushed into Mr. J. Faunters childrens room, and there they saw Lucy Faunter, the second girl, in her bed, with the fire surrounding her. They dragged the child out of bed, and then began throwing water on the bed till the fire was out. It is supposed that sadly their ayah who had been looking for the mosquitoes in the bed, must have let the wick of the candle she had in her hand, without

Thurs Borrowing it, fall on the bed clothes, and so set fire to the bed. Fortunately there were no mosquito curtains, or there would have been little chance of saving the child's life.

At 7:15. I walked home again by myself. For a wonder I eat a slice of toast and butter, and some duck, and drank a cup of tea. Mamma and Phoebe came here I saw them. Dobie brought my clean clothes, but he went to Mr. Padday's first. Took the bazaar account, and gave our boy the orders for the day. 9:15. Bathed. dressed. 9:30. Second breakfast.

I worked a little at my bead collar. After breakfast, Dobie came, took the account. Sent my 1 doz and a 1/2 new chemises to the wash. 12. went to see the newly married couple Capt & Mrs. Alexandersen at Hogesew's Hotel, commonly called the Punch house. Gave her a peach stone bracelet set in silver, as a wedding present. Mr. & Mrs. Bacon arrived there the same time as I did. Alice was spending the day with them.

5. 7 Then I went on Sarah's and had tiffin with her, Major Church, having gone to play cricket. Charley Waller came in after tiffin and stayed until I came away. I began another collar of ruby and transparent beads. It looks very nice, and sparkles a great deal. After tiffin, Sarah and I played some piano duets together reading by sight. 8.

At 3. Miss Dickson and all Mr. Walter Scott's children came for Mr. Waller to take them on the Esplanade, where the cricketers were, to hear the band play. The three eldest children, as well as little Edith, all played some pieces on the piano. At 4. I came away, after having heard some tunes in Mr. J. Waller's musical box.

Then I rested. 5:30. Got up, put my things away, and walked over to see Mrs. Distant, taking 2 eggs for her. I stopped to speak to Mr. James Roddyk on the way, and when I got to Mr. D.'s I found J.M.K. had been there sometime, so I gave her the eggs, said

Thurs 5 good bye, then J.M.K. and I went out for a short drive on the Lazar road. y. home. Mr. Lamb the banker, and Mr. Gentte arrived, we went down to dinner. &

After dinner we had some music, and two games at whist. Mr. Gentte being my partner. We lost. The opposite side being 12 points above us, when the games were finished. 11:30. They went away. I wrote to Carry, in answer to her letter which she wrote to me this morning, and which I received this afternoon. I wrote 5 pages. 12. went to bed.

Fri 6 Up at 6. As it was raining, I got into bed, and went to sleep again. till 7. When I got up dressed. I found I had a great deal of work to do, and so could not go and see Mr. Distant. J.M.K. and I had our early breakfast. I took 2 slices of toast, a cup of tea, and some cold curry, and a glass of sherry. 8:45. It cleared so J.M.K. went to see some of his patients. Took the Lazar account, and gave our boy the orders for the day.

6 Then I put my clean clothes, that the dobie brought yesterday, away, as I had not time to do so yesterday. I also put one of my admirals tidy. 10. Bathed, dressed. The Bengal dulgee came, but as J.M.K. was not yet come home, and he had to go to the nunnery, I told him to go there first, and then to come here. 10:30. J.M.K. came home. He told me D<sup>r</sup> Burn had asked him to go and see M<sup>r</sup> Bagshaw at York House thro<sup>g</sup> Vigzard, as he himself was sick, and could not go out.

10:45. Second breakfast. Then J.M.K. had plenty of work to do. The dulgee came, so I tried on my silk jacket, and J.M.K. told him were it was to be altered; I also gave him some garibaldiis to make. 2 out the striped black cotton from England, and one from here a violet and white stripe. It takes 3 yds, all but 2, inches to make a garibaldi. Before the Tailor went away, I made him fold up my dresses silk, and he helped me to roll them up in a sheet, which J.M.K. had given to me for that purpose.

Thurs

Then I wrote my journal for yesterday, not having had time to do so this morning. The time passes so quickly, and I was quite surprised, when I looked at the clock to find it was 12:30. So I had to dress. I wore a white garibaldi, and a light coloured silk dress, which Mamma had worn on my wedding day. J.R.K. could not find time to take me to the jetty as he promised, as he found he had too much work to do, and Mr. J. Faunter had asked him to go and see his brother George C. who he was afraid was dying from drink.

12:50. I left the house in J.R.K. carriage, and went to the jetty. There I found Captain Senior, who also had just arrived. He took me in his boat, and we went on board the ship "Krishna", which belongs to him. His baby "Mary" was crying, and Mr. Senior, was not quite ready to receive me. We went down to the saloon, then I took off my hat and cloak, and put them in Mr. Senior's room. I had taken my bead work with me.

Capt Semon showed me some views from Paris and Bombay. Then I did some bead work. 2. we had tiffin. Then we went on deck. The breeze was beautiful. There boy Willie was very mischievous, trying to upset and take my beads from me. 3. Mr. came. brought me a letter from Georgie, and the news that George Faunter was dead. 4. We had dinner on deck. There was roast duck & goose, fowl in paste, and curried fowl, Potatoes, Beans chow chow, Rice, Prawn and cucumber, dried prawns curries. Puddings, custards and Tarts. Chees & Lettuce.

After dinner Capt & Mrs Semon each played something on the concertina. Then we had one game at whist. I very foolishly drank 2 cups of coffee, the consequence was, that I felt a little sick. At 10. we left the ship, and got into Capt Semon's boat, and came on shore; got into the carriage and came home. I really was so tired, and feeling so sick, I could not write to Georgie. So directly I got home I went to bed.

September 1867. Penang

Sat 7 up at 6. Walked to see Mr. Distant. J.M.K. accompanied me as far as the gate, and he also went upstairs. George Caunter was buried. I went up the back way into Mr. D.'s room. Her children were all with her. J.M.K. followed the coffin to the burying ground. Mr. D. told me that Amoy Durnford and Charlie Kodyk sat up all the night with the corpse, and they sent Mr. John Caunter to bed. She also told me that Auntie came to see her yesterday, and nearly fainted, when she heard the news.

I found Sandy better, though he had had a very restless night. His cough having troubled him a great deal. Uncle Joseph came to see Mr. J. Caunter. He received me very coldly. He also said that Carry was getting on famously, and that the bill was doing her good, also, Miss Palmer's ayah had come down the hill, some words having passed between her and Miss P. Uncle J. seemed quite in a hurry. He complained of having a bad headache, at the stroke he had received, when he heard of J. Caunter's death.

Last Wednesday, Capt & Mr. Simon with the Angent's son Mr. Le fond went to the big tree, they got wet through, not having provided themselves with Umbrellas. They saw a tiger, but it must have had a good breakfast, as it did not stir, but allowed them to come on quietly. 8. I walked home by myself. Took the bazaar account, and gave our boy the orders for the day. Wrote. Had a slice of dry toast, and a glass of wine, as I was not feeling very well, in consequence of having drunk 2 cups of coffee on board the "Krishna".

9:15. bathed. dressed. I was a little late, it was 10. when J.M.K. came home and I had waited. to ask him if it would do me any harm. to bathe. 12. The tailor came brought my silk jacket nicely finished. I covered my journal myself. 2. I had my dinner of chicken broth. 3. J.M.K. came home. Then I rested. 5. up. Out for a drive with J.M.K. On our way home called to see Mr. D. I took her 2 fresh eggs. 7. home to dinner. music. 9. read the Bible and went to bed.

Up at 6. Walked over to see Mr. Distant. J. W. N. accompanied me to the gate. There we saw Victoria walking with the baby. He looked at it, and then walked on to the General Hospital. We met Capt & Mrs. Godfrey walking with their eldest child a girl. I carried a wineglassful of honey for Sandy, who I found had passed a better night. Mrs. D. wants to go on the hill for a change. She said she was thinking of asking Miss Palmer to allow her to go up to the "Highlands". The children had gone out with Ayah. Stan and ~~had~~<sup>did</sup> not come home till 7.

7:30. Walked home by myself. Left the wineglass with the Ayah. Had a slice of toast and butter, and a glass of wine. Took the bazaar account, and gave our boy the orders for the day. Finished writing down all the birthdays to August. Then not feeling altogether right, rested, 9:30. Bathed. dressed. J. W. N. sent me a letter by one of the Hospital Orderlys for his boots. He had taken 2 odd numbers, instead of a pair.

10. Second breakfast. 10. J.M.K. came home. 11. Church. Neither Alice or Lena were in the gallery. They could not get their mourning finished in time. I asked Constance Hogan to change my Sunday book for me, as Georgie was not here to do it. 1. home. J.M.K. went to see Mr. Earl, who was sick with fever. 1:30. Constance and her three little sisters came here to bring me my book, and they stayed a short time only, and then went away.

2. tiffin. rested. read.

This morning Mr. Gentle wrote to ask J.M.K. to go to Langong Tokong with him this afternoon, and afterwards to dine there, at his house. So at 4, we started. J.M.K. first took me to the Anthony's, where I saw W. C. S. H. C. Pidday, Robert Waller, and Joseph Anthony. I went upstairs to Mary, and J.M.K. went on to Mr. Gentle. Mary asked me to dine with them, so when the carriage returned, I sent it home, told the bye to fetch J.M.K. at 9.

Sun

5. We went for a drive first a little way beyond the tree, and then we turned and went to the jetty. On our way we picked up Alice Caunter. When we got to the jetty, we all got out, with the exception of Mrs Galastain, who said she would go and see Flora. Mr & Mrs Buttery also got out of their open carriage, and we all sat down on the grass.

When we had been talking a little while, Mr & Mrs W. C. S. P. (Paddy), Robert Waller & Joseph Anthony, came. W. C. S. P. gave Mary, Mrs Buttery, Mrs P. & myself each a lime. 7:15. Home. We left Alice at her house, and then went on. We were a little late. Mr & Mrs Anthony having begun their dinner. They had some very nice dishes to eat. After dinner, Mary took a puff or two at her brother's Hooka for fun, and then we went upstairs. Played a Japan first with Mrs Galastain. Then Mary. 10. Mr. came for me. Went home in the carriage. Read the bible. bed.

9 Up at 6. Walked to see Mr. Distant. J.M. accompanied me as far as the gate, spoke to Victoria who was carrying the baby, and then walked on to the General Hospital. I went in, saw Sandy who was looking a little better. He had had a good night's rest. The Ayah carried him in her arms about the garden. I gave him his sougee. The children had gone to see Aunty, and as they had not returned at 7:30, I could not wait any longer, so said good bye, and then walked home again by myself.

Took the bayar account and gave our boy the orders for the day. Eat a slice of toast and butter, and drank a glass of wine. 8. The Mail from and for home arrived. I did not get any letter from Joe. rested. read. finished my Sunday book. 9:15. bathed. dressed. 9:30. Second breakfast. Mamma and Phoebe were here. They were looking after the men, who were bottling another cask of beer.

September 10th 1867. Penang.

Mon 9

After breakfast J.M.K. went to see Mr. Pasley who had fever. He opened his mail letter, and gave me one from Mr. King which she had written to me. So I came up stairs and read it. Then I mended my jacket. I did not know it was torn, till J.M.K. told me. Time passed so quickly, I did not know it was so late as 1. I wrote to Mary, telling her, that as she was not sure whether she was going to the Province or not, to I had better put off the tiffin party till her return.

I received a letter from Mary saying Larry was not at all well, had been spitting blood, and groaning all night. Georgie came down the hill to have her tooth stopped, she was at Mr. Palmer's, and the carriage was at the door, ready to bring her here, but she was frightened to come, because Uncle Joseph had told her, he would bring her over at 3:30. I answered Mary's letter, and also wrote one to Larry, and then I wrote and asked Georgie to take them up the hill.

In my letters up the hill, I proposed going to spend a few days with them, if they thought I might cheer Carry up. Alice was to have gone, but Carry did not wish it. 2. Tiffin alone. 3. Mr. came home. He was going across to the province, and I said I would like to go with him. He consented to my doing so; but when he came home, he said Capt Ellis wanted to go over; and see how the boat that he was making was progressing at all, and that as he could not refuse him, I would not be able to go.

1. Mr. went rested. I was reading a book, and fell asleep over it, till 5:30. Then I got up, dressed, and mended 3 small holes in the sheet. 6. Walked over to see Mr. Pasley who had fever, met Mr. Distant who was just going home. She had brought her baby. Then I walked on to see Sandy. He was much better. Took 2 eggs. As I was coming away, I met Mr. Hogan at the gate. Talked to her a little. Then Mr. went to see Mr. Pasley. Walked home. 7. dinner. music. read the Bible 10. bed.

Tues 10 Up abd. Walked over to see Mr. Distant. J.M. accompanied me to the gate, asked Victoria about Sandy, she said he had been talking a great deal in the night. Then he walked on to the General Hospital, and I walked in. As Mr. Distant was not downstairs, I went up, & gave her an old muslin dress of mine, and I also asked her if she would like some old shirts of J.M.'s, and she said "anything in the shape of cloth will be very acceptable." The children had gone again to see Aunty, and they had not yet returned 7:15. So I saw Sandy take his souge and suck some sugar cand, and then I walked home.

The boy had not yet come, so I began to write, as no one can make hot buttered toast but him and Harry's servant "Bob" who was also not here. When the boy came, I had some toast and butter, and a glass of wine. Saw him dust the tables, and sweep the room. He put a piece of new mat, in front of J.M.'s stool. Took the bazaar account, and gave the boy the orders for the day.

rested. Looked at a book of  
travails. 9:15. bathed. dressed. I was not feeling  
very hungry, so I went to the piano, and sang  
some songs of our the new book. No 2. Then  
at 10. I went downstairs and eat nearly half a  
pamphlet, with rice. When I had finished  
I came up, and sang again. J.M.K. came home  
and heard me. I put my hanging almouch  
tidy. The tailor came I gave him five (5)  
of my jackanet yaribaldis to alter, and or-  
dered him to make a new muslin one  
for me, for Lucy Brown's wedding.

Then I began working my  
stockings (Charlie Waller came to see J.M.K.  
who was downstairs, having his hair cut.  
He brought us a couple of snipes, which  
J.M.K. said was to be cooked for tiffin, and  
I thinking he had told the boy to see about  
it, took no more notice. J.M.K. went to town  
I told him not to forget his promise of bring-  
ing me a book to read from the Library. No.  
de Silver came to tune the piano for the  
first time this month.

Guests

2. As I was busy working at my stockings, our Orderly brought me a visiting card of Mr. Ansons, I had given my best garibaldi to the tailor, so I sent down word I was not at home. At 2.30. I called the Orderly up to tell him not to bring the snipes up till J.B.K. came home but to keep them in the kitchen, when he told me they were not cooked, the feathers even were not taken off, so I thought I would chance it, as J.B.K. did not come home sometimes before 3.30. So I called the cook, gave him 2 slices of bread, and some lard, and told him to cook and clean them directly.

I was feeling very hungry, so I began my tiffin of hash & potatoes. 3. J.B.K. returned, the snipe fortunately were ready so we eat and enjoyed them. Then I worked 4. rested, went to sleep till 5. Got up. dressed 6. Out for a drive. On our way home called on Mrs. Distant gave her 2 eggs, and then walked to Mr. Pasley's and home at 7. to dinner & music. 10. J.B.K. had a headache bed.

11 Up at 6:40. It was raining very hard at 6. so I did not wake Mr. dressed. Walked to see Mrs. Distant. Mr. accompanied me to the gate, and then he walked on to the General Hospital. I went in. As it was drizzling, Victoria was sitting under the house with baby. I went upstairs. Sandy was lying down on his couch outside in the verandah, I walked to the bedroom, and found Mrs. Distant was bathing. So I waited, and presently she came up. I gave her 6 of Mr.'s shirts.

She said Sandy was much better. He was eating a coey Mankos. He had also slept better. 7:15. Walked home again. Then sent the boy out for 2 Apoms, and 4 coey Mankos. 2 price in all. Got the Apoms, and drank a cup of tea, and some wine. I eat also one of the coey's, but I did not like it very much, so I gave the rest away. Saw the boy dust the tables. Took the bazaar account and gave our boy the orders for the day. Drove. Dressed, and read a little of Lords and Ladies.

September. 1867. Penang.

Wed

9:15. Bathed. dressed. Then as I had eaten well this morning, I was not feeling very hungry, so I went to the piano and sang some songs. At 11. The Massalchel came to tell me J.B.K. had come, so I went downstairs, and had my second breakfast with him. He told me he had asked Mr & Mrs Anthony, and that they would be very happy to come and dine with us tomorrow. So after I had finished my breakfast, I came upstairs, and wrote down all that we would require for dinner the. The

Then I read it to the boy, all that he was to buy. Then I worked some dirty socks of J.B.K.'s as he thought if he sent them to the wash, the holes might get bigger, and I should have more trouble in mending them. I also mended some large holes in my chemises. 12. Raining very hard. And every now and then, it gets quite dark, and as I was sitting in the inner room, I could scarcely see. A man brought some incense, and a piece of muslin for dress, for sale.

The muslim was \$6 the piece, and the insertion they wanted 20 cents for just one strip. We did not buy anything. 1. I wrote and asked Aunty, if I might come and dine with her, as J.M.K. was going to Mr. W. Allen's to dinner. It was still raining very hard, so J.M.K. could not go to town. Capt Lemon brought some ponies which he had bought, for J.M.K. to see if they were good for anything. He also said, that he and Uncle Lawrence were going to the Province, and on Saturday to stay till Tuesday.

2. tiffin. Aunty wrote to say she would be very happy to see me. Worked again till 4. when I rested till 5. Mr. Budday's butter made us a present of 25 duck, and 4. geese eggs. 5. 30. Went with Harry to Auntie's. Took her some fried fish to try. Played backgammon. 6:15. Uncle came home to dinner. After that Aunty and I had some games at backgammon, while the rest played at wight-aine. 9. Harry took me first to the jetty, and then we came home. bed.

Thur 12. Up at 8. Walked over to Mr. Johnny Lunter to  
 see Mr. Distant. Mr. L. accompanied me to  
 the gate, and then he walked on to the Gene-  
 ral Hospital. I went in, saw Sandy sitting on  
 the chair outside in the open air. He was look-  
 ing much better. He eat 4 finger biscuits, and  
 drank his egg and brandy, and a cup of broth,  
 while I was there. The broth had some onions  
 chopped up & mixed with it to make it tasty  
 but as he did not like it, I took a spoon and  
 took all the pieces out, and then I gave it to  
 him to drink.

As it was wet under foot, the  
 children did not go out for a walk. But Mr. D.  
 sent Ayesh Etam with a duck to Amy Lorraine's  
 mother, to have it steamed, so that if Sandy felt  
 inclined to eat any, it would be tender enough  
 for him to do so. At 8. I walked home again by  
 myself. Met Mr. V. Prody's little baby at Mr. Kester's  
 door. Gave a slice of toast, and drank a glass of  
 wine. Had the orderly up here to sweep all  
 4 rooms, and dust the pictures he could reach  
 and 2 tables.

He was very slow about it, having taken an hour and nearly a half over it. The boy went to the bazaar again, after I came home, as he had not bought all the things for dinner. So I read, wrote, and rested. 9:15. Bathed dressed 9:30. Took the bazaar account from our boy, and gave him the orders for the day. Gave him also all the silver out of the Admiral, to clean for this evening. 10. J.M.K. came home and brought a couple of snipes, Mr. Hugh Scott had given to him, and some new kind of beans from Mr. Anthony.

I had my second breakfast with J.M.K. Then came upstairs, worked my stockings &c. J.M.K. had 2 pieces of cloth cut for my dressing table, and asked if I thought I could work them, and how long I would be over them. I said not long, and promised to begin them tomorrow. 12:30. I dressed, and went to call on Mrs. Walter Scott. She was in her d'ishabille, she asked me to excuse her, as she was very busy arranging some roses, as they were going to have a dinner party

June 12

While I was there, another carriage drove up, so Mrs. W. Scott said, I must really go and dress, for as your carriage is here, I must see this person, whoever it may be. She asked me to go in her room, but I said never mind. I won't keep you, and so came away. It was a strange gentleman. Then I went on to Mrs. Presgrave's, and asked Alice to lend me the bonnet, Amy trimmed for her, as I wanted one like it. So she lent it to me, and said I might keep it, till after next Sunday, as she was in mourning, and would not be able to wear it yet.

Then I went on to Mrs. Hogans. I took her the bonnet that was bought from Mrs. Plunket, and asked her if she thought it could be unpicked, and made the same shape as Alice's. She said she would try, so she unpicked it. The lace was very good, and would do for another bonnet, but she asked me, if I had been to the Ginnery, to see if I could get a shape like Alice's bonnet, because that was were it was bought.

So I told her I had not been, but would go another day, and they if I could get one like it, I would bring it to her. And she said, if I cannot, never mind. Then I will try and make one like Alice's. 2. home. We had the snipes for tiffin. They were not so well cooked today. After tiffin, I was putting the dirty napkins table in the clothes basket, when I heard a crash, I looked and saw all the silver things, had fallen on the ground the boy having foolishly put them on the clothes basket, instead of on the table.

We were to have had some music but did not do so. I received a letter from Carry, saying she was much better. I began answering it, and also one to Mary, when I was feeling a little tired, so rested. 6. Up. Went on board the "Krishna" with Mr. we came on shore 6:50, and had just time to dress, when Mr. & Mrs. Anthony came. 7. we went down to dinner. After that cards. Mr. Anthony and I being 15 points above them. 10. They went away. Read the Bible. bed.

Fri 13 Up at 6. Walked over to see Mr. Distant. Victoria was walking with the baby outside the gate. Mr. accompanied me as far as the gate, and then I went in, and he walked on to the General Hospital. Lizzie met me and told me not to go upstairs, but that her Gramma was coming down soon. Sandy was sitting out in the open air, munching some finger-biscuits. He was looking better. But had not yet got rid of his fever. The children played about in the garden.

At 7. I walked home again by myself. Eat a slice of toast and butter, and drank a glass of wine. 8. Took the bazaar account, and gave our boy the orders for the day. He brought all the silver things up, so I made him wrap them all up in their separate papers, and then I put them all away in the almirah. Gave him \$4 more, for bazaar. 9:15. Bathed. dressed. I wrote, read "Lords and Ladies". rested. I was not feeling very hungry, so I sat down, and hemmed 2 sides of a toilet cover.

And then to give J.M.K. a sur-  
prise, I called the boy up, had my gleist. brok-  
ing, and little odds and ends taken off the  
table, and then gave him my duster, and  
made him dust everything. When he had  
finished I put the toilet cover on, and arranged  
the other ornaments upon it. By this time  
J.M.K. came, so I went downstairs, and to  
my surprise, he said he had already had  
his breakfast, and as I had not had mine,  
he told me to go and eat it now.

I eat a very good breakfast  
of rice and curry. Just as I finished, the  
tailor came. He had brought my new mus-  
lin jacket, that I ordered him to make for  
me. But he had made a mistake, and  
put pink ribbon upon it, so we told him  
to take the pink ribbon out, and put a  
sucking of Mrs. Padday's silk upon it, and  
sew a piece of lace for a tucker, at the top.  
I also gave him my old muslin shirt to  
make a new band, and a little less bunchy  
at the waist.

Fri 13

Uncle Joseph came to speak to J.M.K. about Parry. He asked me, when I was going up the hill, and I told him I was <sup>not</sup> quite sure. 11. Mr. W. Maxwell came to have his tooth stopped. I sewed my black shirt the back seam. 1. J.M.K. went out. I went and opened the piano, and sang a few songs for my own amusement, and practised some for J.M.K. 2. J.M.K. came home. tiffin. Then he sang 3 songs, he intended taking to Glugan tomorrow.

After that I came in, eat an orange, and hemmed the 2 sides of the other toilet cover. It took me exactly 1 hour. rested. 5. Up dressed. J.M.K. went downstairs to cut the horse's hoofs. 5:45 Out for a drive near Julocong. came home by a different road. Stopped at Mr. Distant's to see Sandy. Then walked on to Mr. Pauley's. Met Miss Anderson. Then home at 7 to dinner. After dinner, I sang some duets, and J.M.K. some solo songs. 9. Very tired. Read the Bible, and went to bed.

Up at 8. Walked over to Mr. J. Faunter's to see  
Mr. Distant. Sandy a little better. Slept pretty  
well. He eat 2 or 3 finger biscuits, and took  
his egg and milk. Mr. D. was bathing went  
I went there. I had the baby on my lap for a  
few minutes, but as it awoke, I gave it back to  
Victoria. The church clock had stopped, so I was  
not quite sure what time it was, I did not like  
to be late, I left and walked home by myself  
and found it had only just struck 7.

Had a slice of toast and  
a glass of wine. Took the account, and  
gave our boy the orders for the day. Wine  
thested. Read "Lords and Ladies." At 9:10. I was  
surprised to hear my name being called.  
So I got up, and opened the door, and who  
should I see but Mr. Distant, She had come  
to tell me, to tell D. King, that Gramma  
had asked her to come and spend a  
few days with her at Uncle's, till their  
return, as Uncle, Aunty and Phoebe,  
had all gone to the Province with  
Captain Simon also.

Sept 14

She also asked me to send her word, if she could get Mr. Friederich's hill. Because she wanted to go up as soon as she could. Then she went away, I went to bathe and dress. Played a little on the piano. Mr. came home. We had our second breakfast together. After that Mr. asked me if I was going to Gloger to tip-fer. After a little thinking, I said that I thought I would not go, then he said. If you do not go this time, you can never expect to have an invite again. Then I said I would go. So he told the boy to get me a hack jalkanen, and also that he was to go with me.

At 11. I wrote a letter to Mary and Larry, telling them, when they were to expect me up the hill. At 11:30. I began to dress. I tried on 2 or 3 different kind of dresses. I had no clean garibaldi, so at last I settled to wear my green pearl silk shirt, with a half clean garibaldi, which did not look bad, when I put it on. Just as I was ready to go Mr. sent the boy to the watchmakers, about the church clock, so I had to wait a little.

I was to have started at 12, but not being quite ready, I did not get away till 12:30. I arrived at Gylgar at about 1:15. The Robertsons from the Province were invited to stay till Monday at Gylgar from today, Saturday, but they never came at all, and never <sup>were</sup> told. It is known to the reason why. 2. The 4 Paddays arrived. George Brown also came to tiffin. 2:30. We all went down to tiffin. Mr. W. C. Padday took me down.

After tiffin, we all had a game of billiards in turn. Then we went. Ladies went up to Miss Brown's room, and rested. 5. We had a cup of tea, and 2 thin slices of bread and butter each. 5:30. Out for a drive to James Town. The gentlemen went snipe shooting. Mr. Brown stayed at home. 6:30. Home. I dressed partly in Charlotte's, and partly in Lucy's room. Mr. Padday tied the string of my lace. 7. dinner. The gentlemen were late, we did not wait for them, but began. In the evening music till 11:30. home at 12:15. Very tired. I nearly left my work basket behind.

Sun 15. Percy. C. Padday's birthday. Up at 6. Called out to Harry, and asked him, if Mr. Distant and children slept at Uncle's last night, and he said "yes". So I walked with J. M. K. as far as the well, opposite the Roman Catholic Church, and near Mr. Logan's house. Then I walked home by myself. Met Mr. Lamb the Banker, just going out for his walk. & home. Took the bazaar account, and gave our boy the orders for the day. Preeted. Read some Sunday books. 9:15. bathed dressed. asked Harry for the old newspapers he promised me some time ago.

Last night as we were driving home from Gungar, J. M. K. told me Mr. & Mrs. Hill, went up to the Spout during the afternoon, and that they had invited us to go up this afternoon, and sleep up there. So I said I would like to go very much, and I would ask Harry to send me his pony, which I did this morning, and at 9. He told me I might have it. But that he would require <sup>me</sup> to bring him home from Uncle's at 8 o'clock.

15.

19. Mr. came home. He had no particular visits to make, so that is how he came home so early. 9. 30. I had my second breakfast with him. 11. No Church, Mr. Mackay having gone to the Province to preach. He remains there until tomorrow, when he is going to marry Miss Bacon (Mr. Wards niece) to her eldest son Mr. Ward. Put all my admirals' tray. Packed up my box to go up the hill. The cookie came for it at 12 o'clock.

At 1 as I was quietly sitting down to write, I received a letter from Mr. Radday, saying that her husband had told her, that Dr. King was coming to tiffin, and that they also expected me to accompany him. I did not know what to do, as I had packed up my crinoline to send on the hill, but fortunately I had some old ones, which I never wore, on account of their being so very large, so I chose the smallest one, and put it on, with my violet spotted grenadine shirt over it, but it looked very lumpy.

Sun 15.

My Garibaldi also I had to give a piece of lace, and some black velvet on. 2. Went to Paddy's. There was Robert Waller, Charlie Kodyk, Joseph Anthony, Mary Ann, ourselves, and the 4 Paddy's. 2:30. We sat down to tiffin. W. C. S. P. took me in. We drank Mr. Percy's health. I asked Mary to come and spend the day, and tiffin with me on Tuesday, and told her to tell Mr. Galastain also to come to. J. M. K. and I left.

Came home, put on my riding habit, got into the carriage, went to the foot of the hill, jumped on my jury and arrived at the "Spout" at 5. Mr. Hill, and Mr. Macfarlane were gardening. J. M. K. and Mr. M. went to bathe, after they had seen us feed the fish in the tank near the house. 6. dressed, sat out in the garden. 7. Just before dinner. Mr. Hill put a chaffie of smoke into the room, as it was filled with Misquitos, and he and Mr. M. took a towel each, and killed numbers on the wall. 9. Very tired. bed.

16 Up at 6. Packed at up my box, also Mr. K's. I had passed a very wretched night. It was frightful  
ly hot, and we were sleeping together in a very  
small bed, Mr. K. opened the curtains, and then  
we could not sleep at all, though it was cooler,  
but the mosquitoes, and sandflies, were dread-  
ful. I could not sleep either, so I begged of him  
to shut the curtains, which he did, after dusting  
them. Then he tried lying on the sofa outside,  
but the mosquitoes were much worse there,  
he had to come in again.

Then he dusted the bed  
in the next room, and got into it, and slept  
better, I too slept, but it was too hot, and I  
neither of us really got a good night's rest. 6:30  
came down the hill. Got into a hack Julian  
been, and came home. I did not have any-  
thing to it, as I didn't feel inclined for it.  
I walked down the hill, and was feeling  
very tired, so I rested, and read the  
times for last month. 9:15. Got up. M. A. wash-  
ed and dressed, and was ready, just as  
Mr. K. came home at 10.

Mon 16

He asked me, if I had eaten my breakfast, and I told him I had not, as I was not at all hungry, besides not feeling very well. So he told me to go and begin to eat, as he had had his breakfast, and he would come in and sit with me a little; so I went and eat a slice of toast and butter, and an hard boiled egg with a glass of wine to finish. Then I came upstairs and unpacked my box. I was feeling very tired, and 2 or 3 times I rested. William Maxwell came to have his tooth stopped.

My dobie came today, so I was busy taking the account of the clean and dirty clothes. I wanted to send my white muslin dress, trimmed with black lace to the wash, but I could not unpack it in time, so I told dobie, I would send it with Jack's things, and for him not to wait for it. 12. Mama M<sup>rs</sup> Distant, Lizzie and Doulie came here to look for an old ship that used to be in Joe's bedroom, but they could not find it. I asked Mamma if she could cut my black silk shirt for me today or tomorrow, but she said she would not have time

6 But at 1. her dobie brought me a note from her saying she would be very glad to cut my shirt out for me today, if I came between 1 to 3:30, she as had nothing particular to do. Mr. Punks was here when I received the letter, so I could not show it to J.M.K., but when Mr. P. went away I gave J.M.K. the letter to read, and asked his opinion. And he said he thought I had better go, as perhaps I should not have another opportunity. But I must have my tiffin paid.

So I ordered the Orderly to bring the tiffin, and I dressed. J.M.K. went out, he said he would send the carriage back for me in 10 minutes. I took my tiffin. When I had finished, I found the carriage had arrived, so I jumped into it, and went to Uncle. I had to wait for the dulgee, as he was not at home. 3:30. He came. Mamma showed him how much. 4. came home. rested. slept. Very tired. did not go out for a drive. 7. dinner. Then we went to the circus at 8. Saw some Japanese men and women, do some tricks. There were not very many Europeans. The circus was over at 11. and we walked home, as we lived so near to it.

Up at 6. I was very tired, but J.M.K. told me I had better get up, as I should have plenty of work to do. So I got up. Got my almukah's and room tidy. Got out some clean clothes, and packed them up in a box, as I was going up the hill this afternoon. Put my almukah tidy. 9:15 Washed dressed. Took the bazaar account, and gave our boy the order for the day. I was not feeling very hungry, so I waited till J.M.K. came home, and then I had my second breakfast. As I was expecting ladies to tiffin, I began to dress.

I wore the silk dress Gramma had on her wedding day, and a white muslin garibaldi. 11:30. Mr. Pidday arrived. I brought her hat in our room, then went outside again. Gramma came and said, someone had been meddling with her Chinese lock, which is on the door of her godown, that contains the wine and beer, as she had been trying to open it, and could not manage to do so. We afterwards found out that the lock had been in her possession a long time, and that it was quite or nearly worn out from old age.

12. Mrs Plunket came. She had walked over from the Shepherd's house just over the way. Her baby she had left there. 12:40. Mary came. I was teasing her, because she had promised to come early, and she came the latest of all. She said Mrs Will had kept her, or else she would have been here at 11:30. I asked her if Mrs Galastoun had come, and she said "Of course not you never asked her." And I said "I did", and I asked Mrs Paddy, who said she had heard me tell Mary, to bring Mrs Galastoun. So Mary said she was very sorry.

Then we all began to work. I was threading the ruby beads, and seeing how many would go through the needle twice. Mrs Paddy was filling in a cushion, with red wool. Mrs Plunket was working some dresses for her little girl, and Mary was hemming some pocket handkerchiefs. 1. Mr. K. went out. He never came out to see the ladies, as he thought it was better not to do so. He had ordered the tiffin before he went out.

Tuesday

At 2. we went downstairs to tiffin. They are all very poor eaters. Mr. Paddy took a little below, Mary & I also took the same. Mr. Plunket eat one cutlet. After tiffin we all went upstairs again. We did not do any more work, but talked. 4. Uncle Joseph came to take me up the hill, directly they saw that, they all went away.

Then I came in. Put on my riding dress, said good bye to Mr. Paddy. Packed up a small bundle, and went on Uncle J's carriage. We stopped at Mr. Presgrave's house, as Mr. Distant had asked Uncle to see them up on their chairs, as they also were going up the hill (Mr. Friedrichs) So when we got to the foot of the hill, I jumped on my pony, we saw Mr. Distant and wife, safe on their chairs then left them. Arrived at the Highlands at 5 o'clock. Larry was looking better. I heard the first room on right hand side. 7. dinner. Then we had a game at commerce. After that I wrote a letter of 4 pages to Mr. Uncle is to take it down. 10. bed. Georgie slept with me.

Up at 6. Left my room just in time to give my letter for J.B.H. to Uncle to take down the hill. Then I had my first meal of a slice and a half of toast and butter, an egg, and a glass of tinto. There was also tea without milk. After we had all finished, I put Carry's chair and pillow under the large tree, near the house, in the shade, and Harry, Georgie, and I, went to the stone. We sat there for about 25 minutes. Then we came back, and I sat with Carry for a little while.

After that, as she said she was not feeling tired, I told her I would go and fetch my work which was upstairs, locked up in my box, and bring it down, and work beside her. When I had finished mending one pair of stockings, Carry said she felt tired, so we went upstairs, and she laid down on the sofa in the drawing room. At 9 we had our second meal of coffee, buns, a toast, then Carry went to sleep. 9:30. We had prayers. We all read them allowed.

Wed. 18

10. Bazaar man arrived. I received a short letter of 1 page and  $\frac{3}{4}$  from J. W. K. Telling me to send the money down for him at 2:30. so that it might be at the foot of the hill by 4. After I had read the letter, I dressed. Then I worked again at my stockings. I sat out in the garden, and made Carry do the same. Georgie read allowed out of "Cassels papers" some short stories, till 12 when we had our third meal of breakfast.

Then we sat out in the garden again. Carry saw a snake about 1 yard and a half long, but before it could be caught, it ran away. It began to drizzle every now and then, so I made Carry all and go in. We sat under the house. Miss Palmer joined us after she had finished her work. I mended 4 pairs of stockings, and began one of Miss Palmer's. Georgie could not now read any more, as she had to mend Mr. de Luz's stockings. Mary and she went into the garden, and picked green guavas, and began eating them. They also brought me one. It was very nice.

3:35. We had our fourth meal-tiffin. I only took a piece of bread and cheese, and some mangosteens, and a glass of beer, as I did not feel at all hungry. At 4. we all began to dress for the evening. Then Mary, Georgie and I went to the rock. We took some Passals papers to read, but we did not pay much attention to them, as we looked up every now and then to see if Uncle and J.S.K. were coming. We sent Rich. down after a little while to meet them, and tell us if he could see them.

At 5. Uncle came alone. He said J.S.K. had gone to the Chaleh to see Mr. Disant. So we three waited at the rock. 5:30. We saw J.S.K. turned round the corner. We waved our handkerchiefs and told him to come up quickly. He brought up 8 oranges for Larry, whom he thought looking better. We each had a glass of wine. 7. dinner. Larry went down. In a wonder after dinner we played at commerce. Uncle would not join us. 10. We were all very tired so ~~would~~<sup>went</sup> to bed. I did not pack up, but left everything for the morning.

September 1867. Penang.

Thurs Morn at 6. Came out of my room. It was rather dark, and Georgie knocked at our door, to ask if we would like a light, and J.M.K. said No. Then I got of bed, and packed my things in the box, as well as J.M.K.'s, also tied the pillows and bolster in a mat, after having rolled them together. Had a slice of toast and butter, which I eat in Carry's room near her bed. I spill some of the wine on her sheet. When I had finished eating J.M.K. came in to see Carry. Then we said good bye to her.

She cried, as she did not like the thoughts of my going down so soon. She would have liked me to stay longer. We said good bye to everyone. And I got on my pony. Uncle Joseph and J.M.K. both walked down the hill. Mary and Georgie accompanied us to the first turning after you pass the stone, and waved their handkerchiefs to us till we were out of sight. Then J.M.K. asked Uncle what time it was, and he said 6:20.

According to that we must have got up at 5:30. We arrived safely at the foot of the hill. Uncle Joseph very kindly offered to take me to town, so I got in his carriage with him, and Mr. got into his and we started. Mr. waved his handkerchief to me as he passed. On our way to town, we went to "Clove Hall," as I wanted to ask Mr. Galastoun and Mary to come and spend this evening with me.

They both accepted the invitation. Then we went to Uncle's. Saw everyone. Aunty said they were going to the circus this evening, and I told her there would be no performance. She said Phoebe was going up the hill tomorrow evening. S. home. The coolie had forgotten to go up in our box this morning, so I sent the boy to tell him to go immediately. G. bathed. dressed. 9:30. A cold breakfast. Then I wrote the boy an account in yesterday, as well as today, & gave him the orders.

Thu. 17

J.M.K. told me that perhaps Mr. Hill might call, so I dressed myself. I only had a large crinoline, which I put on. Then I waited. At 12 Mr. Le fond & Capt. Lemon called his farewell call. Mr. Lemon he said was very sorry, but she could not come. He was telling me a sad story of a poor boy who was drowned. When he heaved up the anchor of the ship "Krishna" he found this dead body. Mr. Cochrane also called, about her daughter Agnes' finger. She had sprained it, in falling down.

The new banker also called. 2. Tiffin. Wrote. Then I rested. slept a little. J.M.K. went on an inquest. To Ayer Utam. I made the macaroni and cheese. 5:30 Up. dressed. 6. J.M.K. came home. I went alone to the jettie for a puff of air. 7. home to dinner. 8. Paddy's dined with us. In the evening Mr. Galonsauri & Mary came. music game at "Commerce". Mr. H. Paddy won. 11. all went away. We went to bed.

Up at 6. Too tired. Did not go out for a walk with J.B.K. Had nowhere to go to. Read "Land at Last." Took the bazaar account, and gave our servant the orders for the day. I saw Mrs. Hogan at the jetty the other evening, and promised to go to her house tomorrow, to spend a few hours, and talk about my new bonnet. Work. Rested. head. 9:15. Bathed dressed. Then as I was not feeling very hungry I waited till 10. when J.B.K. returned, and I had my second breakfast with him.

Then I came upstairs, and wrote the copy of my letter home to Mrs. King. No one called. The basket maker brought some baskets for sale. We had ordered him to make four small baskets for us, and we had paid him the money before hand. So when he came yesterday, we asked him why he had not brought them, as he promised he would do in 4 days. He made some excuses, the men were sick, and he could not get the rattans, but in five days he would bring them.

September 1867 Penang.

Fri 20

Worked my stockings. J.B.K. went out, said he would be back in half an hour. But when it was 3 and he <sup>had</sup> not returned. I ordered the tiffin, and began to eat. Just as I was in the middle of it, J.B.K. came home, and said, Mr. Hill had come to speak to him, so I came in my room, and dressed in a muslin shirt, and cotton gambaldi, as I only had a loose jacket, and jettivast on. Then J.B.K. also came in to change, so I waited for him and we went out together, as I did not like going alone.

I finished my tiffin, and was just going to leave the table, when the Palmer's water man, brought me a long note from Curry, and one from George to J.B.K., a bouquet of flowers, and some tiffin. Later in the day, I received a letter from Mary. I shut the doors leading to my bedroom, but forgot to take my book in to read, so I worked a little, and then rested. I read the Times that Harry lent me, and fell to sleep over them.

0 I did not know when Mrs. Hill left. But at 5 P.M. woke me up and said he had received a note from Mrs. Robertson to ask him to go over to the Province and see her husband who was sick, and that if I wanted to go with him, I must be quick and dress. So I got out of bed. Dressed in my gipsy and salt dress, and my old red cloak over it. Put down the curtains, drank some wine, locked our door, went down stairs, got into the carriage, and arrived at the jetty at 5:30.

The boat was waiting for us. So we went across in it. Mrs. Robertson kept me talking to her, showed me the house. J.W.K. saw first Mrs. R. then he said he would go and have a look at the Hatches who invited us to dinner. We said we were not in dinner costume, but he would make us stay, so we had our dinner of Lapon, &c. After dinner we did nothing but talk till 9. when we came home. J.W.K. corrected my letter, and we went to bed.

Sept 11 Up at 6. Did not go out for a walk, as I had no place to go to. Busy writing my journal for Wed. Tuesday & Thursday, as I had no time to do it before. Read "Land at Last." Took the boys' account, and gave our servant the orders for the day. Rested. I was feeling very tired, but I wrote my letter to Mr. King, I had no time to finish it, as J.B.K. came home early. 9:15. bathed. dressed. 10. Second breakfast. Received a letter from Mary, saying Perry was a little better.

12. Went to the munnery in our carriage, to try and get a frame for a bonnet like Alice's, but there were none to be had. Met Mr. Kapel. Came to tell Mr. that I had bought some net, as there was no bonnet shape to be had. Saw Mr. Charlie Waller who had been to pay his P.P.C. call, just coming out of our gate. The Apothecary of the Province was speaking to Mr. and writing. I had to go into my bedroom, and get some old muslin, to put for a cap inside my bonnet.

12:30. According to promise I went to Mrs. Hogan, and took all the lace, flowers, &c. that I had by me. She was just dressing. I had not been there five minutes when Charlie Waller came to call, so Mrs. Hogan asked me to go outside, (as I was then in her bedroom) and talk to him, while she finished dressing. So I went. He stayed a very short time. Then Mrs. Hogan took me into her bedroom again. As it was Saturday all the children were at home.

Bella and Fustance, were making shirts for themselves, Janet was making a dolls shirt, which she had gored herself. Mrs. H gave me the piece of wire for the frame of my bonnet. It came from one of Bella's old hats. She covered it with the net I bought, and then took the lace that was on Mrs. P's hat's bonnet, and covered the net. Then she took some white beads that Madame Es-chas serian had given me, before she went away, and strung them b. together, and put them round the bonnet.

hd 21

I had brought no ribbon for the strings, so Mr. H. could not finish the bonnet. At 3. Mr. Pasley came to see Mr. H. so I said I would go away, and come again on Monday. He told one of the children to go and meet Mr. Pasley, but she walked right into the bedroom, and Mr. P. said to me. Don't go away. but I said I must, so I ordered the oycce to get ready the carriage, and I came away. Mr. H. was just going to take his tiffin, and as I had not had mine, I sat down, and eat with him.

After tiffin he said he had brought me an amusing book from the library. I wrote to Mary, and also to Uncle Joseph to wish him many happy returns of tomorrow. The boy brought me some handkerchiefs. & rested till 5. Then dressed, went to the jetty alone. Met the usual number of persons. 7. Home to dinner. 8. Drove to the Circus. Nearly the same performance. 11:30 Walked home. George & David Brown came to Harry's room & smoked. 12. Bible. bed.

22. Uncle Joseph's birthday. Up at 6. Did not go out for a walk. Put my clothes of the night before away. Finished writing my letter home to Mr King. 9 pages. Mail from England came in. The Murnah arrived last night. Rested. Read. 9:30. bathed dressed. Took the bazaar account, and gave our boy the orders for the day. 10. J.M. came home. I had my breakfast together with him. Then came upstairs just in time to add a few lines at the end of my home letter, and then dress for church.

11. J.M. first dropped me at the church door, then he went to Mrs. Englishman, who had written to ask him to go and see her child who was sick. We came to church, while Mr. Mackay was reading the Psalms. After church, I asked Constance Hogan to get me 2 Sunday books to read, as I was entitled to 4 books if I wanted them. 1. home. J.M. went to see Millie. 1:30 Constance brought me my books. I went down stairs to see her, but found she had gone

Sun 22

2. Tiffin. Then I rested. 4. We got into the buggy. J.B.K. stopped outside Charlie Wallers door, and went in to see him. Then they both came walking out. Then J.B.K. took me to the Anthony's, left me there, while he went on to the betths. He promised to call for me on his way home. I played at paper with Ayah Kitty and Mr. Galastain. Mary was going to call at Flora's, and I said I would not go out, but she would not hear of it, so I got into their carriage, and drove to the jetty.

On our way there we stopped half way, Mary got out of her carriage, and went to speak to Flora. We also called at the shoemakers for her boots. Everyone was at the jetty as usual. 7. on to the Anthony's. J.B.K. was waiting for me. so we came home to dinner. 8. J.B.K. went on board the Rumsah steamer, to see Mr. & Mrs. Hill. Charlie & Robert Waller off. to Singapore. I went to Flora's till they returned to. Drove home. Read the Bible & went to bed.

8 Up at 8. Did not go out for a walk. J.M.K. walked to the general Hospital. Georgie came down the hill, with Phoebe & Uncle Joseph. Wrote my journal for Thursday & Friday, as I had not time to do it before. Took the bazaar account, and gave our boy the order's for the day. Rested, read "Land at Last". 9:15. Georgie came. She said that she had come early, because she did not know when she might get the carriage, and if she came late, Dr. King might not be able to stop her tooth. I left off reading, and went and bathed & dressed.

10. J.M.K. came home, so Georgie and I went downstairs, and as she had not had her breakfast, we made her eat something with us. Uncle came to see J.M.K. he had received a letter from Mr. Drummond, who had sent a message to him. I wished Uncle Joseph many happy returns of yesterday. After breakfast, Dr. King put some cotton in Georgie's tooth to deaden her nerve. I read a little of "Land at Last" it was getting very interesting.

September 1867 Penang

Mon 23

J.M.K. had brought some very thick sewing silk home, so I cut them up into needlefuls, and wrapped each in a separate piece of paper, ready for use. Then I ordered the carriage, and dressed myself in my cotton dress, and took Georgie with me to the munnery. I wanted to get some ribbon like Alice's bonnet, but could not succeed, so I got some a little narrower 1yd & a half, which J.M.K. thought was better, when I brought it home, after dropping Georgie at Mrs Palmer's, and showed it to him.

Then I went on to Mrs Bogart. When she showed me the bonnet, I found she had unpicked it all down to the net and wire, and cut off a large piece of the latter, and made the bonnet into a different shape. She had finished it all but the ribbon. I was quite surprised. It looked more like a brides bonnet. She put it on my head to see if it suited me. Then I put all my things, cotton, &c in the box, and said good bye, & thanked her very much.

3 I went on to Mrs. Anthony's to speak about my black silk, that she had got from Singapore for me. Mary went up the hill this morning to stay with the Mac-kay's till Friday morning. So only Mrs. Galastan & Mrs. An. were at home. I explained to her about the black silk, and told her I would tell Dr. King to come and speak to her tomorrow morning. After drinking a glass of water I left. On my way home I went to Mr. Palmer's, and brought Georgie here to tiffin, which we took at 2:30.

3. Uncle Joseph came, to take Georgie home, but I said we would send her. I gave him some balechong to take to Cary. 4. Took Georgie home. Mr. was immensely pleased with my new bonnet. Rested till 5. Up. Very dusty. Mr. said he could not take me out for a drive, so at 6. I ordered the carriage, and went to the jetty alone. Mr. was pleased, Mr. liked the bonnet. 7. Home to dinner. music. 9. Read the Bible. Went to bed.

Tues 24 Up at 6. Did not go out for a walk. J.M.K. walk-  
 ed out as usual. Wrote to Georgie, to see if  
 she was coming to spend the day with me.  
 Answer Yes. Had nothing to eat, read instead  
 till 7:30. Wrote. Took the bazaar account and  
 gave our servant the orders for the day. Yester-  
 day morning I had the rooms two washed,  
 with water by the 2 Orderlys. Rested. Read "Land  
 at Last?" 9:30. Bathed. dressed. Read again.  
 10. J.M.K. came home, had my breakfast  
 with him. Just as we had finished, Georgie  
 came in Mrs Palmer's carriage.

J.M.K. was explaining to Lure  
 the game of whist. We came upstairs. A steam-  
 er was signalized. We thought it was the Mail-  
 ly. I sat outside in the verandah. I gave her  
 some of my clean clothes to mend. while I work-  
 ed J.M.K.'s trousers. I mended four pairs. 12.  
 J.M.K. ordered the carriage, and I came in and  
 got ready, and took Ge. with me to town to  
 get some trimming for my bodice. Met  
 Mr Brown who told me it was the Calcutta  
 steamer & Michael Anthony had come back.

24 We came home I brought three kinds of trimming 15. 20. & 40. I chose the latter took two yards, gave it to the boy, who first took what I did not require to Cleveiro's, & then took the 2 yds to Bengal Dulgee. J.B.K. stopped J's teeth for her. She told us she went to the Circus last night, there were only a few new things. 2. Tiffin. 3.30 Georgie went home to dress to go up the hill. rested. 3. Up. but for a drive to the jetty. Saw Harry and George Brown coming across the cricket field. I waved to W. but he did not see me. Mr. Hogan came down to the jetty. There were the usual number of persons, except that W. J. S. Paddy came to my carriage to speak to me, and just as Mr. Hogan was going away, he went and spoke to her. I came home at 7. to dinner. Wrote a letter to carry in answer to the one, I received from her this morning. Very little music. Then I read Army Herbert, until I was so tired, I read the Bible I went to bed 9.

Wed 25. Up at 6. Did not go out for a walk.  
 Took the bazaar account, and gave out  
 by the orders for the day. Rested. Read  
 Land at Last finished the three volumes  
 Wrote. 9:15. Bathed. dressed. Not feel-  
 ing hungry I waited till 10. In my  
 breakfast, when J.B.K. came home. 11.  
 Dobie brought my clothes, took the  
 account of them. 12. Duljee came,  
 with my new bodice. It was quite  
 dirty, he had been obliged to soap it,  
 before he worked, it was so hard.

2. Tiffin. worked my  
 crinoline, and a sock for J.B.K. 4.  
 rested. 5. J.B.K. & I went to Dobie's  
 with my bodice, as J.B.K. said, it was  
 too dirty to wear without being washed.  
 6:30. came home, found a letter for  
 me from Mary & one from Georgie. 7.  
 dinner. Mr. & Mrs. Plunket & Mr. & Mrs. Ellis,  
 dined with us. In the evening whist.  
 till 11:30. when they went away. Read  
 the Bible. bed 12.

6. Up at 6. Did not go out for a walk. It was raining, so I got into bed again, slept, and read "Amy Herbert." J.B.N. packed up the box to send to Miss Brown, I wrote a letter. I gave her 6 salt cellars of the newest fashion. It rained so all day, that it was not till 5 in the evening, that the coolie was able to take it to flygar. 9. bathed. dressed. 9:15. breakfast. I saw the present Harry was going to send Miss Brown. It was a work box of Bombay work.

Took the bazaar account and gave out by the orders for the day. Busy finishing working my cross line. 2. tiffin. work again, some holes in J.B.N.'s sock. 4. rested till 5. When I got up. We went out for a drive to the dobie, who though it had been raining all day, had finished my bodice. 7. home to dinner. We had a little music. I worked again - 9:30. Read the Bible. bed

Fri 27 Up at 6. Did not go out for a walk. ~~Mr~~  
 walked as usual to the General Hospital  
 but my glass admirably tidy. Brought up  
 my journal, and read "Amy Herbert" for  
 an hour. Then called the boy up, and  
 made him put the curtains & mosquito  
 up. Put all my ornaments, and clothes  
 out that I should require today. 9:15.  
 bathed. dressed. 10. J.B.K. came home.,  
 I was not feeling very well, so I asked  
 to come up stairs and give me some  
 Laudanum. and pepperment.

I took 20 drops of the former  
 The latter J.B.K. poured a little in a  
 spoon. After I had drunk it, we went  
 down to breakfast. I eat 2 pieces of my  
 fir & drank a glass of wine. Then I came  
 upstairs, and asked Harry for some  
 scent for my handkerchief, he gave  
 me a bottle out of a case, which has  
 the best scent on account of the bottles  
 having such good stoppers. Then I began  
 to dress for Church.

I wore my light lavender silk dress, a new bounet of lace, with beads all round, and little sprigs of jessamine dotted here and there, also a new garibaldi of muslin with 4 strips of lace in front and six small pleats ~~at~~ <sup>between</sup> each, and a matching of the light lavender silk, just round the neck, down the middle of the garibaldi and round the cuffs. Round the neck I wore Mrs. M's small gold chain, and pearl cross set in gold, Uncle Lawrence's brooch and earrings.

Mr. Brown's bracelet of carved gournis, and Harry pearl one set in gold. At 10:50. We went to church. At 11. Mr. Macray went and sat near the communion table, waiting for the Bride who was late. At 11:10. The Bridesmaids arrived, and a little while after them came the Bride. She walked up the church leaning on her father's arm, looking very happy, and pretty. We heard every word of Mr. & Mrs. Lamb's responses.

Fri 27

The Bride wore a plain white satin dress, with a bow of the same stuff at the back, and a flustering of satin ribbon all round the bottom of the dress. A plain <sup>with</sup> veil, and a wreath of rose buds and jessamin placed on her head, and a long end of the wreath hanging down below her shoulders.

The Brides were Charlotte Brown, Lill, Sad, and Edith Scott, daughters of Mr. Walter Scott. Charlotte wore a white tartan dress, with 2 puffs of the same material, and a piece of <sup>blue</sup> ribbon sewn on plain on the dress just above the puffs with a plain piece of the dress sewn on it. Her wreath was blue flowers, and little fall. The other three Bridesmaids wore the same kind of dress, but with only 1 puff. They had a double skirt on. Their wreaths were blue ribbon, with one white rose in each, and a little fall. Bundry their eldest brother, carried the bouquet, fan, and Handkerchief for Mr. Lewis.

Mr. Stuart was the groom  
man. Only the Ladies had favours put  
on them in Church. The gentlemen were  
had theirs at Gylgar. We were rather late,  
as the carriages were allowed to come in  
any how, and ours being the last. Mr. K.  
had to go and look after it, though it  
was drizzling, but we left the Church at  
12:30. We went to Gylgar in our carriage,  
and with the red pony. We took the  
boy out with us.

A great many of the Ladies  
and gentlemen, had gone out in Hack-  
galsies, and the consequence was, a great  
many stuck in the road, (broke down)  
as the rain had come down in such  
torrents that it made the roads quite  
heavy for the poor ponies. Though we  
left so late, and there were a great many  
hacks before us, yet we passed them all,  
and arrived at Gylgar first. Mrs. Plunket  
came a little while after, and said she  
had broken down, & got in with Mr. Tompson

Fri 27

Harry got in one of the first and he saw Miss Brown reading our letters, that we had sent with our presents. I gave her 6 salt cellars, in the shape of tubs with a handle on each, and 6 salt spoons, each being like a spade. Mr. gave her 5 flower glass stands of 3 different shapes. At 1. we had the wedding cake handed round, Mr. Brown having led the Bride, to the table, to have the first cut. Jill & Dad, made themselves very useful, and were just as good as any grown up Bridesmaid.

At 2:30. We went downstairs to breakfast. The tables were placed in this way 1<sup>st</sup>. The Bride & Bridegroom sat with their backs to the front garden. and I was handed down by Mr. Robert Shaw, but fortunately got a seat near Mr. Walter Scott xx, who sat in the middle of the left hand long table as you come down stairs. He joked and made us all laugh, and we had plenty of fun.

Mr. Stuart and Charlott sat opposite to us. Mr. Mackay, Mr. Lamb, Mr. Frank Shaw, & Mr. Stuart made the speeches, the former for the bride, and the latter for the bridesmaids. After the breakfast the ladies all went upstairs, and a few of the gentlemen Mrs. Bidday went to the piano, and played 3 pieces, Mary Anthony 2, Charlotte 1. and Phoebe sang a song "Home". Then Mr. Vermont came up, and asked the gentlemen present to help him remove the tables, as Mr. Brown said they might dance.

<sup>trimmed black braid dress</sup>  
Bride. White pique. Before the dancing began the Bride & Bridegroom <sup>left</sup>. He poor man, had the slippers knocked on his head, back, shoulders, and everywhere. They had no mercy on him. Mr. Vermont got on the back of the carriage, and went as far as Gugar gate, and then got down to allow the footman to get up. Some of the gentlemen went to meet him, and they brought him back, on their shoulders.

Fri 27

Then we all went upstairs, and began to dance. We had 2 Quadrilles, 1 waltz, and 1 galop. I played the first, reading the music by sight, and danced the rest. J.M. wanted to go home, before they began the waltz, but I begged of him so hard to let me stay, as I was going to dance with Mr. Joseph Anthony, that he allowed me to do so. We left Sugar at 11:30. & arrived home in  $\frac{3}{4}$  of an hour. We brought home 1 of the bouquets.

Harry came home about  $\frac{1}{2}$  an hour after us, I said that all the Ladies left after us, and there were only a few bachelor gentlemen remaining behind. Sandie sent me some beans, which we told the boy to boil for dinner, but they were not cooked enough so told him to keep them for tomorrow's tipping dinner. Then we had music. J.M. sang some new songs & I joined him in the chorus. Wrote to Carry. 10. Read the Bible & went to bed.

8 Up at 6. Did not go for a walk. J.W.K. went out as usual, walking to the General Hospital. Read until 7:15. Then began to write the account of yesterday's doings! Took the bazaar account from the boy, and gave him the orders for the day. Read again, rested. 9:15 bathed. dressed. As I was not feeling very hungry, I went to the Juans, and tried some new songs, out of a book, Michael Anthony, brought from Calcutta for J.W.K. The first few songs, are better than the last.

10:15. I did not wait any longer, but went and began my breakfast. In the middle of it, J.W.K. came home, so we finished it together. Came upstairs 11. was putting my dress I wore yesterday, away, when the Bengal Tailor came. He brought my habit. We made him measure some cloth for my crinoline, and also gave him my black silk skirt to alter. We had put some white lining at the bottom, to prevent it from getting dirtier, than if it had no lining

BA28

But J.B.K. did not think it looked well, so we bought some black lining to put in the place of it. I also gave him my low neck black silk body to make. 12. Put away my jewelry, and put my Admirah tidy. J.B.K. wanted to give the sailor my black cloth cloak to alter, but I could not find it anywhere, and he afterwards remembered that I had given it to the boy to brush, and had never had it brought up again.

12:45. went to see Mrs. Paddy, and ask her to come and take a quiet tiffin with me on Monday. She said she would come at 11:30. We also talked about the dresses worn yesterday. She said everyone remarked both Gen. Stemen & Ladies, the difference between the Scott family. How nice one looked by the side of the other. The Walter Scott children looked like little fairies. 1:15. came home to pick up J.B.K. who was going to see Mrs. Anson.

He left me at Mrs. Hogan's, as the latter had asked me to come and tell her all the news, which I did. I remained  $\frac{1}{2}$  an hour, and then Mr. came to fetch me. He came upstairs to speak to Mrs. Hogan about the dinner she had made for me. 2: home. Harry asked me to let him have tiffin with us, which he did. He told us he sprained his foot yesterday in coming down Auntie's staircase. I had plenty of things to put away, so had no time to rest.

4. Went over to the Province Mr. wanted to see Capt. Hatchel, on business. Fortunately we met Mr. Vermore over there, who kindly offered to take us over in his boat, for which we thanked him, and accepted his offer. (We sailed over, though it was a little rough, and the boat kept going all on one side). So when Mr. had finished his work, we said good bye, & got into Mr. V.'s boat. Capt. Hatchel gave us 2 couple  $\frac{1}{2}$  p snipe

Sat 20

The sea was very rough, and every now and then, such large waves came, we thought we should have had them break into the boat, but we reached the jetty all safely. Met Mr. Buttery, who said he had been to our house with Mr. B. to show J.B.K. her arm, she had been suffering so much from rheumatism. Mr. B. asked us to go he would give us a lift so we got into his carriage & came home.

We gave him 3 snipes. Received and answered a letter from Lena today. J. came down to dinner just as we had begun eating a carriage came to the door, J.B.K. went to see who it was, & found that P.C. P. had brought 2 snipes for me, that he had shot himself this afternoon. After dinner music. Then I finished writing my letter to Mary. J.B.K. also wrote to her. 10. Read the Bible. bed.

9. Up at 6. Did not go out for a walk. It was raining so hard, that J.W. too was not able to go and see his patients. So I jumped into bed again and slept till I was tired, and then I got a book and began reading it. Mail steamer 7. was signalized. Read. Worked J.W.'s dirty socks. They were new, and had gone into holes, and he thought if they were sent to the wash before they were mended, the holes would be worse. 8:45. bathed. dressed. We were both feeling very hungry, so we had our breakfast at 9.

We had all the 4 snipe that were given to us, cooked, and they turned out to be just in a nice state for eating. Then I came upstairs, took the boy's account from our boy, and gave him the orders for the day. 10. Our orderly brought our home letters from the Post Office. I received a note from Florence from my niece, written by herself, no correction. It was still raining, but we went to church at 11. There were about a dozen people all together. I asked instance to change my book for me.

Sun 29

After church I dropped J. B. K. at Mr. Clark's, and then went on to Uncle's. Auntie was out, so I waited till she came home, and then I asked them all to come to dinner tomorrow. They were not quite sure, if they would be able to do so, as they were going to the circus, if it cleared up by tomorrow evening, but Auntie said she would write and let me know. Then I came home. Wrote my journal. Read till 2. when J. B. K. came home. 2:15. tiffin. Rested up at 4. dressed.

Put down the mosquitoë curtain got into the buggy, and went to the Anthony's. Michael An: had fever. Mr. Radday also came. Mary called her upstairs. 5:30. J. B. K. and W. C. Radday went to the baths together. I went to Mr. Anthony's room for the first time, & she showed me all her jewels. 6. Out for a drive with Mary to the jetty, back at 7:15. Went in to see Michael who was better. 7:30. home to dinner. Harry asked J. B. K. to see him, as he was sick with fever. After dinner, I put a mat down to lie on to read, but I went to sleep. woke up at 9. & got into bed.

30 Up at 6. Did not go out for a walk. Though it was wet under foot, J.B.K. walked out as usual to the General Hospital. Read till 7. Then had the 2 Underly's, upstairs, to clean the floors of the 2 rooms without mats. Our syce changed, and brought up the water for them. Mended J.B.K.'s shirt, and trousers. Wrote my journal. Took the bazaar account from our boy, and gave him the orders for the day. 10 Had our Underly to sweep the rooms.

9:30. bathed. dressed.

10. Feeling rather hungry, went down and began eating my breakfast. 10:30.

J.B.K. came home. He brought me some water cresses, grown in the General Hospital garden. He had not had his breakfast, so we finished together. 11 The Bengal Tailor came. He brought my black silk shirt, in which he had changed the lining, and also a white cloth body, low neck, to see if it fitted me, for a pattern, when he made the black <sup>body</sup>

Mon 30

I also gave him my new cotton dress to alter. The front part of the body, was too tight. 12. Mrs. Paddy came to spend the day, and stay to dinner. She brought some baby clothes to work. She told me that in the last month, she had made with the help of her ayah, 1 dozen small baby shifts, ready waiting for the trimming. I came in the room. In a little as Mrs. P. said, when you have been with her for a little while, then you can finish speaking to me.

So I came in, and he told me, we had better some duets together, as it would be a capital chance for me to have Mrs. Paddy to play with. Then I went out, took my work. I mended 4 pairs of stockings. 1. We played on the piano. I took the first part of the first duet in the book, and Mrs. Paddy, took the first of another duet, which we tried. We were both reading music at sight, as we neither of us had tried these duets before.

30

At 2. we had tiffin upstairs, as we do every day, using no ceremony to Mr. Paddy. I got some Calcutta biscuits toasted, for her, & she enjoyed them very much, she had never tasted them before. B. J. M. returned. We waited till he had finished his tiffin, then we went to the piano, and sang 3 trios, Mr. Paddy played 2 and I accompanied. I was growing with rain at the time, we could scarcely hear ourselves sing. Her carriage came for her at 3:30. she waited 10 minutes, and then went home.

I received a letter from Carry. J. M. from Mary. Georgie returned the unmentionable, I lent her the other day. I wrote to Mr. Distant this morning. 4. rested till 5. Then up dressed. Just my things tidy. J. M. and I sat on the portico waiting for Mamma, Sib, Uncle & Aunt who came at 7. took dinner with us. After dinner whist, I was Uncle's partner. We lost 17 points. Uncle though said I played well. 11. went away. Bible. bed. Ke. Mary just from Mr. D.

Tues 1 Up at 6. Did not go out for a drive walk. J.H.K.  
 walked out as usual to the General Hospital.  
 read till 7. Then wrote my journal. 7:30.  
 Took the bazaar account from our servant,  
 and gave him the orders for the day. Then  
 I told him to call the waterman, to clean  
 the jortico. But he did not come to do it  
 till past 8. He brought some cocoanut husks,  
 & earth, and he, the orderly, and our boy helping  
 them occasionally, washed the jortico. Wer-  
 der brought the water.

When the tubs of water were  
 finished upstairs. The boy tied a string on  
 the handle, and then threw them over  
 the jortico, Verder who is standing, waiting  
 down below, refills it, and the boy pulls it  
 up. They took half an hour to clean it.  
 till 9:30. when I bathed and dressed. 10:15.  
 I was feeling rather hungry, so I began eating  
 my breakfast. 10:45. J.H.K. came home, he said  
 he had had his breakfast at Mr. B. Roddy's  
 to I went and finished mine as quick as  
 possible. He brought no water cresses.

After breakfast, I worked my stockings, J.M.K.'s shirt and coat till 12. when I got ready to go out visiting. J.M.K. at first said he would call on Mr. Anson with me, then I said, if he would do so, I would put on my new black silk cloak. Then afterwards he altered his mind, and said that he could not call with me today, as he had to go and pay a medical visit. So I put on my new brown and white cloak, and went and called on Mr. Burn. She was at home fortunately.

Mr. Burn, husband, and family are all going away by the Burmah Steamer this evening at 5. to Rangoon. All her children we saw, down to the little baby, who is very good natured. From there I went to see Mr. Plunket, after having dropped J.M.K. at Mr. Anson's gate. J.M.K. told me to keep the palkee at Mr. Plunket's till he came. As he was going to walk over. Flora Earl was spending the day at Mr. P.'s. Mr. Bonington, and Mary Lewis, both sent Mr. P. some Doocose from Malacca.

Has 1

J.M.R. came in about  $\frac{1}{2}$  an hour. A squall came on, so he was obliged to wait a little. He had some Doocoose given to him by Mr. P. who when he was going away, told him to leave me, and also invited us to go to luck this evening. Mr. & Mrs. were also going to dine with them. So at 2. he went away leaving me behind, after my telling him to send the paluki for me at 4. I was busy in sorting some wools for Mr. P. There were a great many colours all jumbled together, so I put them in different papers.

2:30. Diffin. There was only a small fowl for outlets, and rice pudding baked, with filums. 4. home. Felt hungry from not eating a proper diffin. rested. 6:20. dressed. 7. Dinner at Mr. Plunkets. After dinner, we three ladies, began a game at whist, Mr. Earl came up just as we had begun, so we made him join us. He was my partner, and we lost by 6 points. Mr. P. & J.M.R. went to sleep. 11. home very tired. Put up the bell on the jumbah, rope went to bed

2 Lizzie Distant's birthday, aged 4 years. Up at 8. Just as I was going to get out of bed, Mr. Buttery called out from down below to J.M.K. to ask him to call and see his wife, who was suffering very much from rheumatism in the arm and shoulder. J.M.K. forgot to take his handkerchief down stairs with him, so I had to throw it out of window. Read till 7 when I wrote my journal. Took the layman's account from our boy, and gave him the orders for the day. Made a fresh paper of B. accounts.

9:45. Bathed. dressed. 10.

Played on the piano, and sang some songs, out of a new book, till J.M.K. came home 10:30. when I had my breakfast with him. Mrs. Chapman and Mrs. MacDonald called. The latter came to see J.M.K. as she wanted him to attend her in her confinement about the beginning of next month. I was very busy working the 3 handkerchiefs, I gave Uncle Joseph on his birthday.

1. I told J.M.R. to order the palhi, as I wanted to go out. But before I was ready to go, Mr. Magalhears called to see J.M.R. He stayed sometime. I was unable to leave the house till 1:30. Then I went to Uncle's godown. I took the 3 handkerchiefs to give Uncle Joseph, but he was not in the godown, nor could he be found anywhere, so I told the uncle to call Harry, and I left the message with him, which was to tell Uncle J. to send us the bottle of Calcutta biscuits, which he promised

1:45: home. J.M.R. went out, and returned at 2:30. When he told me that he would have to leave this house at 3:30. to go to the mad house, and meet the Lieut. Governor. I wrote a letter to Mr. Distant, and sent Dooley and Sizzie, a small catan basket each, containing six Calcutta biscuits, and some toffy. Also 1 bundle of Gulwah.

2:30 Liffin. Then Uncle Joseph came, as I had written and told him to call here on his way to the foot of the hill. I gave him one bundle of Mulway for carry. 3. J.B.K. send Worder to look for the water man at Mr. Johnny Lunters house, who always takes the evening milk to Mr. Distant, but he was nowhere to be found, so we told him to go for a cooler, to whose hands we gave the parcels for Mr. Distant.

3:30. J.B.K. went to the mad house in his American buggy. I mended his pantaloons then rested till 5. Up dressed. Received Dookoos from the children of M. S. and a couple of snipe from Mamma. 5:30. Drive with Harry. 6. home. J.B.K. had returned. Mamma sent me some Dookoos, I wrote and thanked her by Harry. 7. dinner. Then we had music. Wrote a letter to Georgie, but got no answer. Read the Bible. Bed. 10.

Thur 3 Up at 6. Did not go out for a walk with J.W.K.  
 read "The last chronicle of Marsel," a book of two  
 volumes from the library till 7. Then as I  
 had written my journal yesterday even-  
 ing. I began writing my letter home to W.  
 King, J. Took the Pagadar account from our  
 servant, and gave him the orders for the  
 day. Then I made him sweep the ceiling  
 of our 3 rooms, as there was a quantity of  
 cobwebs on them. He had the Massalchee  
 up to help him.

Then I went on with the  
 copy of my letter till 9. when I rested and  
 read again. 9:30. Bathed dressed. Mamma  
 came and brought me two Pummeloes  
 that Aurdy had sent me. She got them  
 from Tassek. 10:15. J.W.K. came home and  
 said he had breakfasted. So I went and  
 eat mine. He came and sat beside me.  
 I eat both the snipe. J.W.K. eat the in-  
 side he said that was the best part of  
 them. I came upstairs, and after eating  
 an orange, I began writing my letter again

I wrote till my hand ached then J.W.K. said you had better leave of, and do some work. So I got my bead collar and began working at that. J.W.K. had brought me some silver wire to act as a needle, as I could not get any proper bead needles here. I tried the wire & found it answered well. His dobbie also came today. I sorted his clothes, and took the socks away to mend them. Then I finished writing the copy of my letter, and I did some more bead work.

2:15. tiffin. I received a letter from Alice. J.W.K. wrote to Mary, this is the third time. Worked some of J.W.K.'s socks. Gramma brought Annie here to have her toenail cut. She said Auntie, Phoebe, Bo, & Annie were going up to stay with W<sup>o</sup>. Distant for a few days. 4. rested. 4:45. Up dressed. Went out for a drive, we were caught in the rain, but did not get much wed. 7. home got a letter from Dooley Distant. Stoney fruit. dinner music. Read the Bible. bed. 10

No. 11 Up at 6. Did not go out for a walk with J<sup>r</sup>.  
 Read J<sup>r</sup>'s "The last chronicle of Barsel" till 7.  
 Then wrote my journal. Took the bazaar  
 account from our servant, and gave him  
 the orders for the day. Worked at J<sup>r</sup>'s sewing  
 till 9 finished hemming a whole side of it.  
 Rested. Read again. 9:45. bathed. dressed. 10  
 went down to breakfast, just as I began  
 J<sup>r</sup>'s came, so we eat together. He brought  
 me home water cresses. This is the greatest  
 quantity and the finest lot I have had yet.

After that I eat an orange  
 then I sewed J<sup>r</sup>'s two coats for him.  
 Dulgee came. He brought me my cotton dress  
 that he had taken away to fix a new  
 front, as it was very tight. He also brought  
 my low neck black silk. I wanted to know  
 how to trim it, so I told J<sup>r</sup> to tell the  
 tailor I would take it to Mr. Plunket and  
 asked for my home way, I would leave  
 it at his house. I 2. went to see Mr. Kiddy  
 but the boy there told me she had gone  
 out to spend the day with Mr. Wittery.

Then I went on to Mrs Plunket. Just as I passed the Court, Mrs P.'s boy met me & asked if the D. was at home, as her baby had fallen down, so I drove back, & took Mrs. with me. The Child had nothing the matter with it, only Mrs P. was frightened. She had fallen on her nose principally. Then I showed my black low body. We proposed to have it trimmed with black begal trimming, at first, but afterwards it was changed, and we had a white Bertha with the begal trimming on it.

1.10. Home. Practised on the piano a new duet, & sang some songs.  
2. Mrs. K. came home. Dipped. Worked my black petticoat. rested. 5. Up. wrote a letter to Fanny & Alice. 6. Just going out for a drive, when it began to rain, so I did not get out at all. 7. dinner. Mr. Gentle & Mr. W. Allen dined with us. In the evening whilst Mrs. K. & Mr. W. Allen partners they were, we Mr. Gentle & I lost. 11. went away. Read the Bible. bed

Sat 5 Up at 6. Did not go out for a walk with J.M.K.  
 Read "The last chronicle of Barsed" till 7.  
 Then I began writing a fair copy of my  
 letter home to Mr. King. He heard we  
 were to have been invited out to Gligar  
 to dinner today, but Charlotte Brown  
 must have forgotten to write to us.  
 Wrote till 9. Then rested, and read again  
 9:30. bathed. dressed. 10. J.M.K. came home  
 we had breakfast together. Came upstairs  
 worked. eat an orange.

Worked again. wrote a little  
 more of my letter home to Mr. King. Jodie J.M.  
 came. busy sorting his clothes, and taking  
 those things that require mending. 2 tiffin  
 rested. It was pouring with rain, but at  
 6. it cleared up, so I went to the jetty. Met  
 Mary Anthony, told her if she did not mind  
 would go to her house after dinner. I dinner. She  
 went to the Anthony's. The little children began  
 acting. Bob also. W.L. Paddy dried there  
 music. Then we had two tables of whist.  
 12. home. bed.

Up at 8. The Mail for home came in, to the surprise of everyone. Most were not ready with their letters. I finished writing mine. I wrote 16 pages read till 7. Then wrote after that. Took the bazaar account from our boy, and gave him the order for the day. 9. rested. read. 9:30. Just as I was going down to bathe, M.K. came home. So I dressed quickly, and we had our breakfast together. Then I came upstairs, and wrote a letter to Alice, for Uncle Joseph to take up.

10:30. The bells ring for church. They stopped 2 or 3 times, as the church clock itself stopped. They did not know the time. M.K. not having written his home letters, could not go to church, so I went alone. home. read. 2. tiffin. work. rested. went to sleep. Pouring with rain, not able to go out for a drive. 7. dinner. I felt dreadfully sleepy, but managed to keep awake till 9. when I read the Bible, and went to bed. I gave my head a great knock at the corner of the biscuit table. quite a bump.

Monday. Up at 1. Did not go out for a walk with J.W.K., but he walked to the General Hospital as usual. Read "The last Chronicle of Barset" till 7. Then wrote to Mrs. Paddy to ask her to come and spend the day with me. She wrote back by bearer and accepted the invitation. Then I ordered the two Orderleys and syce, the latter to bring the water, and the former to come and wash our two rooms, which have no mats on them.

I worked part of the time. Looked at my account, and gave our boy the orders for the day. The washing took till 8. Then I worked J.W.K.'s socks again - 8:30. The Bengal Sailor came, with the white lute for the top of my black silk low dress. I made him sew it on, and also a button on my jacket which was nearly off. Asked Harry to lend me his pony to take up the hill. 9. rested. read. 9:30. bathed. dressed. 10. J.W.K. came home we had breakfast together.

11. Young George Scott came to see J.B.K. and he lent him a pony to keep on the hill. 11:30. Mrs. Padday came she brought baby's work. I felt very lazy, and I did not work. 1. We played duets on the piano. I took the treble of one duet, and she took the treble of the other. 2. J.B.K. went out, came home very soon. He came to the piano, and showed Mrs. Padday, the parts which he did not think she played very correctly. Then we went to tiffin.

After tiffin we sang trios. Mrs. Padday went away at 8:30. and took away a book of vocal duets with her, to take the first part. 15. J.B.K. went to the baths, I went to Anthony's. Mary took me to the band with her. There were very few people there. J.B.K. & Michael came just before we left the band. to say they were going to dine with the young Scotts, so I had dinner at Mrs. Anthony's. Whist afterwards. Mrs. Anthony & Burn. 12. home. bed.

Up at 6. Did not go out for a walk with J.W.K.  
 Read "The last Chronicle of Barset" till 7. Then  
 I worked J.W.K.'s stockings. A beggar came, one  
 of the low poor class of clings, and I gave  
 him 6 cents. The China basket maker brought  
 some sugar, and candied fruit, and four  
 oranges, as a present to us. Also \$1. that J.W.K.  
 had given him. They Bengal sailor came, he  
 said the boy told him, I had called him, but  
 I said that I had told our boy to tell him to  
 come at 11. precisely, as I was going out to tiffin  
 at about 11:30.

9. rested. read again. 9:30  
 bathed dressed. 10. J.W.K. came home. we  
 had breakfast together. The boy could not  
 get any fish for me. Took the bazaar ac-  
 count this morning and gave our servant  
 the orders for the day. 11. Marum came  
 and began talking, and telling about some  
 reports she had heard respecting Willie.  
 Thinking that I was we had spread out  
 about it. Then I finished packing up my  
 box for the hill.

12. Went to Uncle's godown,  
to arrange with Uncle Joseph, what time we  
were to start for the hill, and if he would  
take us to the foot of the hill, in his palanquin.  
came home, told J.M.K. to send for me at  
3. Then I went to Mrs. Padday's. Directly I  
got there we began playing our duets on  
the piano. we also tried two new duets.  
2. Tiffin. Then I went into Mrs. Padday's  
room, and showed me her dresses.

Also her wreaths, flowers,  
garibaldi's &c. 3:40. came home. J.M.K. could  
not send me the carriage before as Colonel  
Anson kept him to tiffin there. I found  
Uncle Joseph waiting for us, so at 4. I dressed  
was ready to start. Came to the foot of the  
hill and got on our ponies, and arrived at  
the Highlands about 5:30. Geogie & Mary were  
at the stone waiting for us. J.M.K. first went  
to the Châlet, Sizzie had cut her head, then  
he came on here. Sat out in the garden. 7. din  
ner. Then we had a game at Commerce. 10 we  
were all very tired, so we went to bed.

Wed 9 Up at 6. J.B.K. went down to the plain with Uncle Joseph, he walked down part of the way, and then he rode. It was too wet under foot, so we were not able to go out in the garden. 7. Early breakfast of egg, toast. Then I wrote my journal and a letter to J.B.K. asking him to bring me up some things that I had forgotten. Then Georgie and I went and sat under the tree, and worked, while Mary wrote, and Fanny made a bouquet. 9. We took our second meal, of coffee and buns & biscuits.

I did not eat, so I had a head ache. 9:30. Prayers. 10. Mary and I bathed, together in their bathroom. The water was very nice and cold. Then we dressed for our third meal, breakfast. But there was a little time to spare, so we worked. The bazaar man came. Georgie and Mary received letters. 12. breakfast, Fish, curry & rice, fruit, &c. After that we took a table into the garden, and four chairs, and we all sat round it doing our work and talking. Miss Palmer was busy with house work.

About 3. Miss Palmer came to tell us, that she thought we had better come and lie down, so we first eat our supper of fruit, bread and butter, &c. and then we went to lie down. I went into the children's room and undressed, and laid in the same bed as Larry. We had plenty of fun, and made a great noise. Then Mary went to see what time it was, and came back and told it was considerably past 4.

Finding it was so late we all dressed, and went to the rock, to wait for Uncle and J.W. who arrived (the former) at 5. and the latter about half an hour afterwards, as he had been to the Châlet to see how Lizzie was getting on. He said Auntie sent her love to us. We walked back and found Larry sitting in the garden, she had been sick. Then Mary and I played at La Grâce. J.W. brought up our eyes for Miss Palmer's dinner. Then commenced cards. (any won. &c. Very tired, all went to bed.

Thurs 10 Up at 6. J.B.K. went down to the plain with Uncle. He rode part of the way, and walked the rest. Uncle Joseph was very nearly going down without him, only I called out to him to stop. Georgie generally wakes us, but she over slept herself. It was very damp under foot, so J.B.K. asked me if I had brought my goloshes, and when I told him I had not done so, he said I was not to go out anywhere if it was damp. 7. Early breakfast, I eat two slices of toast and butter and one egg.

Then I and Larry together just my room tidy. After that the servant came upstairs to sweep, so I brought my writing materials downstairs, write my journal, and a letter to Sarah Church, which I enclosed in J.B.K.'s letter, so that he might read it before he sent it, while Larry made me a bouquet to send to Sarah, she also sent me to Mr. Shepherd. 9. Second meal of coffee and biscuits, as the former does not agree with me, I took one slice of toast and butter, and a glass of Sioton (wine)

Then I went upstairs, undressed, rested and read "the last chronicle of Karsis" which J.M. brought up for me last evening. 10. Bazaar man came, only Mary received a letter. 11. Bathed together with Mary. the water was beautifully cold. 12. dressed. third meal. After that we had the table and four chairs taken out in the garden, and put in the shade, we all got our work, and sat out in the open air. Miss Palmer came for a little while, when she had finished her work.

We would scarcely believe her, when she told us it was past 3. Ayah & Lam (Mr Distant's Ayah) together with a water man and chokara, came from the chāler. She had been picking croonontings, and as she was feeling very thirsty, she came here for some water. She told us Annis was going down tomorrow. 3:50. tiffin rested. 5. Up. went to the rock. J.M. and Uncle Joseph came up together. 6. Mary and S. La Grace of dinner. Mary not feeling well I did not play at cards, but sat with her. The rest whist. Retired 9:30.

On 11 Up at 6. J.M.K. went down to the plain with  
 Uncle Joseph. J.M.K. rode down half way and  
 then walked the other half. They had to leave  
 early on account of Auntie who was going down  
 from the Chalet, where she had been staying  
 with M<sup>rs</sup> Distant. She had asked Uncle J. to  
 meet and accompany her to the foot of the  
 hill. When they got down, they found that  
 Phoebe and M<sup>rs</sup> with the Ayah, had gone to  
 town in Uncle Joseph's carriage, and Auntie  
 and Annie was sitting in the carriage waiting  
 for Uncle.

It was too damp, so we did  
 not walk out in the garden. I came up-  
 stairs, put my room tidy. 7. Early break-  
 fast of 2 slices of toast and butter, and an  
 egg. Then I read "The last Chronicle of Bar-  
 set." Wrote a letter to J.M.K. and Mary  
 Anthony, and sent her a bouquet too.  
 The letter I put in J.M.K.'s envelope, and  
 told him to correct it. 8. Prayers. 9. Second  
 meal of toast and wine. Then I went  
 upstairs and fed Larry.

She was not feeling very hungry, but I made her eat a slice of toast and drink her coffee. She made Mary Ann's tongue for me. Then I read again till 12 when Mary and I went and bathed in Uncle's bathroom, as Miss Palmer wanted to bathe in the other. We had not such a nice bath, as the tub was very small. 12:15 Had meal. Then we sat under the house, as Mary could not go out in the garden, the fog was very great, and we had had some pain.

Georgie put some hooks and eyes on my muslin shirt, so that I might not have the trouble of bunching it up under my arm. Miss Palmer then came to tell us that it was past 3. I would not believe it. We went upstairs to tiffin of fruit. Then I finished mending 2 pairs of J.W.K.'s socks. Rested. Played at draughts. 5. J.W.K. came. Uncle did not. We sat on the rock and then came in. 7. Dinner. (Mary not well. did not come down then. Different games at cards 9. so. bed.

L112 Up at 8. J.M.K. went down alone as Uncle J. was not able to come up last night on account of one of the crammies being sick, and there was so much work to do in the go down. J.M.K. rode down part of the way, and walked the rest. I asked him if he was going to stay up all tomorrow, but he could not tell me till this evening, as it all depended on Mrs. Kairney Roddyk, he is expecting her confinement. 7. Early breakfast of toast and butter, and egg.

Then we all went down stairs, so as to allow the boy to sweep the room. I wrote a letter to Miss Dickson, and was going to have a bouquet made for her, but as I heard Uncle and J.M.K. might come up earlier this afternoon, I changed my mind, and told Carry to make the bouquet for me this afternoon and I would send it, and the letter down by Uncle J's syce, to await J.M.K. so that he might read it, before it was sent to Miss Dickson.

9. Prayers. Then I began working J.W.'s socks. Larry was dozing on the couch, Georgie knitting, and Mary writing letters. 11. Mary and I went to bathe. The water was beautiful and cold. 12. Third meal, breakfast. After that we had a table and four chairs taken into the garden, and put under the trees and we all sat round and began our work. They all began teasing me, but I did not mind it. Mary very kindly began darning the other sock for J.W.

About 3. we had the table and chairs taken in, as it was looking very cloudy and rainy, and just as we got comfortably settled, it began to rain. 4. dressed. went to the rock, waited for J.W. and Uncle Joseph who came at 4:30. Then we sat out in the garden, and was just beginning a game of drafts, when the rain came down. <sup>so</sup> we went in. 7. dinner. Then we had some games at whist. Larry was a little sick. 9. went to bed.

June 13 Up at 6:30. No one went down. Harry's  
 pony was sent up for me. 7. Early break  
 fast of toast and butter, wine and egg.  
 J. B. K. had some coffee but no egg. Uncle  
 J. would not eat at first, but after we had  
 all eaten, he began. 9. Prayers. I did not  
 go in this morning. Put my room tidy.  
 Second meal of coffee, and toast. The  
 bayar man came up only letter for Miss  
 Palmer. 12. Third meal, breakfast. Then  
 we sat out in the garden, and I read aloud  
 to Larry and Mary. 3. J. B. K. and I went down  
 to the "Spout" to bathe we called at the  
 Châlet both going and coming back. Every  
 one was getting on well. Lena gave me a  
 letter for Georgie. 4:30. back to Highlands.  
 Then Mary, Georgie, J. B. K. and myself went  
 and sat on the rock till we felt a few  
 drops of rain, when we came in to the house.  
 Then it began to pour, and did not leave  
 off till next morning. I mended my habit  
 which I tore in jumping down from the  
 pony. 7. dinner. 9. bed.

Up at 5:30. Finished packing up my boxes. Folded up the sheets and wrapped with the pillows, with 2 mats. Then had the coolie to come and them on the top of my box. Then I went to see Carry, after I was dressed, eat my toast & drank my wine by the side of her bed. She was crying as I was going down the hill. Directly I had finished, we said good bye, and left I riding on Harry's pony. We got to the foot of the hill without any rain, though it looked very threatening. Uncle J. gave me a lift.

On my way home called to see Uncle S. & Auntie. 8. Home. 9. Bathed. dressed. 10. breakfast. Harry eat with us. Then I went to the godown in A's buggy. Asked Uncle for a party on my birthday, but he said better not. Then came home, put my things away. 12. went over to see Sarah who was going to Singapore, by the <sup>home</sup> mail which came in this morning. 1 returned. No letters from Mr. King for me. 2. tiffin. Then washed my crinoline. rested. 5. Up. 6. drove to the jetty. 7. dinner. Then music. 9. Very tired. Read the Bible, and went to bed.

111  
October 1867 Penang

Tues 15 Up at 6. It was raining so J.M. was not able to go to the General Hospital. I sent our Orderly out to get 2 jice of Aporns for me; but he went to love lane, and brought me some that was not at all sweet, so when the boy came, I sent him to get 1 jice worth from the man who lives at the back of Mr. Palmers house, as he makes them very well. P. 12 cleared up. J.M. went to see some of his patients. Took the bazaar account, and gave our servant the orders for the day.

Sewed a hook on one of J.M.'s coats. Then I did some of my tatting. Georgie and I (when I was on the hill) made out together how Nellie had done the trimming she gave me as a present. We are copying, and tatting it in finer cotton. I had got a little more thread in the shuttle, so I wanted to finish it. g. rested. Read "The Lives of Bunco" a library book. g. 30. Before I had time to go down and bathe J.M. came home, so I told him to wait. I went and bathed and dressed.

10. Second breakfast. Came upstairs, eat an orange. 11. Myan, working my crinoline, I took out to streets and covered them with some thick cloth, which J.M.K. gave me and then sewed a piece of the cloth, on the crinoline cloth, so as to prevent the rust from getting into the stuff, and spoiling it. 12. The Bengual Taylor came. I gave him my habit to alter. He had made the front of it so tight, that I had torn the cloth, and burst the hooks, on my way down the hill yesterday.

I bought some black silk braid at 5 a yds and also asked J.M.K. if I could get a role of that black velvet edged with white for \$1. 1:30. sang a little. 2. Diffin. 3. Received a letter from Mary, and some Hultwah from Miss Palmer to J.M.K. worked. 4. rested. 5. Rec<sup>d</sup>. letter from Miss Dickson, J.M.K. me from M<sup>rs</sup> de Guilliard. 6:10. M<sup>rs</sup> Maggalleans came to see J.M.K. 6. Out for a drive. 7. home. I went to jetty. J.M.K. to Pad days. 7:30. dinner. 8. music till 9:15. Then wrote to Mary in answer to her letter. I got this afternoon. 10. Read the Bible, and went to bed.

October. 1867. Vnang

Wed 16 Up at 6. J. N. K. walked to the general. Was  
 fatal. I read "The Lives of Burcot" till 7. then  
 I wrote my journal, made a copy of a letter  
 to Miss Dixon Dickson. Took the boy an  
 account, and gave our servant the orders  
 for the day. Sent him out to buy a piece  
 of Apoms, from the man who lives behind  
 Mr. Palmer's house. 9. Received a letter from George  
 from the Highlands. Uncle Joseph sent it to  
 me with some Omrah's. Worked two pairs of  
 my stockings, as I had not to wear otherwise.

Dressed, read again. 9:30.  
 bathed dressed. Had the boy upstairs, to  
 sweep the rooms. 10. Second breakfast. J. N. K.  
 brought home a beautiful quantity of water  
 cresses. He said we had been invited to spend  
 the evening at Mr. John Anthony's. After I had  
 finished eating, I gave the soft Omrah's away,  
 and only kept the good ones. Mr. W. Scott  
 came to say, that if I was going out calling  
 with Mr. King, Mr. W. Scott would be very glad  
 to see me also to tiffin. He came afterwards at  
 11:30. to have his tooth stopped.

I was working in the outer room, at Mr. K's socks, patching the holes at the toes. 12:30. Mr. K. went to town to get some currants and cheese. He was unexpectedly detained there, so he made me write to Mr. W. Scott, not to wait tiffin for him. I worked, & played on the piano. 2:30. tiffin alone. Then I received a letter from Carry, and a bouquet from "all on the hill". She was feeling much better. After tiffin work at my crinoline. 4. Dressed. Mr. K. came home a little while after & I shut the shutters of my dressing room, as the sun was coming shining on my looking glass.

He said Mr. Ayer, Rajah and Betty were at tiffin at W. Scotts. 6. Harry took me to the jetty in his buggy. Met Mr. Hogan. D. Anderson &c. 7. home. Began answering Georgie's letter. dinner. Came up finished writing. 8. Started for John Anthony's. There were the 2. Biddays, 2. Pards. & all the Anthony family. we played at cards different games. Flora & I laughed a great deal. We did not come home till near 1. after having dropped Mr. & Michael An. at their house. I wrote to Miss Dickson. Today sent specimen of my tatting

Thursday Up at 6. J. N. K. walked to General Hospital. I read  
~~or~~ look till 7. then I wrote my journal, took the  
 bazaar account from our boy, and gave him  
 the orders for the day. Then I worked at my crinoline  
 till 9. when I rested. I eat 2 apoms. 9:30. Bathed dressed  
 11. Second breakfast. Worked again. J. N. K. returned  
 Dr. Peterkins call yesterday. He lives with his wife  
 at the Mess House, where Dr. Burn and family  
 lived before. They went to Kangoon. Mr. Bishop  
 the new banker called. He comes from Shanghai where  
 they will have snow and ice.

2:30. Tiffin. Received a letter  
 from Mary. Work again till 4. rested. 4:30. Mr.  
 Distant & children came here. They came down  
 from the Châlet this morning. J. N. K. was called  
 to go over to the Province to see Mr. Bowies wife.  
 6. I went to the jetty for a drive: 6:30. home. 8:45  
 J. N. K. returned. 7. Old Mr. Anthony & Mr. John Anthon  
 came and dined with us. Mr. J. A. was my  
 partner. He had the luck on our side, having gain-  
 ed 34. points, without losing me. They went away  
 at 10:30. Then I wrote a letter to Carry, as I had not  
 time to do so before. 11. bed.

5 Up at 6. J.M.K. walked to the General Hospital. I read till 7. Then wrote my journal. Took the bazaar account. Worked at my crinoline. Eat 2 Juice of Apples. 9. rested, read again. 9:15. Bathed dressed. 9:30. Second breakfast. Harry had his breakfast with me. We eat the 2 couples & a 1/2 that Mr. Harry Kidday gave us yesterday. 10. J.M.K. came home. N. Alice came to see me. I asked her to stay to tiffin. Mr. W. Scott came to see J.M.K. about his tooth. My dobie came. I left Alice took the account.

Also the Bengal Sailor about my riding habit, it was still too tight, so he took it back to alter. Received an invite to dine at Uncle's on Tuesday. 1. J.M.K. went out. We had tiffin at Mr. W. Scott. 2. Alice & I had tiffin. Then I showed her my jewelry, wedding presents 3. she left. Mr. Distant came. 4. J.M.K. returned & vaccinated Mr. D's baby. Mamma & Phoebe also came. She latter just returned from Gluegar rested. 5:30. To the land with Harry, then to the jetty. 7. home. dinner. music till 9. Very tired. put a mat on the ground & fell asleep. 10:30. bed.

Sat 19  
 Up at 6. J.M.K. walked to the General Hospital.  
 Read and finished the Burcot of Clive's litt. 7  
 Then I began writing a copy of my letter home  
 to Mrs King. After that I took the bazaar ac-  
 count, and gave out by the orders for the day.  
 Worked at my crinoline. 9. rested. read the  
 newspapers. 9.30. Bathed. dressed. 10. J.M.K. came  
 home we had breakfast together. Then  
 work again. J.M.K. was going out to call on V.  
 Peterkin, so I wrote and asked Harry to lend  
 me his jony buggy.

His buggy was at the coach  
 makers, so I put the jony into J.M.K.'s carriage  
 went to Mr. Paddy's, Mr. Buttery's, the Anthony's  
 Mary Lewis & visited them. here to tiffin next  
 Tuesday. I also called on Miss Clewer. 2. home.  
 3. tiffin. work. rested. 5.30. Out for a drive with  
 Harry. came home at 6.30. ordered our carriage,  
 went to the jetty. but it began to rain, so I had  
 to come home, & besides, there were no Ladies there  
 7. dinner. music. Then I put a mat on the jony  
 with my pillows, & was reading, when I fell asleep.  
 10. J.M.K. woke me up, I got into bed.

20 Madame Es. Chasseriau's birthday. Up at 6. J.M. went as usual to the G. H. I read the news <sup>2</sup> Home till 7. Then I wrote a copy of my letter home. M.A. I was not feeling very well, so, I rested at 8:45. till 9:15. Then washed and dressed. 9:30. Harry was going to Aunties, so I took a lift in his buggy, and he drove me to Mr. Plunket's first, where I was going to breakfast. There was one letter with J.M. here, so I took that with me. 10. J.M. arrived. at Mr. P's. we had breakfast. Then J.M. went over to see Mr. Anson. It was she who had written the letter I brought.

Then Mr. & Mrs. J.M. did their business downstairs. I was upstairs with Mr. P. 2 home. Tiffin. Then just my room tidy. 11:15. J.M. went to bath. 5. I went to Anthony's & drove myself in Harry's buggy. Flora Earl so came there. Mary invited me to tiffin tomorrow. 6. We all went out for a drive to the jetty, saw the usual number of people. 7. home. J.M. was already at the Anthony's, so I jumped into his buggy, & we went to the Plunket's where we dined. 9:30. home. Read the Bible & both went to bed.

Jan 21 Up at 6. J. M. walked as usual to the G. H. I read  
 till 7. Then I wrote my journal. Took the ~~beaver~~  
 account. Saw the Orderlys wash our 2 rooms.  
 had the oyce up to help them. Mended my  
 stockings. 9. rested. 9:30. washed. dressed. 10. J. M.  
 came home. breakfast. He brought some fish  
 that Mr. Brown had given him for me. But  
 we kept them for tiffin. Mr. B. also invited us to  
 tiffin & dinner on Saturday. Afterwards I worked  
 again. I had quite made up my mind, but at  
 last I said I would go to the Anthonys to tiffin  
 at 12. I began to dress, when the  
<sup>duge</sup>  
~~duge~~ came. Then I had to try on my habil. Take the  
 account. at 1. I left home. There was Mary & Mr. Waller  
 spending also the day there. 2. tiffin. 4. Flora Earl  
 brought Mary & I home. I rested. Received letters  
 from Jerry & Georgie. 6. Out for a drive with J. M.  
 home at 7. Read at the dinner table till dinner  
 was ready. Afterwards music. Then I wrote  
 a letter styled children on the highlands. Then  
 I put some fresh cotton on the shuttle & began  
 to talk. 10. Read the Bible. went to bed. I eat  
 1/2 piece of Aprons this morning.

22 Up at 6. I was awoke by the ringing of our bell which we tie on the junkah rope. I thought I heard a little noise down below, so I asked what was the matter, and found that Aunty Phoebe, Annie and B<sup>s</sup>, had walked here, and brought me some presents. The Orderly forgot which gave which. There were 2 bottles of scent, a Maltese lace collar, and a tatted collar. A little while afterwards, I received a letter from Uncle Joseph with \$5. and from one Miss Palmer and the Highlanders, with a present of a dozen Lisbon.

I read till 7. Then wrote my journal. Took the bazaar account. I waited till 8. Thinking Mamma would be here, then I would be able to ask her whom the different parcels come from. But as she did not make her appearance I wrote and excused my self to them and thanked Aunty for the lace, and Phoebe for the tatted collars, and Annie and B<sup>s</sup>, for the scent. Then I told our boy to tell the Bengal sailor to come here at 10:30

Dec 22.

I had no evening dress to go to Glugaz in, so I unpicked a piece of lace which had been sewn of my pink spotted tartan dress, as I did not like it. I had a berth sent up with the dress, but it was thought to be too large for me, but I ran it on in place of the lace, to let J.M.K. look at it. At 8.30. what was my surprise, when I heard the Bengal Sailor had come. I asked him why he came so early, and he said he was told, I wanted him directly. But as far as I could I explained it to him, and he said he would come at 10.30.

9. rested. 9.15. bathed. dressed. Harry came here, and told me Millie's bag had been christened. 10. Uncle Lawrence, and Joseph, and Mamma, came to wish me happy returns of the day. Uncle L. gave me \$15. Mamma a common seed bracelet mounted in silver. I began my breakfast alone. then J.M.K. came home I finished it with him. I had invited some ladies to tiffin, so I came up and dressed. The Bengal Sailor came at 10.30.

J.B.K. explained to him all about the dress. Then the tatted collar I had received, I could not work as my muslin garibaldi, so I gave it to him to work.

12. Mr. & Miss Mackay called. Then Mr. Ridday, Mary Lewis, Mr. Galastan, Mary Anthony, and Mr. Buttery, arrived. We worked, talked, and sang & played on the piano. Mr. Buttery would do neither. 2. tiffin. Then upstairs again to talk. 3:30. Mr. Ridday and Mary L. went away: 3:45. Mary A. and the rest left. I shut down the piano, and took the music in. Rested till 5. Up. dressed. Received a letter from Larry. 12 bouquets from the hill. arranged the flowers. Wrote a letter to Miss Palmer, thanking the Highlanders for their present. 6:30. To the jetty with Harry, J.W. R. Ernest L. which we happened together with the Hogans. home. 7. dinner at Uncle's. Then cards. Mr. Dawson & I partners against J.B.K. Uncle L. We gained 26 points & lost 5. Mr. Dawson showed some tricks at cards. 11:30. home. Bible. bed.

October. 1867. Penang

Wed 23 Up at 6. p.m. walked out as usual. To the G. H. I read till 7. Then wrote my journal and my letter home to Mr. King. Harry passed the English Woman's Magazine, and so I tried the different patterns in tattering that were in it. I managed to do a little, but had no crochet needle, so could not go on. Took the boy out account, and gave our boy the orders for the day. 9. rested. read. 9. 30. bathed. dressed. 10. 5 did not wait for p.m. but began my breakfast. It came a little while afterwards and brought some water-cresses.

Just as we finished eating, Mr. Daniel Brown came to see J.M.K. and ask him to go out to Glugar to see George, whose face was quite swollen. So J.M.K. said he was going to Sans Souci, and from there, he would go to Glugar. So Mr. Brown told him he had better take me to dinner at Sans Souci, as Charlotte was going to the band, and would call & see Mr. W. Scott, and instead of Mr. Brown, she could take me to the band.

28

J. B. K.'s dobie came. I sorted his clothes, mended some dirty socks before going to the wash. I dressed on my black silk shirt and white muslin garibaldi. 2. Went to Sans Souci. Mr. Brown also came there to tiffin. After that J. B. K. stopped 2 holes in Sills tooth, and pulled out Tad's (a Henrietta) tooth. He was thinking of leaving, when it began to pour with rain, so he had to wait. I had no chance of speaking to Miss Dickson at all. It began to clear up about 5. Then J. B. K. said he would start for Glugar.

I said I thought I had better go with him and he said no. But Mr. Brown told us Charlotte was coming at 4 for me, and as this was 5. I did not expect her but J. B. K. wrote to ask Mr. B. to call for me. I just as he had finished writing Mr. B. came told him to take me to Glugar, so we went. Charlotte came soon after. 7. dinner. Then music. J. B. K. and Charlotte sang. Also she and David tried the Harmonium, which they had patched. 12. home.

Sun 26 Up at 6. J.M.K. went out as usual to the G. H. I read  
 till 7. a book of Fairy Tales. They were not so  
 good as those J.M.K. brought some little time  
 ago. Then I took the bazaar account and  
 gave our boy the orders for the day. Wrote a  
 copy of my letter to Miss Wells. J.M.K. wanted  
 me to write to them, as they had been so  
 kind to me, when I was at school. Worked some  
 of Mrs's socks, patching them at the toes.  
 9. rested. read again. 9. 30. Second breakfast.  
 Having eat 2 Aprons for my early breakfast.

11. J.M.K. came home. He  
 corrected my letter to Miss Wells. Worked. 2  
 Pippi. Received a letter from Mary saying  
 they were all coming down the hill to-  
 morrow. 5. rested. 6. Out for a drive. 7. home  
 to dinner. Just as we had finished eating  
 a carriage drove up, so J.M.K. told me to go up-  
 stairs. A little while after, he followed me &  
 said he was going to the Province as Mrs P  
 gellan expected her confinement. I undressed  
 and got into bed quickly, and was nearly  
 asleep when he went away at 9.

25 J.M. slept at the Province. I go up at 6. read till 7. Then copied a pattern from the English Woman's Magazine. 8. J.M. came home, & then ordered his carriage & went to see his patients. I wrote to Mary to tell me when they arrived, & was answered by Mary, they arrived at 10. She returned me the "La Grace" sticks. Took the bazaar account, and gave out by the orders for the day. Eat 2 Apoms. Finished writing the correct copy to Miss Wells & put it on J.M.'s table.

Worked his socks. 9. rested. 9:30. bathed. dressed. 10. Second breakfast. Work again. 1. He called on Mr. Anson, & stay a full hour there. Then went to see Palmers. 2 home & up. The Mail for home came in brought a letter from Joe to us. 4. rested. 5. Up. was just going out for a drive, when we saw the children at the gate, so I stayed at home with them. 7. they went away. Dinner. After that music. I saw some ducks. George brought me my hat. The point the waist too small for her. 9. I went to bed.

Sat 26 Up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers, J.M.K. accompanied me a little way. Had my early breakfast there of 2 slices of toast & an egg. 7:45. home. wrote, read. played on the piano & sang. 9. rested. 9:30. bathed. dressed. 10. J.M.K. came home second breakfast. After that the tailor came with my dress, I gave him another to alter. Annie had her toe nail cut. Then Bengal man came to be paid for a piece of velvet \$1. 12 yds of black silk braid \$1. and a box of looks & eyes \$24. I thought sometimes ago.

Then I packed up my box.

1:10. we started for Gungar. Got there just in time for tiffin. There were the 4 Paddays 2 Witterys, 3. Browns, 2. Lewis, Benson. Maxwell & our two selves. After that, we ladies began a game at billiards but did not finish it. Then we went upstairs, played on piano and Harmonium. 5. Proquet. Train sent us in. 6. dressed for dinner. 7. dinner. Then music again. Benson M. sang a song & played the accompaniment himself. We only sang out of one book. 12. home. passed the Padday's on the way.

27 Up at 6. Walked to see the Palmers. J.B.K. accompanied me a little way. Had my early breakfast there of 2 slices of toast and butter, and a glass of wine, & an egg. 7:40. home. Took the bazaar account, and gave out by the orders for the day. read, wrote, rested at 9. 9:15. bathed dressed. 10. J.B.K. came home. second breakfast together. 11. Church in the Court House. As the church was undergoing repairs. It was thought not safe for the people to sit in it.

The white ants had built their nests on the roofs. After church which was before 12. We walked home. These prayers & the sermon only were read. 2. Tiffin. rested 3:30. Up. Went to Anthony's. J.B.K. went to Sangong Tokong with Mr. Gentle, he also dined with him at his house. 6. Out for a drive to jetty. Took Alice too. 7. came back. I had dinner with Mary. Then Japan with Joseph, Mary and Mr. Galas. Mary said she expected her sister Mrs. Sarah Earl in a day or 2. 11:30. home. bed.

Mon 28 Up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers. J.B.K. accompanied me part of the way, then he went on to the G. St. had my early breakfast there of 2 slices of toast and butter, an egg, & a glass of wine. Took no ink. 7:45. walked home by myself. rested. read. Was so tired went to sleep and over slept myself. 9:30. bathed. dressed. 10. J.B.K. came home. eat very little breakfast. not at all hungry. Took the bazaar account and gave out by the orders for the day. worked J.B.K.'s stockings.

2. Jiffin. eat very little again. Then Bengal Tailor came. gave him another of my dresses to alter. Mail from home. no letter for me. rested 4. Up. dressed in an evening dress, and black silk jacket. 5. Charlotte Brown came to take me to the band. We went to Walter Scott's first. 6. band. round the race course & dinner at Ghyar. David Brown accompanied us. Mr. & Mrs. Lamb came down the hill. Miss Lucy played on the Harmonium. I also tried and succeeded better. As the clock struck 12. we arrived at home. bed.

29 Up at 1. Not feeling at all well. To prevent myself from sleeping, took my work. To Patience with me when I walked over there, J.M. accompanied me a little way. They had already gone. To breakfast early. I eat a slice and a half of toast, an egg, & a glass of wine. Then washed J.M.'s socks & Vicky came to us what time I wanted Harry's buggy, I told him 9:30. Children went in to dress, so I did my work in their room. 9:15. Home drove myself in Harry's buggy.

Took the bazaar account, and gave out by the orders for the day. 9:15. Bathed. Dressed, received box from home opened found socks, and some things for me &c. 2. Tiffin. chicken broth. rested. slept. 5:30. Up & went with J.M. to Walter Scotts to see Edith who was sick, & then on to Anthony's to dinner. All the family. Capt B<sup>r</sup> of Far East were present. 7 dinner. Then some played whist, we had music then whist afterwards. 12 home. bed.

Wed 30 Up at 6. J.M. was called this morning at 4:30  
 to Mr Barney Roddy's, who was delivered of a girl.  
 He came home at 6:30. I was dressed, so I told  
 him, as the Palmers sometimes had. There  
 early breakfast before 7. I would go now, I  
 could not wait any longer for him. So I went  
 and found they were eating. I eat a slice  $\frac{1}{2}$   
 of toast, an egg, and had a glass of wine. I  
 took my work J.M.'s socks, and remained  
 walking till 9 when the Orderly brought  
 an umbrella, and I walked home.

rested. read. 9:30. bathed  
 dressed. 10. J.M. came home, asked me  
 if I had my breakfast, I said I was eating  
 it. he had had his. Work again. 2. Tiffin. told  
 Sailor brought my dress. told him to come  
 tomorrow. rested 4. slept till 5:45. Then  
 as it was raining, J.M. could not go to the  
 baths, so he took me to Barney Roddy's.  
 I stayed in the carriage. Then we went to  
 see Edith Walter Scott. I did not get out of car-  
 riage. 7. home. to dinner. music. quiet day.  
 9. Read the Bible. bed

51 Up at 6. Did not go to Palmer's, as this being  
Ellen Shepherd's birthday. The children  
had all gone to a picnic. read till 7.  
Then busy with my accounts. P. M<sup>rs</sup> Distant  
came to see me. She wanted some \$50  
from Harry, but as he was not at home I  
told her I would ask him for her. and  
also tell him to go and see her at John  
Counter's. She also said, that Capt Distant's  
brother was coming out here by a ship ex-  
pected the end of next month or the begin-  
ing of December.

Look the bazaar account. 9 no  
ted. 9:30. bathed dressed. 10. breakfast. The  
Tailor came, gave him my low blue silk  
body to alter, & also a muslin one. work  
George Brown came & had some teeth drawn.  
2. Supper. beef broth. rested. 6. went to B. Kody's  
saw baby & W<sup>rs</sup> B. 7. home. W<sup>rs</sup> Macfarlane &  
W<sup>rs</sup> Anderson dined with us. In the evening  
to whist. 2. M<sup>rs</sup> Parkers. we lost by 2 fronts

November 1867. Penang.

Fri 1 Up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers. J.N.K.  
 accompanied me part of the way. Then  
 he walked on to the General Hospital.  
 had my early breakfast of a slice of toast  
 and butter, an egg, and a glass of wine.  
 Was not feeling very well, so told Miss P.  
 I could not eat having no appetite, and  
 not to make more than one slice of  
 toast. Did not take any work. S. walked  
 home by myself. Took the bazaar ac-  
 count, and gave our boy the orders for  
 the day. read. wrote.

G. rested. so bathed. dressed  
 then finished working J.N.K.'s socks.  
 10:30 J.N.K. came home. second breakfast  
 worked. George Scott came to see J.N.K.  
 I went over to Palmers again, did work. My  
 bath was sent there. at 11:30 for me. J.N.K.  
 came to bring me home. rested. read.  
 J.N.K. 4:30 was going to the baths, but it rained  
 so Barney Brody's saw baby. y. home to

 26 points. 12 home bed.

November 1867. Penang.

Nov 3 Up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers. J.W.K. accompanied me part of the way. He called out just as I had left him, for me to hold up my dress. Had my early breakfast there of an egg, a slice of toast and butter and a spoon, and a glass of wine. No work. Talk read. 8. Home - walked by myself. Took the bay car account, and gave the orders for the day. read. wrote. 9. rested. 9:30. bathed. dressed. 10:30. J.W.K. home. second breakfast. 11. Church in the Court House. Had the organ today.

Sat 30 Up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers. Jmk. accompanied me part of the way. Had my early breakfast of a slice of toast and butter, an egg, and a glass of wine, finishing with two appoms. Took Jmk's socks, and mended one pair. I walked home by myself. Took the bazaar account and gave our boy the orders for the day. Worked at my wool work, a cushion till 9:30. Then bathed. dressed. 10:30 Jmk. came home, I had my second breakfast with him.

Then work again. No one called. I could not get the carriage to go out visiting. 2. Diffin. rested read 5. Out for a drive to the jetty alone. Saw Mr. Hogan who had not gone to the Province. 7. home. Mr. Mr. Plumbert and Mr. Ellis came to dinner. Mr. S. left us directly after dinner, he said he was tired. Mr. P. & myself partners in whist. But we lost by 8 or 10. Jwinds, 10:15. They left us. we went to bed.

1. Up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers. Mr. walked a little way with me. Had my early breakfast of a slice of toast and butter, an egg, and a glass of wine. Finished with one afternoon. Sunday took no work. read. 8. Walked home by myself read. 9:30. Second breakfast. 10:30. Bathed dressed. 11. Church. Being Sacrament Sunday we took two dollars, but what was our surprise, when we saw Colonel Man reading instead. So there was no Sacrament.

We afterwards heard that Mr. Mackay had one of his old attacks the "lumbago" just as we was going to leave his house. 2. Tiffin. 3. J.B.K. went to Tanjong Tokong. I went to Mary Anthony's. The Hills arrived today in the Home Steamer. Went out for a drive to the jetty with Mary, but first dropped Mr. An: at John An: 's house, the latter asked me to dinner, so we went to jetty, saw Mr. Hill returned at 7 to dinner at John Anthony's. J.B.K. came for me at 11. Home. bed.

Dec 2 Up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers.  
 J.B.K. walked a little way with me. Had  
 my early breakfast there of a slice of  
 toast and butter, an egg, and a glass of  
 Juice, finishing with one apple.  
 Took J.B.K.'s socks, and mended one  
 pair. 7:30. walked home by myself.  
 Took the bazaar account and gave  
 out by the orders for the day. Worked  
 at my wool work till 9:30. when I bath-  
 ed and dressed.

10:30. J.B.K. came home. I  
 had my second breakfast with him.

so Mr. Bayshaw had to change seats with  
Lieutenant Anderson. In the evening  
music, home, at 12:30. bed at 1.

Took the bazaar account and gave out my the orders for the day. Very tired from sitting up so late for so many nights. Worked at my wool work a cushion. 9:30. bathed. dressed. 10:30. J.K. came home. Second breakfast together. Work again. No one called today. 2. Diffin. Then rested, read. We had invited W. Allen to dine with us, but he was locked up on a jury case, so J.K. wrote to Mr. Gentle to bring some one with him. 5:30. I went out for a drive to jetty with Harry. Saw Mrs. Hogan, and the usual number of people there. 7. home. John Anthony Gentle dined with us. After dinner whilst John An. & I partners beat them by 20 points. 10:30. They left. Bible. bed.

5 Up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers. J.M.K. accompanied me part of the way, and then went straight on to see the Chinese building a bathing house for themselves. Had my early breakfast. Worked J.M.K.'s socks. 7:30 walked home by myself. Took the bazaar account, and gave our servant the orders for the day. Preparing for the Pyrotechnic ball tonight. Worked at my wool work till 9:30. bathed. dressed. 10:30. J.M.K. came home.

We had second breakfast together. Work again. No one called. 2:30iffin. rested. read. work. 5. Out for a drive with Harry, who brought Lena here, as we were going to take her with us this evening. 6:30. dinner. 7:30. went to Dr. Bacon's house, where Mr. Blackman used to live. Saw the fireworks. Magnificent this year. Though all were manufactured here. A balloon was sent up in the end. Then dancing. Home at 2:00. For got to bring Lena, sent Harry to fetch her, but Aunty had already taken her home. bed.

Fri 6 Phoebe's birthday. Up at 6. Got into our palke and went to Aunties, to wish "Many happy returns of the day." Had my early breakfast there. Took her a pair of gold earrings like Jonep-anites as a joint present from J. H. & myself. worked. S. Harry sent me his buggy, I drove myself home in it. Took the bazaar account, and gave our servant the orders for the day. work again till 9:00. Then bathed and dressed. 10:00. J. H. came home.

Second breakfast together work again. Uncle gave Phoebe a gold bracelet, Auntie a gold neck chain, Mamma Bonning shell brooch earrings. rested. I went to jelly with Harry, then called to see Bella who had a toothache. y. dinner at Uncle's. Only the Lewis' were there besides ourselves. I was not at all well, & so hysterical fit from being overtired and not able to it. Was perfectly sick. Had to come home, directly after dinner, and go to bed.

7 Up at 6. Neither of us well. Oysters upset J.B.K.

Wed 25

Christmas Day. Up at 8. Walked over to see Uncle and Auntie, had my early breakfast, of one slice of bread and butter and brandy tea. Home in Harry's buggy at 8:30. He came to fetch me himself. wrote read. 9:15. bathed. dressed. 9:45. To Auntie's again with Harry. 10. J.M. arrived there second breakfast. Then home again 11. Church. We sat behind the red screen, near the Vestry door. After church called first on Mr. Palmer, then Mr. Shepherd who invited us to a little dance in the evening, we said we were going to dinner at Uncle's, but when we came home, if we saw lights we would call in and see them.

Then we called on Mr. Wright. Mamma had five girls one after the other. So then sent for us. It seems she was going into Mr. Palmer's house, & young Lorenzo was siding. he did not surmount his pony quick enough so he got under the shafts. Frank had just spoken

To Phoebe in church, and Mamma thought it was him, so she got frightened. Loreiro also screamed. They took her home, and she had five fits one after the other. We called to see her, then went to Mr. Anson, she kept us to supper. Mr. Plow also was there. Home at 11:30. Slept to 7:30. Went out. 6:30. I went to see Mr. Hogan with Harry then on to Uncle's to dinner at 7. Mr. was a little late. He had been to see Mr. Friedrichs, who had a Christmas tree, and she sent me some things off it. In the evening cards. 11. Home. J.W.K. went over for an hour to the Shepherds, but I was not well, so did not accompany him, but went to bed.

26 Up at 6. Walked over to see Auntie, had my early breakfast there. Home 7:30. Took the bazaar account, gave orders for the day 9:30. Bathed, dressed. 10. Second breakfast. work. 2. Supper. Quiet day evening. 6. Out for a drive with Harry. Home at 7 to dinner 9:30. Read the Bible. bed.

December 1867 Penang

Fri 28 Up at 6. Walked over to Aunties to see  
 how Mamma was, found her better.  
 Millie's baby had kept her awake at night,  
 and she had become quite wakeful in  
 consequence, and not able to sleep properly.  
 Had my early breakfast of a slice of  
 bread and butter, some ham, and a  
 cup of tea with  $\frac{1}{2}$  a teaspoon of brandy.

Took my calling and  
 worked it. 8. Drove myself home in Harry's  
 buggy. Took the boy's account, and  
 gave our servant the orders for the day.  
 Work. wrote. read. 9:30. bathed. dressed  
 10:30. J.M. came home, we had our se-  
 cond breakfast together.

Work again. No one call-  
 ed. 2. Tiffin. Then rested. 5:30. Up.  
 J.M. went to see Mamma again, to  
 speak about the Godown doors fastenings,  
 as she had 75 bottles of beer, wine, brandy &c.  
 stolen from it. home to dinner at 7. Then  
 had some music. Very tired. 9:30. I  
 went to bed.

9 Up at 6. Walked over to Aunties and found Mamma better. Millie and baby still there. had my early breakfast of 2 slices of bread and butter, some ham, and a cup of Tea, with half a teaspoonful of brandy in it. 8. home in Harry's buggy. I drove myself. I had taken my letter to Aunties this morning on account of its being the easiest work to do. Look the bayas account, and gave our servants the orders for the day. 9:30. bathed. dressed.

10:30. J.W.K. came home, we had second breakfast together. 11. Auntie came with some silks from Mr. Green, to show me, but I did not buy anything. 2. Tiffin. 4:30. went over to the Province. Mr. Robertson came to fetch us in his boat. Walked on the beach. Capt Reed & Mr. & Mr. Hatchel came to dine at Mr. K's at 7. We had music and singing after dinner. Capt Reed made us laugh a great deal. 11. bed.

Sun 29 Up at 5:30. dressed in my boating dress.  
 Then went down stairs to an early break-  
 fast of corned beef, toast, bread and butter,  
 tea, coffee and wine. Mr. Plunket arrived  
 in Captain Reid's boat, they were all  
 laughing at the way he was steering.  
 At 10. Mr. & Mrs. Robertson, Mr. Plunket, Captain  
 Reid, and our two selves got into the former's  
 boat, and Mrs. Robertson's children were  
 all put in a Louby boat, and in this  
 order we started for the Joor river.

On our way there, we  
 stopped first to get some fish, we hailed  
 two or three boats, and found they were  
 just going a-fishing, at last we found  
 one, and bought 30 cents worth. The se-  
 cond time we stopped was for Mr. Rob-  
 ertson to shoot an alligator, both Mr. Plun-  
 ket, they managed to hit two between  
 them. We were getting very thirsty, and  
 wanted something to drink, so Mr. R.  
 had the boat stopped again, and took  
 out a bottle of brandy some of ginger wine.

They were not opened, so he asked for a cork screw, and found the boy had forgotten to put one in, so they broke the necks of the bottles. We passed Mr. Bacon's landing place, and found some rocks with oysters on them, so we stopped to pick some off, and found them very good. Then we landed, and set about getting the breakfast ready. Making the sambals etc. We had forgotten to bring spoons too, so we eat with our fingers.

Captain Reid, and J.W.K. eat with two forks. Then we washed our hands after eating breakfast. rested, and got into the boat again, having sent the children off first. We arrived at 6:30. Mr. Plunkett left for town directly. We had a bath, then came down to dinner at 7:30. 8:30 we left Captain Reid kindly bringing us over in his boat. We three walked home. J.W.K. offered Capt. R. his paluki, but as he was passing by at the moment, he said good night, and jumped into it. 10:30. bed.

Dec. 30 Up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers  
 J.B.K. accompanying me part of the way.  
 Harry & Georgie had gone on a walk to  
 the jetty with Uncle Joseph. Miss Palmer  
 came out to speak to me about Mary. Had  
 my early breakfast there of two slices of  
 bread and butter, an egg, a glass of wine,  
 and an appoon. Took a duster to patch  
 7:30. walked home by myself. Took the  
 bazaar account of yesterday, as well as to  
 day. work again at duster.

9:30. bathed. dressed. 10:30  
 J.B.K. came home, second breakfast together.  
 12. called on Lady And, who is living at the  
 corner house (Mr. Robert Harris's) and on  
 D. Mrs. Peterkin (Mr. Waco's house). 2.  
 home. toiffin. rested. work. read.  
 6. out for a drive with Harry to jetty.  
 went to Uncle's first, to speak to Auntie  
 about the jig. home at 7. to dinner.  
 J.B.K. after I did, as he had to go to  
 Pulo Secosse to the college there. No  
 music. wrote. Bible. 9:30. bed.

21 Up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers  
J.W.K. accompanied me part of the way.  
Harry and Mary were out this morning  
In a drive, I met them just as I was  
walking up to our gate, they asked me to  
go, but I did not wish to do so. had my  
early breakfast there, of two slices of toast  
and butter, an egg, and a glass of wine.  
home at 7:30. work. Took the bazaar ac-  
count, and gave our boy the orders for  
the day: 9:30. bathed. dressed.

10:30. Second breakfast with  
J.W.K. No one called. Work at home. be-  
gan writing my letters home. 2. Tiffin.  
rested. read. wrote to dinner at Uncle's.

dancing party. The Officers of the "Riflemen"

The other Ladies did not leave till 2:30  
J.W.K. was very tired. bed

Wed 1 Up at 6. Walked as far as the Manse with  
 J.M.K. then got into the carriage, and drove  
 to Aunties. had my early breakfast there  
 of two slices of bread and butter, and some  
 ham, and a cup of tea with half a Teaspoon  
 ful of brandy in it. Took my Catting to do.  
 8. home in Harry's buggy, drove myself.  
 9. bathed. dressed. 9:45. Harry took me  
 to Aunties again, J.M.K. arriving there about  
 10. and we had breakfast all together.

As it was the custom for  
 us to meet on high days and holidays. 10:30  
 home again. work. read. 12. Captain Reid

brandy in it. Then as I was still feeling  
thirsty I took an orange. In A. tatted.  
8. drove myself home in Harry's buggy.  
had our Orderly up to sweep the rooms.

Took the boys account  
and gave our boy the orders for the  
day. We were invited to dine at the Go-  
vernors today but were engaged already.  
9:30. dressed. 10. Second breakfast with  
J.W.K. read. wrote. worked. 2. Tiffin. 3:30.

January 1868. Penang.

Jan 3 Up at 6. Walked as far as the "Inn" with J.B.K. Then got into our paluki, and was driven to Auntie's. I intended to have gone to the Palmers, but as Uncle Joseph had taken the children to "Wattu Ko man" for a change, I did not care to be all alone there. Had my early breakfast of 2 slices of bread and butter, some ham, a cup of tea with half a teaspoonful of brandy, and one orange. Tatted, played at Backgammon with Auntie.

7:30. Drove myself home in Harry's buggy. Took the bazaar account, and gave our boy the orders for the day. 9:30. Washed. Dressed. 10:30. J.B.K. came home. Second breakfast together. Work again. Wrote 2. Tipped. Celled. Work. 6. Out for a drive with Harry to the jetty. Met Miss Wheldon, and congratulated her on her approaching marriage with Mr. Ellis, who made up with her on "New Year's Day." 7. Home to dinner. Then music. J.B.K. sang songs. Wrote 9:30. Read the Bible. Bed.

4 Up at 8. Walked over to see the Palmers.  
J.M. accompanying me part of the way.  
had my early breakfast of two slices of  
bread and butter, an egg, and a glass  
of wine. Darned dueter. Perry was a  
little tired, had enjoyed herself very  
much, fell asleep in the boat, returned  
at 9. Mary very cross. 8. walked home.  
Took the baydar account, and gave  
our boy the orders for the day. 9. Received  
a letter from Joe from Singapore.

He expects to be here about  
the middle of next week. packed up my  
things in the box. 10:30. Second breakfast  
put all my things away. 2. tiffin. 4. went  
to Mr. B. Brody's, and College, at Pulo Teccoose.  
Then to the foot of the hill 5. Reached the  
"Spout" in safety. Mr. Hill nicely dressed.  
J.M. went to bathe, I so dress for the even-  
ing. 7. dinner. Then game at whist. I  
had very nice talk with Mr. Hill. She  
cannot play whist in the least. 10. very  
tired, both went to bed.

Jan 5 Up at 6:30. Mrs. Hill did not come out of her room, got half an hour afterwards Had early breakfast of bread & toast and butter, cold ham, tea and coffee, and jotted meat. After that the Malay man was expected, and Mrs. Hill said she always likes to bathe before then, so we went down to the "Spout" and had a jolly bath. Then I rested and read. The B. man came. J.R.K. went to get his bath.

12. Second breakfast. Then fed the parrots Mrs. Hill brought with her from Java. I went to lie down and sleep. Up at 4. Mrs. Hill had a cup of tea, and some bread with jotted meat. Then Mrs. Macfarlane took us for a walk over the rocks. It was very hot and stuffy. J.R.K. had a second bath. I was feeling a little sick took wine. One of the parrots flew away. Mrs. Hill caught it with butterfly net. J. dinner. Then I talked with Mrs. Hill to bed.

6 Up at 6. Packed up my things. Saw Mr. Hill, and said good bye to him, then jumped on Harry's pony which he had lent me, and sent up the day before, and left the hill. J.M.K. walked down. I went to the College with J.M.K. first, then to J. H. saw him make his coffee. Then he put Harry's pony into his small buggy and Vicky drove me home, while I held the pash over myself. P. home. Looked the bazaar account.

9:30. Bathed. dressed. 10  
J.M.K. came home. second breakfast together. began my letter to Larry. read. 2. tiffin. rested. read. work. wrote.  
6. Out for a drive with Harry to jetty met the Wieldons. congratulated her on her marriage with Mr. Ellis. 7. home to dinner. 8. out boating with Larry, Georgie, Uncle J. & Mary. went on board the Portuguese ship Captain Paracho. had oranges & Sycheese. P. home. Read the Bible. bed. lovely moonlight night.

Tues 7 Up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers. accompanied by J.R.K. had my early breakfast there. Of two slices of bread and butter, an egg, and a glass of wine. Worked at dusk, and showed Georgie a pattern in tatting. 8. Walked home. Took the bazaar account, and gave our servant the orders for the day. wrote a copy of Mrs King's letter and finished Larry's. 9:30. bathed. dressed. 10:30. J.R.K. came home, we had second breakfast together.

Work again. Joe came on shore last night at 11. but we were not awake. Capt. Patterson called of the "Grasshopper" Joe came to us see at 4. Percy Padday came to look at my jewelry in a booth for Alice. 5:30. J.R.K. went over to Province Town for a drive with Harry to jetty. Saw Mary Anthony, Alice and the Morgans. Auntie out trading with Joe. 7. dinner at Auntie's. Capts Paracho & Elias also dine there. Manilla. I sang duets with Phoebe. 10:30. Uncle J brought me home. bed. J.R.K. 11.

8 Up at 6. Walked as far as the Gurnery, then with J.M.K. then got into our carriage & went to Aunties. Wished Uncle Mary's happy returns of the day, and gave him a sofa cushion worked by myself. He was very pleased. Latted. had my early breakfast of one slice of bread and butter, and a cup of tea with a little brandy in it. Played some games at Backgammon with Auntie's. Harry came in his buggy to drive me home. Took the boy's account.

9. 30. bathed. dressed. 10 J.M.K. came home. second breakfast together. wrote letter home, part of it. 2. 11. rested. 6. Drive with J.M.K. to Pulo Perceuse college. Took a look to read there. 7. To Uncle's to dinner. 3. Ferron's, Ernest & Mary Lewis, Mr. Stewart & Uncle Joseph, also dined there. In the evening music and the "Too." J.M.K. played whist also Harry. Sang "Mary happy returns of the day." Mr. Stewart sang "Spinning Wheel." home to bed at 12.

January 1868. Penang.

thing up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers. J.K.  
 accompanied me part of the way, had my  
 early breakfast of one slice of bread and  
 butter, a glass of wine, and an appoin.  
 Darned a duster. Isabella Hogans birthday.  
 7:30. walked home by myself. Look the ba  
 year account, and gave our boy the orders

Near convict lines, fell out of American buggy, on my chest, stomach & arms. could not breathe. Mr. Hogan fortunately came up, brought me home in her carriage. Larry & I came to see me. Grazed my chin also. 7. dinner. jaw very stiff, could scarcely eat. 8. Uncle's to whist. Uncle & Auntie one 2 3 times home. to bed at 11.

January 1868. Penang.

Jan 11 Up at 6. Matt got into our paltri and drove  
 to Aunties, & where she rubed my chest.  
 had my early breakfast of bread and butter  
 and ham. Tatted. Mended my riding  
 habit sleeve. 8. Drove myself home in  
 Jox's big buggy. Took the bazaar accounts  
 and gave our boy the orders for the day:

Jan 13 Up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers had my early breakfast there of a slice of bread and butter, a glass of wine, and an approun. Worked dusters. 7.30. walked home by myself. Took the bazaar account, and gave our boy the orders for the day. 9. Mrs Hill wrote and asked me to allow her to come and dress here, as their house was being painted. So I bathed and dressed, and put our room neat. Mrs Hill came at 9.15. Having suffered very much from toothache. No sleep last night.

10. Breakfast. Then J. N. K. looked at Mrs Hill's tooth. He gave her chloroform to take. The pain was dreadful. Then she went to sleep on my bed, till 2. when we had tiffin. Then she felt better. 3.30. J. N. K. went to an inquest. 4. Mrs Hill went away. 6. Out for a drive. To jetty with Harry. Went on board Captain Distant's ship. All the family were there. 7. home to dinner. J. N. K. had arrived about 1/4 of an hour before. Then music till 9.30. when I read the Bible & went to bed.

Walked home by myself. Took the bazaar account, and gave our boy the orders for the day. worked. wrote 9:30. bathed. dressed. 10:30. J.B.K. came home we had our second breakfast together. Wrote and told Auntie we were coming to dine with her this evening.

work again. wrote. 2. Tiffin rested. tatted. began a piece of tating for the top of my evening dress. 5:30. Mr. Gentle, & Willworth Allen dined came to see J.B.K. 6. J.B.K. went to see the Christian Brothers at Pulo Secoos College. Harry took me to the jetty. Met Mr. Hogan & there. Auntie Phoebe, Annie, Bo & Joe, together with the Lewis' went out boating. 7. Dinner at Uncle's. Trust in the evening with Auntie & Uncle J. Uncle L. played up Manilla with the Portugues who dined there. home at 11.

Wed 15 Up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers.  
 Had my early breakfast there of one slice  
 of bread and butter, an appoon, and a  
 glass of wine. Tatted. 7.30. walked home

10:30. J.M.K. came home, we had our second breakfast together. Work. No one called. 2. Tiffin. 4. Mr. Maxwell came to sing trios with us. Then we walked on the green sward where Capt. Patterson of the "Grasshopper", his sailors & some of the Penangites, were playing a running game. Mr. Anson, Stiggins were there. 7. Home to dinner. David & George Brown dined at Aunties music in the evening. Bed at 10:30

Fri 17 Up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers. J. & K.  
 accompanied me part of the way. Had  
 my early breakfast there of 2 slices of  
 bread and butter, an egg, a glass of wine  
 and one approom. Took my tatted color to  
 work. 7:30. Walked home by myself. Took  
 the bazaar account, and gave our boy

Sunday up at 6. Walked over to see the Palmers. J.N.R. accompanied me part of the way. had my early breakfast there of a slice of bread and butter, a glass of wine, and finished with two appoons 7:30. Walked home by myself. Took the bazaar account and gave our servant the orders for the day. read. rested. 9:30. bathed. dressed. saw the orderly dust the room, tables, and chairs, &c. 10:30. 18 Up at 6. The first lady on deck. D. M. 20.00. Mr. very much wind. saw a few islands, but being rather foggy, they were not very distinct. Still feeling well. Expected a squall, looks very threatening, but fine as yet. bed at 8.

19. Up at 6. Prayers at 11. just finished when a grand squall came. The decks were wet, though there was a double awning where we sat. We were all obliged to keep our feet on chairs, there was not a dry place on deck for them. Mr. Mackay & Mr. Mackay went down & sat in the cabin. We had rain off & on all day. The steamer pitched dreadfully, & also rolled a little. No service in afternoon. A pouring rain. J. K. made me go down through the skylight, he standing below to catch me, he had done the same thing. Wanted the Mackays to do it, but no. They came by the steps, which were perfectly wet. bed directly

June 20 Up at 6. Rain, wind, and heavy rolling. At 2.50  
 to mouth of Maulmain river. Waited one hour,  
 when pilot came on board. Entered the river.  
 beautifully calm. Passed a steamer going out  
 as we were going down, bound to the north. 6.  
 Anchored at Maulmain, too dark to go on shore.  
 The Mackay's went to William M.'s house. Capt  
 said we had to remain here one week. On ac-  
 count of the steamer we passed, having taken  
 the mails away. Very cool night. bed at 8.

June 21 Up at 6. Had a bath for first time since leaving  
 Rangoon. Water very muddy, but that is the colour  
 of it. Mr. D. Manjey went on shore, returned  
 on board to breakfast. Went on shore again at  
 12. Left Uncle's letter of introduction to Mr. Han-  
 nay, Mr. H.'s office, as he was out, also his card.  
 returned. At 4 to dinner. 6. On shore. I went  
 Mr. M. not well, stayed behind. Last evening  
 walked up to see a Pagoda. Very large and  
 inside. Beautiful view of Maulmain from the  
 large flight of steps about 500. It was a fine even-  
 ing fortunately. To board again. 7. On board. Had  
 a cup of tea. bed.

22 Up at 6. All went on shore. Walked through the bazaar. It was divided <sup>in</sup> to several compartments. All kinds of vegetables to be had, besides toys, cloth &c. Fish not good, caught the afternoon the day before. On board to breakfast at 8. At 12. Mr. Harnay came on board & took us on shore after tiffin to spend the rest of the day & dine. I did not like Mr. Harnay much. Very cross looking. We came off in the Master Attendant's boat at 9:30. & found a note from Mr. Donally inviting us to spend the day with her tomorrow.

23 Up at 6. On board till 12. Then went to the Donallys with Dr. M. His wife was not well, so would not have accompanied us. Dr. M. left me at the Donnelly's & went to see the saw mills, worked by elephants. Robert Scott, Mr. Oyer Rajah's son was there at work. 4. dinner. Then Mr. D. took me ~~to see~~ out for a drive in their new carriage, & two ponies. She drove. It rained a little just before we got home. 7. tea, which Mr. D. made herself. Then music. Mr. D. plays very nicely, but not so well as Mr. Henry Paddy in Penang. Left them at 10. Went on board

Fri 24 Up at 6. On board till 3. when we started in  
 the steamers boat with Mr. Fawcett, Mr. Kennedy,  
 Mr. Woolbridge (2<sup>nd</sup> Officer & Purser) in the Mastaba  
 coast. Landed at the point called "The Duke of  
 Wellington's nose". Then got into the boat again where  
 we had our dinner at 5. of hump, biscuits, cheese  
 & 4 bottles of beer. At 6:30. it began to rain & we  
 took refuge in the Pagoda at the Point. There we  
 remained till 10. singing songs, when it cleared  
 up a little, & we got into the boat, & wearing Mr. Faw-  
 cett's water proof coat, & went on board. we missed  
 the steamer. Supper & then bed.

Sat 25 Up at 7. Then Mr. K. went on shore, where he met  
 J. Donnelly, who asked us to go on shore, & remain  
 & spend the day with them. After dinner on  
 board, went to their house. It began to rain  
 so we did not go out for a drive. J. tea. Then  
 music. 10. on board to bed.

Sun 26 Up at 6. On shore with Mr. Hethorn (Chief Officer)  
 to church. Rev. Rustie read prayers, Mr. Mack  
 preached. After church to bazaar. Then to the  
 Donnelly's where we spent the rest of the day. Heard  
 that the "Arracan" <sup>was going</sup> ~~went~~ to Kangaroo tomorrow.

so said good night to the Donnellis, & went on board, when D.K. began packing up.

27 Up at 5. D.K. went on board "Mraean" in the ships boat. No other boat to be had. Nasty rainy morning. I the only passenger left in the "Loringa". 4 Macrays came. And in the evening 2 other passengers, a Scotch Minister, & a broker. bed at 8.

28 Up at 5.10. Manigais came on board. Was introduced to D. Kuster. W. Hamray and Robert Scott came to say good bye. 12. The steamer started. got to the mouth of the river at 2. stopped for want of water, started again at 5. In the evening Miss Mackay & I sang songs. Sang W. Fawcett 20 tats. W. Macray very sick. bed at 8.

29 Up at 6. In the Rangoon river, anchored at 10, off the jetty. D.K. came to fetch me about half an hour afterwards. Went on shore to Capt M. Adlard's. Sat in the drawing room for an hour, then went to D. Burns. Mr. B. very kindly gave us up rooms in their house. Had for a drive in the evening, music, tea, bed at 9.

Thurs<sup>30</sup> Up at 6. M<sup>r</sup> K. walked with Miss Sinclair in the  
 Rangoon gardens. had my early breakfast of coffee  
 & toast and butter. 12. Went out with M<sup>rs</sup> Burn in  
 her carriage, also M<sup>rs</sup> Gray & Jones, where M<sup>r</sup> K.  
 bought me 2 hats, a hat box, and a crinoline, could  
 not get any golooshes, came home to dinner at 2. 4.  
 dinner. Then at 5. went to see M<sup>rs</sup> Mac call's pur-  
 chase which was going to be sold by auction on  
 Saturday. Had some difficulty in finding the  
 house. home to tea at 7. bed at 9.

Fri<sup>31</sup> Up at 6. Had my early breakfast of coffee and  
 toast & butter. M<sup>r</sup> K. wanted to take me to call  
 on M<sup>rs</sup> Fyche, but as I had no silk dress or bon-  
 net, I did not go. M<sup>rs</sup> Burn took me to see Miss  
 Jackson. She keeps house for her father, who is a  
 Doctor. Her mother, being at home in England with  
 the other children. One brother is staying with the  
 family here we went to ~~at~~ Jones's again, & M<sup>rs</sup> M.  
 Gray bought, cooking utensil, dinner set, etc. to furnish  
 house. 2. home to dinner. 5. Out for a drive  
 to hear 30<sup>th</sup> band. 7. home to tea. Betty goes to sleep  
 always under M<sup>rs</sup> B's chair, then D. B. takes her to  
 her bed. 8. bed. 9.

21 Up at 6. Had my early breakfast of coffee, toast & butter. Mr. went to the jail with Dr. Manjary, who puttered about & wasted time. I wrote my letter to Mr. King 7 pages long. 10. breakfast. played on piano, tatted. went to shop at 12. returned at 2. So tiffin. Plenty of rain. Bought some trousers buttons, elastic for Bengal. Sulu also stuff to make short jacket. 4 dinner. Major Sinclair dined with us. More rain could not go out for a drive, so the Major made us sing some Christy Minstrel songs to him. 7 tea. then bed at 10.

22. Plenty of rain, no going out, to church even.

23 Up at 6. Packed up in case of having to go away today. Mr. went out returned at 11 to say we were going to Port Blair. Took me on board, after saying good bye to the Kurris. Found steamer started at 3. P. M. Mr. went on shore again to see after the luggage. 8. P. M. left Rangoon. Our fellow passengers were, Capt & Mrs. Williams, 45. children. Charlie, Harry, Annie, Amy & baby. Capt Warne Lieut Lyden & Ensign Banks. 7. anchored. Too dark to see to go out of the river. 8. I went to bed.

Tues 4 up at 6. So much rain was not able to get on deck till 11 after breakfast. Then was obliged to come down again, deck was wet. The consequence was I was sick. I had no dinner. got into bed, and did not get up again the rest of the day.

Wed 5 more rain. Did not get up till 11. Went on deck for a little while. A great deal of itching & tossing.

Thurs 6 the same. more rain. nasty weather.

Fri 7 the same, more rain, nasty weather.

Sat 8. Anchored at "Port Blair". Mr. Man came on board to fetch the Williams' not knowing that we had come so. Landed at the jetty at 12:30. my hat blew off into the water. Mr. K. would not let me walk, so the Double Mr. Fraser lent me his gongong, a chair with 2 long poles on each side, & four convicts to carry it. Went up to the Mans, who very kindly gave us rooms, till we knew whether we were going to stay or not. Mr. Laughton, who is going to be married to Miss Man, came, he is half an inch later than Colonel Man. Mr. Williams went home & did not return, as she was too tired, only Capt W. came. Music. bed.

- 9 Up at 6. Went out for a walk to the new barracks  
 with Mr. Hutton. 10. breakfast. Then  
 went to Church in Mr. Man's company. Sat  
 in the front row. Singing remarkably good.  
 Harmonium played by a soldier. 12. Home  
 2:30. Tiffin. Then at 5 out for a walk, to the  
 Williams at 6:30. Church again. Mr. Slaughter  
 played Harmonium. 7:30. dinner. bed. 10.
10. Up at 6. Sat in my room till breakfast time  
 at 10:30. Then began to write my letters to  
 send by "Aracau". Mr. called on Mr. Warren  
 the Clergyman for the Mess. 24<sup>th</sup> Regiment  
 N. H. In the evening I walked over to see  
 Mr. Williams, the children not at all well.  
 She came back to the Man's at dinner to 7:30.  
 The W's are living in Capt. Duncan's house,  
 till Mr. Cumming goes away. 10. bed.
- 11 Up at 6. Stayed in my room till nearly breakfast  
 time. The Williams' ~~came~~ got into their house today.  
 Spent the day at Man's. Walked by the sea shore  
 with Mr. & picked up Boonking shells. Can  
 only get small ones here. 7:30. dinner. music  
 Mr. Williams sings very nicely. bed 10.

- Sat 12 Up at 6. Stayed in my room till 10:30. when we had breakfast. M.K. went out for a walk with Arthur Man. Wrote my letters to Kuang and England. 2:30. tiffin. Then out for a walk just on the sea beach then to Williams' children not at all well. 7:30. dinner. 10. bed. Mess dinner
- Sun 23 Up at 6. Stayed in my room till breakfast time at 10:30. M.K. was tired, having not come home till 1 o'clock on account of the farewell mess dinner to Mr. Lunnings. 2:30. tiffin. Then out for a walk. M.K. went out boating with Dr. Watts. Mr. Lunnings & Dr. Keane dined with the Mess at 7.30. Today. music. bed at 10.
- Mon 24 Up at 6. Went ~~to~~ with Colonel & Arthur Man, & M.K. to Aberdeen. Landed there, and then walked to Phoenix Bay, got into a boat, and crossed over to Chatham. Stayed at the landing place, while the rest went to look at Hospital then back again to "Cross Island". After breakfast at 12. we called on Mr. Warneford, Mr. William & Mr. Duncan & their sister Miss Potts. In the evening went strolling with Arthur Man. 7:30. dinner then whist. Colonel Man & I won. 10. bed

25 Up at 6:30. M.K. went out for a walk. Went to the library & brought me a book to read. After breakfast he went to the mess, and had a game at billiards. In the afternoon, Arthur Man & ourselves went to South Point walked to Aberdeen, then returned to Cross Island in a boat. In the evening whist.

26 Up at 6:30. M.K. went to Haddo with the Mauns. I stayed in my room till breakfast time at 10:30. Wrote my letters home to Vera & England. In the afternoon M.K. went out for a sail in the "Coquette." Capt Falle & Lieutenant Cumming dined with us at 7:30. music. 11 bed.

27 Went up at 6. Went for a walk to the jetty with M.K. After breakfast he dined the Mauns.

28 Up at 6:30. A regatta. It was a very nasty day, pouring with rain. M.K. was out in it, in Capt Sawoods boat.

29 Lieut Cumming went away today in the "Garrick" commanded by Capt Falle.

30. Went for a walk at 1:30. to church. Then in the evening to Mr Williams & again to church.

31 This evening went to theatricals. "Alabama" done very well. B.K. had the sailors & soldiers did not know their parts well.

Tues 8 Up at 6. had a cup of tea. 8:30. bathed and dressed. At 9:30 went to the Mess to breakfast with Ladies & Gentlemen, after which an address was read by Colonel Man to Dr. Jamnack. At 11:30. I returned to the Mans, and Dr. K. went on boat to see Dr. Jamnack off. At 1. we said good bye to the Mans, and thanked them for their hospitality. We had been with since Aug 8. which makes exactly a month. Went to the jetty, met some of the Officers there, got into our own boat, and started for Chatham. Landed at 1:30. had tiffin. In the evening we looked about the garden, made some alterations, and saw the men pick up the weeds. At 7. we had dinner. Then went to bed. This is our first day at Chatham.

Wed 9 Up at 7. Dr. K. went to his hospital. I read, & wrote. Took the house accounts. 9:30. bathed. dressed. second breakfast. Busy all day, unpacking. Not able to put our mosquito curtains up, as there are no proper poles. Fortunately there are very few mosquitoes. Over to Haddo in our own boat in the afternoon. 7. dinner. bed.

no up at 6. M<sup>r</sup>. went to meet Colonel Mann, who landed at the jetty at 7. A. M. M<sup>r</sup>. did not come up to the house. His son Arthur was with him. In the afternoon we went out in a row round the Terog shah, a schooner on a mud bank. M<sup>r</sup>. landed in some jingle. It was too deep water for me to be able to get out, so I waited in the boat for him. In the evening I played at cards by myself. G. went to bed.

in up at 6. M<sup>r</sup>. went down to meet Captain Williams, and Harry also came. Charlie was better. M<sup>rs</sup>. Williams came to see me yesterday afternoon, but I was out. He had brought his cook in exchange for ours. He came up to the house, but would not take anything to eat or drink, neither would Harry. Our cook left us at 9. The new cook confessed he was a table boy, and did not know anything about cooking. ~~He~~ What he did, was so badly done, that M<sup>r</sup>. had to go in the afternoon to "Cross Island" to ask Mr. Bryant for a new cook, he promised to send him the next day.

Sat 12 Up at 6. M.K. went to his hospital, also to Hadda. I stayed at home. read. worked. wrote. 9:30. bathed. dressed. 10. breakfast. In the afternoon we went for a sail, had to turn back twice on account of the rain. Took shelter under the shed, opposite the landing place. I got very wet, <sup>in</sup> just the front part of my dress, and my feet. This was the first time I had been out sailing, so I was ~~for~~ a little frightened.

Sun 13 Up at 6. M.K. went to visit his hospital as usual. returned home ~~at~~ 9. to breakfast. 10. Started for "Cross Island". I did not accompany him, as it looked very doubtful, and it had been raining off and on, till the present time. M.K. went to Captain Darwoods to dress. He wrote the day before asking if we might both of us go there always. Then M.K. went to Mr. Maw to ask her to lend him a bed, as the one he bought from D. Jarnack, was broken. The nails had given way. Then he went to D. Kearis & then came back here. He was caught in 2 showers of rain, on his way here, and was wet up to his waist nearly. Rain all day off and on

2184 Up at 6. M.K. went to the Chatham Hospital, Haddo,  
Mary's Bay. I stayed at home, read, work, write  
9:30. bathed, dressed. 10. M.K. came home, breakfast  
At 12. M.K. went to Haddo, to see they some furni-  
ture, that was going to be sold by auction today.  
At 4:30. We went to Phoenix Bay, walked through  
some jungle, got a fine uncommon creaper,  
and also a Penang lizard. Came home a little  
after six. Just as I got up to the house, I saw  
Mrs. Man coming, so I had to go down again  
to meet. She did not stay very long, only came  
soat outside our house, but did not enter it.

2015 Up at 6. M.K. went to Hope Town & Mount Heriot.  
At the latter place he saw someone that  
had been in the hospital in Penang under  
him. He came home to breakfast at 10. And  
said I could not possibly walk up, as it  
was very steep. In the afternoon we had a  
splendid sail, all by Mary's Bay, & quite sound  
viper. We met Mr. Wandal, Capt Church, Capt  
Grove & 2 or 3 other Officers. We were enabled  
to sail till the way home. Dr. Watts & Mr. Wandal  
Jnd, called while we were out

Wed 16 Up at 6. D.M.K. went to meet Colonel Man, he had come to see the hospital. His son Arthur accompanied him. They neither of them came up. Our boat was sent at 12. To "Cross Island" about some \$2,500 that D.M.K. wanted to send to Penang. As it came back, D.M.K. would not believe it was our boat. And said there was only one of our men in it. I told him they were all there. So he went down to meet the boat, & found what I said was true, & that they had a new sail.

Thurs 17 Up at 6. Colonel Man & his son Arthur called to take D.M.K. to Haddo. They did not come up to the house. I stayed at home. read. worked. wrote. 9:30. bathed. dressed. 10. D.M.K. came home second breakfast. 3:30. went to Haddo to pick up shells. As we were coming away. Mr. Warford & Mr. Mosyne came. They said they had called at the house for us, but found we had already come here. They told us to go on to "Black Reef" and they would meet us again. Capt. Chum & Ensign Banks also came. Capt. C. cut his feet by a rock. We got a few shells, & went up close to Capt. C's boat & he jumped in ours to see them.
