a whole kennel of his hounds with it. that
were bit

Take of the roots of Agremony, Brimrose,
Dragon and Single Diony of each half an ounce
of y^e Star of y^e earth 2 ounces, of y^e Blak of
Crabs Claws & Venice Treacle of each half
an ounce, when y^e roots & herbs are bruised
y^e Crabs Claws and Venice Treacle are to be
Infused warme with them in a quart of the
strongest white wine for 12 hours att least
then being strained y^e party bitten is to take
above a quarter of a Sint, Evenings and
mornings, for three days together, and also
afterwards again 3 days before y^e new and full
of y^e moon, it may be sweetened with sugar
or with any Cordiall Sirop.

My Lady Essex Griffin's
receipt to procure Good Labour

Take half a pound of figgs and slice them, a
quarter of a pound of reason of y^e Sun stoned,
4 ounces of Liquorish, Scraped & sliced, a Spoon
full of Anis Seed, a little bruised Stew all these
in 2 quarts of Spring water till a full fourth
part be consumed, then pour it gently through
a Sieve & drink y^e third part of a pint in
y^e morning fasting & att your going to bed -
Drink this for a month or 6 weekes together
before your Labour you may drink it as hot
as you please

for y^e Gravell

Take a glass of flint water in y^e morning
early which will begin to make y^e Gravell
pass after 2 or three times taking

M^{rs} Redfords Receipt for
Curing the Gravel

Take 2 quarts of Spring water, and put in
a good large handfull of 4 Drickles of Thorne
Backs after 4 fish is boyled, if such a quantity
cannot be got, you may take the same quantity
of 4 fish it self bones & all add. to that a handfull
of parsley roots and 2 ounces of Sweet fennel
Seed and an ounce of Anyse Seed, and an
ounce of Reddish seed, Boyle it till half the
Liquour is consumed. Drink half a pinte
of 4 Liquor Strained through a sieve without
Squeezing, milk warm at night when you
go to bed, & 4 same quantity in 4 morning for
2 days together: it has Cured some persons
that have had a stoppage of water for 10 days
together. — approved of by L. E. Hatcher

My Lady William Waldegraves
Receipt for healing a Burne

Take a good handfull of green Elder Barke
Scrape off 4 out side, & take some of the
pith along with it, In 4 leaves a handfull
a pound & half of fat Bacon, roll the Bacon
(being cut into thin slices) on 4 out side of
4 Elder and In 4 & put white paper round
it, heat a pare of tongs red hot & hold the
roll of Bacon in it till it drop into an
Earthen pot, as 4 tongs cool heat them
again till it will drop no longer, Let it
stand till it is cold & after wards lay it
to any Burn, & it will heal it without a
scar. — It may be made into severall
little Rolles to drop it 4 more
conveniently. — extremely good & experienced

M^{rs} Redfords Surging Cordiall.

Take an ounce of Rubarb, & Slice it thin
 2 ounces of Sene, 2 ounces of lignum vite, two
 ounces of carraway seeds, 2 ounces of anys seed
 2 ounces of Elicumpane roots, Sliced thin
 2 penny worth of Safran, pull'd asunder, 2
 handfulls of Damask roseleaves, a pound of
 reasons of y^e Sun Stoned, a quarter of an ounce
 of y^e best Aloes beaten, 2 ounces of Sweet
 fennel seed. take 3 quarts of y^e smallest aquavite
 with y^e Drugs mentioned, & put them in a glass
 bottle of 6 quarts, Let them stand 6 weeks, then
 strain it in another great Bottle, Let it stand
 one week or more to settle, then put it into
 bottles for your use, if you would make but
 half y^e Liguour, take only half of each
 particular, and when y^e Liguour has run
 through a sieve as long as it can, then take
 y^e Bottle wherein y^e Druggs are & turn it with
 y^e mouth downward through a joint stole
 placing a pan underneath y^e Bottles mouth
 to receive the Droppings for 2 hours time
 take these droppings & Straine them through
 a sieve into y^e former Liguour which was
 Strained & then it is fit for use the Drugs
 must not be squeezed least it alter the
 property of y^e Drink. — 4 ounces of.
 Wormseed being added to this receipt, & infused
 with y^e rest of the Drugs makes it an admirable
 medicin against the wormes, It cures all sorts
 of Cholicks, & is very good against aques. It
 may be taken 3 spoonfulls over night and

3 spoonfulls in y^e morning by persons of a
 Strong Constitution, but for persons of a
 Weak constitution, one Spoonfull att night
 and 2 in y^e morning is enough it should be
 taken 10 days together, tis very good to take
 for y^e gravell or stone adding to it half an
 handfull of an herb called Sarsely Brake-
 stone, tis admirable against y^e green
 sickness, before a pinte is taken it usually
 cures that Distemper after taking it two
 days together, tis fit to Intermit 4 or 5 days
 before you take it againe it is very good to
 bath one for any ach. —

M^{rs} Gulium's Receipt
 of Milk Water. —

Take 2 handfulls of mint and two
 handfulls of Cardus Benedictus and a
 handfull of wormwood and 2 handfulls
 of angelica shred them small and lay them
 in your Still & pour 6 quarts of new milk
 upon your herbs, if you are Carefull you
 may distill 4 quarts. mingle the severall
 runnings together that they may be all
 alike. — it is very good against a surfeit.
 it is likewise good to wash y^e face

How to make the Syrup of Turnups

Take a large Earthen pot, fill it with turnups that are very clean washed, not pared but all the spots and worm eaten pieces cut out pack them down in y^e pot as close as you can then cover y^e pot and passe all y^e edges of it close up that no air may get in, the pot must be large enough at least to hold 12 English quarts Set y^e pot into y^e Oven with the household bread & let it stand soaking in y^e oven after y^e bread is taken out as long as there remains any heat, when you take out y^e pot squeeze all y^e Juice out of y^e turnups to each English pinte of Juice put a pound of sugar & near a quarter of a pound of Liquorish Scrape it very clean before you put it into y^e Liguour, & let it be a little bruised in a mortar, then take y^e Inner rine of athorn that bears flocs, put y^e same quantity of that into your Liguour that you do of Liquorish, & about y^e quantity of a large Walnut of Elicumpaine root, then set your Liguour upon a slow fire & let it boyle very softly till it comes to y^e height of a good Syrup then pass it through a flannel bag & keep it in glass bottles very close stoped, a spoonfull of it taken in y^e morning fasting 2 spoonfulls about 4 a clock in y^e afternoon & a spoonfull at night when you are going to bed is esteemed an excellent remedy for a Consumption and a most certaine cure for an ordinary cold

To Cure an Ague

If it be in Spring, take 4 tops of nettles
moisten them in wine or beer as you please
then straine out y^e Juice & drink a good
beer Glass full of it an hour before your
fitt comes. If be in Winter you must get
y^e Juice out of y^e roots & 'twill have the same
Effect; it commonly cures y^e first time but
seldom or never fails y^e second (as y^e Lady
Elizabeth Hatcher assures. — approved

My Lady Dalavall's receipt
for y^e Sciatica approved.

Take three ounces of Beeswax 3 on^s of
Stonepitch 3 ounces of white pitch 3 on^s.
of Rosen y^e quantity of a little Egg or
Walnut of Ducks grease, or sweet butter
all boyled together plaister wise, which
spread on a piece of new Sheeps Leather
and made into a sock must be drawn

An admirable Balsam.

Take a quart of 4th Spirits of Sack in a Double
glass bottle, of a Bottle. of Sassaaparilla the
Strings cut out 4 ounces, of Virginia Snakeweed
an ounce & half, wipe cleane Sassaaparilla &
split into 4 quarters a fingers Length. put
these into 4th bottle & let it stand till 4th Spirits
be as yellow as gold, then take from it the
Sassaaparilla & put to it of Gum Guyacum
beaten in a hot stone mortar to a fine powder
eight ounces, stop it close and set in the sun
or where it may have a moderate heat 16 or
20 days, shaking it 3 or 4 times day till
4th gum be dissolved then straine it & add to it
an ounce & half. of Balsom of Peru
which you must mix well with it so keep
it for use

It is good for an Inward Bruise ulcer

To make Rubarb Water.

Take 2 ounces of 4th best rubarb dried before
4th fire or in an oven then beat it into fine
powder, take plague Water, Surfitt Water and
Juniper Water of each one pinte put them
all together into a glass bottle & then put
in 4th rubarb & stop it close up setting it
in the sun or by the fire for a month
shaking it very often then keep it for

your use, you may give 3 Spoonfulls to
 a man & 2 to a woman but a little more
 or less will do no harm,
 for want of these waters you may put
 In 3 pintes of y^e best Brandy —
 It is an excellent remedy against the

Take of Sappaparilla 5 ounces, 2 ounces of
 flinty China put them into 5 Quarts of
 Spring Water, which must stand before the
 fire 7 or 8 hours, then let it boyl down

 an hour before it is taken off put In a
 quarter of an ounce of Coriander Seed, and
 half an ounce of yellow Saunders, then strain
 it off & drink a quart aday for 6 Weekes

Take of Sappaparilla cut 4 ounces, China 2 ounces
 Lentinwood 2 ounces, Hartshorne, Ivory, and
 White saunders half an ounce of each, Infuse
 them 12 hours in a gallon of Spring water
 then add six ounces of raisins of y^e sun whole
 and boyl it to 2 quarts adding a little before
 it is done half an ounce of red saunders,
 Liquorish & Corianderseed of each a quarter
 of an ounce then strain it off & drink a
 quart aday —

How to cure a Dropsy which
certainly cured a man given over by 4^e Physicians

Take the Bark of an Ash tree, tis best in the
Spring pull off the out side the inside vine -
that you must use is red. put four handfulls of
it into 3 quarts of Spring water, Let it stand
close stoped up in an Earthen pot 3 days and
3 nights, then Let 4^e person drink of it the
quantity of half an English pint for nine
mornings together fasting & as much all
night when he is going to bed, about an hour
after taking it in y^e morning, 4^e person must
walk for 2 hours, till he sweats Extreamly
4^e first 2 or 3 days 4^e person will be Very sick
with this medecin, but it is a very certain cure
4^e person that was cured by it was Swelled to a very

Take three Gallons of Brandy & three
gallons of anniseed water, and two quarts
of poppy water, pover them into an Earthen

three ounces of Liquorish, all these must be
Sliced, then take two ounces of Cinnaomon
and one of Mace, half an ounce of Cloves

Into Every gallon of Drink put a pound of Rincoroots which must be blanched like almonds & hard pith must be thrown away & they must be beat to massh, put them in a thin Tiffiny bag when you put the Hopps in and put that bag afterwards into y^e Vessel while it is working — This is m^{rs} Caldo's Receipt also. —

M^{rs} Dixey's Black Blaister for a Fistula in the Eyes or any other part it will also cure a Bruise a sprain or any green Wound

Take half a pinte of y^e best Sallet Oyl & a quarter of a pound of Red Lead, and Boyl them together, till it comes to a falue, then put in 6 penny worth of Sarmesette, & keep stirring them together, then put in a spoonfull or two of y^e best Brandy, & boyl them together, then put in a bag & when it is cold if your fingers doe not stick to it, tis Enough, it must be stirred till it is quite cold, it must likewise be pretty cold when you put in y^e Brandy or else it will fly in your face.

A Gargarism

for a sore throat or any wound outwardly.

Take Sage wormwood Ling foil rosmary, Collombine Dries Leaves, roft tree, Honey suckle, plantin & raspberry Leaves of each a like quantity, four ounces of Bole almonee, boyl all these in a sufficient quantity of water, being small cut before you take it from y^e fire, & let it stand till it be cold, strain it, & add to y^e second part when it is settled so every ~~half~~ ^{half a pinte} an ounce of honey with a small quantity of allum, let it stand till cold then bottle it up & keep it for your use. —

Balsam of Sulphur

Take a quart of y^e best Oyl of olives put it into a well glazed bottle pot, then put in 4 ounces of y^e best flower of brimstone, & set it upon a moderate fire, Let it boyl about six hours or till y^e brimstone is Entirely melted, which you may see by dropping a little upon any thing that is cold, you must keep stirring it all y^e while it is on y^e fire, & y^e pot you boyl it in must not be near full, for it is apt to rise when you take it off y^e fire, put in a quarter of an ounce of Chymicall oyl of annis seed & keep stirring it half an hour then put it into a vessel that may be close stopp'd you may take about 15 or 20 drops at night & morning it is y^e usuall Dose — It is good for a cold Decay in y^e breast

A Bitter Draught

Take Gentian root & slice it thin put it into a pint of Clean water & let it boyl a quarter of an hour, then take of Sentry, Cammomil flowers & y^e tops of Cardis Benedictus of each as much as you can take up between your two fingers & your thumb, put them into y^e same water Let them Infuse an hour before y^e use covering them close in an Earthen pipkin if you will have it purging you must put in twice as much Sene & drink this att twice being cold you may mingle it with wine & then it will serve three or 4 mornings.. it is Excellent for purifying y^e blood.

The Earle of Rutlands receipt for y^e Biles —

Take some figgs, slit them & toast them, then
Dip them in brandy & lay them to the place
where you feel your paine as hot as you can
suffer them one after another, as they cool lay
may on for about an hour. —

The Scotch Bils

Take half a pound of aloes *Sucatriana* in powder
half an ounce of y^e powder of Saffran, an ounce
of cristall minerrall beat to powder, half an ounce
of y^e flower of brimstone, half an ounce of y^e
powder of Coriander seed, half an ounce of y^e powder
of Carraway seed, half an ounce of the powder
of Burdock seed, half an ounce of y^e powder of
Canell seed, half an ounce of y^e powder of parsley
seed, y^e aloes must be boyled in brandy over a
slow fire in an earthen pot, put all y^e seeds
in a little water strain them through a linnen
cloth & put y^e Juice of them to y^e aloes & Saffron
& brandy, Let them all boyl over a slow fire
till they be thick, Stir them with a stick all
y^e time, after it is cold roll it up in pills, take
one every night, before supper, they are very
good for a swelling, they purge the head and
you may^{go} any where about your business.

Conferve of Heips

Take a quantity of Heips take out y^e pips, & put them
into an earthen pot, then put them well covered in
y^e cellar till y^e heips are rotten then pass them
through a ^{setch} ~~strainer~~, & boyl y^e Sugar to Siropp, then put
Equall weight of Sugar & Heips & boyl them 2 or 3
boyls & take y^e biggness of a nutmeg att any time
y^e Cough takes you — they need not be rotten but soft enough
to pass through a hair Sieve you must take out all y^e inside and
must gather them before they are too soft

The Salsey water

Take of Cowslippes, Rosemary, Sage flowers —
 Bittenerie, burridge biglose flowers, Lillies of y^e
 Valley, orange flowers, of each one large hand-
 full as they blossom, put every one by themselves
 in a wide mouth glass, that holds an English pint
 & pour as much Spirit of wine upon them as
 will cover them, & stop them very close, with
 a cork & a bladder or a piece of Leather, & keep them
 till y^e Lavander blows then take of these flowers
 one gallon & steep them in two quarts of y^e same
 Spirit of wine as y^e other flowers were there
 must be six quarts in all, when y^e Lavander hath
 stood 8 or 10 days, put all these things into an
 Alimbeck & put to them balm & motherwort
 Day leaves orange leaves of each an ounce
 cut them small, then take of Citorn Bil-
 oring Bill, Lemon Bill, pionet seed hulled of
 each Six Drachms, Cinnamon, nut meags, maa
 Coriander of each an ounce, Jububs, a good
 half pound y^e Stones must be taken out and
 cut very small, put all these into y^e alimbeck
 with y^e rest stop up your Alimbeck very well
 & Draw from it three quarts or more if you

 red roses Dried red Sanders, yellow Sanders
 of each an ounce, hang the bag with all
 these things in it in y^e glass with y^e first spirits
 stoped very close, Let it stand six weekes then
 strain it & put it into glass Bottles, stoped
 very well, & tied down very close & it will keep
 20 years, then put y^e second water to y^e bag
 & let it stand as long as y^e other then strain
 it & put it into bottles stoped close —
 nota y^e musc would be better left out because
 of its strong smell & perfume —

put 2 ounces of red Sanders made into fine powder
& let it boyl till all y^e water & wine be consumed

time it rises or offers to run over take it from
y^e fire till it falls down, & when you shall see
no more Sim. rise it is enough, & so you may
straine it into pots for your use.

An ounce of Cinnamon 2 penny worth of cloves

To Stop Bleeding

Take toad Spawn and dip some old cloth in it & dry it in y^e air, dip it again & dry it again, so do three or four times, & when you need it, dip y^e cloth in fair water & lay it round about y^e wound & not on it, & for y^e nose Lye it about the left hand wrist
The water of y^e Spawn distilled in a rose Still is very good you must bath y^e place with it

To stop Spitting of Blood

Take 3 spoonfuls of y^e juice of Comphry red nettles & plantine twice or three times every day till the spitting of blood ceases

To stop bleeding att y^e NOSE take flower of sulphur put it in a quill & blow it up that nostrill y^e bleeds

For a great Looseness y^e powder.

Take of y^e Troches of Spodium & of y^e Troches of Diatema & of Diarodian Abbitis of each an equal quantity, powder them very fine & mix them well together & give about 20 grains every morning fasting & last att night in y^e following Liquor.

Take some of y^e fruit of a Shumack tree: a good quantity of y^e middle rinde of black thorn, & some Cinnamon and boyle them in fair water, then add to it some red wine or Claret & sweeten it with Syrrup of Quinces or Cedarberries or if you have not these with Loaf sugar
Let y^e party take y^e powder in this Liquor & drink a draught of it after it

For an Obstinate Looseness nothing can be better then to take 15 or 20 grains of Rhubarb toasted or dried by y^e fire & made into fine powder mix it with a little Conserve of red roses & so swallow it, or else take it in y^e Syrrup of dried red roses, you must take it in y^e morning fasting & about an hour after drink a small draught of some thin broth if need require repeat this every third day. you may be confident of y^e Cure Especially if y^e Looseness be caused by any sharp humours in y^e bowels

To stop Looseness in Childbed or any other Take half a pinte of right Claret or as much water with a Crust of bread some loaf Sugar & good store of Ciinamon grossly beaten. Boyle all these for a quarter of an hour. then take it off y^e fire & add to it y^e yolks of two Eggs well beaten. & set it over y^e fire till it be ready to boyle. Let y^e party drink half of it att a time & repeat it as often as there shall be need you must Sweeten it to your taste.

D^r. Sydenham's anti Scorbutick drink
Sage, Scuroygrass, Orroomtops, Centuary tops of each four handfuls dried of Wormwood three handfuls three oranges sliced rinde & all six nutmegs. two ounces of juniper berries & two ounces of horse raddie roots put these into six gallons of very strong ale while it is working, when it is fine draw it out of the Vessel as you drink it & do not bottle it. you may add some yarrow to y^e above herbs.

Mr Lowdham's Dyet Drink

To four gallons of middling Ale put four ounces of
 y^e root of Polypodium of y^e Oak, six ounces of Sena
 one ounce & half of Rhubarb sliced, four handfulls of
 Sea Scurvi grass, six handfulls of Stars tongue leaves,
 Water crepe & brooklines of each five handfulls, y^e

Castle Soaps taken in white wine or bean skid water
 or Cucumber or horse raddie water hath also eased &
 helped many y^e Soaps must be scraped or sliced thin
 & taken in one spoonfull drinking five or six after
 it half white wine & half of these waters have sometimes
 been most effectuell.

If y^e pains in y^e reins are very grievous take one ounce
 of unguent de Althea & a dram or two of Oyle of sweet
 almon's mix these well together & anoint y^e back near
 y^e Kidneys.

This is also of much use in a pleurisie.

For y^e Strangury

Take a Large Onion Slice it thin Steep it in a draught of white wine for 12 hours & then drink y^e wine & use moderate Exercise.

Colebatch. for a Suppression of Urine give a Large draught of Vinegar repeat it two or three times

For Stoppage of urine

Take an ounce & half of horse raddish thin Sliced Boyl it in a quart of Ale a good while then take half a pint of it & put into it 30 dropsof y^e oyle or Spirit of Turpentine & a Spoonfull of Oximell Squills. you may repeat this 2. 3. or 4 times aday if occasion y^e horse raddish alone is good if you heenty other things

For y^e Stone

Take a good quantity of y^e berries of white thorn & pull off y^e stems & pound them very small then put as much white wine as will make them like flower milk. distill it in a rose Still, stirring it once in half an hour that it may not burn it must be done every year about michaellmas you must drink about half a pint three mornings following att every full moon.

A Syrup. to be taken att night when you take y^e Hau water y^e next morning Take an ounce of y^e Syrup or Decoction of Althea, one Dram of y^e Seeds of Mallows & half a dram of Salprunella. mix all these & take about a Spoonfull in a draught of posset

Escolo

Infused & taken as tea is good for y^e Gravel

For y^e Stone approved

Take half an ounce of Lignum Nephriticum or Skinney wood Steep it in a quart of milk water & drink it in y^e morning 3 or 4 ounces mixed with 4 Spoonfulls of white wine or y^e Water of Stawes (white thorn berries) fast two hours after it, take this every fortnight or three weeks.

For y^e Yellow Jaundice or Ague

To a pint of white wine put some Turmeric, Saffran & Treacle beat y^e turmeric small, dry y^e Saffran & make it into powder, mix all together & drink it a little warm in y^e morning fasting & at night also if you please three or four times taking is enough to cure you

To drink Store of posset in which Artichoake leaves have been boyled hath also cured many

To Stop Violent Vomitting in a fit of y^e Stone or otherwise.

Take a good handfull of Burnet boyle it in a draught of posset drink & repeat it as often as you need

For y^e Yellow Jaundice

33 Castile Soap 1 ounce & half, Six penny worth of Saffran infuse y^e third part in a quarter of pinte of white wine over night strain it & drink it warm y^e next morning so do for 3 mornings y^e above Soap & Saffran will serve 3 times an approved medicine

D^r. Sydenham's Liquid Laudanum

Take of Opium two ounces, Safran one ounce, Cloves

You must pound all y^e abovesaid herbs or those you can most conveniently get, but such as are marked (✗) ought not to be omitted. pound them in a mortar, pouring in by little & little of good whitewine, y^e y^e herbs may be y^e more easily pounded. put them in an earthen pot y^e herbs must be covered with white wine, which will be about 3 quarts. cover y^e pot & put it in a fresh cold place untill y^e morning following then you must straine it through a new linnen Cloth, wringing out all y^e juice you can with two sticks & put y^e juice into a Clean brass pan

An Excellent Sear cloth for Aches or Corns

Take an ounce of Litarge of gold two ounces of white

a pinte of Oyl. untill it reams as you stir it with your
stick & lift it up, then have your Dowlas in readines
& dip it in y^e Same & keep it for your use.

An excellent Green Balsame

Take red Sage & Rue of each a pound, young bay leaves & wormwood, of each half a pound, wash them not but stamp them, then take 3 pounds of Mutton Suet hot from y^e sheep & mince it small & stamp it with y^e herbs till it be all of one Colour, then add to it a pottle of y^e best Oyl-olive & work it well together, then put it into an earthen pot stop it well, & set it in a cold place eight days, then boyl all together on a soft fire, being half boyl'd, put into it four ounces of Oyl of Spike, let this boyl a little & strain it, let it boyl till it be very green y^e month of May is y^e prime time for making it, if it be well stop't it will keep good many years.

Some properties of this Balsame

It is good for y^e Stone being rub'd in well on y^e reins, a quantity of half a peece chafed in y^e ears & stop't with black wool helpeth all pains, it is good for aches, felons, a swaging of anguish (anointing y^e wound round about) tooth ache bruises, Cramps, Stitches Stiffness of Limbs in man or beast for hardness or Swellings in womens breasts & for healing them being broken.

For y^e Cramp

Take pearl & red Corall of each ten graines (being finely powdered) of y^e powder of a dead man's Scull Philosophically prepared Six graines, & Six graines of y^e powder of an Elks hoof, mix these together & take it in a spoonfull of Syrrup of Gillyflowers & drink a little draught of Black-Cherry water after it, do this first in y^e morning & last att night seven days.

This & y^e following bath did abundance of good to y^e old Lady Yonge. D^r Thurston prescribed it to her.

The Bath for y^e Cramp.

Take rose-mary & Sage a good quantity of each & boylit in 2 gallons of fair water, a pretty while then take it off & when it is cool enough put in your legs, keep them there about half an hour. go into a warm bed, do this for severall nights. 3 Stone horse hairs tied above y^e knee has eased many

M^r. Northcots receipt for a Dropisie

Take 4 lemons cut in Slices, a few angelic roots cut
small, 12 Scorsonarie roots cut in bits, of fennel seed, ~~Skeivet~~
Coriander Carraway & annis seeds of each one ounce, a
handfull of juniper berries & half an ounce of Myrrh half a
pound of sugar & two bottles of brandy, infuse it a fortnight &
run it through y^e bag, it is very good to prevent Infection
drinking a Spoonfull mornings.

Lord Lamberts Water

Take of moderate Spirit of wine & y^e best
 Canary of each a quart, anniseed & Carraway seeds
 bruised of each 2 ounces, nutmegs, & ginger, 30
 grains of each bruised, stoned raisins 6 dosen, dates
 4 dosen, put all these into y^e Violl to y^e Canary stop
 it close, then put into y^e Spirits of wine 5 ounces of
 y^e best Castor with skins bruise them & put it into
 another bottle stop up both Violls very close, & let
 them stand in y^e Sun 10 days, shaking them twice
 a day & now & then give a little vent, then mix both
 liquors together shake them well & let them stand 5
 days longer in y^e Sun shaking it as before then strain it
 out & stop it close & keep it for your use. add 4 ounces of
 Liquorish to y^e Infusion in y^e Canary. very good for
 Convulsions & a few drops in a glass of water or wine

Surfitt Water my Sister Duke's receipt

Take a peck & half of red poppies, put them to six
 quarts of Orandy add thereto one pound of raisons
 of y^e Sun stoned, one pound of figgs sliced, Cloves
 ginger anniseed, sweet fennell seed, Coriander seed of each
 one ounce, 3 ounces of Liquorish, bruise the Spices and y^e
 seeds, slice y^e Liquorish & bruise it in a mortar, put all
 these in an earthen pot with a Cover into y^e brandy
 & poppies, let it Infuse 9 days then strain it through
 a flannel Bag & add to it one pound of brown
 Sugar Candy powdered then bottle it up.
 it is very good for a Surfitt or to remove any thing

from y^e Stomack, also in violent vomittings
purgings, or if both come together, in fainting fits or
for women in Childbed or in feavers, to procure rest
or for pains in y^e head, it is an Excellent Settle.

2 or 3 spoonfulls att a time is enough — it is
an excellent water.

After you have strained out these Ingredients from
y^e Brandy, you may add to them 4 or 5 quarts of
good Ale & half a handfull of Balsme & so of mint
Angelica & Dragon & Distill it in a cold Still.

Aqua Mirabilis

Take Cardamoms, Cubebs, Gallinall, Melilot flowers
Ginger, Nutmegs, Cloves, Mace, of each of these one dram
of Cinnamon two drams & make it all into a fine powder
then put thereto a pint of Brandy & three pints of good
white wine & a pint of y^e juice of Sallendine & y^e juice
of Oralm & Spear Mint of each a quarter of a pint
put all these into a rose Still & stop it close & let it stand

Take Gillowflowers single or double, (y^e yellow ones are best) of Rosemary flowers of each 5 handfulls, of Damask rose Burrage & Buglose flowers, 4 handfulls of each, two handfulls of Balm, of Pinks & marygolds of each eight handfulls, twelve handfulls of Clove Gillowflowers eight handfulls of Cowslips, one handfull of Cinnamon grossly beaten Six penny worth of Saffran, put all these into a pottle of Sack & let it steep 3 or 4 days stirring it well every day, then Distill it in a Rose Still, pasting y^e Sides of y^e Still very close. Let it drop on Six ounces of white Sugar Candy.

M^r Jefferys Cordial water

Take red poppies, rue, red sage, Salendine, worm-wood, rosa solis, mugwort, pimpernel, dragon, scabious eyrimony, featherfew, balm, Scordium, cardius, bittany flowers & leaves, S^t. Johns wort flowers, Centry flowers & leaves, marygolds, meadow Sweet, flowers & leaves, angelica, of each of these half a pound, angelica roots, male piony, butterbut, tormentell, Ely compaine, zentian, Zedoary Snake roots, Scorsinary Lyquorish, angelica seeds from Citron of each of these one ounce. chop them small or beat them in a mortar. Slice & beat your roots, bruise your seeds & infuse them in a gallon of Sack & one of white wine or some white wine & brandy as you like for strength, if you distill in a cold Still do it with a very quick fire, pasting y^e Still close & keep wet cloaths on y^e head add two pounds of wallnuts pounded. it is good for Surfits, in y^e plague Small pox & measles for women with child, in fits of y^e mother & for children in convulsions, a Spoonfull 2 or 3, 4 or 5, according to the strength of y^e water & patient.

Red Eye water

Take Tutia preparative, Aloes hepaticus, & Sugar Candy, of each one dracmh. Camphir half a dracmh & ounces of white wine, & ounces of red rose water, put them into a bottle & shake them often, till y^e Sugar Candy & Camphir are dissolved, when you use it, put a small quantity of it into a Violl & mix it with a little rose & plantine waters.

This is good for redness, soreness, & itchings of the Eyes or for a filme, or to stay y^e rheume, if y^e Eyes are much inflamed this water is not to be used till y^e Inflammation is taken off by either of the two following medicines.

for a great Inflammation

Take y^e juice of Sallendine & y^e like quantity of y^e Oyl of y^e white of an Egg, beat it with as much allum as a harel nut, & make plaisters of fine flex & Lay them on y^e Eyes, & drop a drop or two of y^e red water.

The other for an Inflammation

Take of Crocus metallorum one Scruple. quince kernels two drachms & infuse it in red rose water Strawberry & plantine waters of each four or five Spoonfulls, shaking it often together then strain it & wet fine raggs & apply it to y^e Eyes.

J.^r Hans Sloan for y^e Eyes.

Take half a dram of Lapis Calaminaris & half a dram of Tutty finely powdered, 2 Spoonfulls of rose water & 2 of plantain, Shake it & wash your Eyes with it as you go to bed & rise & two or three times a day or oftener, shaking it allways, when you use it & let as much as you can go into y^e Eye — you may add a little white sugar Candy — & two Spoonfulls of french white wine

Yellow rodd Salve M^r. Butson's

for y^e wind strain or cuts
 Take rosin 6 ounces, 2 ounces of wax, 2 ounces of frankincense, 6 ounces of Venice turpentine, melt all these together & cast it into a basin of cold water, having first stroke y^e sides of y^e basin with hogs Lard, & before to draw it & work it well before y^e fire & so make it into rolles.

A Desowing Salve.

Take of red lead finely powdered 4 ounces. Oyl of roses 6 ounces, of wax 2 ounces. first melt y^e wax in y^e Oyl then add y^e lead & let it boil over a gentle fire stirring it allways till it looks of a Brown Colour, then take it off y^e fire & add 2 grains of musc being rubd to powder dip Stripes of cloth therein whilst it is hot.

A Drawing Salve.

Take a pint of Oyl half a pound of red lead, a quarter a pound of wax, 2 penny worth of candle Soap, about y^e bigness of ^{French} anut of stone pitch, boyl it well & mix it well & when it is cold enough rub your hands with Oyl & rolle it into rolles.

Paracelsus's Brown Balsome

Take half a pint of Lyseed or Sallet Oyl, half a pound of yellow rosin, 2 ounces of beeswax one ounce of Oraril pitch melt these together in a skellet with 2 ounces of fresh butter. then take it off y^e fire & add to it 2 ounces of Liquid Storax & 2 ounces of Venice Turpentine & stir it till it is melted giving it a gentle heat over y^e fire, it is Excellent for Cramps, as well as Sores & wounds

The spleen Salve

Take white & red Lead of each 4 ounces. Castle Soap 5 ounces good Oyl one pound, boyle all till it comes of a pale colour & to y^e height of a plaister, then add to it Oyl of Bay & good hogs mort of each half an ounce, let it boyle up & it is enough. & when cool enough make it into rolles.

Observe to put y^e soap & Oyl together & melt it down then add y^e white & red lead, as it is apt to rise you must take it off. & set it on y^e fire again you will know when it is enough by trying a little on a cold thing. This plaister is good to be applyed to y^e pilt of y^e Stomach for y^e wind of y^e mother, & for any bruise applying it to y^e afflicted part. for y^e bloody flux applying it to y^e Chine. it is Excellent for those that are troubled with phlegm applyed to y^e mouth of y^e Stomach.

This is one of Aunt Boutfons receipts, who att another place calls it y^e Lead plaister & prescribes 12 ounces of Castle Soap red lead & white lead of each one pound & a pint of Oyl, made to use as above & leaves out y^e Oyl of Bay & hogs mort. She valued this Salve very much & says it must be kept as very precious

Another Spleen Plaister of Aunt Boutfons.

Take y^e juice of hemlock 6 ounces. vineger of oxine Squills 8 ounces. in which dissolve 8 ounces of Gum Amoniack by infusion two days stirring it often then give it a heat & strain it through a bag, then boyl off y^e vineger

is juice, then take it off y^e fire & add to it 3 ounces
of bees wax. plaister of Mellilote 2 ounces. oylment
of Althea one ounce. powder of oris half an ounce
which must be put in Last Oesopus half an ounce
stir it till it be well melted & mixt together & when
cold make it into rolles your hands wet wth vinegar

An Excellent healing Salve

given to me in france, where I see a great
many good Experiments of it.

Take a pound of Cerafe & two pounds of y^e best Oyl
put it in a new earthen pipkin or other vessel that
will fitt. over a moderate fire. stirring it almost
continually for 12 hours. y^e next day you must
put it on warm ashes wth a few coales & by degrees
make it boyle softly, you may know when it is
enough by dropping a little on paper & wet y^e end of

Take a quart of Vineger or Sharp Cyder as you can get then take a quantity of barley meal according to your discretion then take one pound of polypodium of $\frac{1}{2}$ Oak Scraped very clean & beaten very small in a wooden dish then put them into the vineger adding to it some red lead to give it a Colour. & Stir it all together till it comes to $\frac{1}{2}$ thickness of a pultis & so apply it & as you find it grow dry you must put on fresh pultis & so continue it by often Exchanging & in a little time you will see its good Effects.

you may add some oyl of Turpentine & the pultis will be $\frac{1}{2}$ better.

For Swollen Leggs

To a pinte of water put six Spoonfulls of vineger & a handfull of salt. warm it so as to melt $\frac{1}{2}$ Salt, then dip linnen cloths & wrap $\frac{1}{2}$ leg or leggs going to bed putting over it some beet leaves or cole leaves & this do for severall nights.

For Chilblines

Apply to them $\frac{1}{2}$ paps of a golden pippin soaked an hour in brandy

Oyl of S^t John's Wort

Eight ounces of Castile soap 4 of nitre 4 of powdered Rosin make it into eight Balls with honey give 3 a week it may be taken with at graze

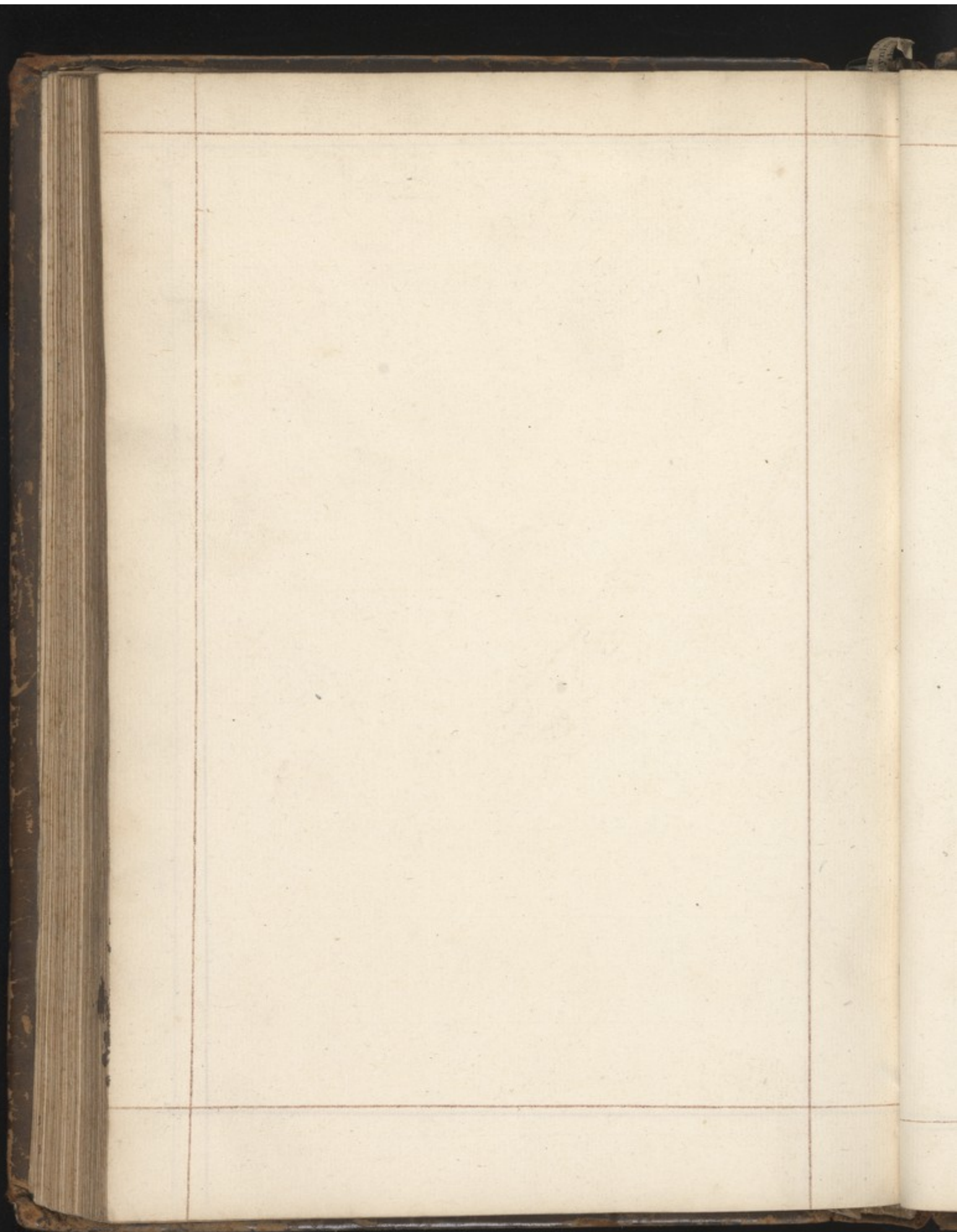

How to make an admirable white
varnish for Japan work —

Take a quart of spirit of wine put to
it two ounces of black gums & four
ounces of gum of Amomy and two ounces
of sandern, beat the gums & shake
them well with y^e spirit, stop the bottle
very close & tie a string to the neck of
it & hang it in a kettle of water, so that
the bottom touch not y^e bottom of y^e kettle
keep a gentle fire under it, but let not
the water be hotter then you can suffer your
hand in it, keep it thus five or six hours
then take it out & let it stand by the
fire 10 or 12 hours, you need not strain
it but draw it off into another bottle

Mr. Middleton's varnish for
Japan work —

Take 2 ounces of gum lac, wash it very
clean then dry it by the fire in a clean
lute covered over with paper then put
it into a large bottle which will hold
2 quarts, & put in that bottle only one
bottle of y^e spirit of wine, with two
ounces of gum & let it stand three or
four days together over an oven the
bottle must be very close stoped —

you repeat 4 Varnish, that your brush
be very clean, & that you keep your Varnish
not well covered between the whilst you
did your brush into it, let your boxes
stand 4 or 10 days at least before you
use them. The softening part is
done with some Turpentine scraped into
very fine powder & rubed upon your boxes
with some fine linen or cloth dyed
in water Oyl 'tis is very smooth then
take another Clean soft Rag & rub idly
with white powder such as is made for
the Hair without any gum in it.

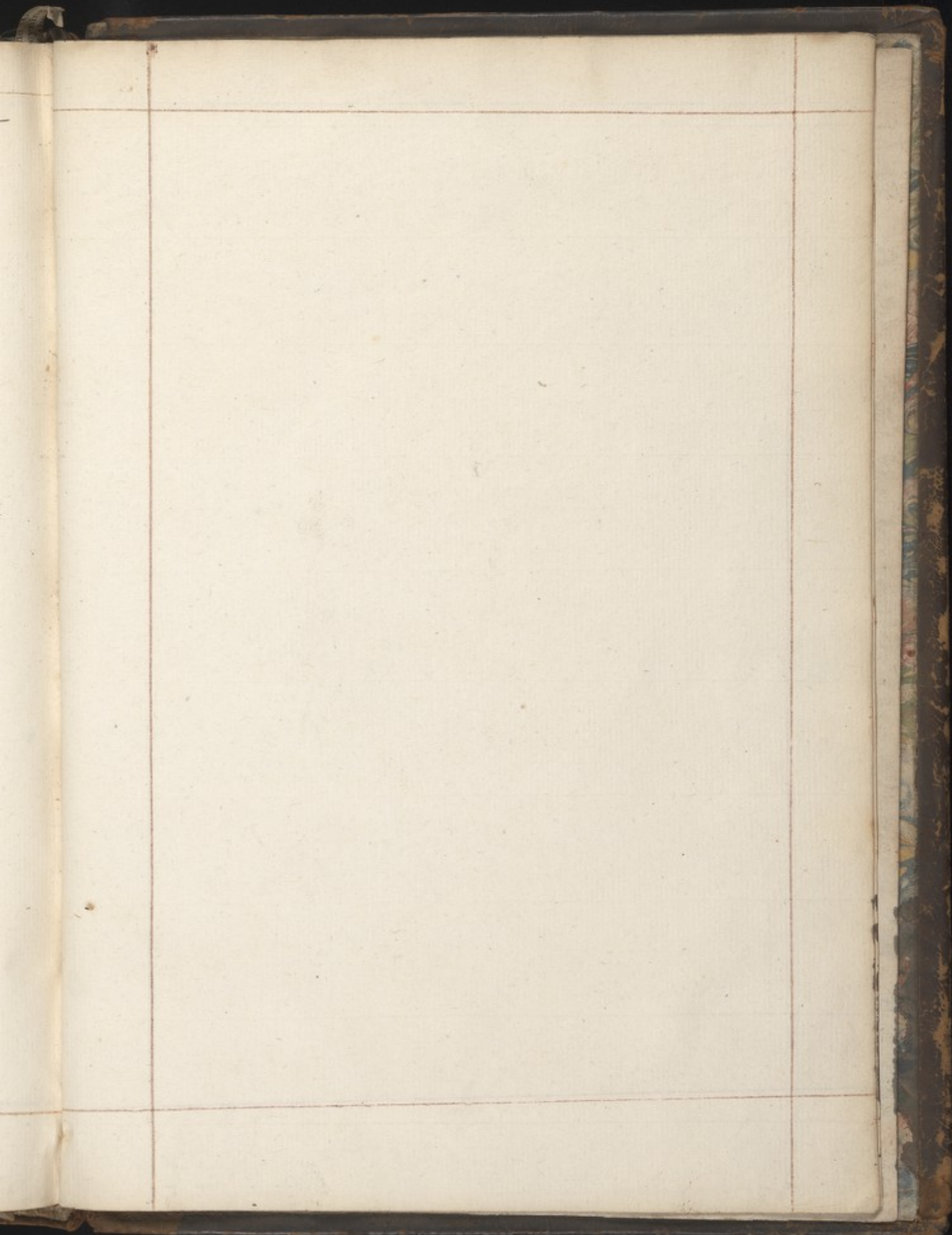

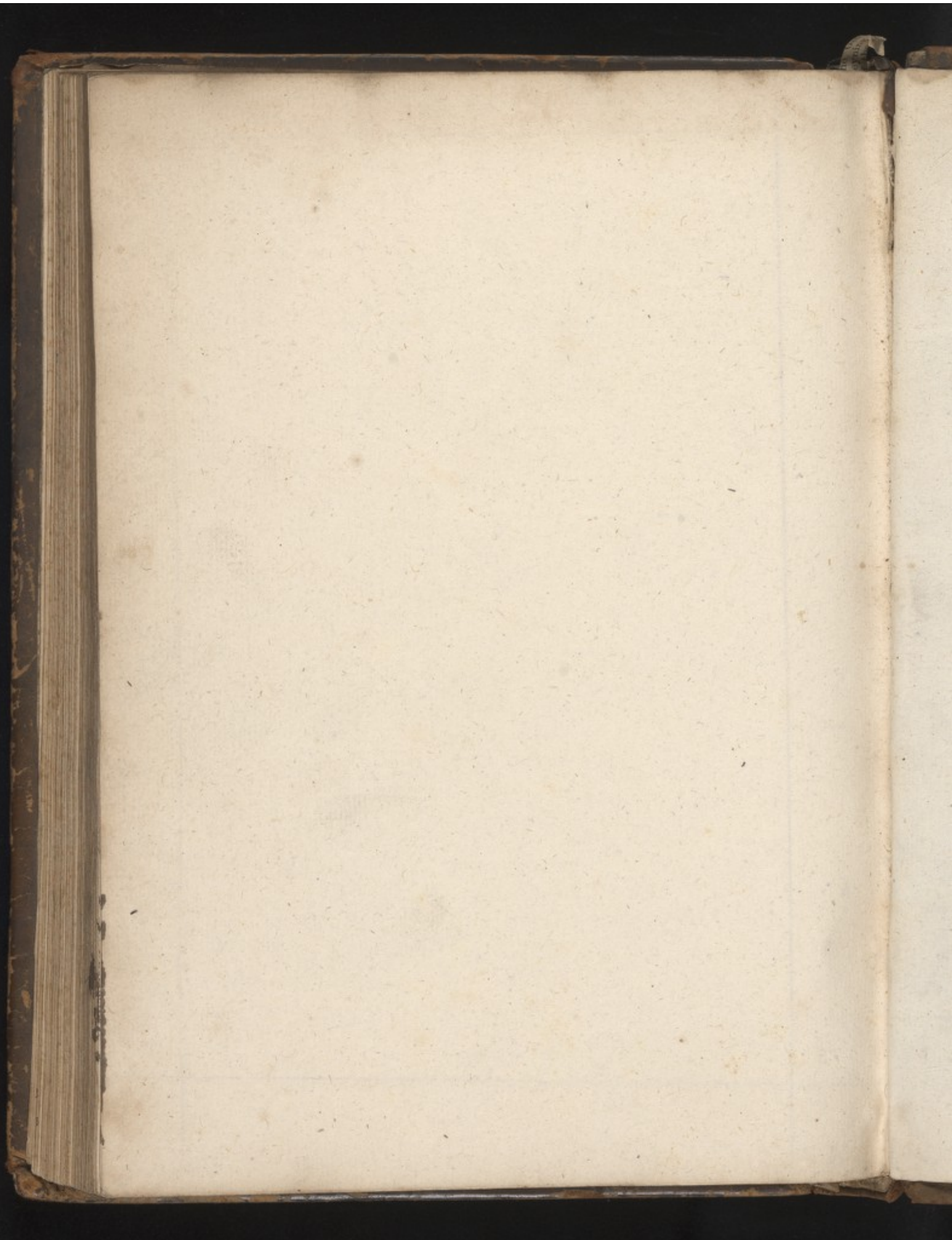

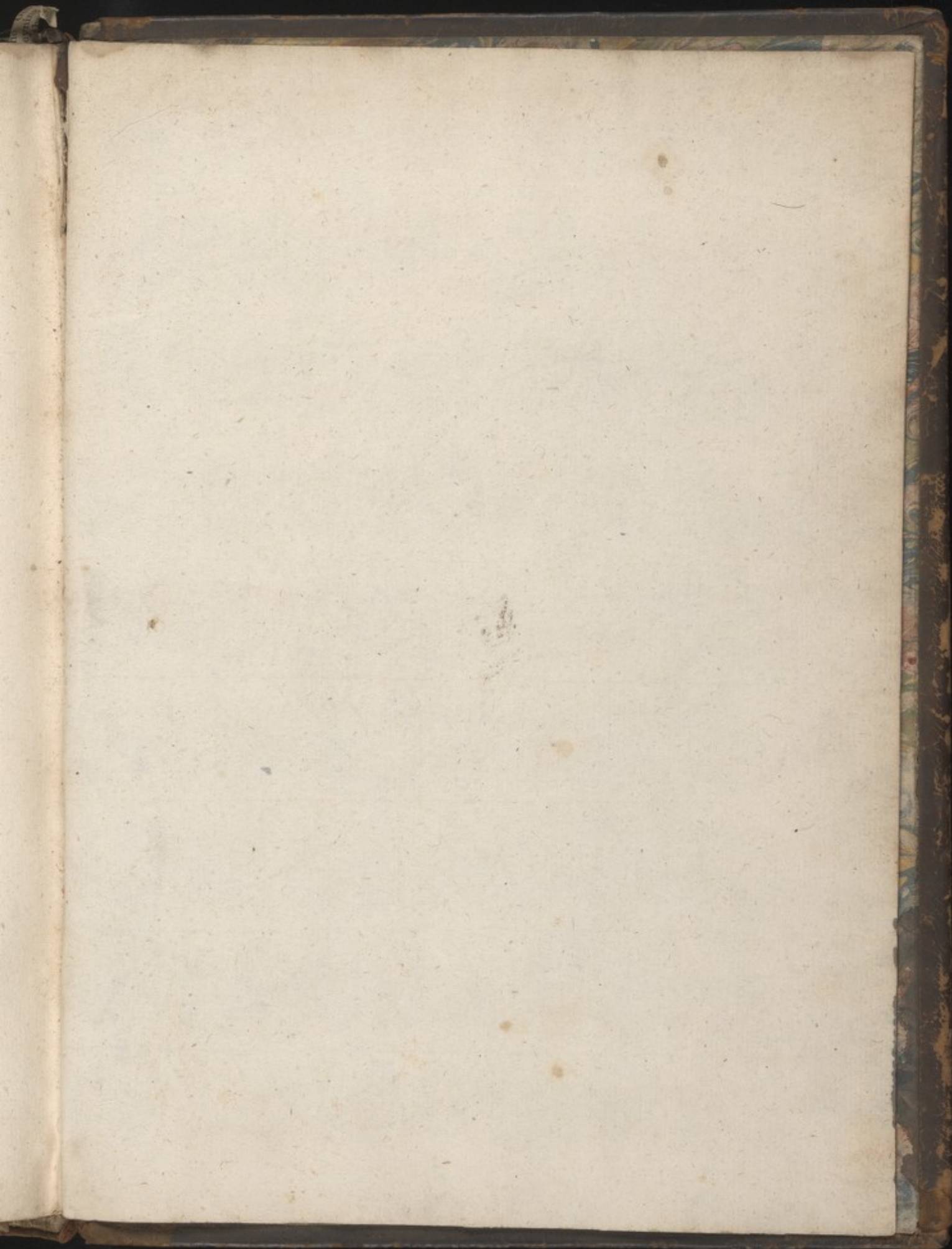

layd on 18 times. —

be Vermilion mixed with y^e Varnish layd
on for y^e ground work of y^e Black it must
be repeated 6 times. —

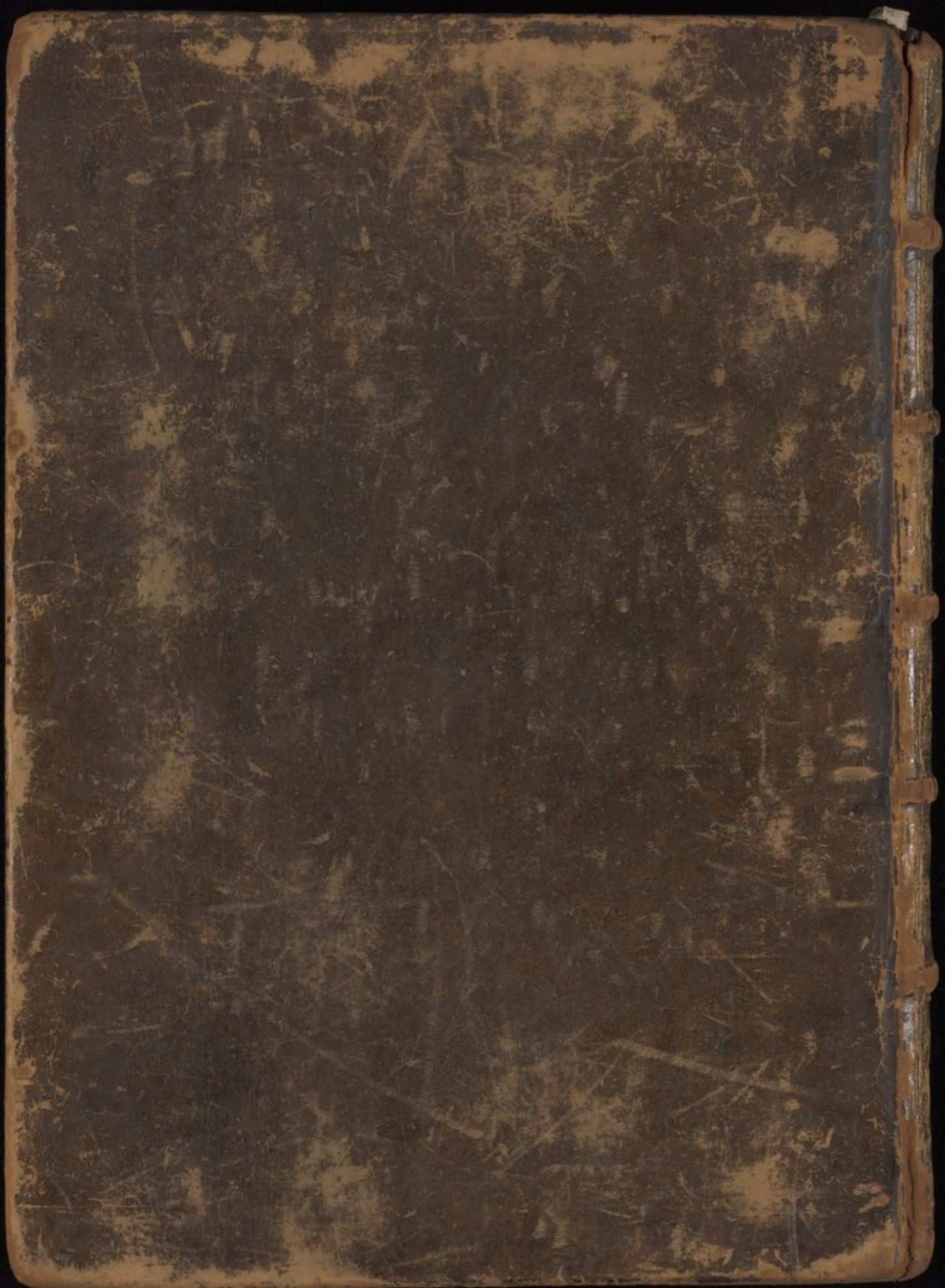










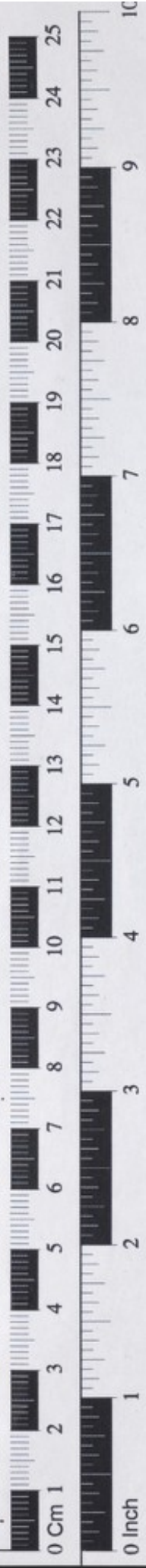

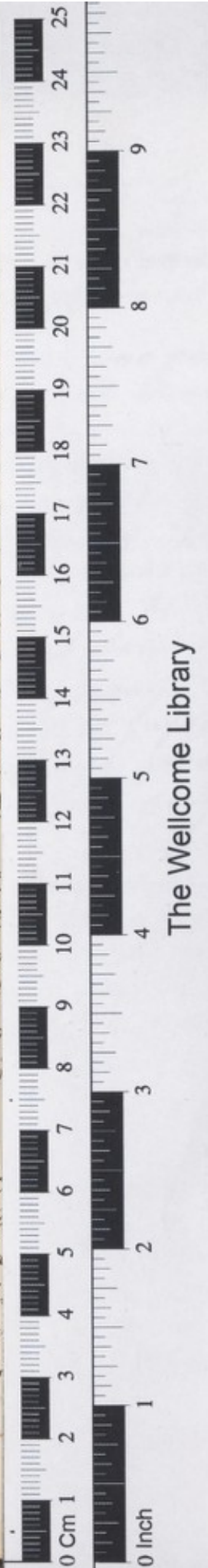
