Translation of letter from Fl. Defays, Chemist, Chatelet, Belgium, dated 24th Jan. 1905, received here 26th Jan. 1905, addressed to Mr. Wellcome.

Thave at home two bronze mortars 20 and 25 centimetres high which are not at all extraordinary as regards form, but which may be of interest to your exposition because of their origin. I think a great deal of them, but would consent to lend them to you. Here is their history:-

Towards the end of the 18th century, there was in Fleurus, province of Hainaut, a chemist named Pasquier, who was a great amateur collector of historic souvenirs. About 1793, the French revolutionists entered the little town as conquerors and set fire to the church. The bells melted in the steeple and as a souvenir of the episode, Pasquier had a mortar made for his pharmacy from a part of the débris. In 1819 after the famous of Waterloo, Pasquier like a great number of his fellow-citizens went to the field where Napoleon had fallen - Fleurus is only separated from Waterloo by about 3 leagues. He took some fragments of cannon as a souvenir of the field of battle, and mhad a second mortar made from them as a match for the other. His son Charles succeeded him and he after a few years left Fleurus and came to live in Chatelet. After having practised pharmacy for 50 years he retired in 1890 handing over his pharmacy to me and the two historic souvenirs of which he himself told me the story. Awaiting your reply, etc.

The reading of this book causes a deep emotion, because many of the medicaments which are thought to be modern nowadays, were already known in those times in which medicine reached such a great splendout. Thus, for instance refering to Alums, it says:

O NOW ,909

"Alums are useful to excrescences of the gums, and to "the uvula and to purulent glands"

Therefore, they already knew the properties of this body. The same thing happens as regards armonia of which they knew the property of curing drunkeness.

The said book was written by Dioscorides Anazarbeo, called "the freckled" and of whom Pliny and Suidas have mentioned, the latter writes saying:-

"Dioscorides Anazarbeo, Physician called the freckle owing to the freckles he had on his face, lived with "Cleopatra and Anthony and wrote XXIIIImedicinal books very celebrated by the universal world".

It was translated into Castilian by Dr. Laguna who was Dr. to Pope Jules III and the edition made was very short in number, and this is so indeed, that notwithstanding the enquiries I have made both in the State Libraries as in private libraries, I have not been able to find another copy. Undoubtedly owing to the ignorance in those days they would throw it away without understanding its just and immense value.

Dr. Laguna added in it a good number of notes and comment of positive utility.

Dear Doctor kindly do me the kindness when writing, to inform me how it is to be sent and conditions and guarantees which I shall have, so that the book is neither lost nor damaged, as this would cause me great grief as I value it very much.

P.S. I was forgetting to say, that the Discorides is a volume containing 616 pages in large quarto, divided into 5 books, and has numerous illustrations of plants and animals.


