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

For a Mad Dogg

Take Row, masher of time, & a little Angelica, boyle them in new milk
just thirry with them 2 or 3 roots of Paganilly, 3 or 4 cloves of
partick brasted boyle all gently a good space then strain out the milk put
to it a little Mithridate, & swag thirry a little Mithridate, if washing
that forme; put there 2 or 3 quozfulls of colicade oyle; if the dog will
not take it, pour it into him twice a day and let him see

An approved Medicine agst the Scurvy

Take 3 pint of Chalmery; boyle thirry half an hourfull of Sage, as much
Row, with one pint be watted, strain it, and sett it on the fire again, put in
it is worth of long pepper half an ounce of pepper, a quarter of an ounce
of Nutmeggs, well beaten together, lett it boyle a little, then put there 2
worth of Mithridate, 2^d of Treacle, a quarter of a pint of hot America
water, take it warme morning and evening a spoonfull at a time if you be already
diseas'd, sweat upon it; if not, once a day a spoonfull is sufficient; In all the
diseas's, which come from the scurvy man, whether the cold be decreas'd by the Medicine
if the heart were not wholly mortified & decayed by the same & for the taking
of it, this is extremely good for the small pox & measles

An Antidote against Plague

Take conserve of maceothere & mithridate, or Venice treacle, & mingle
them together like an Electuarie, take the Quantity of a halmy morning
& night

An excellent medicine for a green wound or old sore

The yellow
Salve. Take Resin & pyrosia of each halfe a pound, Virgins wax & frankincense
of each a quart of white Charlock an ounce, of hearts tullen a quart of a Consphire
2 drams that is not to be melted, but make a powder of it; then boyle them
in the fire together & strain it through a cleane cloth into a pottle of white
wine, then boyle it & let it coole a little, then put into it a quarter of a
pint of Turpentine, stir it well together untill it be cold, or keep it for your use
It is the best ointment that may be gotten, and hath these Vertues
If health be now wound, it suffereth no corruption in a wound, so all
flesh to be murther'd, it is good for bruisings, singings in the brain, all Ulc-
cers, in the head or body, for swellings in the eyes, for sinews shrunke
or strained, for swellings in the cheeks or prickings of the face; it draweth out
broken bones, it is good for the biting of venomous Beests, it healeth all man-
ner of Bitches, fester or chokes, or hollow me-tungere, also in the Gout-
tous or plaies, for swelling of y^e Members & inflammation that comes
therein, And an exceeding good Charcolock for all their greifes is made of this
A Charcolock for a cold Cancer, it is also good for the Haemorrhoids & haile of face.

A Charcolock for a cold Cancer

Take Virgins wax & Deers Surt of each a like quantity, half that quantity
of Turpentine, with a little Sulfur oyle boyle in the fire untill the
the powder of Sack clove & Cinamon, being hot dipp the Charcolock, and
spread it being hot

Another for an hott Cause

Take things above mentioned without the spices & use it as before
A very good Medicine, for y^e Piles
Take chalk & hoggs liguene, mix it to y^e Consistence of a Salve, & anoint y^e
sore thirry a day

A Clyster for a Tympanie

Take Camemile, Pellitorie of the wall, & partly half an hand full of each sort, fennel seed & Anise seed, Boyle all in clear pee-
sew drink, then straine it, & putt therein the yolk of an egge, & a
little salt, give it away as you please.

For the Tympanie

Take hoggs grease partly and small edged put them into an
earthen pott, boyle them together, & after you have purged, apply it
to your paine as hot as you can.

Another

Take thyme, popple, pellitorie of the wall, Succifrage, Cattle crop
white hennel, fennel seed, the fenne, small edged, shallow, Red
lacule seed, Alexander, Rosh roots, Egg shells, an ounce of Seesay
Redd nettles, (lary) Camemile, Savory, Licuoris, Amittide, other
things as many Rayns of the lake, boyle all these in strong Ale
an hour, & put in one pint of white wine, Saffron & Orpiment of
each 2. boyle it againe halfe an hour, then straine it, take of first
last as hot as you can.

Another

Take Camemile worm wood & heart of graie, & fennel seed take a dish
put the eye in it, & lay the heartes a stopp then lay a thin strainer
a top of the dish, & as hot as you can apply it to your eye, & as of
ten to your paine take you, drinking a good draught of pee drink as hot as you can.

An excellent Clyster

M^r Brooks. Take a pint or a quart of clear pee drink, boyle in it a small head full
of Camemile, flowers of shallow, one, a spoon full of Camomile seed, boyle
it all this till the liquor come to a pint, then straine it, put to it
quarter of a pint Butter, y^e yolk of a pipers eye, y^e yolk of an egge &
one large spoon full of honey or cowd sugar both boyled together, put it
into a tubben stir it well, & administer it warm, this may be given to a
woman with child.

A Candle for a woman having a flux in childbed

Char. Take a pint of spring water, & a pint of Claret wine, a stick of Cinamon
the veltes of an egge to a crust of bread, boyle these together to consume it
with leaf sugar, tying her arms to thighs in y^e most fleshy place as hard as she
can suffer you. To clear the Body after Childbirth

Take sage, Rosemary, Salve, Nettles of thyme, sweet Marjoram, penny-
rual of each alike quantitie, boyle them in Ale, straine it, & take of
Sweeten it with powdered sugar, give it warme, a week after her delivary.

Against a filen

Take spring water & wheat flour, hoggs grease, boyle them to a poulty
& apply it as warm as you may, this will break down & heal it, it must
be done twice a day. probat.

A poulty for a sore Breast.

M^r Bonner.

Take

Take the grounds of strong Ale, the brains of white bread, white lye 3.
pouces reduced, shred them, & hoggs grease, apply it twice a day as hot as
you can suffer it, this will heal it, probat.

Against y^e Rheum in Childrens eyes.

Take spring water & white brinde, boyle it to a poulty, apply it warm
morning & evening.

A green Salve for old or new sores.

Take a pound of Resin half a lb. of Bees wax, half a lb. of Oares or
shaps, half a lb. of pitch, boyle them all together till all be melted,
then take it off the fire, put therein one ounce of Turpentine, & two
drams of Oil of Turpentine, stir it well, & after put in a quart of
pale of Ale water, then boyle it till you have made it up in the
poulty.

To bring away y^e After-birth.

Presently after she is brought to bed, let her drink a draught of
pale water, boyle it with Camemile, & penny rual, Camemile is the most
prevalent, Some drink it boyled in their birthdays Wine, you may drink of this
when you are in travell, if this prevail not, let the string of the Afterbirth be
fast tied to her thigh, lay her in Bed, then have in readiness some white
Challice 1. or 2. byens very tender boyled in spring Water, take them
up & lay the water warme thero from thain, & bear them small like
a poulty, also beat the yolk of an egge mix with it, so lay it to her
in the place of nature, if this prevail not apply more when this is
done, if it do as long as you think fitt, but if it come not before y^e
3. or 4. day, take an ounce of Scurup of Mellice & Scurup together in white
wine.

**For the falling down of y^e palate of y^e mouth
or Althand of y^e Case.**

Take gross pepper & salt put it up with your thumb, if it will not stay,
keep your neck warme with Enys for manye week, opening about the
Eldes, pick & Comb it lay it about your neck, take 5. Gulabine leaves
& tops of roses, boyle them in milk & gargle your throat often, & make
a washing water for your throat, of plantain & Gulabine leaves &
tops of roses, or use plantain Water, or Scurup of Mellice, Walrus or hot.

To take away Venome

Take a sparrow or pigeon, cut it open alive, & lay the inside to y^e place re-
quired, & it will take it away. probat.

To procure Urine

Take Sallivariell or Cream of tartar, of either as much as will serve on a
great, put it in your breath, & so take it.

To stay vomiting in a woman with child.

Take wormwood, penny rual, & Meats, of each one hand full, boyle y^e m halfe
lb. of fresh butter, all the vertue, kee your cut the steam forth, & an
ounce of eternal with y^e butter, lay a plaster of it to y^e stomach wth brown paper.

For a rank nose or face.

Take Argemone sublimed, & beat it small mingle it wth running water,
with the force the drop a linen cloth therein, & then hang it to the place
where y^e rankness is, when it is all as a scabb take off of Cream a little
Brimstone, a little white Copras, a little Alu. mixt into fine powder, and
there wth anoynt y^e place.

For suddain losse of hearing

Take warm bread cut off y^e Oven, lay it to y^e deaf ear, or hot water.

For a Dropsie

Take the topps of Green Dragon, the topps of Walworth boyle y^e m white
wine from a pottle to a quart, drink it night & morning. probat.

For a scald Head.

Take pines & Caree seeth them together make a plaister hereof
snout of the hare and apply it somewhat hott.

To make Breath sweet.

Take the powder of Sage, of winter Savoric, of Cloves & mace
nutmeg all powdered a little mulld in juce of Lemons
& white wine; drink of this compound a spoonfull or two morn-
ing & night.

A water to cleave hands & face.

Ven. Stanley Take a quart of faine water, a pint of white wine the juce of
4. Lemons, put theria Bean blossoms, white lilly Blossoms, Elder
blossoms, of each one handfull, put to it a whole Dairie roots
4. marsh mallen roots, 2. or 3. Branches of wild tansey as much
flintoric, the weight of 2^o in fampshire, put all these in an
earthen pott, sett it in warm Ashes all night in the morning
strain it through a peece of white linnen, put it in a narrow
mouthed glass, sett it in the heat of the sun 3. or 4. dayes, if
there bee any pimples or rednes in the face take a quantitie of
water in the glasse & steepe this white dung of an hen in it one
night then straine it through a cloth wash your face in this
morning & night if your hands need shree or 4. brushed Almonds
this is a most excellent water, prob.

A powder for teeth

Take the powder of Sage, the shavings of Ivory put y^e among
the juce of Lemons, night & morn, rubb your teeth herewith, it
will make them both white & sweet.

To kill Quicksilver

Putt it into a glass vial, put fasting spittle to it, stopp the
vial with wax then shake it till it looke like Ashes.

For a sore throat

Take 3^o of quicksilver, put it in a wooden dish & fill it with
fasting spittle, then take 4^o of oyle of Bayes, put to it three
quarts of Sage leaves, so grind all well together & putt it in a cally
pott to keepe it all the yere, annoynt y^e throat of the head & y^e nose
of the neck lay a dry linc at each, so do it when you goe to bed
keep you warm, (swee drinking with care, prob.)

Another

Take y^e shells & seeds of a. Beyle them in a quart of peece all
the 9^o part bee consumed, let in remain in y^e drink, take 8. spoon-
fulls night & morning. Another

Another

M^r. Briscoe Take a great Onion, cutt off y^e topp, fill it with faine honey, sett it
y^e topp on, when rotted, take & bind it to the nose of y^e head, this will cure.

For a Quinsy.

Take Alra grace, beat it to powder, put to it a pint of strong Ale
& heavy to sweeten it, then strain it, put Rutchy to give it a taste
if it

If it bee sore & another way, take a plaister of the same powder
heavy spread it in butter, & apply it to the throat.

To loosen Stomach in the Breast & bring it away
by Expectoration.

Take Hyssop, Pennyroall, of each an handfull Rosemary 4. branches
of camphire Roots half an ounce, Licoras an ounce & half, Amalords one ounce
M^r. Brookes
bruse the seeds & slice the roots, put all in 2. quartes of fountain water,
boyle it to halfe & strain it, put to y^e liquor some white wine, wringe it
it tart, give almost halfe a pint in the morning fasting 3. dayes & at Bed
time warme.

To kill the wormes in young Children.

Spread chittolate upon a peece of leather, sprinkle in it, this powder
& apply it to y^e navell.

For the toothache

Take long pepper, Guiny pepper, Bayberrie, y^e inward bark of an Elder, M^r. Brookes
tree, beat to powder & beat newle seed, bruse all to powder, put in a
suffly bagg with the bagg in strong Aquaviva, & lay it on the same of the
tooth, or tooth that aches, in let the Aquaviva distill, this is for tooth
ache, but if they bee, take y^e Gum Tragacanth, beat it small, then take least
dip it in Aquaviva, so roast it in the sun & stopp the tooth herewith.

For the Stone

Take two good handfull of being Anemone, boyle it in 3. gallons of wort,
till it be to powder, & beat newle seed, bruse all to powder, put in a
strong Beare, hang in it a bagg with a y^e of hyssop, y^e of bayberrie, then & brand
before it begin to work, wring it to the Beare with a pillow, lett it remain
in the vessel so long as the drink lasteth, lett it work & be 3. times
before you drink it, & every morning drink two good draughts fasting, add
salt & hewe after, let this be your ordinarie drink, prob.

To stay Bleeding

Take Borax, what quantitie you will, finely powdered & y^e white of an
Egge, mix them well together, dip in a peece of flax, & tyo it on y^e place.

For the Colick

Take the inward skins of the gizzards of pigeons, scrape wash and
dry them well, beat them to a small a powder, as you can, take as much
as will lay on a peece, with an spoonfull of Aquaviva water, or
take thus of it 3. mornings together, or when you feel y^e self troubled wth

Against y^e wind in y^e spleen

Take a good handfull of Mother wort, boyle it in halfe a pint of
Redd water, & halfe a pint of sweet wine, boyle it to halfe, strain
y^e liquor from the herbs, put to the liquor 2. pintes of fine sugar
boyle it to a Syrrup, keep it and give y^e troubled 3. spoonfull a time.

An oymntment to strengthen a weak Back

Take brastherne, make a stilly of it, when it is cold, take of it in
a plaister & add to it a spoonfull of redd wine water, & a spoon full
of white wine Vinegar, mixle it, annoynt y^e back wth it morning & night.

Cakes good for y^e lungs or any stopping in y^e breast.

Take half a lb. of Trevis, crampd well & sliced thin, put it in a paper
bagg & hang it to have some warmth from y^e fire, pound & sift it as
fine as you can, take 4. ounces hereof, put to halfe a pint of Hyssop
water, take 6. handfulls of y^e tops of Marsh-mallows, y^e of Marsh-mallows
flowers, or the most of them half an handfull of y^e tops, beat y^e
herbs & strain out y^e Juice, put to it the Hyssop water & Trevis, let
all boyle a litle while at a soft fire, strain it again through a fine
Boville add to it 4. ounces of brown Sugar, 2. ounce of Trevis, boyle all on a
Chafin dish of Calid (not too fast) till it looke yellowish, being stirring

it will be thick to fashion in what takes you please lay them on flatter plates till they be dry enough to cut off, then warm the plate some in the fire, with your fingers in water when you make the up, keep the wax the fire, and take them at any time.

For a Cist.

Take a quart of Spring Water, & 4 ounces of Clove-gamb roots, beat it to the half, then add as much Sugar Candy as will sweeten it, keep it till it be like a Syrrup.

For the Almonds of the throat being swollen with cometh of Cold

Take Charly hulled, Bayens of the Sun, Stands, & running water taken up in the strigam, put all in an earthen pott and sothe them for the space of your throat as lett as you can.

For y^e Kings Evil & breaking out of these sores when other things fail.

Take the Greyn Plagg like a weed w^{ch} grows in the Water, but be sure to take y^e right, wash dry, & scrape the roots very clean, then beat them in a Mortar, as fine as you can, mix it with Linc honey as to make it like an Electuary, take it in a morning fasting as much as a Walnut full on fauce or more, after it take the same at going to bed, this must be taken for 3. months together. It cured one who had 10. years upon her, & none came after a fortnight taking; But if any new sore chise, presently make a Lulter of y^e milk & the Roots of Tiggwort cut small, apply it to break it, it will be with ease than being broken lay upon it till it draw & heal y^e plaster pulled, Inwarding, it is good notwithstanding this if you send a vein to give the roots of Signort with hogld or buttered or good dry after.

For the yellow Jaundice

Take the urine of the party sick, and as much wheat flower as you think fit, make hereof a cake, and stick it on the back of the Gummye as the cake rather the disease will leave the party.

To stop Bleeding

Take a Napkin or a cloth of some Agnesse, wett it in spring water then wring the water forth & apply it to the Groyne.

To make Haire grow

Take 2^o of non yellow wax, & ounces of red brick finely breised, put all into a ro glass with luted then fit the ro in an earthen pott filling it round about with fine sifted sand or ash, set the pott with the body in it on a furnace, so to distill it with a soft fire, & there will come forth a fair yellow oyle, which congeals in y^e like pap, when it is cold, if you draw for the oyle or distill it again, it will be the better, this oyle worketh wonders on them that are haire rarer of head or beard.

Rose cakes to stop Rheum.

Take red Rose leaves, dip the white of, so keep them in a paper bagg untill you see them as fellows, set it ready as you think to use, to fast the fire when they are through dry, beat as many of them to powder as will make four ounces, draw it very fine, with one ounce of Nutmegg powder sered together, & when you have beat your Sugar with must be a pound to something higher than a Syrrup, put in the powders, stir them well together, press them in a pte plate when they are cold you may eat them in what form you will, & take them at what time you will, but especially at Bedtime.

To make

To make Syrrup of Poppies to procure Sleep softly, & good for any Coughs of y^e Lungs.

Take red Poppy that grows in the Cere, cut the black of very carefully, then take the leaves, still them at Reze, take a quart of your Syrruped Water, & putting to it an handful of the same leaves fresh gathered, with the black cut very carefully, from them as before, so let it stand 12. hours in the Embers, then strain it softly & put to another handfull so cut, & let it stand 12. hours more, strain it softly again, put to it 3. & half of Sugar arid, & three grains of Myk tied in Linc.

To stop y^e Bleeding of wound or nose

Take a flesh, wett it well in soops spawne then dry it, laying thine in the wound will stop the effusion of Blood, or if y^e nose bleed, mix powder to powder, being drunk or worn about the neck in a bagg.

For a Scald or Burne

Take the sweetest Myrrour & each of each a like quantitie, pound y^e well together, & apply it as it requires put on fresh for 2 or 3 hours & this will cure it, if the skin be not broken should it be better.

For a Pearle in y^e eye

Take a faire piece of Helland, & when it is cleane in a powder, then blow forth the stone, & there will be an eye at the bottom of the dish, which you must take with a small pointed dagger, the sore, this will cure it, then dressing, or y^e eye of white paper after this.

For a consumption

Take the most sweetest Myrrour, & each of each half an handful, a quarter of one of Rusley seeds, as many small seeds, stamped & sliced the y^e taken away, y^e of Geoze receivd & sliced very small, 1/2 of Amyseds, half a quart of y^e of Corras, as many Bayens of the sun, beid, kept all in a pott of Running Water, till half be consumed, Add to it 1. Ounce of known Sugar Candy, Drink of this first & last a quarter of a pint or more at a time, blood warme, Let the Water be taken from a spring that the sun riseth upon, set it in an earthen pott keeping it still covered, it must be made every 4. or 5. dayes, when y^e drink is wanting, let the patient take Syrrup of Turneps, or harts-horn softly made of the Water of Turneps.

For a distillent Reum, or short Cough.

Take a quarter of a pound of Ragens stone, & pound the same, add 2. ounces of Costone of Reze, 2. ounces of Sugar Candy finely beaten, all well together, add 10. or 12. Drops of Spirit of Sulphur, when all is well mixed, use the quantitie of a grain night & morning especially at any other time.

For a Vomitt

Take y^e of y^e biggest clearebacke leaves, being y^e very small, then put to that by 1. Ounce of White wine, strain it very hard, & put one ounce of white wine more to y^e green substance by degrees, & strain that, put it to the former, then drink it, half a quarter of a pint is ounces 2.

For swellings & Aches

Take Elder flowers when they be full ripe, pick them very clean, put a double glasse with the flowers, thin fill your glass with oyle, set it in a pott of Water, let it stand 12. hours, strain out y^e flowers, & putt

part of the Aquavita, steep it 24 hours, then strain it, add a good quantity of Sugar & a little Rose water, so put it in a bottle being a bag of Muske in it, & stopp it close.

To stay the Whites in y^e Back. prob.

Take Mastick & wax in proportion of Red roses & so melt out for the same or a weak Back.

Take an handful of Sumpsey or some flax, Kust grass, 6 leaves of Betony, 6 leaves of Rye, an handful of Violet leaves of Marjold, Stambrey leaves, a quantity of Rosewort, an handful of Blackening, & pick out the haire, as many Plantain, a quantity of Arthangel, bold wine & white a quartie of white wine, take as many plantain haire with a quartie of white wine, take an Oke bark and stop it out of the skin, beat it y^e daisy with, an handful of every sort of y^e haire together very well, then when all y^e haire have boild together a good while put in them a y^el that before & when they have boild together very well abate strain them through a linnen cloth, then let them be cool, before it be cold, put in a quartie of y^e best Sugar, drink half a pint at a time morning & evening, & y^e that find great relief.

Another

Take Red wine Sumpsey, Mastick, Dazie roots, Gum Amber, Gum Dragon, or take of the spleen 5 ounces, Cardus Sempliciter, 3 ounces, Knot grass, or y^e spleen an equal quantity, steep y^e daisy shall & make a Emulsion thereof, eat of it morning & night.

To make fat & strengthen y^e Back

Take of the spirit of flax a Spoonfull or 2. in y^e morning fasting. prob. Or take of white sanders the stickings of 3 or 4. One lay quantity of a quart & putt in pastimes salt in thin slices, put them in a quart of water to boile, as it boiles shake it some times with y^e hand not to, when it is through put Sugar & Gumman in powder, so eat it.

Another

Take red rose water, Sugar, thin soft 5 or 10 dates in a brown paper, & putt them in, eat before morning & evening.

Another

Take of Sumpsey a dram & half, a little white sanders, 5 or 6. Sweet Almonds blanck, beat altogether into a fine powder, so mix it in a penny weight of Muske, put in a penny weight of this powder & drink it 3. morning together.

Another

Take of whites of 30 eggs beat them into an oyle, let them stand an hour take of all the fat, & as it is beat beat them again, let them stand another hour, then take a pint of y^e best Ale, add y^e daisy, half a pint of red rose water, 3. or 5. Nutmegs sliced very thin, put all this in a glass & shake it together, let it stand 24. hours, & so drink it fasting in y^e morning & night 6. Spoonfulls at a time.

A Purge

A Purge for the Back.

Take an Ounce of Cassia, that is non deare, & a dram of Rhubarb make it in an Electuarie, this will serve two mornings.

For the Wormes

Take a quart of Chik a y^e of Wormwood, beate it & then boile it till there will halfe be consumed, putting therein half a y^e of Saffron, w^{ch} help to make it very sweet.

To kill Wormes in any Body. prob.

Take Sennese being hot as he makes it, in a double cloth apply it to the Navel, this will drive you to void a worm, w^{ch} is goodly, & worth, then dry it in an Oven & pound it to powder, & give some of it in any drink the patient likes, it will break the bred of Worms.

For the Wind Collique

Take high Centery white Wine, & hest & the cutmed parmes of Orange a good handfull, boyl them till a good part be consumed, so drink it very oft. & fast two hours after it.

Another. prob.

Take an handfull of white Thyme as many water, Coriander, half a pint of Rosemary, a little Rosewood, boild in a quart of water, & put in a pint of Sack after you have steamed the Ale, so mix y^e Ale, drink this 3. or 4. times a day, soe 4. Spoonfulls at a time.

A Water for the eyes or any Inflammacion

Take y^e May dew of Berley to y^e quantitie of a pottle being w^{ch} is not you for 2. days before, take 2. of white clove, 3. and pint of bay salt, boyl them in a new pottle, not used, till it stand boyling gentle 24. hours till a quart is boild, then strain it gently through a fine cloth into a glass of y^e glass not been used, drop it in y^e eye & bath the Orbits.

An excellent Purge

Take a pint of y^e fairest Water, & half a pint of white Wine, if you would have it strong otherwise a pint will be enough, take a quart of an Ounce of Cassia (if you find it not strong enough for y^e use of y^e royal) of Cassia in the pint, beat the sticks of it small in wine, & so put y^e pint in the liquor, put to it a quart of an Ounce of Rhubarb half an Ounce of Senna, and a little Sumpsey, cleave y^e Rhubarb into 3. or 4. slices, putt them in short pipes, put all in a new pottle, take it over close & set it on y^e Embred for 7. or 8. hours, but be sure it do not boile, then take a Rosh straine, it so let it cool, it must be taken 3. times a day, & early in y^e morning fasting, & then leave after, if it be so long a working drink some warm broth, a good pottle of full before you put it out of the pottle to warm, put into Ounce of Red Lead into the pint before, & so the y^e best cold water amongst the liquor, this purge is good, if you abound in moist humors, or if your stomach be not good, but especially for a Woman once a month, before her flower.

For the Stone or Strangurie




