And having been attended by the Solicitors for the said Charles Hamilton Killett Long and Ernest Henry Killett Long and having in the presence of such Solicitors read and considered such State of Facts and Proposal and Evidence and what was alleged by them

I find and Certify to Your Lordship as follows:

Inquisition

1. That by an Inquisition dated the 10<sup>th</sup> day of August 1877 the said Fortescue Walter Killett &

Long was found to be a person of unsound mind and not competent for the management of himself, or his estate.

2. That the said Fortescue Walter Kellitt Long attended before me by his Counsel and Solicitor on taking the said Inquisition -

That the said Charles Hamilton Kellitt Long a brother of the said Fortescue Walter Kellitt Long is his heir at law and he and the said Ernest Henry Kellitt Long also a brother of the said Fortescue Walter Kellitt Long are his only next of kin and the only persons who would be entitled to his estate under the Statutes for the distribution of intestates estates in case he were now dead intestate.

That the said Fortescue Walter Kellitt Long is a bachelor of the age of 33 years or thereabouts and is of independent means and the owner of Dunston Hall in the County of Norfolk where he has resided until recently and in the month of January last he was charged before one of the Metropolitan Police Magistrates with furious driving and remanded for the state of his mind to be investigated by 2 Medical men and after such investigation they certified that he was of unsound mind and he was discharged from custody and given into the care of the said Charles Hamilton Kellitt Long who thereupon placed



him as a patient in the Asylum for Lunatics called the Priory situate at Roehampton in the County of Surrey where he has ever since resided and is now residing.

6. That the said Fortescue Walter Killest Long is very rambling in his conversation and his ideas as to his duty, duties and conduct are very incoherent and extravagant and he asserts that he is Jesus i. e. the Master in a higher grade of Society than other people because he is a Worker and that he has been in heaven from 1870 until lately and he considers that he is a Mahometan, at the same time a Christian and that by hard work, neither food nor sleep are necessary and he also fancies he hears voices but he is very unwilling to converse on any of his delusions.

7. That the said Charles Hamilton Killest Long and Ernest Henry Killest Long are as aforesaid the only brothers of the said Fortescue Walter Killest Long and in Holy Orders, the former resides at Twickenham Vicarage in the County of Lincoln and the other resides at Spottiswoode Rectory in the County of York and they are in the opinion of Edward Stalgrave Simpson of the City of Norwich Solicitor (but who is not acting in this matter) who has for upwards of 3 years known and been well acquainted with them and in the opinion of William Henry Doreton Haggard of the Foreign Office Westminster who has for upwards of 14 years known and been well acquainted with them highly respectable and responsible persons and the most fit and proper persons to be appointed Committees of the Person and

Estate of the said Fortescue Walter Kellatt Long.
