Milk.

50 pounds (dry milk) of milk were granted to Clinic mothers and children during the year either free or at less than cost price.

Wartime Nurseries.

The first nursery was opened in temporary quarters at Crayford House, on the 8th June, 1942, and transferred on the 27th July, 1942, to Shenstone.

The second nursery to serve the Slade Green Area was not opened until the 11th January, 1943.

The attendances at the Crayford nursery were 5,892. At the end of the year there were 63 children on the register.

Home Helps.

Home helps have carried out their duties satisfactorily to 12 families during the year.

Maternal Mortality.

138 women attended the Clinic. The total number of attendances during the year was 586.

Clothing Coupons.

During the year 28,260 clothing coupons have been issued to 503 expectant mothers.

Maternity and Nursing Homes.

Of the 441 live births 280 occurred at Institutions and 127 of these at the Crayford Rus**sell-S**toneham Memorial Hospital.

Health Visiting.

During the year the Health Visitors paid 13,880 visits. Infant Life Protection.

At the end of the year there were 15 persons receiving children for reward under the Children Act, 1908, and Children and Young Persons Act, 1932.

91 visits were paid to foster children during the year. At the end of the year there were 17 children remaining on the register.

INSPECTION AND SUPERVISION OF FOOD.

Milk Supply.

26 samples of milk taken from school supplies for bacteriological examination were found to be satisfactory.

One mixed sample of milk was procured from a producer's herd and two samples from individual cows for pathological examination; the result showed no evidence of tuberculosis.

MEAT AND OTHER FOODS.

Local slaughterhouses are closed owing to the Centralised Slaughtering Scheme of the Ministry of Food. During the year a total of 5 tons, 13 cwts., 2 qrs., 9 lbs. of food was found to be unfit for human consumption. Classification is shown below :—
