

THE BOARD'S REPORT

For the year 1895-6,

Prepared by Order of the Board, under the 198th sect. of the Metropolis Local Management Act, 1855 (18 and 19 Victoria, cap. 120).

EXTENT AND AREA OF DISTRICT.

The District over which the Board exercise jurisdiction comprises the Parish of Lewisham, and the Hamlet of Penge. It includes Blackheath—Lewisham—Ladywell and part of Brockley—Catford—Forest Hill—Upper Sydenham—Lower Sydenham—Southend—Anerley and Penge.

The area of the District is 6,544 acres,—Lewisham 5,774 and Penge 770 acres. The population, according to the Census, 1891, was 92,647, viz., Lewisham 72,272 and Penge 20,375.

POPULATION.

The Population of the District, taken on the 29th March, 1896, for the purposes of the Equalisation Fund, was 104,521, viz., Lewisham, 83,213, and Penge, 21,308, showing a total increase in the District, in the five years, 1891—1896, of 11,874.

CONSTITUTION.

THE Board are constituted under and pursuant to the provisions of the Metropolis Local Management Act, 1855, and exercise jurisdiction under that Act and the several Acts amending and extending the same.

The Board are the Sanitary Authority for the Lewisham District, under the Public Health (London) Act, 1891.

As at first constituted the Board consisted of 27 Members: 24 representing Lewisham and 3 representing Penge. In 1867 the numbers were altered by an Order of the late Metropolitan Board of Works, but without increasing the total number, and 6 Members were assigned to Penge and 21 to Lewisham.

In June, 1896, the number was, by an Order made by the London County Council, increased to 48, viz., Lewisham, 39, and Penge, 9.

CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD.

At the Meeting of the Board held on the 17th June, 1896, Mr. T. W. Williams, J.P., L.C.C., was unanimously re-elected Chairman of the Board, and the following resolu-

tion was also passed :-

"Resolved unanimously that a cordial vote of thanks be given to Mr. Williams for his able conduct in the chair during the past year, and for the ability he has shown in the management of the meetings of the Board, and in supervising their work; and also for his regular attendance, and for all that he has done for and in the interest of the Board."

DEPUTY CHAIRMAN.

Mr. Geo. E. Dodson has been nominated deputy Chairman of the Board.

The Finance Committee, in addition to their fortnightly Meeting before each Board Meeting, have met once in each month for the examination of all claims, and for the transaction of general business relating to the finances of the Board.

There is also—

An Audit Committee.

A Recreation Ground Sub-Committee; and

A Horse Sub-Committee.

All these Committees have held their regular meetings throughout the year.

An account in abstract, showing the Receipts and Expenditure of the Board during the year ended 25th March, 1896; a summary statement of their Assets and Liabilities on that day; a statement of the contracts entered into by them during the year; and other details and particulars.

A table of Loans from the 1st January, 1856, to the 25th March, 1896.

The Board submit the Report of the Medical Officer of Health of the District for the year ended 31st December, 1895, on the Sanitary condition of the District and the Public Health Work carried out during the year.

The Board also submit the Report of their Surveyor for the year ended 25th March, 1896, on the various works relating to the Highways, Lighting, Watering, Sewerage, Street Improvements, and other works projected and carried out during the year; and the Applications or Notices relating to house building and drainage, new streets, and all other works.

EXPENDITURE.

The Expenditure in Lewisham for purposes raised by rate does not show any increase. The sum raised by Precept last year was £45,000, or an equivalent of 21.29d. in the £ on the rateable value then in force. This year the Board have raised a similar sum, but owing to the growth of the District, and to the sums received under the provisions of the Equalisation of Rates Act (£2,508 16s. 4d.), the amount raised is equivalent to 1.27d, or 1¼d. in the £ less than last year.

In Penge the expenditure shows a slight increase over that of the previous year, on account of the provision made for repayment of loans raised for carrying out the Surface Drainage Works it has been necessary to construct for the relief of flooding. The amount raised was £12,642, being equivalent to 19.80d in the £ on the rateable value then in force. The sum received in accordance with the provisions of the Equalisation of Rates Act, was £644 7s. 10d.

The sum raised under the Precept of the School Board for London, and paid over to that Board was £31,783 0s. 11d.

LOANS.

The total indebtedness of the Board on the Loan account at the 25th March, 1896, was £81,136 0s. 6d.

During the year the Board paid the sum of £5,098 in reduction of the mortgages owing by them, and raised the sum of £15,600 for the construction of the Penge and Bell-green Sewer, purchase of land at Lower Sydenham for Depôt, and sundry paving and other works

The following statement of the loan debt shows the changes made in the same in the six years ended 25th March, 1896, and the amount outstanding at the end of each financial year in that period.

The following statement indicates the amount borrowed in each period of ten years from 1856 to 1886, and the rate at which the different loans were obtained. From 1856 to 1866 the sum raised was £32,223, at £5 per cent. per annum. In the next period, to the end of 1876, the sum raised was £87,844, and the interest was 5 per cent. at the early part of the decade, and $4\frac{1}{4}$ and $3\frac{7}{8}$ at the latter part. Following this, the sum of £68,268 was raised in the ten years ended December, 1886, and the interest was, in the first half of

this period, $4\frac{1}{2}$ and $4\frac{1}{4}$, but in the latter part it was $3\frac{1}{4}$. This sum of £68,268 included £24,800 raised under a scheme submitted by Mr. T. W. Williams, then Chairman of the Finance Committee, and approved by the Board, for the consolidation of previous loans borrowed at rates of $4\frac{3}{4}$, $4\frac{1}{2}$, and $4\frac{1}{4}$, and the new loan was obtained at $3\frac{3}{4}$. The sum therefore raised for new works in the third period, from 1876 to the end of 1886, was £43,468. The sums raised in the second period (i.e., 1866 to 1876) included the loans for the New Offices and for special paving works.

The amount borrowed by the Board up to the end of 1886 (exclusive of the sum raised for consolidation of loans) was £163,535

The amount outstanding at Lady-day, 1886, was 56,222

Showing a total payment off the Loan Debt to that date of £107,313

The foregoing statements with regard to the previous Loan transactions of the Board have been included in previous reports. The Board again submit the information believing it will be of considerable interest to the rate-payers of the District, and that it is worthy of a place in this Report.

PUBLIC HEALTH (LONDON) ACT, 1891, AND SANITARY WORK.

General.

During the year 4,399 houses and premises were visited and inspected, and 1,803 notices for the abatement of nui-

sances were served between 31st December, 1894, and 31st December, 1895.

In most cases the first notices served were attended to, and it was not necessary, except in a few instances, to resort to legal proceedings.

Table VI in the Medical Officer's Report shows the number of complaints brought under the notice of the Board and the Committees, and the proceedings taken thereon.

On receipt of notice from any person of any nuisance or defect the Board's officers will at once attend to the matter, and proceedings will be taken if the matter comes properly within the Board's jurisdiction under the Public Health (London) Act, 1891.

House to House Inspections.

The house to house inspections in the District were continued. In all cases where defects were discovered orders were made and notices were served and followed up until the defects were remedied.

Dust Collection.

During the year there were 84 complaints or requests as to the removal of dust. Personal enquiry was made into each such case.

The Board's men are required to make regular calls—once in each week as near as practicable.

The Board again request all householders to observe the following suggestions as a means of facilitating this work:—

To see that the men are allowed to take the dust on calling for same.

To burn (in small quantities at a time) all animal or vegetable refuse.

To place no animal or vegetable refuse in the dustbins. To cleanse, and disinfect and limewash, or limewhite periodically the dust bins where necessary.

To forward complaints of the non-removal of dust to the Clerk of the Board, at their Offices.

Infectious Diseases Notification.

The cases of infectious disease notified during the year will be found referred to in the Medical Officer's Report, Table (B).

Steps have been taken for the disinfection of each house or room where cases have occurred, and also for the disinfec-

tion or destruction of the articles therein.

It was suggested (by the St. Olave's District Board) that "measles" should be added to the list of "infectious diseases" of which notification is required under the Public Health (London) Act, 1891. The Board referred the matter to their Medical Officer of Health, who reported that he did not consider the notification of measles desirable at the present time, and he gave in his report his reasons for that opinion. The matter was referred to the Sanitary Committee; they reported their concurrence in the Medical Officer's opinion, and no steps were taken in the matter.

Water Supply Certificates.

During the year the Board have received and considered 307 applications for certificates under section 48 of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and on evidence before them that the houses were properly furnished with water, the certificates were granted. By the section referred to it is provided that a house newly erected or rebuilt after the commencement of the Act, shall not be occupied as a dwelling-house until the Sanitary Authority have certified that it has a proper and sufficient supply of water either from a Water Company or by some other means.

Water-closets.

The Board have also received and dealt with during the year 625 notices relating to the construction of waterclosets. By the Bye-laws made by the London County Council it is provided (14) that

"Every person who shall intend to construct any watercloset, earth-closet, or privy, or to fit or fix in or in connection with any water-closet, earth-closet, or privy any apparatus or any trap or soil-pipe, shall, before executing any such works, give notice in writing to the Clerk of the Sanitary Authority."

Bye-laws.

The Bye-laws made by the London County Council, and the District Board, as the Sanitary Authority, under the provisions of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, have been enforced during the year in all cases where necessary.

The Bye-laws made by the Council are published by the

Council's printers at a charge of 3d. per copy.

Those made by the District Board are also published,

copies can be had on application at the Board's offices.

The Board in July re-opened their small infectious diseases hospital at Hither Green. Since that date (to 25th March,) cases have been admitted and treated there. The Board adopted this course as the Asylums Board were unable to take all the cases, particularly those from Penge. The Board have also made an agreement with the Croydon Guardians with reference to non-pauper cases from Penge. Under this agreement, such cases are admitted and maintained in the new hospital at Waddon, the charge being £2 per week for each patient.

Bakehouses.

The bakehouses have been regularly inspected during the year.

Cowhouses and Slaughterhouses.

These premises have also been regularly inspected.

THE VACCINATION ACTS.

The attention of the Board having been called to the action of the Guardians of the Poor of the Lewisham Union in carrying out the Statutory duties imposed upon them by the Vaccination Acts, and by the Order of the Local Government Board of the 31st October, 1874—the Board,

in December last, decided to call the attention of the Local Government Board to the matter, and the following Petition was prepared and forwarded to that Board:—

The Petition referred to.

TO THE RIGHT HONOURABLE THE PRESIDENT OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.

THE PETITION OF THE BOARD OF WORKS FOR THE LEWISHAM DISTRICT.

SHEWETH-

THAT YOUR PETITIONERS are the Sanitary Authority for the Lewisham District (including the Parish of Lewisham), and as such Sanitary Authority are charged with the execution of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, in the said District and Parish.

Under and pursuant to the provisions of that Act your Petitioners are entrusted with important duties incident and relating to the prevention of the spread of the Infectious Diseases particularly specified in the said Act.

The Guardians of the Poor of the Lewisham Union are within the Parish of Lewisham charged and entrusted with the administration of the Vaccination Acts.

Your Petitioners, as such Sanitary Authority, regard it as of great importance to the welfare of their District that the provisions of the Vaccination Acts as laid down by the Legislature should be duly and properly administered and enforced.

The attention of your Petitioners has been specially directed to the large number of cases in which the Guardians have excused from prosecution parents and others who have made default in complying with the provisions and requirements of the Vaccination Acts. Your Petitioners are informed that forty-seven persons have been excused during the past twelve months.

Your Petitioners are informed and believe that the excuse advanced by the parent or responsible person in most, if not all, the cases excused is that he or they object to vaccination.

The death rate of your Petitioners' District is an exceptionally low rate, the same having been for the year ended 31st December, 1894, 14.0 per 1000, and for the five weeks ended 30th November, 1895, 10.7 per 1000, as reported by the Medical Officer of Health of your Petitioners' District.

That the population of the Parish of Lewisham at the census taken in 1891 was 72,272, occupying 13,084 houses, and

this number has since considerably increased.

Your Petitioners, as the Sanitary Authority of the District, are desirous of maintaining the healthy character of their District, and they believe that the action of the Guardians in not enforcing the law with regard to vaccination is dangerous and prejudicial to the public health.

Your Petitioners having therefore duly considered the circumstances at their last Meeting resolved by 38 votes to

2 as follows :-

That this Board, as the Sanitary Authority of the District, do call the attention of the Local Government Board to the action of the Guardians of the Poor of the Lewisham Union in the matter of the Vaccination Acts.

And your Petitioners do therefore submit the matter for the consideration of your Honourable Board accordingly, and do pray that your Honourable Board will take such action in the matter as to them may appear necessary and desirable. And your Petitioners will ever pray, &c.

The Common Seal of the Board of Works for the Lewisham District was hereunto affixed, by Order, this 3rd day of January, 1896, in the presence of

In consequence the Local Government Board addressed a letter to the Guardians, forwarding them a copy of the Memorial, and subsequently wrote to them, stating that—as regards first proceedings under Section 31 of the Vaccination Act of 1867, as well as proceedings under Section 29—Article 16, of the Board's Order of 31st October, 1874, requires the Guardians in all cases where the provisions of the

Vaccination Acts have been neglected, to cause proceedings to be taken against persons in default, and for this purpose to give directions authorising the Vaccination Officer to institute and conduct such proceedings.

The Local Government Board also intimated that the Guardians had no discretion in the matter, and that the question of what was a reasonable excuse for the parents, was one for the Magistrates only.

From this communication it appeared that this Board's

action was fully justified.

The Guardians, notwithstanding the communication of the Local Government Board, continued to excuse cases of default brought before them, and this Board decided to take proceedings with a view to enforcing the law, and the matter was under the consideration of the Board's legal advisers at the close of the year. The Board have since made a formal demand on the Guardians, requiring them to carry out the Acts, and await their reply.

DISPOSAL OF DUST AND HOUSE REFUSE.

This question has been, for some time, under the consideration of the Board, and on the 6th November, 1895, they received the following report from their Works and General Purposes Committee:—

"The Committee beg to report that for more than twelve months they have had under consideration the question of the disposal of dust and house refuse. The serious character of this question has been pressed upon their attention by reports from the Surveyor as to the precarious holding of the present shoots. A Sub-Committee was appointed to enquire thoroughly into the matter, and to consider the advisability of adopting some method of burning the refuse. An offer by Mr. Willoughby to erect, at his own expense, a Dust Destructor on an improved principle, was also referred to the Sub-Committee. Mr. Willoughby offers to erect this Destructor at his own expense, on ground to be provided by the Board, and to remove it should it fail to realise the results promised from its use. If, however, the trial prove

satisfactory, the Board is to purchase the apparatus for the sum of £3,000. The Sub-Committee visited several towns where Destructors were in use; they also visited Calstock, to see the special principle of Mr. Willoughby's machine in operation destroying ore. The Sub-Committee reported in favour of Mr. Willoughby's offer being accepted; and the Committee recommend

That Mr. Willoughby's offer be accepted, on the terms of his proposal, as contained in the letters dated the 24th September and 13th December, 1894."

This recommendation was adopted, and an Agreement was accordingly entered into with Mr. Willoughby, and he is, at the present time, proceeding with the erection of his Dust Destructor.

SALE OF FOOD AND DRUGS ACTS.

During the year 73 samples were analysed, and 11 were found adulterated or reduced in quality. In 7 of these cases summonses were applied for and granted, and 5 convictions were obtained; the fines imposed were:—20s. and 2s. costs; 10s. and 2s. costs; £3 and 2s. costs; £4 and 2s. costs; and £5 and £2 8s. costs.

GAS EXAMINATION.

The Board received during the year six reports from the Examiner, Dr. Samuel Rideal, from which it appeared that the gas supplied by the Crystal Palace District Gas Company was within the statutory limits as to illuminating power and purity, except upon one occasion, when the Board wrote to the Company, and upon their explanation did not consider it necessary to take any action therein.

THE ANNUAL INSPECTION.

The Board made their usual Annual Inspection of the District on the 4th July, when they viewed the various depôts, and the works and improvements effected in the previous year, and the sites of the new works provided for in the current year's Estimates; the various New Streets then

recently paved and formed, and other works in contemplation.

The Board also visited the Recreation Grounds

PRIVATE DRAINS.

The question, referred to in last year's report, relating to the responsibility for the repair of private drains is still under consideration.

A Bill has been introduced into Parliament with a view to an amendment in the definition of the words sewer and drain in the Metropolis Management Acts, as suggested by the Holborn conference. Very little progress has, however, been made with the same.

OPEN SPACES.

In October, the Chairman of the Board submitted a proposal to them for the acquisition of a piece of ground near Wells Road, Sydenham, as a play ground for the people there, explaining fully the proposed scheme. The ground is situated near the thickly populated district of Wells Road, and some distance from the existing Recreation Ground at Mayow Road. The matter was referred to the Works and General Purposes Committee who reported favourably, and a memorial was duly presented to the London County Council thereon. This Memorial was under consideration at the end of the year. The Board had, however, found it desirable to withdraw an offer they had made to the owner of the ground owing to certain conditions proposed with regard to the same.

THE RAVENSBOURNE AND SYDENHAM MAIN SEWER.

The London County Council are proceeding with the construction of their New Main Sewer from Loampit Vale to Bell Green, and this Board have made considerable progress with their new sewer from Bell Green to Penge.

Further particulars as to these works will be found in the Surveyor's report. The Board have every reason to believe that these large and important works will be of great

benefit to the District.

The Board have in hand other important sewerage works.

BROMLEY ROAD SEWER.

This sewer will be extended to Southend Village, at an estimated cost of £5,384 12s 0d., thus providing for the drainage of this part of the District. The cost of this work will be defrayed in part by the Board, and in part by the owners of the property.

STANSTEAD ROAD SEWER.

The Board have decided to construct an additional sewer in Stanstead Road, mainly with the view of remedying the flooding taking place at Forest Hill in time of storm. This sewer was contemplated some few years ago, when the new sewerage works were carried out in Stanstead Road, between Catford and Park Road, but was held back in order that the Board might see if the first part of the work would be sufficient.

HITHER GREEN SEWERS.

A large building estate (278 acres) is in course of developement at Hither Green, extending from Brownhill Road north and south along Hither Green Lane for some distance. The Board considered the plans of the proposed New Roads on this Estate, sent to them for suggestions by the London County Council, and plans were finally approved by which the road in Hither Green Lane will be widened to 50 feet.

The question of drainage then arose, and after some

negotiation with the owner of the estate, the Board were able to conclude an arrangement by which the owner agreed to contribute the sum of £3,500 towards the cost of a new sewer draining into Ennersdale Road, and thence into the Ravensbourne and Lee Green Sewer. The Board have also made an arrangement with another owner of property in the locality under which he will contribute the sum of £375 towards the cost of this sewer.

MORTUARY AND CORONER'S COURT.

By section 88 of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, the Sanitary Authority are required to provide a Mortuary, and by section 92 the County Council are required to provide and maintain proper accommodation for the holding of inquests, and they may, by agreement with the Sanitary Authority, provide the same in connection with a Mortuary, on such terms as may be agreed with the Authority.

As stated in the Board's last report, they have had this matter under consideration, and decided upon erecting the

necessary buildings at Ladywell.

The plans have been agreed to, and the London County Council have expressed their willingness to enter into an agreement with the Board for the use of the Coroner's Court, and to pay a rent of £95 per annum for the same.

The consent of the Local Government Board to the loan for the greater part of the work has been obtained, and the

works will no doubt be proceeded with this year.

In this Report some of the most important matters that have been brought under the consideration of the Board are summarised briefly. There are, however, a large number of matters of detail, many of which have involved much time and consideration, but these in themselves are not of sufficient importance for reproduction here.

The Board, during the year, received and dealt with numerous letters from the Board of Trade, the Local Government Board, the London County Council, and from Metropolitan Vestries and District Boards and other Boards, relating to matters of business and general interest to the Metropolis.

The Board also received and dealt with a large number of letters from residents relating to numerous and varied subjects affecting the District, and the lighting, cleansing, and improvement of the same, but not of sufficient importance for reproduction in this report.

MEETINGS OF THE BOARD AND COMMITTEES.

There were in all 143 Meetings held during the year, viz., 20 Ordinary Meetings of the Board; 7 Meetings of the Special Committee; 18 Meetings of the Works and General Purposes Committee; 9 Ordinary Monthly Meetings of the Finance Committee; and 20 Fortnightly Meetings

held immediately before the Board Meetings; 17 Meetings of the Local Committee of Blackheath and Lewisham; 17 Meetings of the Sydenham and Forest Hill Local Committee; and 17 Meetings of the Penge Local Committee.

The Board of Morks fon the Lewisham District TO THE END OF THE YEAR 1895,

Medical Officer of Health for the District.

GENTLEMEN,

The number of deaths registered as having occurred in the Lewisham District during the year 1895 was 1456. Of these 59 were of persons who did not belong to this District, while, on the other hand, 99 persons belonging to the District died in hospitals and asylums outside, making the actual total of deaths 1496, as against 1404 in the previous year, and the corrected death rate for 1895 14:44 per 1000, as compared with 14:0 per 1000 in 1894.

There has been no outbreak of zymotic disease in 1895. There have been 337 cases of scarlet fever notified during the year, against 312 notifications of this disease in 1894; but the disease was as a rule of a still milder type, there

being only 9 deaths, against 12 in 1894.

There have been 135 notifications of diphtheria, with 17 deaths, against 172 notifications and 35 deaths in 1894. The smaller number of deaths in this disease is to a great extent due to the severe cases among the poor having been, in most cases, removed to hospital at once. There were 53 cases of typhoid notified, with 9 deaths, against 63 cases in 1894, with 15 deaths. Only 2 cases of small-pox were notified during 1895. Thus on the whole there has been a decrease in the notifications of zymotic diseases, and also in the death rate from that cause. Influenza, on the contrary, was

much more fatal last year than in the preceding year: 61 deaths occurring from Influenza in 1895, against 29 in 1894, 58 in 1893, and 74 in 1892.

POPULATION.

The population of the Lewisham District, at the Census of 1891, was found to be 92,647, occupying 15,643 houses, distributed thus — Lewisham Parish, 72,272, occupying 12,317 houses, giving an average of 5.9 persons to each house; and Hamlet of Penge 20,375, occupying 3,326 houses, giving an average of 6.1 persons to each house.

At Midsummer, 1895, there were in Lewisham 13,991 occupied houses, estimated to contain 82,547 persons, and in Penge 3,443 occupied houses, estimated to contain 21,002 persons. Total, 17,434 occupied houses, and estimated population 103,549, an increase of nearly 11,000 in the last five years, nearly 10,000 having been added to the population of the Lewisham Parish, and less than 1,000 to the Hamlet of Penge.

BIRTHS.

The registered births in the District in the year 1895 amounted to 2,535, or 105 more than in the previous year; of these 65, or 2.5 per cent., were illegitimate.

The birth rate to population was 24.5 per 1,000.

In England and Wales it was 30·3 per 1,000 of the population, which, although higher than the low rates in 1890 and 1894, is lower than any other rate on record, and 0·9 per 1,000 below the average rate for the previous ten years. The birth rate in London, 30·0 per 1000, was the lowest yet recorded.

DEATHS.

The total number of deaths for 1895 was 1,496, as compared with 1,404 in the previous year.

The number of deaths in public institutions in the District amounted to 157, or 8 less than in the previous year. There were 189 deaths in the Lewisham Union Infirmary, but only 135 were those of persons belonging to the District; of these 85 were residents in Lewisham Village; 46 were of residents in the Sydenham Chapelry; 3 belonged to Lee; and one only to Penge. There were 54 deaths of persons who did not belong to this District.

Death rate for 1895, 14.4 per 1000, as compared with 14.0 per 1,000 in the previous year.

During the same period the death rate in England and Wales was 18 7 per 1,000, which shows an increase of 2.1 per 1,000 on the low rate in the previous year; but is 0.2 below the average of the last ten years

The death rate for London for 1895 was 19.8 per 1000. The death rate of the "Outer Ring" of suburban districts, with a population of over a million and a-half, was 14.5 per 1,000.

The death rate of the thirty-three great towns of England and Wales, with a population of more than ten millions and a half, averaged 20.6 per 1,000, ranging from 14.5 in Croydon to 28.8 in Liverpool.

ZYMOTIC DISEASE.

The number of deaths from the 7 principal Zymotic Diseases was 156, as compared with 202 in the previous year. In each of the seven diseases there was a considerable dimi-

nution in the number of deaths, except in the case of diarrhœa, in which disease there was a considerable increase in the number of deaths, owing to the unusually hot summer: the deaths, in the majority of cases, being in infants under one year.

SCARLET FEVER.

There were 337 notifications of this disease received during 1895, with 9 deaths, as compared 312 notifications in 1894 and 12 deaths. The type of disease was as the rule even more mild than in 1894. 117 of these cases were removed to hospital.

DIPHTHERIA.

There were 135 notifications of this disease received in 1895, with 17 deaths, as compared with 172 notifications and 35 deaths in 1894. 47 of these cases were removed to hospital. I hoped to be able to give some statistics as to the results of the treatment of diphtheria by injection of antitoxin in this District, and for that purpose wrote to all the medical men in this District asking them to kindly let me know the results of their use of this treatment in their cases. So far, however, I have only had notes of 8 cases treated by antitoxin injections. As there have been 135 notifications of this disease, and of these only 47 were removed to hospital, there remain 88 cases of diphtheria which have been treated in this District, and in only 8 cases has antitoxin injection been used. Of course the treatment may have been used in other cases, but, if so, the medical man in attendance has not communicated the result to me. Of the 8 cases in

which this treatment was used 7 were very severe cases, and the treatment seems to have been of great value. Death resulted in one case from Nephritis, but in this case the kidney trouble had begun before the injection of antitoxin, and the diphtheria itself appeared to have been influenced for the better by the treatment. In all the other cases recovery took place, and in the one mild case the diphtheric membrane cleared off in 24 hours. In no case was any bad effect observed from the injection.

I have before me the combined report of the Medical Superintendents of six of the Hospitals of the Metropolitan Asylums Board, "upon the use of antitoxin serum in the treatment of diphtheria in the hospitals of the Board during the year 1895."

No fewer than 2,182 cases have been treated by injection of antitoxin serum. The results of the treatment are grouped in a number of Tables, 71 in number. The results, however, are shortly as follows:—

Whilst of 3,042 patients of all ages treated without antitoxin in 1894, 902 died; of 3,529 cases treated in 1895 only 796 died, a mortality of 22.5 per cent. in 1895 against a mortality of 29.6 per cent. in 1894. The serum injection was used only in severe cases; but the general average of severity of the disease among the cases was about the same in both years. The difference in mortality was especially noticed in cases under 5 years of age, there being a difference in favour of 1895 of 13.2 per cent. As diphtheria is exceedingly fatal to young children, this improvement is all the more satisfactory. The earlier the treatment was begun the better the results, and in the hospitals, where the doses were large, and the antitoxin treatment had been most often used, the mortality was smallest.

In cases in which tracheotomy was necessary, recovery occurred in 50 per cent. more of the cases in which antitoxin was used, than in previous years without the use of antitoxin.

The conclusion arrived at, therefore, is distinctly in favour of the value of antitoxin in the treatment of diph-

theria, especially in cases brought under the influence of the remedy not later than the second day of the disease. Their final remark is, that "in antitoxin serum we possess a remedy of distinctly greater value in the treatment of diphtheria than any other with which we are acquainted." The only bad effects observed from the injections was a rash in 45 per cent. of the cases, secondary fever in 29.6 per cent. of the cases; and abscess at the site of the injection in 2.3 per cent. It seems doubtful whether the antitoxin injection has any result, one way or the other, on the paralysis, which is one of the commonest sequelæ of diphtheria.

SMALL-POX.

There were 2 notifications of this disease, with no deaths, as compared with 8 notifications and no deaths in 1894, and 28 notifications and 5 deaths in 1893. We must congratulate ourselves on the almost entire absence of small-pox from this District; but unless the vaccination laws are carried out, we shall not be able to congratulate ourselves long. However, I trust that the energetic action of our Board will shortly ensure the law once more being enforced in this District, as it has always been in past years.

The fearful outbreak of small-pox at Gloucester certainly should be a warning to all those who profess disbelief in vaccination. During the height of this outbreak Dr. Bond reported to the Glouces er Board of Guardians that, "of the 366 persons recently attacked, 207 were not vaccinated at all; 158 vaccinated only in infancy; and one revaccinated 14 years ago; and out of 81 deaths 70 were unvaccinated cases, and 11 vaccinated only in infancy." Yet even at this very time, and in the face of such a report as this certain people were getting up anti-vaccination meetings in this country!

DISEASES OF THE RESPIRATORY ORGANS.

The number of deaths from Phthisis show a decrease of 21 on the previous year.

The total number of deaths from diseases of the respi-

ratory organs was 329, or 80 more than last year. Of this number 61 deaths were attributed directly to Influenza, as compared with 29 only in 1894.

INQUESTS.

Coroner's inquests were held in 78 cases of death. The causes of death were returned as follows:—

Natural causes 36

Violent deaths 42

Of these latter 24 were accidental, 16 suicidal, and 2 homicidal. Twenty-five deaths were registered as "Not Certified."

MARRIAGES.

During the year 1895 there were 495 Marriages in the Parish of Lewisham, of which 365 were solemnised in the various Churches, 43 in Dissenting Chapels, and 87 at the Registrar's Office.

During the same period there were 148 marriages in the Hamlet of Penge, of which 107 were solemnised in Churches, 14 in Dissenting Chapels, and 26 at the Registrar's Office. Total 642, as compared with 652 in 1894.

The marriage rate was equal to 12.4 persons married per 1,000 of estimated population.

METEOROLOGY.

The mean temperature of the air at Greenwich in 1895 was 47.9.

The highest reading by day, 87.3, was registered in September, and the lowest reading by night, 6.9, in Feb.

Rain fell on 158 days. The total amount of rainfall was 19.75 inches.



The rainfall for the year ending Lady-day, 1895, was 21.84 inches with 158 wet days; this shows a decrease of 1.95 inches of rainfall and 19 fewer wet days for last year.

There was no snow during the year, and the winter was exceptionally mild, consequently very little grit and ashes were used on the roads.

ROAD WATERING.

The Board's horses were employed in the Blackheath and Lewisham Division for road watering purposes, and when additional horses were required they were supplied by Mr. W. Joy, at 8s. 9d. at Blackheath, and 8s. 6d. per horse, harness and driver in Lewisham.

The whole of the horses in the Sydenham and Forest Hill division were supplied by Mr. W. Stimpson at 8s. per horse, harness and driver per day.

Mr. R. Winnifrith supplied the horses, in Penge, at 7s. 6d.

per horse, per day, including harness and driver.

All the vans and carts are the property of the Board.

STREET LIGHTING.

In the Parish of Lewisham the gas for Lighting the Street Lamps is supplied by the South Metropolitan and Crystal Palace District Gas Companies, and in the Hamlet of Penge by the Crystal Palace District Gas Company. The Companies also light, extinguish, clean, paint and maintain the lanterns and columns; the former at £3 3s. 9d., and the latter Company at £3 2s. 10d. per lamp per annum.

There are 868 ordinary and 23 special lamps supplied by the South Metropolitan Gas Company, and 921 ordinary and 21 special lamps supplied by the Crystal Palace District Gas Company in

the Parish of Lewisham.

The South Metropolitan Gas Company also supply gas to one lamp at the White Hart urinal, which is paid for jointly by the Board and Messrs. Whitbread.

One lamp in Adelaide Road, and one in Lewisham Road, were discontinued, special lamps being erected in substitution for them.

In the Parish of Lewisham 45 lamps were removed, and 2 in the Hamlet of Penge.

The Crystal Palace District Gas Company supply gas to 373 ordinary lamps and 26 special lamps in the Hamlet of Penge.

One lamp was discontinued in Beckenham Road.

Several incandescent burners were fixed in public lamps by way of experiment, but so far I cannot report in favour of this system for Street Lighting, on account of the expense of replacing the mantles, which have a very short life in public lamps, being exposed more or less to the weather, and also to severe vibration from the traffic.

During the year an unusual amount of labour and care was expended on the examination of old drainage, removal of stoppages, testing drains with water, &c. Within the last few years this particular work has increased to a large extent.

In my last annual Report I spoke of the commencement of the London County Council's new Outfall Sewer from Loampit Vale, Lewisham, to Bell Green. I regret to say wet and bad ground has been met with, causing some delay in the progress of the work. I expect it will be Christmas before the Sewer is completed as far as Catford Bridge. The Council are carrying out the work themselves without a Contractor.

The brick and concrete Sewer from Bell Green to Penge, in continuation of this new Outfall Sewer of the London County Council, was commenced by the Lewisham Board of Works during the year. The work is being executed under contract by Mr. Wm. Woodham, of Lower Sydenham. It is the deepest and most difficult sewer the Board have ever had to construct, the invert level being, in the deepest place, 58ft. 6in. below the surface of the ground. Very good progress has been made with the work, and there are now 3000 feet run of sewer completed out of a total length of 7320 feet. The sewer is 4ft. by 2ft. 8in., egg-shaped.

The brick and concrete Sewer in continuation of the Ennersdale Road Sewer, to and along Hither Green Lane, to drain the St. Germans Estate, belonging to Mr. A. C. Corbett, M.P., was commenced on the 4th May, 1896. The Sewer is egg shaped, 3ft. 3in. by 2ft. 2in. in size, and will be constructed under the Dartford Branch and Main Line of the South Eastern Railway. The work is being executed under contract by Mr. John Jackson of Plaistow. Considerable progress has been made with the work and at the present time 2600 feet run of the sewer are completed out of a total of 5212 feet.

A plan, estimate and apportionment of a brick and concrete egg-shaped Sewer, in extension of the present sewer at Rose-lawn, Bromley-road, to Southend Village, was prepared, and I hope to see it carried out soon. When this work is completed the cesspools at Southend will be done away with. I also prepared a plan, section and estimate for extending the Stanstead-road Sewer trom the corner of Sunderland-road to near the Devonshire-road. The sewer will be egg-shaped, 4ft. 0in. by 2ft. 8in., brick and

concrete. When this sewer is completed the full advantage of the new Stanstead-road Sewer will be obtained.

An inspection of the tables of Sewers, Surface Water Drains and House Drainage given in this Report and sanctioned by the Board during the year, will show the large amount of Sewer work, etc., carried out, or in hand at the present time, and points to the extent the building land is being developed in the District.

IMPROVEMENTS, FRONTAGE LINES, &c.

The two road improvements on the south west side of Hither-green-lane, from Ennersdale-road to near Beacon-road, and at the junction of George and Hither-green-lanes, mentioned in my last year's Report, were completed during the year.

The widening of Catford and Ladywell Bridges is not commenced yet. The matter is still in the hands of the London County Council. I shall be very glad to see these bridges widened.

The London County Council sent eighteen applications with requests for suggestions, and the annexed table will show how they were dealt with. The most important application was that of Mr. E. H. Selby (Case 8290) to build shops in High-street, Lewisham, and in George-lane.

I append to this Report a return of the mileage of the streets and roads at present maintained by the Board, and a list of the Automatic Flushing Tanks at present at work in the District, also a list of New Streets sanctioned during the year.

One hundred and sixty drawings and tracings were made in my office, including three sets of drawings for a Coroner's Court and Mortuary. Many estimates were prepared, and specifications, reports and letters written also a number of statutory notices were served.
