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# PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT,

## TOWN HALL, WEST HAM.

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*To the Council of the County Borough of West Ham.*

MR. MAYOR AND GENTLEMEN,

“Every Medical Officer of Health appointed under the Public Health Act is required by order of the Local Government Board to make an annual report with regard to the sanitary district which is under his superintendence. . . . . The report is to be for the year ending 31st December. It should be chiefly concerned with the conditions affecting health in the district, and of any improvement or deterioration which may have occurred during the year in those circumstances.”

In accordance with the above requirement, I beg to submit my annual report for the year 1914, and in doing so, desire to point out that such report must necessarily consist very largely of a summary of my periodical reports and other matters which have been under discussion by the Council during the year, and which, therefore, are more or less within the immediate recollection of the members. The collated returns, however, and the statement of local circumstances which may appear superfluous to members fully conversant with them, serve not only as valuable statistical records for future reference, but are needed by the Local Government Board and other authorities, to whom the Medical Officer of Health is required to forward copies.

**Physical Features and General Character of the District.**—West Ham is situate in latitude  $51^{\circ} 30'$  to  $51^{\circ} 33'$  N., and the longitude  $0^{\circ}$  to  $1'$  W., to  $0^{\circ} 3'$  E., on the extreme west of the County of Essex, and on the eastern side of the administrative County of London, from which it is separated by the windings of the River Lee and Bow Creek for  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

In shape it is an irregular rhomboid, some 2 miles from west to east and 4 miles from north to south, comprising within its boundaries 4,706 acres. The northern and eastern sides of the Borough are contiguous to the populated districts of Leyton and East Ham. The southern boundary is formed by the River Thames for  $2\frac{1}{8}$  miles. In elevation it is almost flat, varying from less than 5ft. to 45ft. above ordnance datum, about half of the area being not more than 10ft. above that level. Chalk may be reached at depths varying from 100ft. to 150ft., overlaid by green Thanet sands and Woolwich beds, on which rests 5ft. to 50ft. of London clay. In the north-eastern half of the Borough 16ft. to 20ft. of river drift gravel overlays the London clay, sloping down towards the River Lee and River Thames into marshy clay and alluvium, a large part of the immediate surface being made ground.

## METEOROLOGY.

The meteorological returns hitherto published by the Registrar-General were temporarily discontinued after the week ending October 24th. The following table consequently only applies to 42 weeks and no comparison can be made between it and the previously published tables relating to entire years. The observations were taken at Greenwich Observatory, a course justified by the geographical position of the Borough immediately to the North of Greenwich :—

**Water Supply.**—Several large firms possess private wells for drawing water from the chalk, but practically the whole of the Borough is supplied with water by the Metropolitan Water Board, successors to the East London Water Company, the main source of the water being derived from the River Lee and the wells sunk by the latter company.

**Milk Supply.**—Under the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops Orders, 335 premises were on the Register for the sale of Milk at the commencement of the year, the majority of these being small general shops retailing very small quantities of milk, the storage of which is frequently of a doubtful character. On inspection, 31 were found to require cleansing or to exhibit defects remediable under the Public Health Acts. 28 milkshops were struck off the Register and 21 placed thereon during the year.

In addition to the above, the Register contained the names of 20 persons registered as cowkeepers. 97 visits were paid to the cowsheds of these persons, and in several cases notices to cleanse or remedy structural defects were served upon the cowkeepers. Most of the cowsheds were kept in a fairly cleanly state, but there is still much room for improvement in some, both in the character of the buildings and in the care exercised in the collection and distribution of the milk.

With a view to the detection of Tuberculosis of the Udder, prior to the year 1908, an annual inspection of all cows in the Borough was made by the Council's Veterinary Surgeon, but in that year the Council, on the advice of the Medical Officer of Health, decided that a quarterly inspection should be made.

With respect to the quarterly inspections I received the following reports during the year after the cows had been examined:—

First Quarter.—A number of cases of cough were present in several sheds. This is accompanied by a form of non-specific fever and occasionally by lung congestion. There were no cases of mammitis requiring attention.

Second Quarter.—The cows on this inspection were in excellent condition. Those at Thomas Street and Anne Street were out at pasture. There were no cases of specific udder disease requiring special attention. The number of cows is the same as in the last report.

Third Quarter.—I beg to report that I have inspected the cows at the different sheds throughout the Borough. Those at Anne Street and Thomas Street are still out at pasture. There is no evidence of active specific disease, and, with the exception of two cases of simple mammitis, the cows are in splendid condition. I venture to suggest that more attention should be paid to general cleanliness, this particularly at the Edwin Street shed.

Fourth Quarter.—The cows generally are in good condition, several cases of simple mammitis were evident. These are chiefly caused by injuries to the teats. No evidence of any specific disease was present in any of the cases.

**Chief Occupations of Inhabitants.**—West Ham is a typical industrial Borough. Large factories abound on the river frontages west and south; railway works employing thousands of regular hands are located in the north, and large docks—the staple support of casual labour—intersect the south. The rest of the area may be said to form the dormitory of artisans, clerks and others whose daily work is carried on in London, together with the local shops and retail businesses necessary for the welfare of their families. There is no particular industry calculated to specially affect the public health.

**Housing Accommodation.**—The dedicated roads of the Borough extend to  $127\frac{1}{4}$  miles, some four-fifths of which are at least



40 ft. wide, and are bordered by houses of two storeys. Originally constructed as self-contained houses, they have, in a large measure, been adapted by alterations and additions for the accommodation of two families, while in recent years the flat system has been generally adopted in developing the newer estates. Very few blocks of dwellings of three or more storeys exist, and the unsatisfactory character of these give rise to the need for constant supervision and action by the Sanitary Staff. The erection of all new buildings are supervised by Building Inspectors of the Borough Engineer's Department.

At the census in 1901 there were 41,368 inhabited houses in the Borough. The figures for the 1911 census published by the Registrar-General show them then to be 61,882 families or separate occupiers. The census population figures for the Wards were published in my report for 1911, and those now given in the table on page 32 are the estimated approximate figures to the middle of 1914. A regular house-to-house visitation is paid to these, and during the year the number of dwelling-houses inspected was 13,514, while, in addition, 4,834 were visited on account of infectious disease.

The following matters were dealt with either under the Housing of the Working Classes Act, 1890, or the Housing, Town Planning, &c., Act :—

*Re* Nos. 21, 31, and 33, Carlton Street.

These houses were reported in 1913 with a view of making Closing Orders, and the matter was adjourned to enable the owners to execute certain works. This was done during the year under review, and the houses rendered fit for human habitation.

*Re* No. 4a, Camel Road.

93, 95, and 99, High Street, Stratford.

7, 8, 9, 10, and 11, Lea Street, Stratford.

9, 10, 11, 12, 13, and 14, River Street.

233, Neville Road.

1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, James' Place.

The above 22 houses were, during the year, reported to the Public Health Committee, and on their recommendation the Council made Closing Orders in respect thereof.

*Re* Nos. 42, 44, 46, and 48, Hoy Street.

These four houses received the attention of the Committee with a view to a Closing Order being made, but at the end of the year the requisite works being in progress it did not become necessary to recommend the making of Closing Orders.

*Re* Nos. 11, 13, 15, 17, and 19, Scott Street, and 29, Maplin Road.

The above 6 houses which had been closed under the Public Health Acts and Housing Town Planning Act, respectively, were rendered fit, and the Closing Orders in respect of same were determined.

### **Housing (Inspection of District) Regulations, 1910.**

The following is the report on the work carried out under the above Regulations during the year 1914, together with tabular statement in accordance with Article 5 of the said Regulations.

The Regulations provide for the Inspection for the purposes of Sub-section 1 of Section 17 of the Housing, Town Planning, &c., Act of 1909, by the Medical Officer of Health, or by an Officer designated by the Local Authority but coming under his directions and supervision, and require that the inspection of each house shall deal with the following matters :—

- (1) The arrangements for preventing the contamination of the water supply.
- (2) Closet accommodation.



- (3) Drainage.
- (4) The condition of the dwelling-house in regard to light, free circulation of air, dampness and cleanliness.
- (5) The paving, drainage and sanitary condition of any yard or outhouses belonging to the dwelling-house.
- (6) The arrangements for the deposit of refuse and ashes.
- (7) The existence of any room which contravenes Sub-section 7 of Section 17 of the Act of 1909.
- (8) Defects in other matters which tend to render the dwelling-house dangerous to the health of an inhabitant.

The Regulations also provide for the records being kept in connection with the inspection.

For years past, a house-to-house inspection has been carried on in West Ham, and immediately upon the issue of the above Regulations, the Inspectors were instructed to continue their systematic inspection, each of them being supplied with a copy of the Regulations. As a result of such inspection during the year 1914, the following action was taken under the Housing and Town Planning Act :—

The general character of the defects found to exist included defective drain, soil pipes and w.c. pans, foul and defective surface gullies, sink waste and rain-water pipes, absence of water fittings,

dilapidated conditions of roofs, windows, staircases, fireplaces, and walls and ceilings.

**Food Inspection.**—Each of the 12 Inspectors is required to inspect the food shops and slaughter-houses in his district. In addition to these, the Food Inspector, who devotes the greater part of his time to the administration of the Sale of Food and Drugs Acts, is charged equally with the other Inspectors with the duty of safeguarding the sale of food in market streets and other premises where dietary articles are exposed for sale.

In the appendix to this report will be found a list of unsound food seized as unfit and unwholesome at its time of exposure for sale, or condemned without formal seizure under Section 117 Public Health Act, 1875.

Legal proceedings were instituted during the year in three cases under the above section, and the particulars of these will also be found in the list of Prosecutions in the Appendix.

The "American Gooseberry Mildew (Fruit) Order, 1912," issued that year by the Board of Agriculture with the object of detecting the disease of *sphaerotheca mors-uvæ* which particularly affects that fruit, continued to have the attention of the Inspectors.

**Inspection of Bakehouses and Fishshops.**—This is also carried out by the Inspectors, particular attention being directed to the regular removal of offal and trade refuse, which is carried out by private contractors.

In connection with nuisances arising from the fishmongers' trade, complaints continue to be received in the summer months of the



offensive odours arising from the removal of fish offal, and during the year nine persons were prosecuted for conveying offensive matter through the district during prohibited hours.

**Slaughter-houses.**—There are now upon the Register 16 old registered slaughter-houses and one registered knacker's yard, together with 16 annually licensed slaughter-houses and one annually licensed knacker's yard. Owing to the proximity to the London market the amount of slaughtering carried out locally forms a small percentage of the meat sold, but the infrequency of use and scattered location of the private slaughter-house render efficient inspection extremely difficult and unsatisfactory. I dealt with the possibilities in this connection very fully in my report for 1910.

**Sale of Food and Drugs Acts.**—Although each Inspector of Nuisances is required by the terms of his appointment to take samples if necessary under the above Acts, a special Inspector is appointed *ad hoc* to devote the greater part of his time to carrying out the duties imposed by their provisions on the Council.

Under the Sale of Food and Drugs Acts, and the Public Health (Milk and Cream) Regulations, 1912, 1,267 samples were purchased for analysis, and 86 were returned by the Public Analyst as adulterated, the number of samples taken being at the rate of 4·2 per 1,000 of the estimated population. In London the samples taken during the year 1913 were at the rate of 5·6 per 1,000, and in the rest of England at the rate of 2·6 per 1,000. I applied for summonses in 49 cases, at the hearing of which fines and costs amounting to £71 1s. were imposed. The particulars of these will be found in the appendix.

It will be noted that although 73 samples of Milk were returned as adulterated a considerable proportion of these cases show a deficiency either in fat or solids not fat so small in amount that legal proceedings would scarcely be justifiable. They might be described as Milks of very poor quality rather than adulterated Milk, but under the "Sale of Milk Regulations" the Local Government Board state that "it remains the duty of the Analyst to class as adulterated or not up to standard all Milk samples failing to reach the limits fixed by the Regulations."

During the year the Home & Colonial Stores, Ltd., were registered as Wholesale Dealers in Margarine at their following premises in the Borough:—11, Angel Lane; 11, Woodgrange Road; 388, Green Street; 119, Leytonstone Road; 60, Stratford Road; 3, Church Street; 290, Barking Road; 11, Freemasons Road; 15 and 110, Victoria Dock Road.

**Sewerage and Drainage.**—The water carriage system of sewage removal is almost universal throughout the whole area of the district. With few exceptions all houses are provided with properly-flushed modern water-closets, discharging through appropriate pipes into brick sewers, which also convey the surface water and most of the rainfall. The Southern portion of the Borough, being isolated by the Victoria and Albert Dock, is drained into a main sewer running from West to East, through a narrow strip of the Southern portion of the Borough of East Ham, whence it discharges into the London County Council Sewer in North Woolwich.

The North-western corner of the Borough—an area of roughly 120 acres containing two terraces of houses and some isolated houses and factories—remains unsewered, the excrement disposal consisting of cesspools, while scattered cesspools are to be found here and there in a few places remote from the general system of sewerage.

The sewers draining the main portion of the district (five-sixths of the whole area) converge by means of specially constructed intercepting sewers to the Corporation's Pumping Station, situate near the middle of the Western border of the Borough. Here the sewerage is pumped into the Northern Metropolitan Outfall Sewer which crosses the Borough obliquely, whence it gravitates to the London Outfall at Barking.

**Collection of House Refuse.**—By the West Ham Corporation Act, 1888, the Corporation is empowered to require owners of houses to provide movable receptacles for house refuse instead of ashpits, and by special bye-law the occupiers of houses are required to place them outside their houses on such days as the Council fix. Under these provisions the house refuse is collected twice each week by the Council's own vehicles. Thirty-six carts and vans are used, and the staff employed numbers 56 men, besides the Dust Inspector and two foremen.

The total amount collected during the 283 working days in the year was 27,221 loads, a decrease of 1,187 loads on the previous year

The shoots on which the above house refuse was deposited, together with the number of loads in each case, are set out below :—

In my report for 1911, I dealt fully with the arrangements with regard to “barging” house refuse as far as the Southern portion of the

Borough was concerned, and in my Reports for 1912 and 1913 I mentioned the question of the erection of a Dust Destructor. The definite decision of the Council having been held over the negotiations with Messrs. Cory resulted in a renewal of the Agreement with them for the continuance of "barging" for a further period not exceeding two years.

Owing to the outbreak of European hostilities the usual bi-weekly collection of house refuse was reduced to a once-a-week collection between 17th August and 10th October in consequence of the War Office commandeering the greater part of the Council's stud of horses at the Corporation Stables. The temporary dislocation of collection was remedied by the purchase by the Council of horses to replace those taken.

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## **BYE-LAWS RELATING TO OFFENSIVE TRADES, COMMON LODGING HOUSES, &c.**

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**Offensive Trades.**—Upwards of 30 premises where statutory offensive businesses are carried on are located in the Borough, and include soap manufacturers, 9; fat melters and bone boilers, 16; gut scrapers, 2; fish and offal contractors, 2; organic manure manufacturers, 2; other trades, 5. These are subject to constant inspection, and may be said to be carried on with comparatively little nuisance to the general public.

During the year it was necessary to institute proceedings for nuisance from smoke and fumes against the London Peat Fuel Company, of 10, Newton Road, Stratford, a trade which was not amenable to the Bye-Laws governing offensive trades. The proceedings resulted in the imposition by the Magistrate of a fine of



£2 and costs. The firm has subsequently removed from the district.

An application was received from the Excel Co., Ltd., of Carpenters Road, Stratford, for permission to include in their limited powers of bone boiling, the treatment of bones from their own slaughterhouse in Whitechapel. The application was acceded to by the Council.

An application, received from Messrs. M. P. Hunt & Co., to establish fat melting at soap making works in Marshgate Lane in proposed new building was granted subject to the plans and plant being to the satisfaction of the Borough Engineer and Medical Officer of Health.

**Common Lodging Houses.**—There are 14 Common Lodging Houses in the Borough, seven in the Stratford district and 7 in the Tidal Basin district, all of which, with one exception were originally constructed and used for other purposes such as private dwellings or warehouses, and have been adapted more or less successfully to meet the requirements of the Common Lodging House Bye-Laws. The accommodation in these amount to 964 beds.

**Schools.**—The Public Elementary Schools consist of 49 Council Schools and 14 Non-Provided Schools, together with four Council Special Schools, and two Higher Elementary Schools, affording in the aggregate accommodation for 69,523 scholars.

The Schools are for the most part modern, substantially built buildings, adequately supplied with water and provided with sufficient surrounding air space, while their general cleanliness appears to be well looked after.

With a view to checking the spread of epidemic disease it has been the practice for many years past for the Medical Officer of Health

on receiving information of the occurrence of infectious disease in the family of a scholar to send a red-coloured notice to the Head Teacher of the School (Day School and Sunday School) recommending the exclusion of children coming from the infected home, subsequently followed by a white notice freeing the family from quarantine on the completion of the necessary isolation and the official disinfection of the premises. Each School is provided with a supply of disinfectants for general or special use.

The particular action taken with regard to Schools during the year will be found under the heading "Chief Zymotic Diseases."

**Bacteriology.**—During the year arrangements were made with the Authorities of the new Pathological Laboratory at the Tropical School of Medicine, Royal Albert Docks, for bacteriological and other necessary examinations to be available for Medical Practitioners of the district where, after conferring with the Practitioner, an examination was considered advisable by the Medical Officer of Health.

**Methods of Dealing with Infectious Disease.**—Prior to the Infectious Disease Notification Act, 1899, the notification of these diseases in West Ham had been compulsory for 11 years, under special powers obtained by the West Ham Corporation Act, 1888, which provided for the notification of all the diseases specified in the general Act, with the exception of Erysipelas and Membranous Croup.

The Hospital accommodation of the Borough for the isolation of infectious disease consists of—

- (1) The Plaistow Fever Hospital (opened as to two wards in 1896 and as to the completed Hospital in 1901) now contains 210 beds, allocated to the following purposes:



110 beds for Scarlet Fever, 63 for Diphtheria, 22 for Enteric Fever, and 15 isolation beds for Mixed or Staff cases.

- (2) Dagenham Small-pox Hospital, situate about 9 miles from the Borough, occupying a site of  $6\frac{1}{2}$  acres, enclosed within a farm of 119 acres, owned and cultivated by the Council, was opened in 1899. It consists of permanent buildings capable of accommodating 50 patients with the administrative staff required for their care, together with temporary iron buildings sufficient to treat 300 cases. Under agreement, eight other Sanitary Authorities contribute to the establishment and maintenance of this Hospital, in consideration of West Ham undertaking to receive and treat all the Small-pox cases sent to the Hospital by those Authorities. This Hospital is now being used as a temporary Sanatorium.

- (3) The Grange Convalescent Home is situate about  $9\frac{1}{2}$  miles from the Borough at Harold Wood, Essex, in which the accommodation is ample for 40 children. This Home consists of a residential mansion with out-buildings and 7 acres of ground, together with  $61\frac{1}{2}$  acres of pasture land, and has required considerable alterations and additions to render it fit for its present use. The Home was opened for the reception of patients on 22nd February, 1909.

In connection with the Dagenham Hospital is a building containing an Equifex steam disinfecter for Hospital use, while attached to the Plaistow Fever Hospital is a large Washington-Lyons disinfecter, so arranged as to serve the purposes of a public disinfecting station for the treatment of bedding, &c., of infectious cases occurring in the Borough on removal to hospital or on recovery at home.

**Methods of Control of Tuberculosis.**—Down to the end of 1908 no system, voluntary or compulsory, of notification of Pulmonary Tuberculosis pertained in West Ham, and consequently very few cases of living consumptives were brought to the knowledge of the Public Health Department. Since 1st January, 1909, the Public Health (Tuberculosis) Regulations, 1908, issued by the Local Government Board, have been in operation, by which the notification of Phthisis occurring in Poor Law Institutions or under the care of District Medical Officers became compulsory. On the 22nd March, 1911, the Local Government Board issued further regulations making Pulmonary Tuberculosis compulsorily notifiable by the Medical Officer of any hospital in any out- or in-patient. This came into operation on the 1st May, 1911. At the end of that year the Local Government Board issued a further Order making Pulmonary Tuberculosis notifiable as and from January 1st, 1912, by Medical Practitioners in their private practice and also School Medical Inspectors, so from this date all cases of Phthisis with a few exceptions became notifiable to the Local Authority.

In December, 1912, the Local Government Board issued further Regulations revoking all the above-mentioned Orders, and making all forms of Tuberculosis notifiable as and from February 1st, 1913. The number of cases notified, both pulmonary and other forms, will be found in the Appendix, page 75.

In all cases notified a member of the Sanitary Staff visits the home, with a view to the remedying of any existing defects in the structural surroundings of the patient, of advising him as to the necessity of properly using the means at his disposal, of aiding him by verbal converse and printed literature to appreciate the value to himself and his family of the proper treatment and disposal of his expectoration, and of teaching him the right use of disinfectants. In every case of a recorded death from Phthisis a similar visit is paid, disinfection of the premises advised and, in most cases, carried out.



With regard to the treatment of Tuberculosis, I set out in full the whole aspect of the position and obligations of the Council under the Act in my Report for 1912. The utilisation of the Council's Small Pox Hospital at Dagenham continued to receive the sanction of the Local Government Board as a temporary Sanatorium, and during the year 190 cases (125 males and 65 females) were admitted thereto, of whom 174 were insured persons and 16 un-insured. With regard to the scheme for the erection of the permanent Sanatorium the Council's decision that Wootton's Farm, Langdon Hills, Essex, be purchased as the site therefor received the sanction of the Local Government Board, and the Borough Engineer and Medical Officer of Health were instructed to confer and prepare plans of the buildings to be erected. The Local Government Board recommended that it was desirable that a Resident Medical Officer should be appointed for the temporary Sanatorium, and in accordance therewith the Council appointed Dr. G. M. Mayberry, who commenced his duties on 2nd April, such appointment having received the approval of the Board. The question of the provision of temporary hospital accommodation came before the Council, and they decided after considering the matter from various points of view to use some of the permanent beds at Dagenham Hospital for the purpose.

At the end of last year the Dispensary was in course of completion. On 23rd February, 1914, it commenced its operations. Two nurses were appointed with Dr. F. G. Collins, still acting as Tuberculosis Officer. Towards the middle of the year the West Ham Insurance Committee agreed that the duties of Medical Adviser to the Committee be transferred from the Medical Officer of Health to Dr. Collins with full clinical charge of the cases referred to the Tuberculosis Dispensary, and that the Medical Officer of Health act in future as the General Medical Adviser to the Committee. The Council agreed to the proposals of the Insurance Committee.

**Births.**—The number of births registered in the Borough during the year was 8,939 (4,614 males and 4,325 females), which will be found distributed in the following table. From this number, however, 91 (39 males and 52 females) have to be deducted in accordance with the return supplied by the Registrar-General as belonging elsewhere, bringing the total net births to 8,848. This is a decrease under last year's net births of 277, but 68 above the average number during the preceding five years. The birth-rate for the year was 29·8 per 1,000, while the average birth-rate during the five years 1909–1913 was 30·0 per 1,000. After the suitable adjustments rendered necessary by the foregoing tables have been made, the net deaths of the Borough numbered 4,425 (2,338 males and 2,087 females), being 113 more than the previous year and 182 more than the average for the last five years. This makes an annual death-rate for the year of 14·9 per 1,000, or 0·4 less than the average death-rate during the five years 1909–1913, which was 14·5 per 1,000.

Corrected for age and sex distribution, the annual death-rate becomes 15·9 per 1,000, the factor for correction being 1·0693.

Both the foregoing birth-rate and death-rate, as well as the subsequent rates, have been calculated from a population estimated by the Registrar General for the middle of the year at 296,570.

**Chief Zymotic Diseases.**—The total deaths from the seven principal Zymotic diseases numbered 589, making an annual Zymotic death-rate of 1·98 per 1,000, the average Zymotic death-rate during the previous five years being 2·15 per 1,000. In the following tables I append particulars as far as possible relating to each disease separately—both notifiable and non-notifiable epidemic diseases. In the case of the latter, however, the reported cases are necessarily inexact, as the numbers are chiefly obtained from the School Attendance Officers, who are in many cases unable to verify by medical certificate the nature of the illness alleged to be the cause of absence from School.

**Small-pox.**—There were no cases of this disease notified during 1914, either in West Ham or the surrounding Districts, contributing to the Agreement for the upkeep of Dagenham Small-Pox Hospital, which, of course, is used by the Council as their temporary Sanatorium. Consequently, it did not become necessary for the Council to avail themselves of the contingent accommodation provided by the Metropolitan Asylums Board.

The Agreements with the surrounding contributing Authorities expiring in September, the Council recommended that same be renewed for a further period of five years.

### Acute Poliomyelitis and Cerebro Spinal Fever.

During the year 1914, three cases of the former disease, and five cases of the latter disease were notified, the deaths being two and five respectively.

In accordance with the instructions of the Local Government Board the following is a resumé of the investigations made into the cases:—

CASE 1.—I. F., aged 6 months, of Napier Road. Posthumous female child. Father died 12 months prior of Bright's Disease. Child notified 6th January. Had never ailed until about two weeks prior, when she suffered from bronchitis. On 3rd January became worse, moving head backwards and forwards, limbs twitching and eyes rolling, accompanied by screaming. Spots were noticed on 6th January. Had been vomiting for a week and previous two days' motions were very green. At time of investigation child laid with head flexed backwards, mouth and eyes wide open, pupils dilated, no squint, limbs tender to the touch, and child gave little troubled cries. Spots of dark purplish brown appeared on neck, forearm, near wrists and below knees, but free from the body. No history of fall. Fourth child, and all living. Breast-fed and well-nourished. Died 8th January.

CASE 2.—A. F., 20 years, male. This case was an Indian seaman, admitted to the Seamen's Hospital where death took place on 28th March. It was not notified, and the cause of death was ascertained bacteriologically. No other particulars were ascertainable.

CASE 3.—E. R., 41 years, male, of Sutton Court Road. Notified 24th April. Patient went out on 9th March perfectly well, but came home shivering. Ate dinner fairly well, and laid down. Two tabloids of quinine were taken. Complained of pain in small of back and up the spine to back of head. Vomited on rising with excessive perspiration, so went to bed. Still sweating



freely, bedclothes became saturated. Following day he seemed much better and did little light work. Went to bed at 9 p.m., but could not remain owing to severity of pain. On the next day (11th March) medical advice was sought; the patient being delirious and "seeing" things which were non-existent. Doctor thought he had delirium tremens. The following day he was easier and a powder was given him. After then he lapsed into a state of semi-coma, but could be roused, and he was removed to London Hospital on 14th March. He died on 20th April, but had been unconscious for about a week prior. Quite unable to speak. Came from a healthy family, both parents and eight brothers and sisters still living. Had been married 21 years. One child only who was healthy. Patient, plumber by trade, and was strong and healthy. Was in Chili for year 1907, came home and went to New York in July, 1912, and from there to Canada arriving home at Christmas, 1913. After his return suffered from headaches and terrible dreams. No history of accident or injury.

CASE 4.—R. M. (male) aged 5 weeks, of Brock Road. Child born 2nd April. Fine healthy baby, but screamed a good deal. Mother attended London Hospital for herself on 7th May, and asked the Doctor to examine child for suspected rupture. Suspicion confirmed, and request made to bring child on 9th for circumcision. Baby ill, and screaming during night of 8th, with temperature of 103.2 or 104.2, so mother was told to take him home and call in a doctor, which was done. Continued ill, with a good deal of screaming. "Fits" set in on 17th May, and death took place on 20th. Few days before death a lump formed at top of his

head. During fits muscles were contracted and thumbs turned inward, mouth and nose looking blue, and foaming at the mouth. Before and after fits head thrown back. Mother had easy confinement, but was very ill during pregnancy, especially last three months. Seventh child, four of whom were boys, and all were ruptured. One girl died at  $3\frac{1}{2}$  years from measles, one at 6 months from bronchitis, and one boy at  $1\frac{1}{2}$  years from wasting. Mother thinks present child born about fortnight before full term. No history of fall. No vomiting until fits came on. No discharge from eyes, ears, and nose. Breast-fed infant. No family history of fits. Father suffers from varicose veins, for which he has been operated upon, and has also undergone operation for appendicitis. Electrician by trade.

CASE 5.—E. F., male, aged 7 years 11 months, of Hack Road. Child taken to Pitsea 30th May. Was a breast-fed baby, and walked at 13 months. Had all his teeth, and has never ailed. On 3rd June was drowsy and cross. Brought home on 5th, and getting worse medical advice was sought on 8th. On 14th right leg and upper part of right arm were powerless, but had use of hands. No discharge from eyes, ears or nose, no squinting, vomiting, or throwing backwards of head. No convulsions until last 24 hours when wrists and thumbs turned inwards. Died on 17th June. No history of fall or exposure to sun. Water supply at Pitsea was rain water collected in a tub, and for drinking purposes was passed through a stone filter, but child did not drink much water. Maternal grandmother suffered from "fits," losing consciousness, but was never violent. She died from cancer. Child was last one of three, one dying 4 years ago, aged 4 months,



from diarrhœa. Remaining child is a fine boy, aged  $4\frac{1}{2}$  years. Live in lower half of house. Comfortable home. Father a stevedore. The only definite symptom in this case up to last 24 hours of life seems to have been drowsiness.

CASE 6.—F. W., male, aged 8 years, of Plashet Road. On 27th July child fell against garden pick grazing left temple. Bleeding ensued, and mother dressed abrasion with disinfectant. Child complained of headache afterwards, and seemed heavy and desired to sleep. Seemed fairly well on following two days, but on the third (30th July) played cricket on Wanstead Flats. Was irritable and "light headed" in evening. Next day he was taken to medical man. Child appeared ill, and complained of his head and back, pain becoming more acute with extreme tenderness on the 1st and 2nd August. Heavy sweating came on, and he became delirious, eventually dying on 7th August. From 31st July his legs became weak and ached, and he gradually lost all power of his limbs except he could move his left hand slightly. He was removed to West Ham Hospital on 4th August. Child was the younger of two boys, both being healthy boys. He was more easily tired at exercise than his elder brother. Had had measles, whooping cough, and been operated upon for adenoids. Maternal grandfather died of phthisis. Suspicion of rheumatism in father's family. Mother had never had a miscarriage. No convulsions, fits or paralysis in family. No vomiting, discharge from ears or nose or spots on deceased.

CASE 7.—H. M. (male), aged 7 months, of Montesquieu Street. Patient a very happy baby, but was costive and occasionally brought up his food. Had a nœvous

behind left ear and another on scrotum, which were increasing in size. On 25th September was very sick, but did not appear ill. The next day the family removed from Poplar to above. No illness at last address, but bad smell in house. On 27th September child was cross and screamed, and could not bear to lie on his left side, placing left foot over right as if he was afraid of pressure on left leg. Taken to Poplar Hospital, 28th September, and the next day to London Hospital. Taken to latter Institution again on 1st October. He was too ill to have nœvi attended to, and was admitted on that day as an in-patient. Temperature was then 103 degrees. No spots, but back of his neck looked discoloured—like a bruise. On 29th and 30th September there was a little “mattery” discharge from eyes. Tongue had been coated and lips dry. Slept well, even during illness. Was breast-fed with an occasional bottle of cow’s milk and water, when mother at work. She is a second-hand clothes dealer in Poplar. Child had never been hopping or to any public crowded building. Apparently the welfare of child was the parents’ first consideration. Father boiler scaler by trade. This is a third child. Eldest girl now 20 years old. Other child died  $2\frac{1}{2}$  years ago at birth. Mother has never had miscarriage. Family history good. No evidence of fall or accident to child. Patient died in Hospital on 8th November.

CASE 8.—J. B., male,  $5\frac{1}{2}$  years, of Fen Street. On 28th November child was eating fried potatoes hurriedly when he fell with a groan and at once became unconscious, his teeth clenched, his eyes closed and face grey. Taken immediately to Poplar Hospital where he was placed in hot bath, and admitted as an in-patient. On 29th he seemed better, but still dozed.



On 1st December he knew his mother, and on 4th, though still in bed, appeared able to move all his limbs. Was breast-fed as a baby, and did not use a "dummy." When about 3 years was operated upon at London Hospital for either adenoids or tonsils. Had a sore heel before present illness, caused by boot. Mother has four children living—all healthy. One died of convulsions at 4 months. Has had no miscarriage. No history of fits, paralysis, tuberculosis, or rheumatism in family. Father is abroad.

After being in hospital 3 weeks and 2 days he recovered and appears perfectly well. No paralysis or weakness of any limb or group of muscles.

It will be observed that in no instance in any of the cases is there evidence of connection with any military forces.

**Scarlet Fever.**—The number of cases notified from this disease was 1,061, being 131 less than in 1913, equivalent to an attack-rate of 3·57 per 1,000, the average attack-rate for the preceding five years 1909–1913 being 3·14 per 1,000. Fourteen deaths occurred, making an annual death-rate of 0·04 per 1,000, the average death-rate for the preceding five years being 0·05 per 1,000. The fatality rate was 1·3 per cent. Of the notified cases, 705, or 66 per cent., were removed to Hospital. The number of cases transferred from Plaistow Hospital to the Convalescent Home, Harold Wood, during the year was 322, where the average duration of stay amounted to 35 days.

**Diphtheria** (including Membranous Croup).—The number of cases notified during 1914 was 445, being 18 more than in 1913. The attack-rate was 1·50 per 1,000, the average attack-rate during the past five years being 1·33 per 1,000. Fifty deaths occurred from the disease, equal to an annual death-rate of 0·16 per 1,000,

the average death-rate during the past five years being 0·15 per 1,000. The fatality or ratio of deaths to attacks was 11·2 per cent. Of the 445 cases notified, 390, or 87·0 per cent., were removed to Hospital.

**Enteric Fever.**—Only 67 cases of this disease were notified during 1914 compared with 75 during the preceding year, and 90 during 1912. This number is equivalent to an annual attack-rate of 0·22 per 1,000, the average attack-rate during the previous five years being 0·33 per 1,000. Thirteen deaths occurred, making an annual death-rate of 0·04 per 1,000, the average death-rate for the years 1909–1913 being 0·05 per 1,000. The fatality rate was 19·4 per cent. Fifty-three cases out of the 67 were removed to Hospital, equivalent to 79·1 per cent.

Besides the admission into Plaistow Hospital of cases of the three preceding diseases, the mixed and other cases received during the year were as follows :—

**Measles.**—The number of cases reported by the School Attendance Officers was 1,890, as against 472 during the previous year. The deaths numbered 134, making an annual death-rate of 0·45



per 1,000, the average death-rate during the previous five years being 0·53 per 1,000.

**Whooping Cough.**—This disease frequently becomes epidemic when Measles is prevalent, and also occurs as a sequelæ of that affection. The number of cases brought to the knowledge of the Medical Officer of Health was 719, and the number of deaths recorded was 115, equivalent to an annual death-rate of 0·38 per 1,000, the average death-rate for the preceding five years being 0·30 per 1,000.

**Diarrhœa.**—Epidemic Diarrhœa, as a rule, is always responsible for the greater part of the zymotic death-rate, and generally accounts for a considerable share in the death-roll of young children, in that the number of deaths from this disease were 263, as against 383 for the preceding year. This is equivalent to a death-rate of 0·88 per 1,000, the average death-rate for the preceding five years 1909–1913 being 1·05 per 1,000.

**Bronchitis** (acute and chronic) caused 500 deaths, or a death-rate of 1·68 per 1,000, the average rate for the past five years being 1·43 per 1,000, while the deaths from Pneumonia numbered 459, equal to a death-rate of 1·54 per 1,000 as compared with an average rate of 1·35 for the preceding five years.

**Heart Diseases** were responsible for 289 deaths, giving a death-rate of 0·97 per 1,000, the five years' average rate being 0·99 per 1,000.

**Cancer**, in which term is included all forms of malignant growth, showed an increase of 21 above the number of deaths recorded during 1913, the number for 1914 being 268. The death-rate is equal to 0·90 per 1,000 as compared with a five years' average rate of 0·86 per 1,000.

**Tubercular Diseases.**—During the year 1914 758 cases of Phthisis were notified, equivalent to a rate of 2·55 per 1,000 of the population. The total number of deaths of West Ham residents from the same cause was 361, equal to a death-rate of 1·21 per 1,000, while the deaths from other tubercular diseases numbered 135, equal to a death-rate of 0·45 per 1,000. During the previous five years the average death-rate from Phthisis was 1·16 per 1,000, and that of other tubercular diseases was 0·44 per 1,000.

**Puerperal Fever.**—Thirteen cases of this disease were notified during the year, and four proved fatal, giving a case mortality of 30·7 per cent. The attack rate (0·04 per 1,000) was the same as the average rate for the previous five years (0·04 per 1,000), while the death-rate (0·01 per 1,000) was the same as the average for five years (0·01 per 1,000).

**Midwives Act, 1902.**—The Midwives' Roll for 1914 contained the names of 337 Certified Midwives residing in West Ham, being a decrease of 21 on the names on the Roll for the previous year, which numbered 358.

Only 69 midwives sent in notice of their intention to practise during the year in accordance with Section 10 of the Act.

432 records of sending for medical aid were received from 51 midwives, and the causes which induced them to require assistance are detailed as under:—

**Infant Mortality.**—Much has been done of recent years to inspire interest in the question of providing the best means of combating with the great waste of infant life, and although recent summers, except that of 1911, have been favourable to the newly born, there is little doubt some of the improvement has been the result of painstaking visitation and the steady infusion of knowledge.

Infant mortality is usually recorded in comparison with the number of births. The total number of infants who died before they

reached the age of one year during 1914 was 957, being 27 less than in 1913. This is equivalent to an infant death-rate of 108 per 1,000 births. The average rate during the past five years 1909–1913 was 112 per 1,000 births. Practically one-fifth of these infants died within a week of birth, and about one-third within a month.

**Notification of Births Act, 1907.**—The adoption of this Act by the Council on 14th January, 1908, received the sanction of the Local Government Board and came into operation in the Borough on 9th March, 1908.

The Act provides for the notification in writing of every birth, whether still-born or otherwise, to the Medical Officer of Health within 36 hours of its occurrence by the father if he is actually residing in the house or by any person in attendance upon the mother at the time of or within six hours after the birth. The Act also provides for the inspection by the Registrars of Births and Deaths of the register kept or notifications received, and has been of much assistance to the Registrars in enabling them to check false information and false addresses.

Every medical practitioner and midwife is supplied with prepaid post-cards as required by the Act, and the following are the figures for the year :—

Of the total 8,848 West Ham births registered in the year 1906 were illegitimate, and of the total infant deaths 42 were illegitimate.



**Factory and Workshops Act, 1901.**—Section 132 provides that the Medical Officer of Health of every District Council shall, in his annual report to them, report specifically on the administration of this Act in workshops and workplaces, and he shall send a copy of his annual report, or so much of it as deals with this subject, to the Secretary of State.

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**Shops Act, 1912.**—This Act received the Royal Assent on 29th March, 1912, and came into operation on 1st May, 1912, and in my Report for that year I dealt with the subject of the complexity of its administration.

Early in 1913 (7th March), an Act amending the Shops Act received the Royal Assent, whereby the provisions of Section 1 of the Shops Act, 1912, were amended to meet the requirements of refreshment houses.

The following Closing Orders and Half-Holiday Orders were in operation at the commencement of the year :—

- (1) Hairdressers' and Barbers' Closing Order, 1909.
- (2) Butchers' Closing Order, 1912.
- (3) Grocers', General Shopkeepers' and Provision Dealers' Half-Holiday Order, 1912.
- (4) Chemists' and Druggists' Half-Holiday Order, 1912.
- (5) West Ham Bakers' Half-Holiday Order, 1913, fixing the half-holiday on Thursday at 2 o'clock.

With regard to the last mentioned Order a petition was received from the Master Bakers' Association of South Essex praying for the revocation of same. This petition was, on the instructions of the Council, verified, in accordance with the Regulations, and the majority of the occupiers being in favour of such revocation the Council recommended that the necessary steps be taken. Notices of the Petition were advertised in the local Press, and also sent to each occupier on the Register. Several objections were received to any alteration in the Order, and after submission of the whole of the facts to the Home Office, the Secretary of State decided to hold a Local Inquiry where any person

affected by the suggested Revocation could attend and be heard thereon. The Inquiry was duly held on 3rd December and the various interested associations and individuals gave evidence and opinions. At the end of the year the decision of the Secretary of State had not been received.

An application was received from Eel-pie Shops in Stratford for the Council to make a Half-Holiday Order for Thursdays, but no *prima facie* case being made out for such an Order the Council decided to take no action.

In my Report for last year I dealt with the question of the considerable element of doubt and misapprehension as to the provisions of the Act, applying both to the various Orders made by the Council and all other shops as to closing immediately preceding and succeeding Christmas and reproduced the special advertisement which was published dealing with the matter. However, during the year under review the Secretary of State issued certain permissible arrangements, and for the purposes of record are reproduced on the following pages in toto:—

Sir,

I am directed by the Secretary of State to say that it appeared from the numerous inquiries on the subject which were addressed to him last winter that considerable doubt prevailed in many quarters as to the extent to which and the manner in which shopkeepers could avail themselves of the provisions of Section 4 (5) of the Shops Act, 1912, during the Christmas shopping season. He thinks, therefore, that it may be of assistance to local authorities if he states certain arrangements which will, in his opinion, be permissible under the Act this year, when Christmas Day and Boxing Day (both of which, he is advised,



are " Bank Holidays " within the meaning of the Act) fall on a Friday and a Saturday respectively.

It is provided by Section 4 (5) that if a shop is closed throughout the whole of a Bank Holiday, **and the Bank Holiday does not fall on the day fixed for the weekly half holiday**, the shopkeeper may keep open either on the half holiday immediately preceding or on the half holiday immediately succeeding the Bank Holiday.

**1. Where Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday is the day fixed for the weekly half holiday :—**

(a) The shopkeeper will, if he closes the whole of Christmas Day or Boxing Day, be entitled to keep open either on the half holiday in Christmas week or on the half holiday in the week following; and, if he closes the whole of **both** days, to keep open on the half holidays in both these weeks.

(b) If, however, he desires to keep open on the Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday, as the case may be, in the week preceding Christmas week, as well as in Christmas week, he must change the day of the weekly half holiday in Christmas week to Saturday in the prescribed manner (that is, by putting up a notice in his shop that in Christmas week the half holiday will be on Saturday). The half holiday in the week preceding Christmas week would then become the half holiday immediately preceding Christmas Day, and the shopkeeper, if he closed the whole of Christmas Day, would not be required to close on that half holiday; but as Saturday the 26th would become the day of the half holiday for Christmas week, he will not be able by virtue of closing the

whole of the 26th to keep open on the usual half holiday in the week after Christmas week.

2. **Where Friday is the day fixed for the weekly half holiday**, the shopkeeper, if he wishes to remain open on Friday the 18th, must change the weekly half holiday in Christmas week to Saturday; but, as explained above, he will then have to close for the usual half holiday in the week after Christmas week.

3. **Where Saturday is the day fixed for the weekly half holiday**, the shopkeeper will be able to keep open on Saturday the 19th by closing the whole of Christmas Day; but, as explained above, he will have to close for the usual half holiday in the week after Christmas week.

As regards New Year's Day, the expression "Bank Holiday" is defined by Section 19 (1) of the Act to include "any public holiday or day of public rejoicing or mourning; and this definition will, the Secretary of State thinks, include New Year's Day in places where that day is, **in fact**, kept as a public holiday. In such places, therefore, a shopkeeper who closes the whole of New Year's Day will be entitled, if his half holiday in New Year's week is fixed for Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday, to keep open either on the half holiday in that week or on the half holiday in the week following; or, if his half holiday is fixed for Saturday, to keep open on Saturday, the 2nd January.

It will be understood that, in the case of shops not affected by a Weekly Half Holiday Order under Section 4 (2), the right of the shopkeeper to change the day of the weekly half holiday in the manner suggested above is subject to the condition that he has not already changed the day within the previous three months (see Section 4 (3) of the Act); but the Secretary of State may



say that he is advised that where a shopkeeper, in the circumstances described above, changes the day of the weekly half holiday in Christmas week to Saturday and reverts to the ordinary day in the following week, such change would constitute a single change only for the purposes of Section 4 (3). In the case of shops for which an Order has been made, the right to change the day will be subject to any conditions imposed by such Order.

As regards the assistants' half holiday, the shopkeeper will not be required to give it in the week preceding Christmas, if he gives them a whole holiday on Christmas Day and a half holiday or a whole holiday on Boxing Day. He should, if Saturday is not the ordinary day for the assistants' half holiday, put up a notice in his shop in the official form saying that in Christmas week Boxing Day will be a half (or whole) holiday.

**The Rag Flock Act, 1911**, came into operation on the 1st July, 1912. This Act prohibits the sale or possession of flock manufactured from rags intended to be used for the purpose of making upholstery, cushions, or bedding, unless the flock conforms to a standard of cleanliness prescribed by the Local Government Board, which standard was fixed by Regulations issued by the Board on 8th June, 1912. Article 1 provides:—Flock shall be deemed to conform to the standard of cleanliness for the purposes of Sub-section (1) of Section 1 of the Act when the amount of soluble chlorine, in the form of chlorides, removed by thorough washing with distilled water at a temperature not exceeding 25°C. from not less than 40 grammes of a well mixed sample of flock does not exceed 30 parts of chlorine in 100,000 parts of flock.

For administrative convenience, all the Inspectors of Nuisances were authorised by the Council to take samples in accordance with Section 5 of the above Act.
