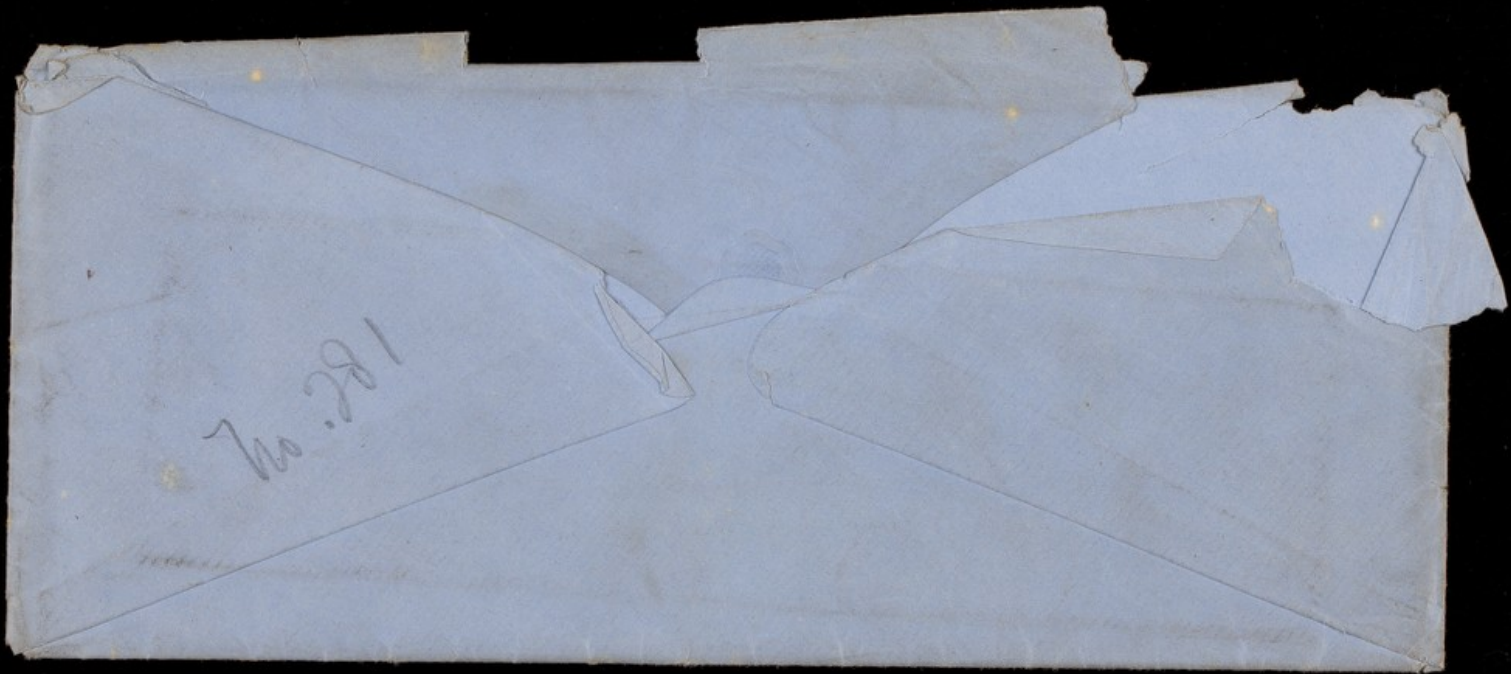

If there be no Husband or Wife, then by the Patient's Father: 4. If there be no Father, then by the Patient's Mother: 5. If there be no Father or Mother, then by any one of the Patient's nearest of Kin: Or by the person who made the last payment on the Patient's account.
