I have been in charge of the patient in Paris for the last three months, and during that period he has remained under the active & persistent influence of these delusions. Dr. Jules Voisin Physician to the Salpetriere has examined the patient Gerald James Potter several times, and Dr. Charcot also of the Salpetriere Paris, has examined him once, & both have given a written opinion that Gerald James Potter is a dangerous lunatic, having delusions of suspicion to the effect that he is mesmerized or magnetized with a view to turning him into dishonour, and therefore they think he should be kept under strict Asylum Surveillance. On the evening of the 25th inst. the patient threatened me that if I did not clear out of the house by the morning of the 26th inst. he would kill me.*
