

IY LORDS AND GENTLEMEN,

I HAVE the honour to inform you that in obedience to your astructions, and after notice given as directed by the Public Iealth Act, I visited this day the parish of Bulkington, in the punty of Warwick, and held a public sitting there at the White ion inn, at noon, for the purpose of hearing statements upon the oundaries within which, in my Report of the 28th July 1849, recommended the application of the Public Health Act, and ore particularly with reference to the combination therein proosed, for administrative purposes, of the parish of Bulkington ith those of Nuneaton and Chilvers-Coton.

The meeting was attended by a considerable number of ratetyers, and I heard statements concerning the impracticability of liting, at present, for administrative purposes, and with a view to onomy of expenditure, the above parishes; and a very strong and nanimous opinion, based on various local reasons, was expressed rainst the proposed union, as likely to interfere materially with e working of the Act: in consequence I have reconsidered my mer recommendation, and I am now of opinion and do recomend that the Public Health Act be applied to the whole petitiong arish of Bulkington alone.
