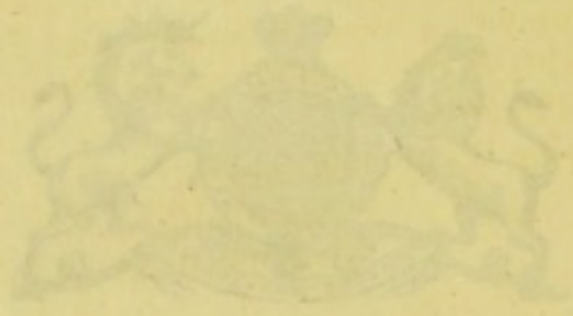
NOTIFICATION.

MY LORDS AND GENTLEMEN,

I HAVE the honour to inform you that in obedience to your instructions, and after notice given as directed by the Public Health Act, I visited this day the parish of Bulkington, in the county of Warwick, and held a public sitting there at the White Lion inn, at noon, for the purpose of hearing statements upon the boundaries within which, in my Report of the 28th July 1849, I recommended the application of the Public Health Act, and more particularly with reference to the combination therein proposed, for administrative purposes, of the parish of Bulkington with those of Nuneaton and Chilvers-Coton.

The meeting was attended by a considerable number of ratepayers, and I heard statements concerning the impracticability of uniting, at present, for administrative purposes, and with a view to economy of expenditure, the above parishes; and a very strong and unanimous opinion, based on various local reasons, was expressed against the proposed union, as likely to interfere materially with the working of the Act: in consequence I have reconsidered my former recommendation, and I am now of opinion and do recommend that the Public Health Act be applied to the whole petitioning parish of Bulkington alone.
