INSTRUCTIONS.

1. This card is issued by the butcher on the authority of the Ministry of Food, so that he can check how he distributes the butcher's meat supplied to him for his registered customers.

2. Any household registering five persons or less with a butcher will receive from him one card. If the number is more than five, but not more than ten, two cards will be issued, and so on. The spaces not required must be cancelled by the butcher before he issues the card.

3. YOU MUST PRODUCE THIS CARD ON THE OCCASION OF EACH PURCHASE, AND SEE THAT YOUR BUTCHER MARKS OR CANCELS THE APPROPRIATE SPACE OR SPACES.

4. THIS CARD IS VALID ONLY WITH THE BUTCHER WHO HAS ENTERED HIS NAME ON IT. The name and address of the butcher must be entered at A by the butcher before issue, and may also be entered at C.

5. The butcher will enter on this card at D the number of persons to whose ration of meat it applies, and the total value of their weekly rations of meat.

6. Enter your name and address on the front of the card at B.

7. This card by itself is no authority to obtain meat, and your butcher may, therefore, before serving you, require the production of the Ration Cards (N. 86) of the persons included on this card.

8. If any person included in the number stated on this card as registered with your butcher is temporarily away from home, and therefore takes his Ration Card with him, meat may not be obtained for him on this card. If any such person is away from the household for four weeks or more, you must tell your butcher, who will amend this card accordingly.

9. The butcher may be informed at any time by the Food Office that a member or members of the household formerly registered with him, has ceased to be so registered. In such case the butcher may require the surrender of this card, with a view to its re-issue as amended, or to the issue of a new card.

PENALTY FOR MISUSE.—£100 fine or 6 months' imprisonment, or both.
