## INTRODUCTION

It is now six years since the previous *Guide* appeared. This 5th edition includes all the accessions received between January 1995 and the end of June 2000. Information published here is also now available on the Wellcome Library's web pages (<http://library.wellcome.ac.uk>), but it is recognized that many researchers still like to be able to browse through and annotate the more traditional hard copy paper guides.

The Contemporary Medical Archives Centre (CMAC) was established in 1979 as part of the Wellcome Institute for the History of Medicine. In July 2000 the CMAC merged with the Western Manuscripts Department, forming the Archives and Manuscripts section of the Wellcome Library for the History and Understanding of Medicine.<sup>1</sup> This *Guide* provides details of collections in the CMAC prior to the merger. During the 21 years of its existence, the CMAC was recognized as one of the foremost repositories of archival collections covering the history of British 20th-century medicine and the health sciences. Although concentrating on archives of the 20th century generated within the UK, scope and date ranges were extended in 1989 when a number of accessions from the Wellcome Tropical Institute (1985–1989) were received. Already strong in imperial/colonial holdings, the Wellcome Tropical Institute added, amongst other collections, the voluminous Royal Army Medical Corps Muniment Collection, which includes much pre-20th-century material. A number of archives of international organizations have also been acquired in recent years.

Since January 1995, over 170 new collections have been added to the archive, and many of the collections that were previously uncatalogued have now been catalogued. Details about all the holdings, their size, scope, reference and availability can be found in this *Guide*. Each entry notes the existence of more detailed finding aids, mainly in the form of lists, but in some cases automated databases. Detailed lists are available for the majority of the collections. Uncatalogued material is *not* normally made available to readers. In addition, access to parts of some catalogued collections may be restricted, and this is

noted in both the *Guide* and the lists themselves. Name and subject indexes are also included in this *Guide* and a list of sources leaflets providing information about the subject and topographical strengths of different collections can be found in Appendix I. At present there are 52 such sources leaflets which are regularly updated, and further leaflets are produced as new collections are made available. They can be obtained from the Library free of charge and can also be found on the web pages. Articles on several of the collections have appeared, mainly in *Medical History*, and these are listed in Appendix II.

Described for the first time in the *Guide* is the Wellcome Archive, a large body of records consisting of the private papers of Sir Henry Wellcome (1853–1936) and the archives of the Wellcome Research Institution and its affiliated bodies including the Wellcome Historical Medical Museum and Bureau of Scientific Research set up by Sir Henry. Now fully catalogued on an automated database and as hard-copy lists, this archive became generally available for the first time in 1999. It had been very little consulted before then because of its inaccessibility, but offers an invaluable new resource for research.

The *Guide* is divided into several categories of material: Personal Papers; Societies and Associations; General Collections; General Practice; Royal Army Medical Corps Muniment Collection; Wellcome Archive. In previous editions the collections in each category were arranged in alphabetical order by reference. However, it was felt that this would be better replaced by an alphabetical arrangement by name of collection. There is no longer a section devoted to Wellcome Tropical Institute collections: these are now integrated with the other categories (a key to their re-categorization can be found in Appendix IV).

Accessions received are reported in our *Annual Review* and also to the National Register of Archives (NRA) at the Royal Commission on Historical Manuscripts. An annual digest of accessions, *Major accessions to repositories in [year] relating to health and medicine*, is edited and mounted by them on their website ([www.hmc.gov.uk](http://www.hmc.gov.uk)). Photocopies of lists can be supplied at the normal Library photocopying charge. Microfiche copies of certain lists are available in the *National Inventory of Documentary Sources in the United Kingdom and Ireland* (NIDS), published by Chadwyck-Healey.

Material from the 20th century can be found elsewhere in the Wellcome Library. In particular the previously named Western Manuscripts Department acquired numerous 20th-century collections prior to 1979. Readers should consult S. A. J. Moorat, *Catalogue of Western Manuscripts... in the Wellcome Historical Medical Library, Part II, MSS written after 1650 A.D.*, 2 vols,

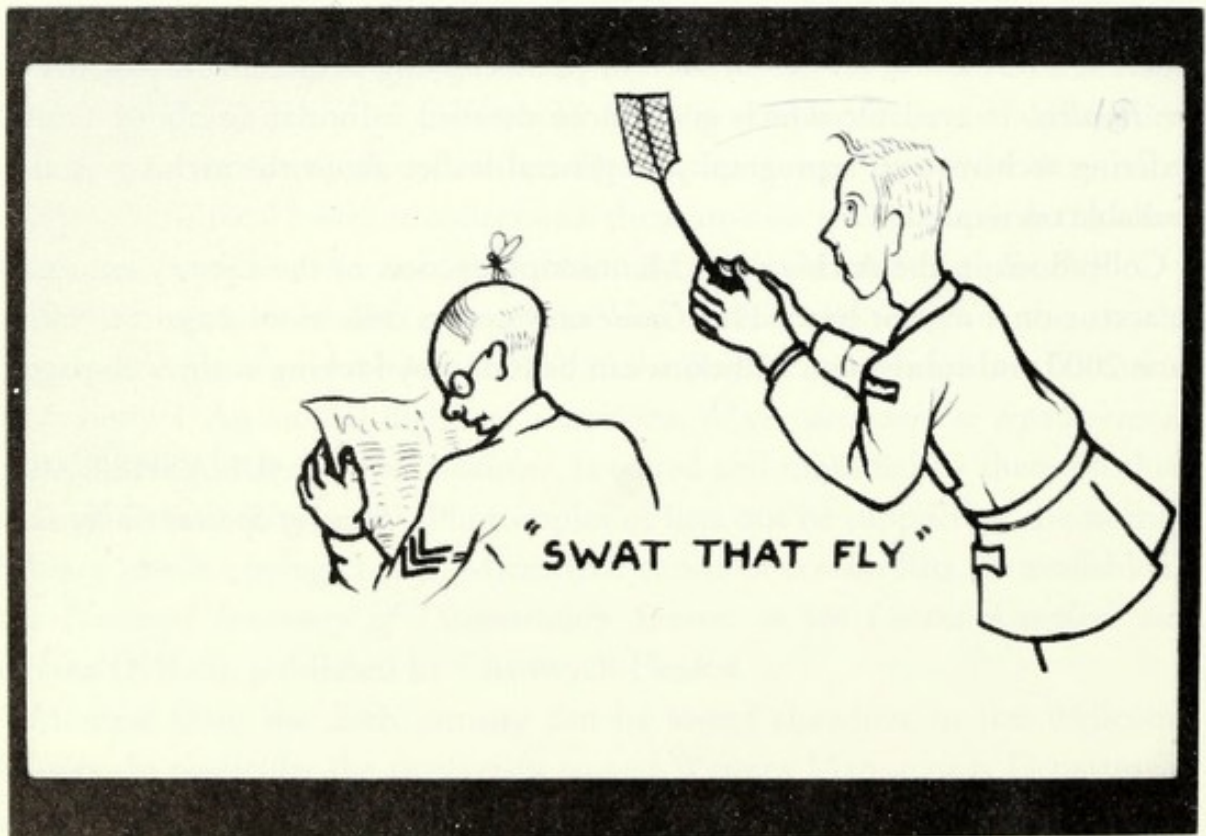
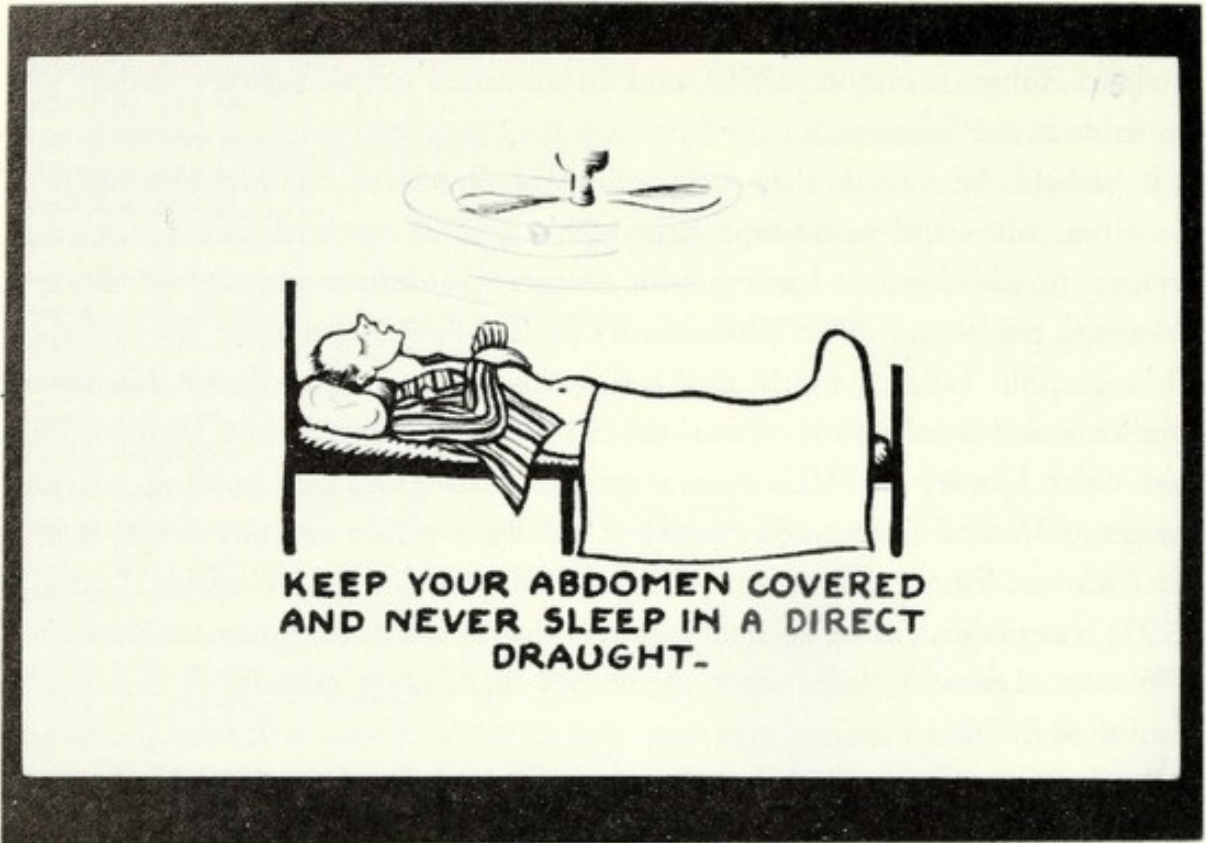
(London, 1973): *Catalogue of Western Manuscripts 5120-6244* compiled by Richard Palmer (London, 2000); and unpublished supplementary finding aids available in the Library.

It should be noted that the archival collections include photographs, drawings, films and audio-tapes where this type of material forms part of an archive. In addition, the Iconographic Department houses photograph albums, drawings, prints and other 20th-century pictorial documentation. The Medical Photographic Library holds many thousands of images of the history of medicine and a collection of medical films can be found in the Medical Film and Video Library (MFVL). A catalogue of the MFVL's film holdings, *Moving Images of Medical Science and History: A catalogue of film and video titles held by the Wellcome Trust and the Wellcome Institute for the History of Medicine* (London, 1995) is available. An up-to-date version is held on a database accessible via the Wellcome Library's web pages. A revised hard-copy edition is due to be published in 2001.

Readers may find it helpful to arrange an initial discussion with an archivist prior to beginning research and should in any case make an appointment for their first visit. They will be asked to sign a Reader's Undertaking and will also need to register as a Library user and complete an application for a library ticket. There is a restriction on the amount of photocopying allowed. A leaflet, *Notes for Readers*, is available which gives more detailed information about access, ordering archives and reprography. A general leaflet about the archives is also available on request.

Collections in the Archive and Manuscripts section of the Library continue to accrue on a regular basis. This *Guide* only covers collections acquired before June 2000 and subsequent additions can be found by looking at the web pages.

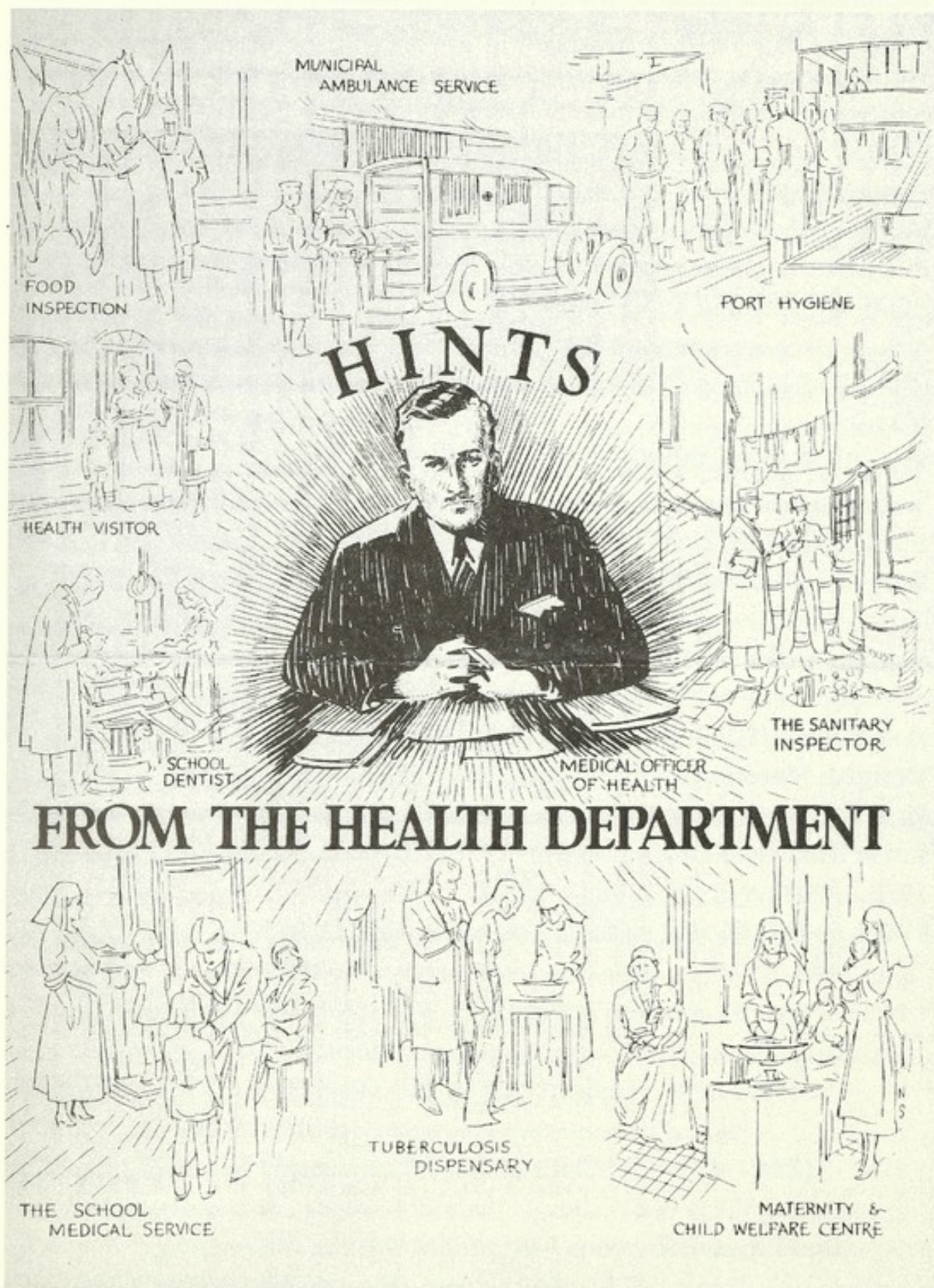

*(Belts Classes)*

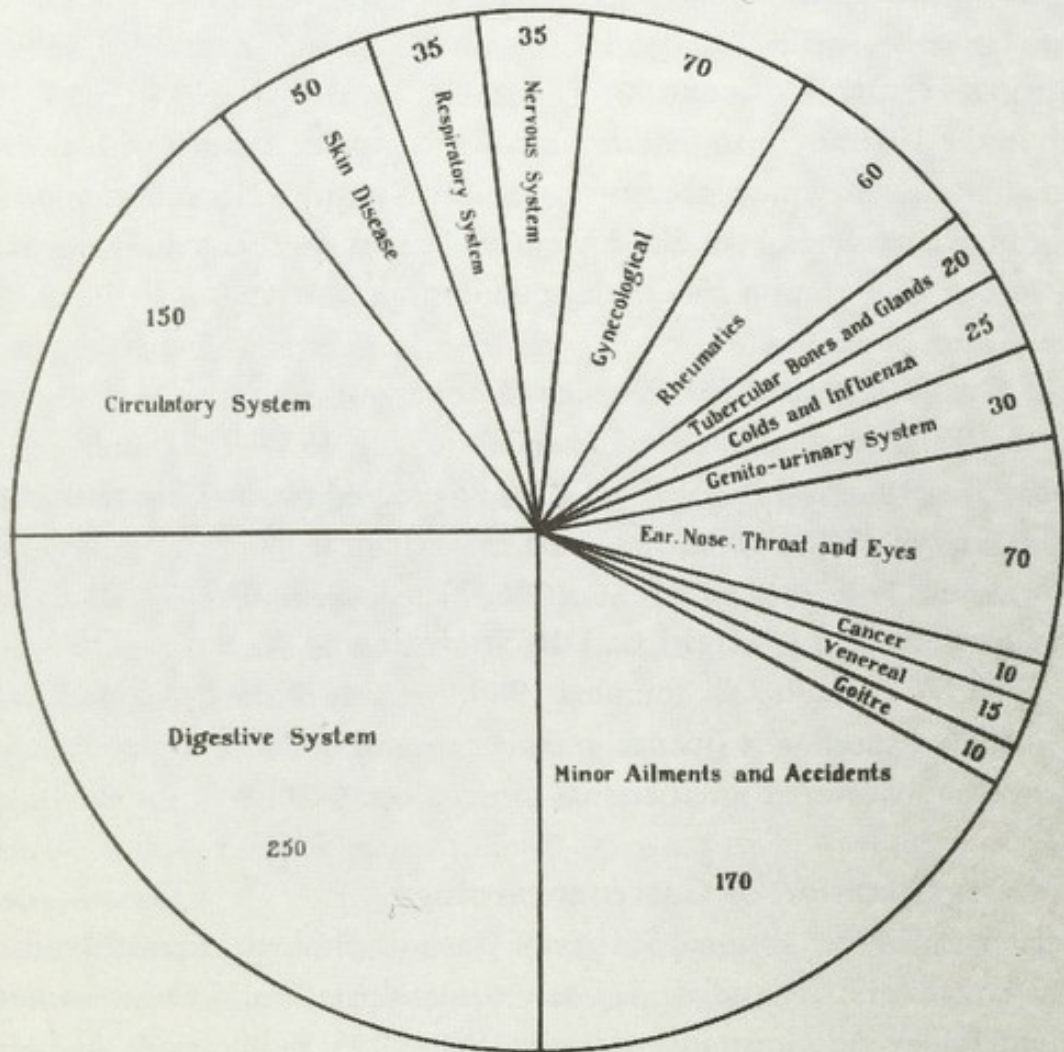

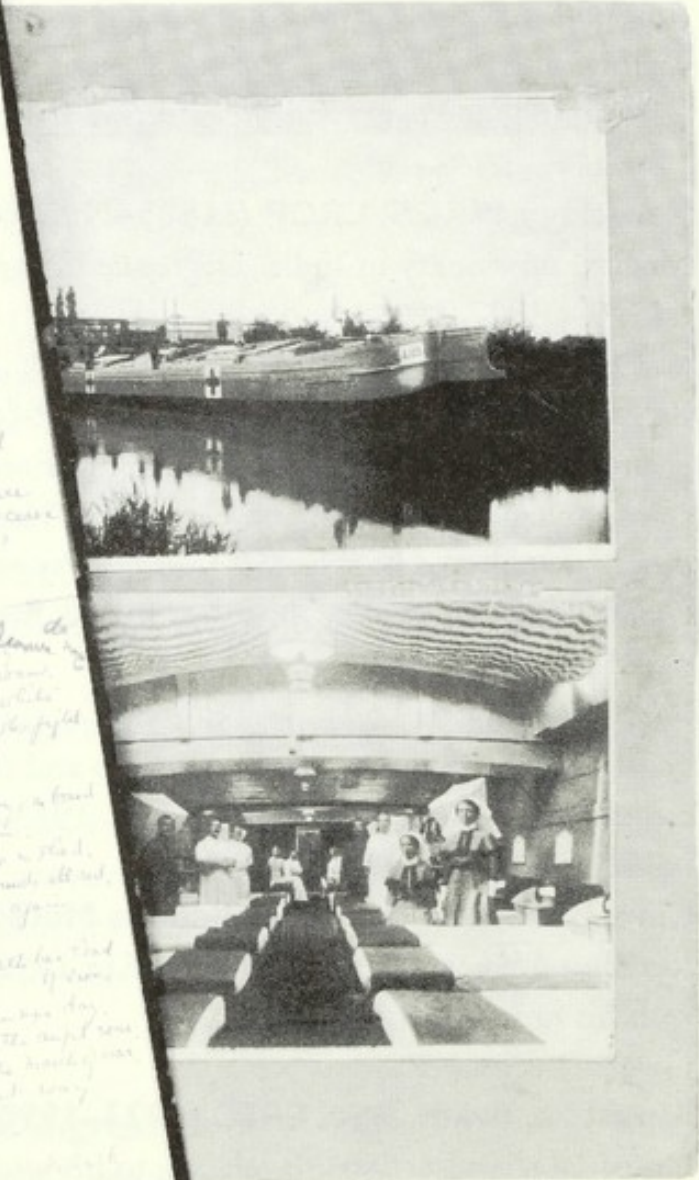

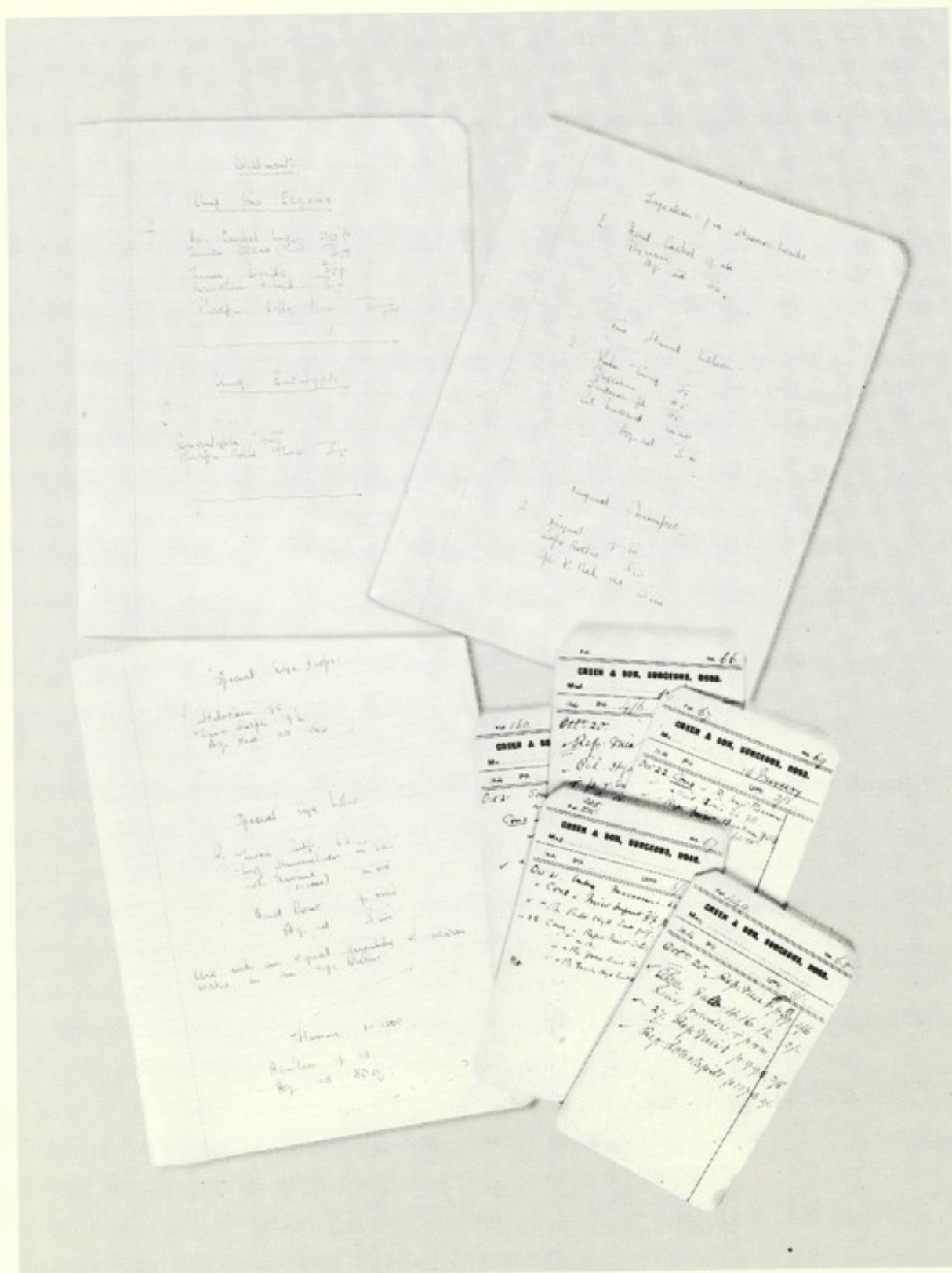

## RAMC: ROYAL ARMY MEDICAL CORPS MUNIMENT COLLECTION

A collection of records, memoirs and memorabilia placed in the RAMC Historical Museum and the Army Medical School (Royal Army Medical College) Library, mainly by former officers and men of the Corps.

The earliest items include a draft of the appointment of Charles II's Surgeon General, military hospital records and memoirs from the European wars of the late 17th and 18th centuries, and regulations on teaching in French military hospitals dated 1775. There are some records of the army's medical care in the colonies dating back to the early 19th century, and some records and diaries from the Napoleonic Wars, but the bulk of the collection dates from the Crimean War onwards, with emphasis on the World Wars of the 20th century.

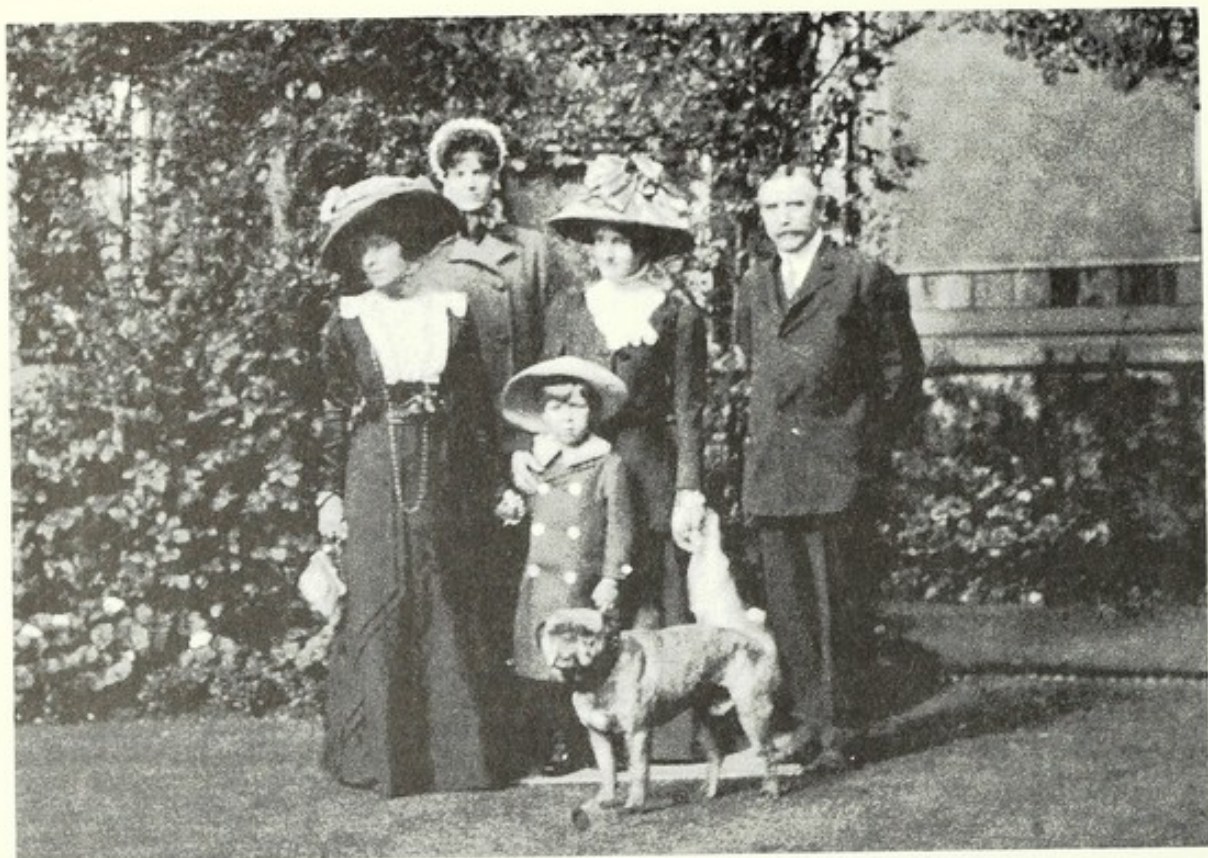
The Corps's accumulated records, being public records, should be mainly found in the Public Record Office, but this collection does contain a few strays, notably the registers of the Crimean War Pathological Board. The personal paper collections of high-ranking army medical officers often contain official statistics and correspondence. Examples in this collection include the Peninsular War papers of **William Fergusson** (1773–1846), including correspondence of **G J Guthrie** (1785–1856); the papers of **Sir John Hall** (1794–1866), which contain reports, registers and correspondence from the West Indies, 1841–1843, Cape of Good Hope, 1846–1851, Bombay Presidency, 1851–1854, and the Crimean War; Army Medical School records in the papers of **Sir Thomas Longmore** (1816–1895) papers; and the Second World War papers of **Sir John Boyd** (1891–1981). Many collections contain the unit copy of a War Diary from the First or Second World War.

The great majority of the collections comprise more personal records: service record books, training and education certificates, diaries, usually written during military campaigns, and photographs. There are also a large number of training manuals, historical works and memoirs, both published and unpublished.

Collections are described by RAMC accession order and it is therefore recommended that readers consult the index (Vol. I) before they see the list which gives further details under RAMC number.

## THE WELLCOME ARCHIVE

A collection comprising the personal papers of Henry Solomon Wellcome, co-founder of the pharmaceutical company Burroughs Wellcome & Co (f.1880), the Wellcome Foundation Limited (f.1924) and the Wellcome Trust (f.1936), and records of the various historical medical museums and scientific research institutions which he established.

The Wellcome archives were divided in 1990 at the time of the physical separation of the Wellcome Foundation Limited and the Wellcome Trust. Papers relating to the commercial side of operations were to be held by the Wellcome Foundation Limited, while Henry Wellcome's personal papers and the records of the various research laboratories and museums were to be held by the Wellcome Trust. Following the merger of Wellcome plc and Glaxo plc in 1995, the Wellcome Foundation Limited archives were removed to the Glaxo Wellcome campus at Greenford. The archives up to c.1945 are due to be transferred to the Wellcome Trust by the company (now GlaxoSmithKline) in 2001. They will become available for research after they have been catalogued, over the next few years. Due to the parallel and often overlapping relationship between Burroughs Wellcome & Co and the museums and research institutions, aspects of Wellcome's business enterprises can also be found in this collection.

Additional related material, mostly generated by or at the behest of the Wellcome Historical Medical Museum or Wellcome Institute for the History of Medicine in the early 20th century, can be found in MSS.8017-8962. A published catalogue is available in the Wellcome Library. The Library also holds many publications by the Museum, Institute and some of the Research Laboratories associated with the pharmaceutical company the Wellcome Foundation Limited.

## APPENDIX III

### **Surveys**

In addition to acquiring archives for the Wellcome Library, the archivists are involved in surveying archives elsewhere in order to advise on their preservation and to be able to guide scholars to additional source material held in other repositories or in private hands. Registers of this information may be consulted on application to one of the archivists. The archivists will be glad to learn of archives of relevance for incorporation into their survey reports.

Members of staff are involved in two other surveys briefly described below. For more information on these please consult the Wellcome Library's web pages or contact one of the archivists.

### **The Medical Archives and Manuscripts Survey**

For some years staff have been compiling an exhaustive survey of archive and manuscript material in Britain that is of medical interest (and falls between the dates 1660 and 1945): the Medical Archives and Manuscripts Survey or MAMS. Public repositories and private institutions are both covered. The initial focus has been upon repositories in London and data on the medical holdings of over 100 archive repositories in the city is now available on the Wellcome Library website, at [www.wellcome.ac.uk/mams](http://www.wellcome.ac.uk/mams). It is hoped to extend the project to cover the rest of the United Kingdom.

### **The Hospital Records Database**

This important project is run jointly by the Wellcome Library and the Public Record Office. It records information about some 2750 hospitals throughout the United Kingdom: historical and administrative notes on the institutions, an outline of the types and covering dates of records known to exist, and the repositories where these records are located. The database can be consulted in the Library or the Public Record Office, or via the Internet at <http://hospitalrecords.pro.gov.uk>.

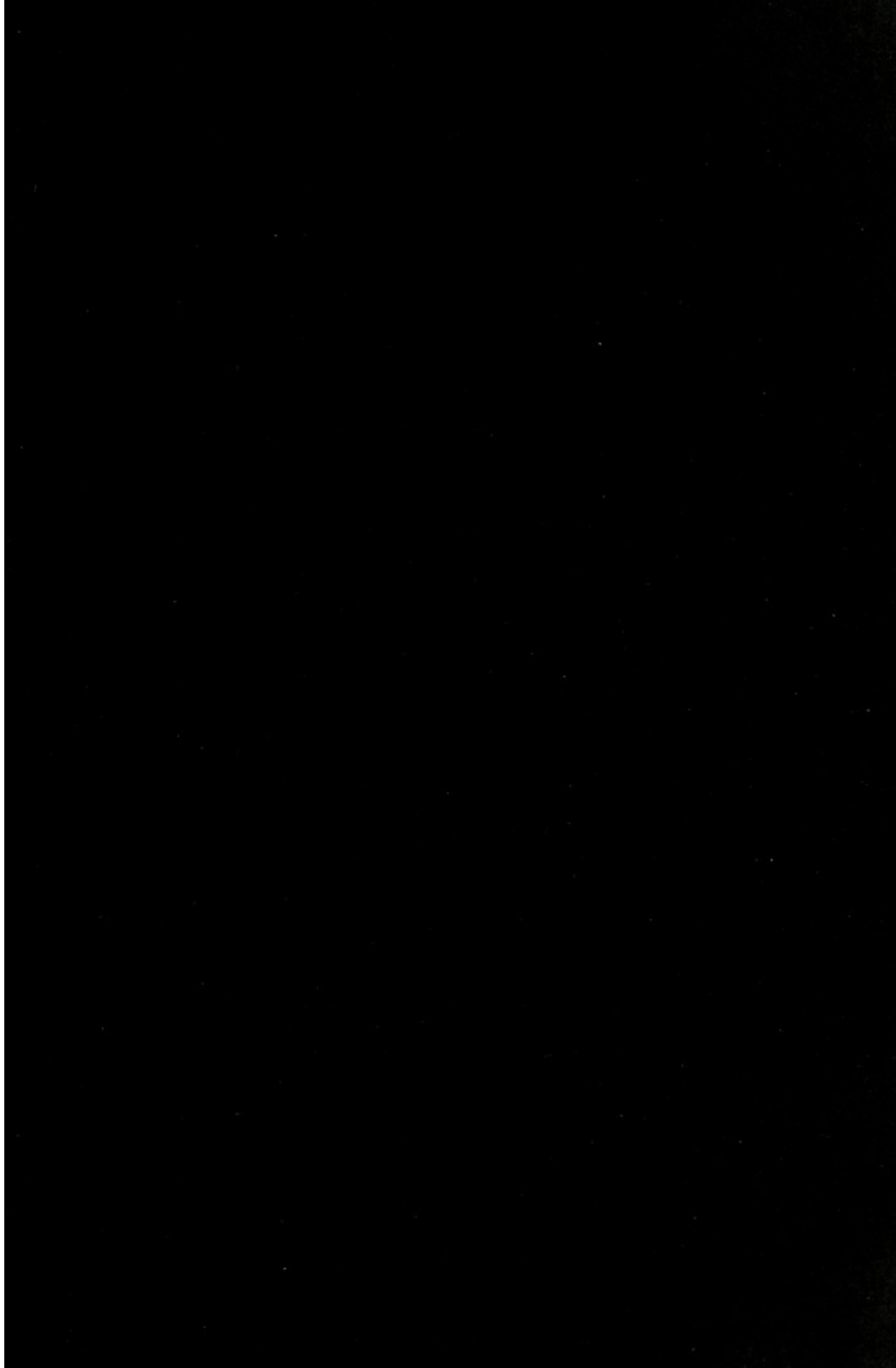

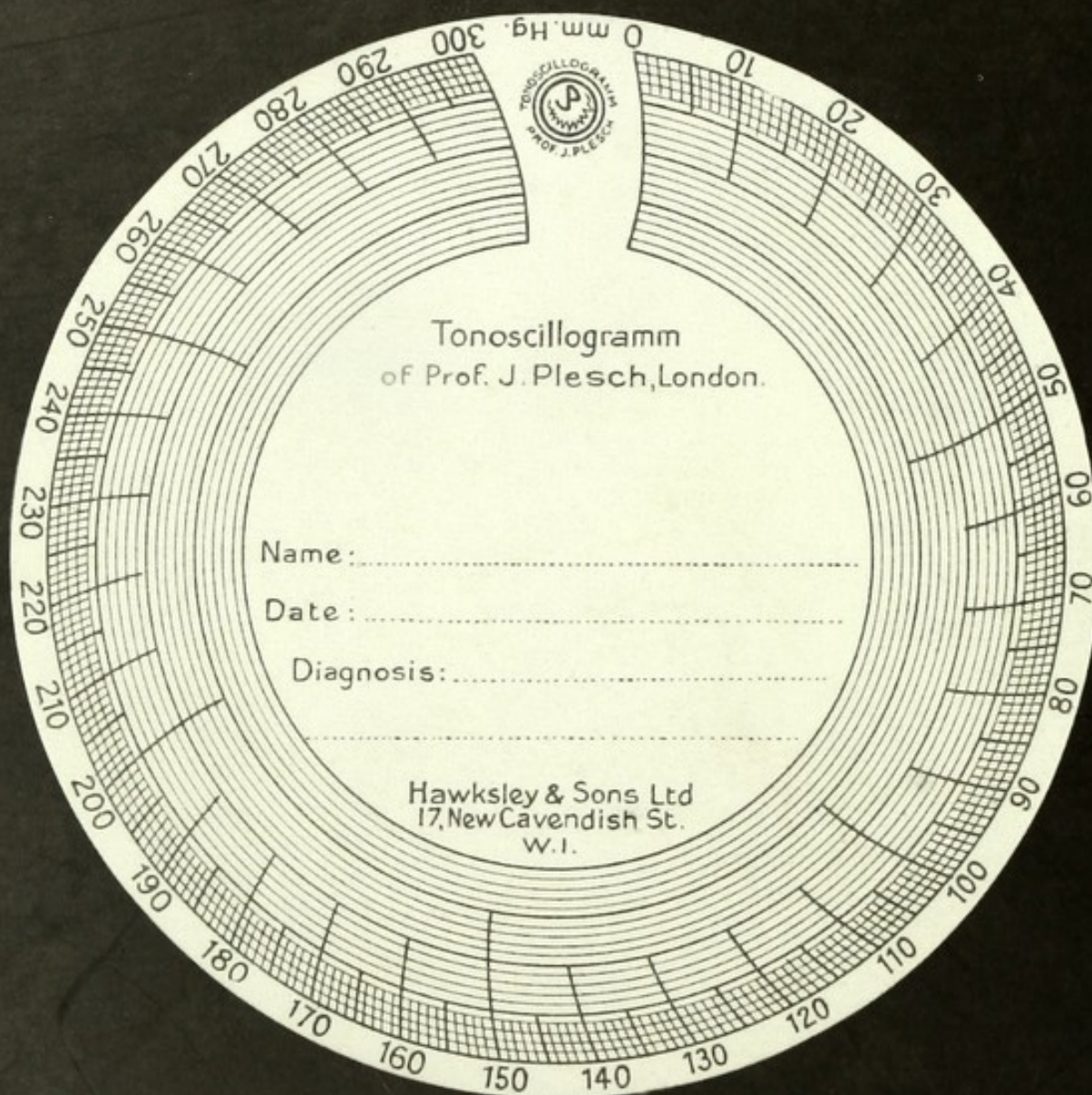
