MR. FRANCIS GALTON offers £500 in prizes to those British subjects resident in the United Kingdom who shall furnish him before May 15, 1884, with the best Extracts from their own Family Records.

These Extracts will be treated as confidential documents, to be used for statistical purposes only, the insertion of names of persons and places being required solely as a guarantee of authenticity and to enable Mr. Galton to communicate with the writers in cases where further question may be necessary.

The value of the Extracts will be estimated by the degree in which they seem likely to facilitate the scientific investigations described in the preface to the *Record of Family Faculties*.<sup>1</sup>

More especially:

(a) By including *every* direct ancestor who stands within the limits of kinship there specified.

(b) By including brief notices of the brothers and sisters (if any) of each of those ancestors. (Importance will be attached both to the *completeness* with which each family of brothers and sisters is described, and also to the *number* of persons so described.)

(c) By the character of the evidence upon which the information is based.

(d) By the clearness and conciseness with which the statements and remarks are made.

(It will be obvious that uniformity in the arrangement of documents is of primary importance to those who examine and collate a large number of them.)

Each competitor must furnish the name and address of a referee of good social standing (magistrate, clergyman, lawyer, medical practitioner, &c.), who is personally acquainted with his family, and of whom inquiry may be made, if desired, as to the general trustworthiness of the competitor.

The Extracts must be sent prepaid and by post, addressed to FRANCIS GALTON, 42 Rutland Gate, London, S.W. It will be convenient if the letters "R.F.F." (Record of Family Faculties) be written in the left-hand corner of the parcel, below the address.

The examination will be conducted by the donor of the prizes, aided by competent examiners.

The value of the individual prizes cannot be fixed beforehand. No prize will, however, exceed £50, nor be less than £5, and £500 will, on the whole, be awarded.

A list of the gainers of the prizes will be posted to each of them. It will be published in one or more of the daily newspapers, also in at least one clerical, and one medical journal.

\* \* The above conditions are in lieu of those provisionally sketched out by MR. GALTON in the *Fortnightly Review* of August, 1883, for the purpose of eliciting suggestions, and which were subsequently submitted in a more elaborate form to many members of the medical profession. Their present shape is fixed in accordance with the balance of opinions elicited by these preliminaries, which was in favour of throwing them open to general competition, and not to medical men only, as at first intended.

MR. GALTON would add, that extracts from the Records of any family would be very acceptable to him, even such as may be too incomplete in the opinion of their authors to have the chance of gaining a prize, or which for any other reason should have the words, "not for competition," written upon them.

He sincerely trusts that his efforts to draw the attention of the public to the utility of family records, to induce them to rescue facts that are steadily gliding into oblivion, and to collect materials for serious scientific study, will be taken in good part and in the spirit in which they are made.

### THE LATE MRS. JOHN CASH.

Our obituary contains the name of Mrs. John Cash, who died at her residence, Rosehill, on Monday last after a short illness due to paralytic seizure. Mrs. Cash was known to a large circle of friends, and in some degree to a wider public, as a woman of more than ordinary qualities. She was the daughter of the Rev. John Sibree, minister of Vicar-lane Congregation from 1820 to 1858, who was in his day a prominent figure in Coventry. On her mother's side she was descended from the Guests, of King's Norton, near Birmingham : Edmund Geste—as the name was then spelt—who died Bishop of Salisbury in 1578, was a member of this family. A more recent member, Dr. Edwin Guest, Master of Gonville and Caius College (1852-80), was described by Freeman, the historian, as an illustrious scholar, who "ranks with Palgrave and Kemble." In 1852 Miss Sibree was married to Mr. John Cash, whose public activities as a member of the Town Council, chairman of the Free Library Committee, and as an ardent friend of popular education, made his untimely death in 1880 a severe public loss. Mrs. Cash, within her own sphere, was not less devoted to the cause of progress ; she had a wide outlook on life, and a firm faith in human possibilities. She took a private and unostentatious part in many movements of social amelioration which made no great outward stir in the world ; among them may be mentioned the Girls' Industrial School (of which she was hon. secretary), and the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals. She was also one of the lady visitors at the workhouse.

An interesting phase in Mrs. Cash's history was her connection with Miss Evans, afterwards known as George Eliot ; her recollections of the famous novelist are contained partly in an appendix to "George Eliot's Life as Related in Her Letters and Journals," edited by Mr. J. W. Cross, and partly in the text of that work. The beginning of this intimacy was in 1841, when Mrs. Cash — then Miss Sibree — was sixteen years of age. Miss Evans resided in Foleshill with her father ; the Sibrees were near neighbours. Mrs. Cash's memories of her friend, give many valuable glimpses of one who was destined to attain a world wide celebrity, and from this and other points of view they form a remarkable chapter in local history. Mr. Cross in writing of this period says :—
