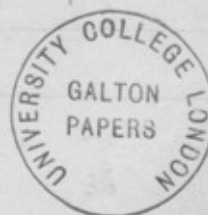

There was but one meeting at Tottenham on the Sundays, & a proposal was made that there should be two - which Old David Barday strenuously opposed & succeeded in procuring during his life. Stating that Friends confined by their Business during the week in London, liked to come out into the country on a Sunday - and on a Sunday he always gave a dinner, to which

His friends & those connected with him resorted,
much to their Benefit and edification.

Robert Barclay went into Scotland, leaving his
wife with her father - & she died during his
absence - I think she was burnt to death, & your
Grandmother Mrs. Gallon was afterwards under
the care of an Aunt Missella Barclay who
lived at Bengio in Hertfordshire - & never went
to Scotland till she was 16 years old.

It would therefore appear that Mrs. Gallon must
have been born in 1757, and registered in
Grace Church Street Meeting.

Under the late act for delivering the registers to the
Government Repository, there was a negotiation
with the Quakers that they might send in attested
copies.

And all the registers of the Friends are in their rooms
attached to Devonshire House Meeting in Round Church
(N^o 86 in Post Office Directory)

The Quakers registers there, are admirably kept -
I have had attested copies of registers at various
times, but I cannot now recollect the name of

the Secretary who resides there - You could get any of your connections who may remain Friends to call there & take out an attested copy as in any other Registry, or have the search made. My last application there was for dates of death for Arthur Barday's proof of being Head of the Family for the Lord Levis office. Having the date 1756 you can have no difficulty - Gurney Barday at Bardays & Co could get it done for you, or I could get you the Secretary's name - So far for your enquiry - I can either learn the name of the Register, or get the search made, if you should like it" -

I have now before me my Grandfather's & Grandmother's Bardays Marriage certificate - The identical Certificate which was signed at the Meeting at the time of their Marriage; bearing date 3rd day of the sixth month called June in the year One thousand seven hundred & fifty six -

My Mother was born on the 21st of March 1757, and I have also my Father's & Mother's marriage Certificate dated the 7th day of the 10th month called Oct^r 1777.

The only link wanting is the certificate of my Mother's birth. I always understood my Mother she was born at her Maternal Grandfather's - but whether at his Country House, Bush Hill in the Parish of Edmonton or at his town residence Cheapside I don't know. My Grandmother died 3 days after giving birth to my Mother -

With respect to the ten thousand ^{Pounds} (£10,000) it ought first to be proved that my Father ever received it, which I take upon myself to deny, as I have seen a Statement drawn out by my Father of his property at his marriage, with its increase in each successive year, whether through donations, legacies or business and no note was taken of any such anonymous receipt" (as Cameron Galton heard of) "and my Father often spoke to me very openly about his affairs - I have found a copy of my Father's marriage certificate which I enclose. Please return it to me - You will see that my Mother is designated as the daughter of Robert Barclay of Ury in Scotland and Lucy his wife" -

Mr. Brown writes word, "I think that Mr. Gurney is mis-
 taken with respect to ^{the cause of} my grandmother's death. I understand
 my mother, that her mother Levy Barclay, died 3 days
 after giving birth to her child - that my mother (Mrs. Gallon)
 was born at her grandfather's, whether at Bush Hill or
 Cheapside I know not. That she lived with her grandfather
 till his decease, which I understand took place when she
 was 12 years old - From that period till the time of her
 marriage she resided with her Aunt, Missella Barclay,
 who resided, I think 2 years in a place called Wormley
 in Hertfordshire - Afterwards at Bejeo in Hertfordshire

Old David Barclay was born at Wry 1682. He died at Bush Hill March the 10th 1769, & was buried at Winchmore Hill March 21st

His Will is dated Decem: 2nd 1757

Hudson Gurney m. Lucy Galtton's sister - & Mother in Law to Lucy Galtton

The marriage Settlement of Robert Barclay Jun^r of Wry, with Lucy Barclay, is dated in 1756

In 1760 George the 3rd came to the Throne - & the next Lord Mayors Day, went to the House of David Barclay in Chiepside - The family were about him.

& the King is said to have taken notice of the child. The talking of which, appears to have been the foundation of the subsequent Birmingham story -

In his Will of 1757 David Barclay appears to have left his "Granddaughter Lucy" £2000 - & I think some further provision at the death of his Widow.

He leaves his Daughter Priscilla Barclay £1000 & £5000, under certain Provisions -

Lucy Barclay (afterwards Mrs Galton) lived with & was brought up by Priscilla Barclay - who lived at Bengeo in Hertfordshire -

Priscilla Barclay died - & by her Will dated March 1780, leaves her Residence "To my dear Niece Adopted Daughter Lucy."

Therefore you see when David Barclay made his Will, she was an Infant & when the King took notice of her, under 4 years old.

Mrs Galton's Mother, dying when she was but a few days old, naturally the Aunt Priscilla Barclay, her Mother's sister, took care of the child & lived with the ^{maternal} grandfather David Barclay - Mrs Galton's Father lived at Ury in Scotland, many days journey from London - He was in Parliament & often walked most of the way (if not all the way) to London -

 Lucy Barday) was in Scotland, when his young wife
 was confined at her maternal Grandfather's House

 Houndsditch, as having died at Bush Hill on 23rd March 1757.
 two days after the birth of her Baby, Lucy, (afterwards Mrs. Galloway)

Upon hearing of the event, of course young Robert

From time to time the absurd report of my Grandmother being daughter
of Geo: III has come up. I believe it was started of at Bath, before I was born

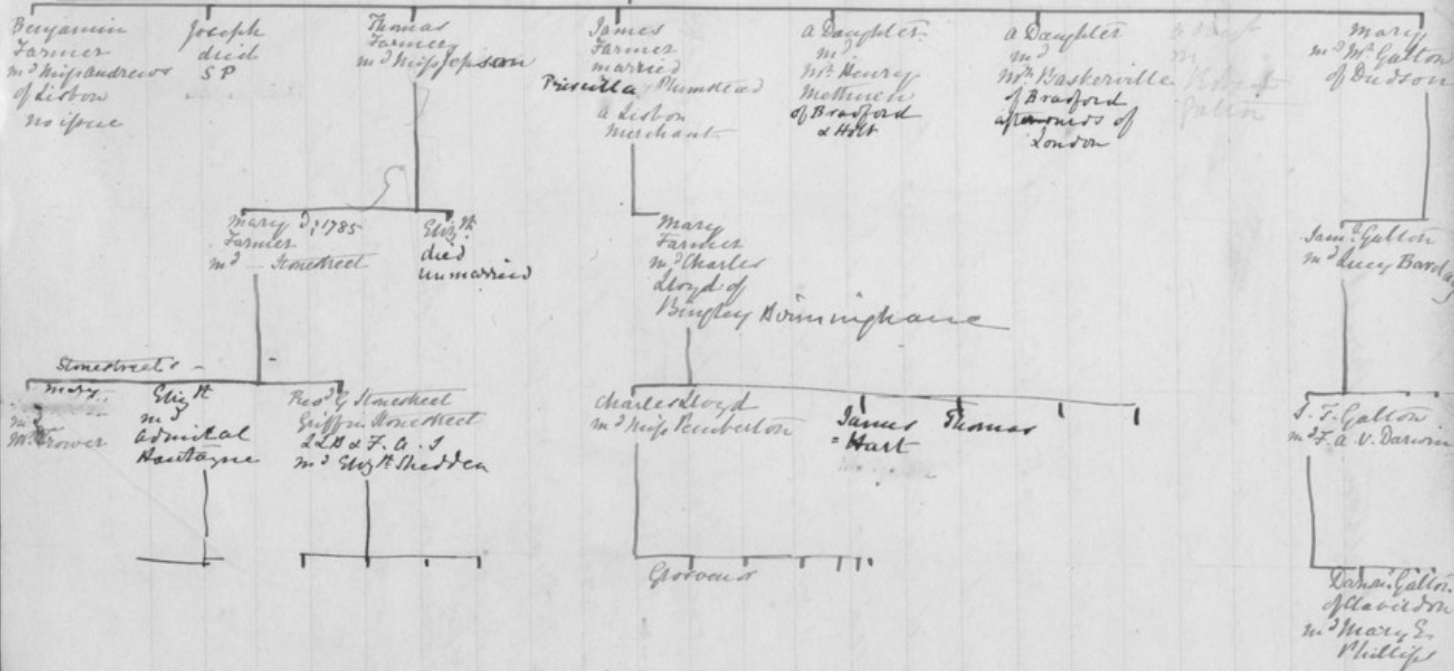

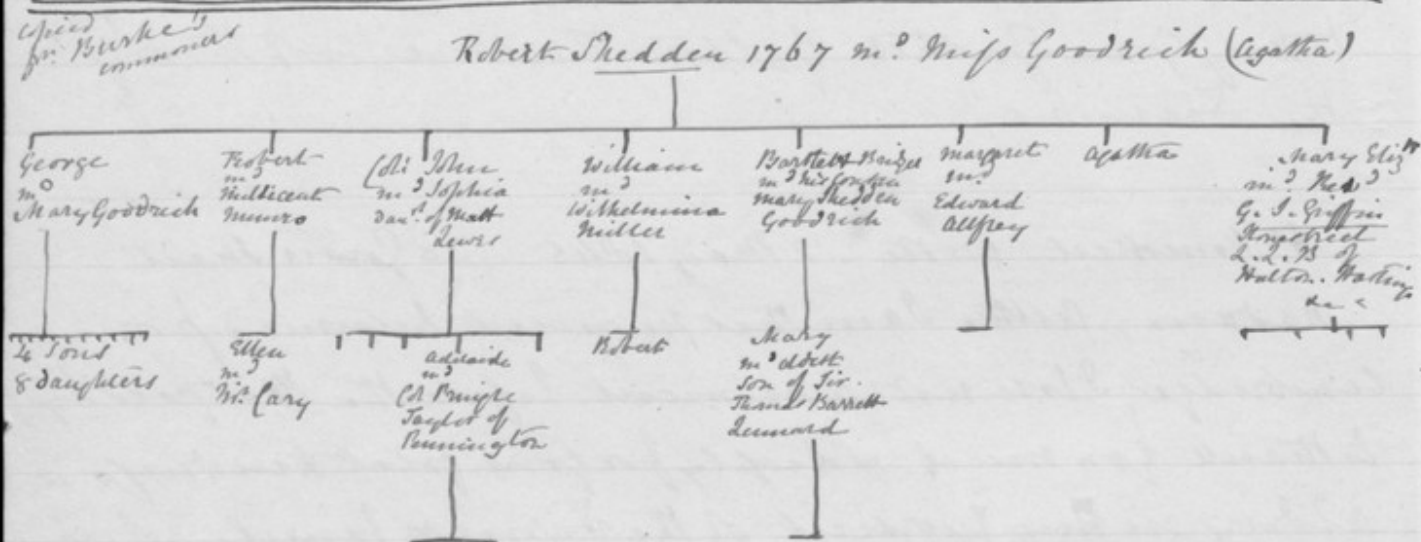

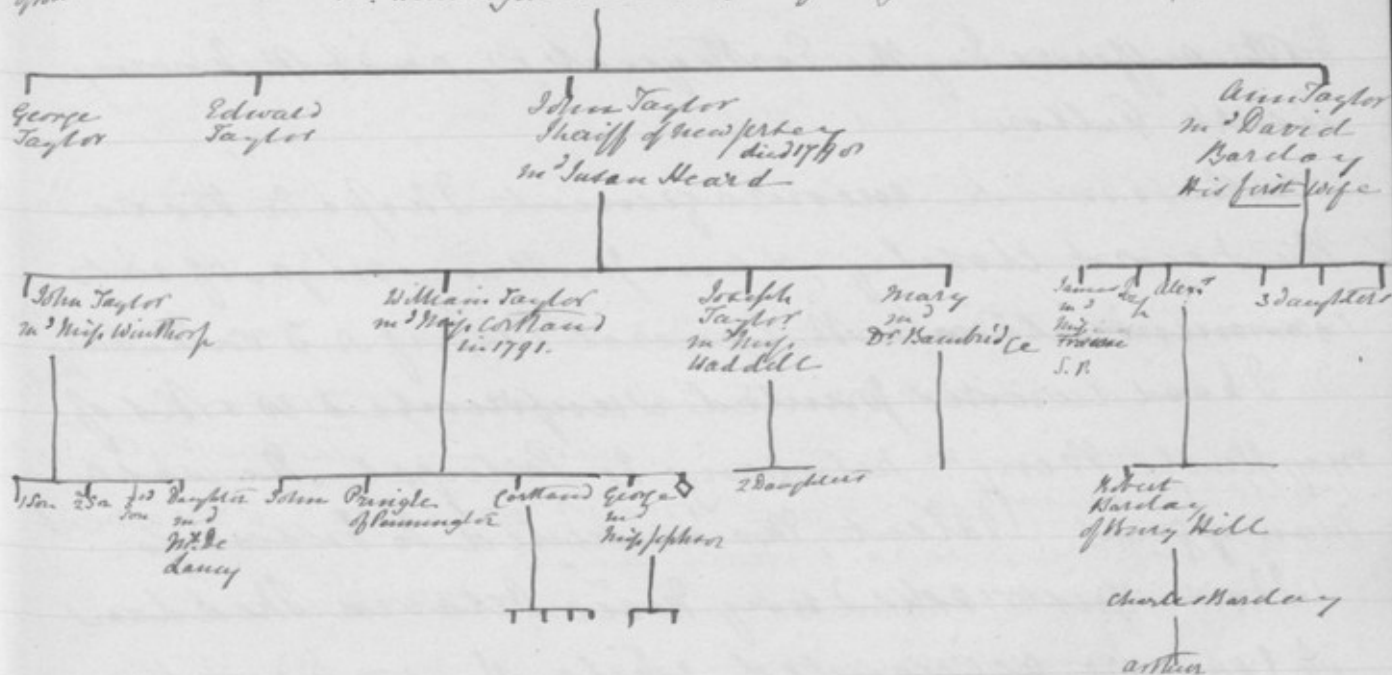

ROYAL GEOGRAPHICAL SOCIETY.—The Royal Geographical Society's anniversary meeting was held last week, in the Theatre of the Royal Institution, Albemarle Street, London, the President, Sir RODERICK I. MURCHISON, F.R.S., in the chair. The proceedings were most interesting, and a number of ladies were present to the close.—Mr. Osborne Smith read the annual report of the Council, by which it appeared a greater number had joined the society than in any previous year, and that 701 ordinary and sixty-two honorary and corresponding members were now enrolled. The funded capital of £2,000: Three-and-a-Quarter per Cent. Government Stock remained untouched. The receipts amounted to £1,540, 14s. 6d., less £38. 5s., received in aid of the recent Arctic expedition, and since paid over to Lady Franklin. The progressive increase of the society's income had enabled the Council to make good some library deficiencies, and to improve many details of scientific arrangement. Last year, a catalogue, prepared with much ability and care by the excellent assistant secretary, Dr. Shaw, was printed, and the society's valuable collection of books, maps, and charts were now available to the members. This year, the same zealous officer was revising for publication a general index to the journals, vols. 40 to 20 inclusive, compiled and presented to the society by Mr. George Brent, which would also be issued to the fellows free of charge. Since the last anniversary, 156 volumes had been bound, 456 maps and charts mounted, and 438 volumes, 13 atlases, and 400 sheets of maps and charts added to the library. The gold medals, forming the annual donation of her Most Gracious Majesty, had been awarded as follows:—The Founder's Medal to Francis Galton, Esq., for having, at his own cost, and in furtherance of the expressed desire of the society, fitted out an expedition to explore the centre of Southern Africa, and for having so successfully conducted it through the countries of the Namaqua, the Damara, and the Ovampo, (a journey of about 1,700 miles,) as to enable this society to publish a valuable memoir and map in the last volume of the journal relating to a country hitherto unknown; the astronomical observations, determining the latitude and longitude of places, having been most accurately made by himself. The Patron's Medal to Commander Edward Augustus Inglefield, of the Royal Navy, for his very remarkable and enterprising survey of the coasts of Baffin's Bay, Smith's Sound, and Lancaster Sound, in the last summer, during which he threw much new light on the geography of the Arctic regions, and, with the very limited means at his disposal, accomplished most important results. The Council concluded by referring to the want of suitable apartments, the claim for which had been urged upon successive Governments.—Sir David Dundas moved that the report be adopted, which was seconded by Mr. Wyld, and agreed to.—The President having read the paragraph in the report referring to Mr. Galton, said that gentleman had a distinct claim upon the society, before all other African travellers, because he had fitted out the expedition at his own expense, in furtherance of their expressed wishes, and had zealously accomplished that which he had so disinterestedly undertaken. Then, turning to Mr. Galton, he added: "It is now my pleasing duty to place in your hands this testimony of the approbation of the Royal Geographical Society. I am sure you will receive it, as we intend it, as the highest honour which we can possibly confer. You left a happy home to visit a country never before penetrated by a civilised being. You have accomplished that which every geographer in this room must feel is of eminent advantage to the science in which we take so deep an interest. Accept, with these expressions, my belief that, so long as England possesses travellers with the resolution you have displayed, and so long as private gentlemen will devote themselves to accomplish what you have achieved, we shall always be able to boast that this country produces the best geographers of the day."—Mr. Galton, on taking the medal, said, "I thank you for this honour, believing that in acknowledging any efforts of mine it is more in consideration of the exertions made than of the results obtained. I had to travel through a most inhospitable and most difficult territory, and I regret that I was not able to do more. Mr. Anderson, the Swedish traveller, is still in the country, and though his expedition has been driven back to the Cape, he has started again, and I trust will succeed in penetrating where I have failed."

THE LATE J. H. GALTON, ESQ., OF HADZOR.—It is with sincere regret that we record the decease of that amiable and accomplished gentleman, J. H. GALTON, Esq., (brother of the late SAMUEL TERTIUS GALTON, Esq., of Leamington, and uncle to DARWIN GALTON, Esq., of Claverdon Leys, in this County), which took place at Rome on the 29th ult., his malady being, we believe, gout in the stomach. Mr GALTON was born November 8th, 1794, and was consequently in his 68th year. He was one of a large family, being the fifth son of the late SAMUEL GALTON, Esq., F.R.S., of Duddeston House, Warwickshire, (originally a member of the Society of Friends,) by LUCY, eldest daughter of ROBERT BARCLAY, Esq., of Ury, in the county of Kincardine, N.B., and sister, on the father's side, of the Captain BARCLAY, (formerly 23rd Welsh Fusiliers,) renowned for his astounding feats of pedestrianism and strength, and also laying claim, through his mother, to the Earldoms of Strathern, Monteith, and Airth, and to be sole heir of the body of Prince DAVID, son of ROBERT II., King of Scotland. Through his mother, the late Mr GALTON could claim a lineal descent from ROBERT BARCLAY, the eldest son of a colonel in the army of the immortal GUSTAVUS ADOLPHUS, King of Sweden, and notable as one of the earliest converts to Quakerism, and author of the "Apology for Quakerism," an elaborate work, written in remarkably good latin, and dated "from ye place of my pilgrimage at Ury." This ROBERT BARCLAY was descended from HUMPHREY DE BERKELEY or BARCLAY, a scion of the great Norman house of BERKELEY. The family of GALTON originally came from Dorsetshire, where, at a very early period, SIMON DE GALTON or GAVELTON held the hamlet of the same name, as is related in HUTCHINGS's history of that county, and at a later period members of this family held clerical preferments there. It was in the beginning of the eighteenth century that they found their way into Warwickshire. The late Mr JOHN HOWARD GALTON married, December 16th, 1819, Isabella, the only surviving child of JOSEPH STRUTT, Esq., who gave the beautiful Aboretum to the town of Derby. By that lady, who survives him, he leaves four sons, THEODORE HOWARD, barrister-at-law, engaged in Parliamentary practice; DOUGLAS STRUTT, a captain in the Royal Engineers, at present the principal official of the railway department of the Board of Trade; HERMAN ERNEST, and ROBERT CAMERON. The deceased gentleman acquired the Hadzor property by purchase from the family of AMPLETT, who had become possessed of it in a similar way in the reign of KING JAMES, and he erected a handsome mansion there on a delightful wooded eminence. He served the office of Sheriff of Worcestershire in 1834. He was also a magistrate and deputy-lieutenant of the county, and he had been for a long period captain of the Hanbury troop of the Queen's Own Worcestershire Yeomanry. He possessed a highly cultivated and discriminating intellect, large perceptive faculties, engaging manners, with an air of *la vieille cour*, a benevolent disposition, and abounded in kind consideration for everybody, but especially the poor. It may be mentioned, as a curious circumstance, that the father of the deceased was expelled from the Society of Friends, during the last war with France, for having declined to abandon the manufacture of guns in the town of Birmingham.

On Wednesday last, in the 80th year of his age, Charles Lloyd, Esq. Banker, of this town, a member of the Society of Friends. His long and active life was marked by great intelligence in business, unaffected piety, and zealous exertions to promote the welfare of his fellow creatures. How often has his simple yet impressive eloquence been heard amongst us, pleading the cause of the oppressed African, advocating the diffusion of the Holy Scriptures, and promoting the Education of the people! For the prosperity of the General Hospital he always manifested deep interest, and aided it by his personal exertions. As Treasurer, he kept the accounts with his own hand during a period of fifty years. In public Subscriptions he set a generous example, and in private Charity he was most bountiful and kind. Cheerfulness and piety were mingled in his character with a simplicity truly patriarchal. Strict and conscientious in his own conduct, he manifested a christian and benevolent spirit in regard to others—and whilst he endeavoured to act up to the principles of the society in which he was educated, he felt unbounded love and charity, and prayed for the prosperity of all denominations of christians. To a very numerous family he was ever a most affectionate father, counsellor, and friend—setting them the example of a religious life and conversation, and reaping, during seasons of great trial and affliction, the divine consolations of his Lord and Master. Hopeful unto the end, he shewed his mournful friends with what peace a christian can die!
