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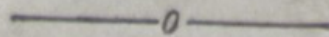








MEDAL OF THE LONDON
INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITIONS.



Her Majesty's Commissioners have prepared a Medal which is to be presented to every exhibitor whose name appears in the Official Catalogue of the Exhibition of 1874, and to those who have rendered services.

The Medal is of Bronze, and 2 inches in diameter. On the obverse is a head with inscription, "Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, President," which has been designed by MR. J. E. BOEHM. The reverse was designed by MR. J. GAMBLE, one of the Decorative Artists of the South Kensington Museum, and represents the buildings of the Exhibition, the Royal Albert Hall, the Albert Memorial in Hyde Park, and the Arcades of the Horticultural Gardens.

Her Majesty's Commissioners have prepared

The Medal is of Bronze, and a inches in
diameter. On the obverse is a laurel wreath
inscribed, "ALBERT EDWARD PRINCE OF WALES
1851," which has been designed by Mr.
J. H. BURNETT. The reverse was designed by
Mr. J. GARRATT, one of the Directors of the
South Kensington Museum, and bears
the inscription "INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION, THE GREAT
EXHIBITION OF 1851, LONDON." The Medal is
to be struck at the Mint in Her
Majesty's Palace, and the Arrangements of the Horticultural
Gardens.
