SIR,

The very inadequate manner in which the progress of Science, and the labours and opinions of our scientific men, have been recorded in the weekly press, and the want of a weekly organ which would afford scientific men a means of communication between themselves and with the public, have been long felt.

The proprietors of *THE READER*, with the view of supplying this deficiency, determined in 1863 to extend the portion allotted to Science in the hope that scientific men, and especially the office-bearers of the various Scientific and Learned Societies, would support the plan, and co-operate in transmitting reports or abstracts of memoirs, in order that an authoritative weekly record of the work done might be presented to the public in the largely circulated pages of *THE READER*.

This hope has been abundantly realised, and a full weekly summary of scientific progress is now given, in which the workers themselves assist.

In addition to this, the transactions of the various Continental and American Academies are copiously noticed, and ample space also is set apart for Correspondence on all scientific subjects.

At the same time, it is the intention to support and improve the general literary and scientific character of *THE READER*, and to maintain and secure the assistance of the most eminent writers in every department for the review of new books, and for the occasional contribution of independent articles. The subjects of Art, Music, and the Drama will also receive full attention.

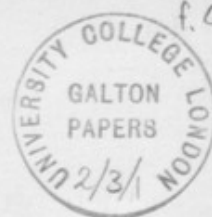

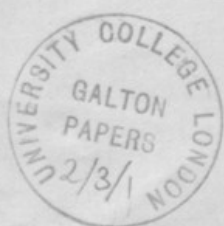
