

Dear Sir,

In pursuance of
your suggestion during our
conversation, some time ago,
at Pentonville, on the subject
of craniometry, I used strips
of sheet lead, and took
many measurements. It
was my intention before I



sent them to you, to have
increased the number of
examples, but my removal
to this prison arrested the
work, and I now take
the liberty of sending my
collection, such as it is, with
the hope that it may be of
some interest to you.

The band of lead was applied from the root of the nose over the centre of the cranial vault down to the roots of the hair on the nape. The finger was then pressed repeatedly along the band, in order to get an exact mould, and this was favoured by the absence of (or rather closely cropped) hair.


The lead was then carefully lifted off, and so taken as to retain the form, it was laid and secured on the paper

while the pencil was carried
round the edge I added

such information as I could
give in each case, but I fear
it is very rough work, although
pains were taken to give
accurate casts. The notes

were hastily added; I shall
be glad however to explain
any of them that may require
elucidation.

and likely to be of interest.


In



My dear Galton

I presume by skulls
I mean living skulls.
In dead ones it seems to
me that their features are
~~made~~ best superimposed
by drawing a vertical
line from the auditory
opening (middle) to the
junction of the coronal
& Sagittal Sutures. —
& this would be the position

of your figure A 

If the same line could be
contrived which with a
little care might I think
be readily done - this position
would be the best & most
uniform. The position of
the auditory opening alone
would not suffice without
the vertical line.

It should not be the outline
of the head & the position
of the ear-hole be taken
by means of a Camera
Lucida. - ~~to~~
to avoid any

distortion of the position of
the opening from the figure
being perspective it would
suffice if the Camera
were supported on a long
stem so as to project the
figure if needed on the
floor or at the edge of the table.

But in fact I think if
the head were taken at
a distance of 20 inches
the support of the camera
being 10 — the line connecting
the above two points, would
be correctly vertical although
the actual distance between
them would be slightly greater
than the actual. The difficult
point would be in all cases
to be sure


of the precise situation



FLOGGING IN NEWGATE.

Five young men, who were sentenced at the last sessions of the Central Criminal Court to be flogged, for acts of robbery with violence, underwent the penalty in Newgate last yesterday morning, at half-past nine o'clock. One of them, being a more hardened criminal, received 20 strokes with the birch instead of the cut. His name was Timothy Lawson, and his offence was being concerned with Edward Colclough, and in robbing a woman, whom they brutally killed. Three youths were the first to take their punishment, which was inflicted in the room appointed for such occasions, and lined with the usual apparatus for whipping. These were present Alderman Sir William Ross, as visiting magistrate; Alderman and Sheriff Hadow, the governor of the prison; Mr. Sidney Smith, the paid surgeon (Mr. Gibbon), with whom was Dr. Kay Haxton, and a few representatives of the newspaper press. The convicts were brought in one at a time, the name of each, and the number of lashes he was to receive, being called out by the governor. First came the boy Lawson, who submitted quietly to the process of being stripped and fastened to the whipping-post. Two warden administered each 10 strokes of the birch, and the lad screamed and cried loudly for mercy while receiving his stripes, which were vigorously laid on, and left heavy marks of its severity. His sister, Catherine, Colclough, began to howl most shrilly, even before his name was mentioned, and screamed loudly, from first to last, an unusual remark. His 20 strokes were laid on by the two wardens, each delivering 10, with a severity the like "rare" of which were of still whiplast with the proverbial number of lashes. The back of the convict bore evidence of the rigour with which the warden, too tall and powerful man, discharged their duty. As a matter of course the prisoner, who had shown signs that by his conduct on being led into the room, decided and looked his pills when the blows began to rain across his back and shoulders.

The next lads, who were to suffer for a more violent outrage, had been sentenced to receive each 20 lashes with the cut. They were Harry West, and J. a famous pugilist; Thomas Harrison, 11, and William Baynes, 20, both described as laborers. All three belonged to Wandsworth, in which neighbourhood, last November, their crime was committed. In conjunction with a fourth man, named Joseph Walsh, who has been sentenced to seven years' penal servitude, without a flogging, they attacked an elderly gentleman, Mr. David Arnold, of Chancery Lane, Aldershot, because he was soliciting loans at nine o'clock in the evening, from a temporary meeting in South-street. The first serious preliminary of the robbery was to take away their victim's watch, thus depriving him of a handy weapon of defence. They then proceeded to shove him down, and to tie him up by his wrists, his legs, groin, and neck, with a few postage-stamps; and, as he protested in calling for help, they kicked him about the head, causing eight wounds. For this average robbery they were all sentenced by Sir Thomas Chenderse, G.C., M.P., the new Recorder, to penal servitude; and, as the three prisoners, West, Harrison, and Baynes, had been previously convicted, the additional judgment of a flogging was pronounced on them. There was first brought into the room, and his defence took the subject downwards, slightly towards a determination to go through the ordeal with as much equanimity as he could command. It was not till the third lash descended that he cried out, and thenceforth his calls were loud and piteous, a supplication for his prisoner's mercy being constantly uttered by him when the first warden had finished giving the 10 lashes, and the second was stepping forward to deliver the other 10. The appeal was rebuffed, and West continued to beat out one for mercy till the end of his punishment; but, immediately on being released from the confinement of the whipping-post, he turned the "double-shuff," as is familiarly of his miserable progress of towards. It is noticeable that this convict had previously made his attempt to leave the lads with evidence against, and that his pills of pain were profuse wrong from him. Harrison, the next man, cried as the first and called for the doctor at the curb, and then, commencing faintness, dropped his head on one side; but looked up loudly when the second warden came to work him to deliver the 10 remaining strokes. When the full measure of Harrison's punishment had been administered, he gave a puff of such of relief, and was led out moaning. The last man was Baynes, who submitted stoutly all that he was being killed, and whose flogging left him in a state of more painful bitterness and depression than either of the others had witnessed. In witness the determination of the case was very good, and blood followed the course of the lads. A typical of one more than 20 strokes was mentioned in flogging of five convicts.



(Dublin, Ireland.)

It is reported that Thomas Jackson, described as a Irish-
born man, was arrested for the purpose of breaking and entering
the office of the London & North Western Railway, at Hatfield,
near London, and stealing a large sum of money and other articles.
Mr. O'Hara presented, and Mr. J. Arden defended.
The prisoner pleaded guilty. On the evening of March 2
the house of Mr. Jackson was entered, a window having
been forced, and a number of valuable articles taken
from a bedroom. On the robbery being discovered in-
formation was given to the police, and Chief-Inspector
of the Derby Constabulary, stationed at Derby, was
sent to the Lanchester Railway Station. He found
that a train was about to leave for London at that
time. The constable remained himself in the locality.
He followed the man, who took seats in a third class
carriage. Upon seeing him they jumped out of the
carriage by the opposite door, and crossed over the
line. The officer pursued and found the prisoner near
a house, and seized a book in the sitting room. The
prisoner took a loaded rifle from his pocket
and struck the constable several times on the head. A
struggle ensued, and the constable was knocked down,
having received a severe wound, which rendered him
incapable for a moment. George Wright, a railway
porter, came to the aid of the policeman, and was also
struck by the prisoner with the loaded rifle. The con-
stable recovered, and the prisoner was arrested. The
other man escaped. The prisoner was seriously injured, and
was obliged to leave his bed for several days. A dress-
ing case stolen from the house was found in a field
about a mile from the place. It had a screw driver,
containing six gold rings, which had been overhauled in
the Liverpool & Lancashire Railway. The prisoner was
that the accused had never been in Liverpool before.
The Chairman ordered the prisoner to be kept in penal
servitude for 18 years. The constable Wright was
awarded £1, and the witness Wright £2.

George Wilkinson, a well known, was indicted at the Leeds Assizes, to-day, for abducting and maliciously assaulting Matthew Bacon, with intent to do grievous bodily harm, at Bradford.
