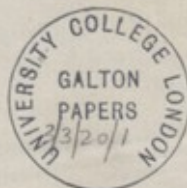
We will certainly adopt your suggestion and label the office "Eugenic Record Office".

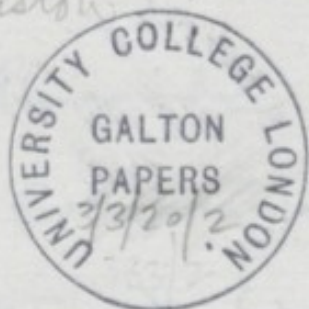
