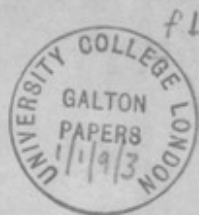

DIARY

- 1838 Erasmus sat to Oakley for his portrait.
 March 6th Darwin went to live at Gannaway Gate
 May 29th First stone laid at the house at Claverdon
- 1848 June 9th Diana Galton died; my Uncle wrote "The loss we have sustained, is not only that of a child, but a most affectionate daughter, whose sole aim and delight was to please us. I can truly say she doubled our pleasures and divided our sorrow; she was the sunshine of our circle."
- 1840 Francis sat to Oakley for his portrait in December
- 1841 February 24th Darwin sat to Oakley for his portrait.
- 1843 March 22nd, Easton began my Father's likeness.
- 1844 October 9th, we took 57 Marina, St. Leonard's where my Father died 23rd October 1844.
 Bessy wrote to Aunt Hubert - "Yet none but his children can know what a daily, what an hourly loss he is to them. All our occupations and pleasures were so connected with him, that every thing now seems a blank and it will be a very long time before we shall cease to be constantly reminded of him in every thing we do."
 Personalty sworn under £45,000.

Louisa Galton wrote in a book of requests when she died for Frank to attend to:- "To no mere relation do I feel I owe more than to your dear sister Emma, and I should like you to give her, what she would really prize in my memory. She might not care for the gold brooch even; my chuddah shawl give to Emma Galton.

To Erasmus, answer to some letters he sent for Bessy and myself to read:- "I return your letter, which Bessy and I have read. We both have the same opinion of them, and we should say, yours were most gentlemanly and forbearing." April 25th 1894.

Dear Francis sent me Louisa's chuddah shawl and the gold brooch which Mrs. Phillips gave her at her marriage and the watch chain she always wore; the pendant to the chain I gave her when she lost hers.

The examination of the cause of Louisa's long ill health and final death showed, that the stomach was barely one third the natural size and the outlet leading out of it no larger than would just contain a common lead pencil. The contracted outlet was due to her illness 19 years ago.

Bothschild told Mr. Gurney he never lends money to any State, unless they have 50 bayonets ready to collect the taxes.
