The number of Goys in our schools averaged 30, but out of that number only 5 chools averaged 30, but out as possessing qualities rivally those of the average clever boys of the best public schools... the other boys in the school, consisted of the dunces, the indolent, the malingeness, the nibe truants, the dull, the moisy, the fat witted majority, just 6 times more numerous than the naturally able boys.
