Safer aspirin

Present-day therapy of early rheumatoid arthritis has re-affirmed the antirheumatic value of aspirin, but has emphasised the risk of side-effects. Now, by means of Paynocil, the benefits of aspirin in full dosage may be obtained with less danger of gastric intolerance.
