from that noylome pelitience, which not long lince, raged in this Citie, Iweeping away the rich with the pooze, the aged with the young, leaving whole houses defolate, and filling all places with dead bodies: So that in mans judgement there was no hope remayning, but that this yeere would have thereby prooved yet more dreadful and infectious then the form

mer.
