FOR some *reasons* I apprehend my self engaged to give an *account* of *two* things, that refer to the ensuing *piece* : The one, for not *publishing* this *Catalogue* untill now : The other, of the *mode & manner* thereof, being partly *Latine*, and partly *English*.
About three yeares agoe,

goe, (by the perswasion
of some *friends*) I was re-
solved to take a *Catalogue*
of those *Rarities* and *Cu-
riosities* which my *Father*
had scedulously collected,
and my *selfe* with conti-
nued diligence have aug-
mented, & hitherto *preser-
ved* together: They then
pressed me with that Ar-
gument, *That the enume-
ration of these Rarities, (be-
ing more for variety than
any one place known in Eu-
rope could afford) would be*

*an honour to our Nation,
and a benefit to such ingeni-
ous persons as would become
further enquirers into the
various modes of Natures
admirable workes, and the
curious Imitators thereof: I
readily yeilded to the thing
so urged, and with the as-
sistance of two worthy
friends (well acquainted
with my design,) we then
began it, and many exami-
nations of the materialls
themselves, & their agree-
ments with severall Au-
thors*

thors compared, a Draugh
was made, which they
gave into my hands to
examine over. Presently
thereupon my onely Son
dyed, one of my Friends fell
very sick for about a yeare
and my other Friend by
unhappy Law-suits much
disturbed. Upon these ac-
cidents that first Draugh
lay neglected in my hand
another year. Afterward
my said Friends call again
upon me, and the designe
of Printing, a-new contri-
ved

ved, onely the prefixed
Pictures were not ready,
and I found my kinde
friend Mr *Hollar* then en-
gaged for about tenne
Moneths, for whose hand
to finish the *Plates*, I was
necessarily constrained to
stay untill this time.

Now for the *materialls*
themselves I reduce them
into two sorts; one *Na-*
trall, of which some are
more familiarly known &
named amongst us, as di-
vers sorts of Birds, foure-
a 2 footed

footed Beasts and Fishes,
to whom I have given u-
sual *English* names. Others
are lesse familiar, and as
yet unfitted with apt *En-
glish* termes, as the shell-
Creatures, Insects, Mine-
ralls, Outlandish-Fruits,
and the like, which are
part of the *Materia Me-
dica*; (Encroachers upon
that faculty, may try how
they can crack such shels.)
The other sort is *Artifici-
alls*, as Vtenfills, House-
holdstusse, Habits, Instru-
ment

ments of VVarre used by
severall Nations, rare cu-
riosities of Art, &c. These
are also expressed in *En-
glish*, (saving the Coynes,
which would vary but
little if Translated) for the
ready satisfying whom-
soever may desire a view

added in the Conclusion
(and given the names of
the *Plants* both in *Latine*
and *English*) that nothing
may be wanting which at
