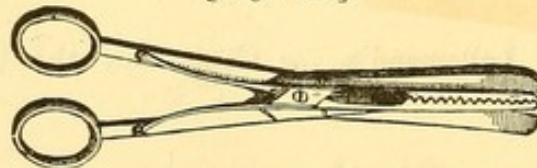
(Fig. 34,) each, - \$1 50

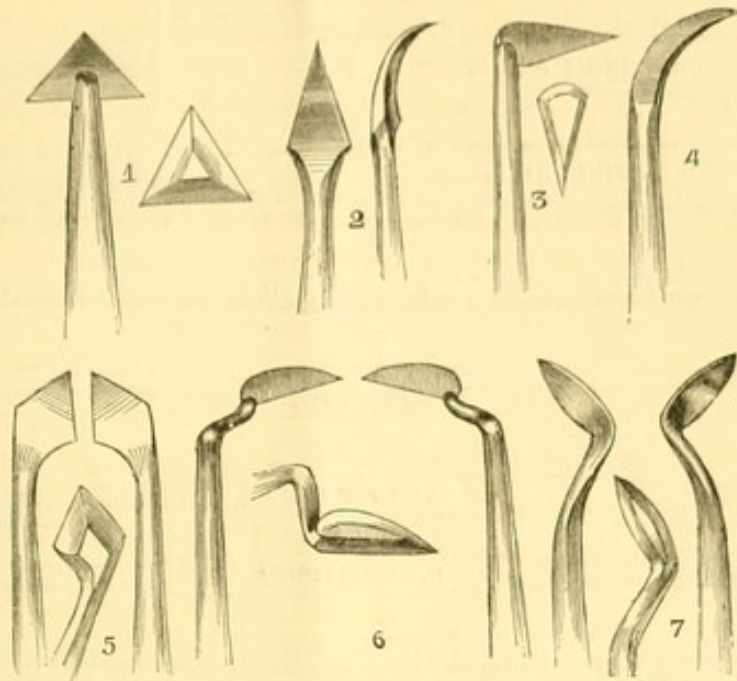

As the cuts are just half the real size, by doubling the measure a correct idea may be formed of the exact size; and as the shapes of the handles are different in form from those usually made, (the largest part being in the *centre* of the handles, instead of the butt,) I have discarded the use of inches to designate the size, and adopted the use of numbers.
