These cuts represent the different styles of Plugging and Scaling

Instruments. As the cuts are just half the real size, by doubling the measure a correct idea may be formed of the exact size; and as the shapes of the handles are different in form from those usually made, (the largest part being in the *centre* of the handles, instead of the butt,) I have discarded the use of inches to designate the size, and adopted the use of numbers. This shape of handle is better adapted to the hand, and more pleasant to the operator, than the other form, (which is in the shape of a truncated pyramid,) and although not so large in appearance, yet requires more ivory to make, and are greatly preferred by those who have used them.



These cuts represent the various and most approved forms of points in use. In making out an order, it is simply necessary to name the number of the cut to insure obtaining what is wanted. There are, of course, different *sizes* of the same number, which it would be necessary also to specify.
