TO THE MEDICAL PROFESSION:

Perceiving, as you must have done by this time the utter impossibility of foretelling, in many cases, especially in chronic disease, the particular agent by which you are to obtain amelioration or cure, you must see the necessity of commencing your treatment with the smallest available doses of the more potent remedies; of feeling your way, in short, before you venture upon *the doses prescribed by the schools*. You will see we do not countenance the Homœopathic nonsense. The twelfth part of a grain of Calomel, for example, has no more relation to the millionth or decillionth part of a grain of the same substance, than the twelfth part of a bottle of wine (one glass) has to a *drop* of that liquid. The one has power to influence the whole body, the other is utterly inappreciable, beyond the taste it may impart to the tongue, the only organ it can, by any possibility, even momentarily influence.

P R E F A C E

THE object of this manual is to prevent mistakes being made by Physicians, (particularly young graduates,) in the doses of medicines. So numerous have been the lives of persons lost by over-doses of the more active medicines, both mineral and vegetable. I hold that, as regards the quality, we have not such a thing as a poison, but only as to quantity. Having been a student of medicine for nearly thirty years, and a practitioner Allopathically, and as a Chrono-Thermalist for nearly twenty years, I presume will be sufficient to satisfy all those into whose hands this little work may fall, that I *ought* to be acquainted with the subject which I am about to introduce.

I have found so many Chrono-Thermal medicines which I use in my practice, not mentioned in the celebrated work of Dr. Dickson, of London, that I shall introduce them in the catalogue; besides, a knowledge of their Latin, French, and German names, will be found highly beneficial to the Physician, though unacquainted with those languages. It is already understood by those who have read Dickson's C. T. system of medicine, that we do not use the excessive doses of the Allopathist, nor the ridiculous doses of the Homeopathist, and experience has proven to me that small doses answer a better and safer purpose, in removing diseases--keeping in mind the proper time for their administration--than the excessive dose of the Allopathist. Since Dr. Dickson's work has been re-published, it is pleasing to me to see so many physicians, who heretofore used the lancet on almost every occasion, suddenly abandon blood letting; particularly in this western country. Although many of them practice on the C. T. system without having the honesty to acknowledge it, but on the contrary, will stigmatize the practice and its followers as quacks. Thank God our patients don't. I have often been stigmatized by my Allopathic brethren for publicly coming out a Chrono-Thermalist. Why not they tell me, practice it if you like, but don't let the world know it. My answer has universally been, that I do not wish to act the hypocrite; besides, my

patients would soon find it out by the smallness of the dose and their speedy recovery. I admire its author too much to steal from him without giving him the credit due to him; yet I strongly fear we can never repay Dr. Dickson for his wonderful discovery of the type and periodicity of disease, nor Dr. Turner, of New York, for his kindness in republishing his American edition.

Before concluding I will notice one fact, that in the city of Louisville alone, (I am informed by most respectable apothecaries,) where they used to sell one ounce of Hydrocyanic Acid per month, they now sell fifty. How passing strange, that Allopathists should all at once find more virtue in *that medicine* than they ever did before. I use in my own practice four ounces per month, on an average, and find it a superior medicine for children; yea, even for infants. Hoping, then, that all who use medicines in the doses prescribed in this little work, may find them, as I have done, more beneficial in diseases than large ones. I respectfully submit it for their examination.
