This disease proceeds often from the striking in of eruptions, the sudden checking of perspiration, the neglect of customary evacuations from the bowels, &c., and is frequently removed upon a slight operation of Lorraine's Pills.

CHAPTER VIII.

Directions

In using LORRAINE'S PILLS, no care is necessary, except in taking such doses as shall operate fully upon the bowels, which is from three to six pills; repeat every six hours until a full purgative effect is produced. The above are the directions in all sudden attacks of acute diseases, such as taking cold, &c. But it is to be particularly remembered, that if the blood is cleansed, every other function will be duly performed. The skin, kidneys, and bowels, will each discharge their portion of impurities. To cleanse the blood, Lorraine's Pills should never be taken to exceed one pill at a time, and that every night on going to bed, so that the energy of this extraordinary medicine may be imparted to the blood, which will enable that fluid to disengage and deposit its impurities into the bowels, from whence they will be carried off.

For small Children — Directions.


One of Lorraine's Pills should be dissolved in a table-spoonful of hot water, and sweetened, or made into a syrup; when it becomes the most convenient and excellent medicine known for small children. It is then given to the youngest children, on account of its mildness and safety, in doses of from one half to a whole tea-spoonful at a time, until it produces a purgative effect. In this form it is a certain cure for worms; and children afflicted with worms should take a small quantity of it daily, in such quantities as not to purge much.
