The students will, in addition to the private instruction, have the privilege of attending gratuitously, the Medical and Surgical practice, and the Surgical Operations at the Massachusetts General Hospital, during the period of their pupilage, and they will also have free admission to the Lectures on Anatomy and Surgery, delivered at the Medical School of Harvard University. Clinical Lectures on Surgery will be occasionally given.
