

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PREFACE

The Bellevue Hospital Nomenclature, compiled by this Committee, was first published in 1903. It was revised and entirely recast in 1909 and published in the New York Medical Journal in May and June of that year.

In this, the third edition, the nomenclature has been again revised and has been collocated with the International List of Causes of Death, by prefixing to each of its terms the proper International Title Number. The Nomenclature thus constitutes an amplification of that list, rendering it suitable for the registration and compilation of morbidity as well as mortality statistics.

The classification of terms into separate groups, alphabetically arranged, is designed to meet the needs of large hospitals where volumes of histories must be kept, easily accessible and in a useful order.

A statement of the primary causes of injuries being necessary for the purposes of vital statisticians* and of industrial and insurance statisticians as well, a plan has been incorporated whereby, not only is the nature of the injury shown, but the character of the violence is also indicated. This scheme was devised from the Draft of proposed Arrangement of Violent Deaths, which was included by the American Committee in their recommendations preliminary to the Congress of Revision, at Paris, in July, 1909.

The orthography conforms to that recommended by the Basle Anatomical Nomenclature and endorsed by the

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Rules for the Recording and Filing of Histories.*

- 1. All cards, charts, or other blank forms used in obtaining clinical records of patients must be approved by the Committee on Clinical Records and issued from the Record Room.
- 2. The Admitting Clerk upon the admission of a patient shall fill out the sociological data upon the obverse of the bedside card legibly in black ink.
- 3. The bedside card shall be delivered at once to the Nurse in charge of the ward to which the patient is assigned.
- 4. The Nurse in charge of the ward shall verify when, and as soon as possible, the sociological data on the bedside card.
- 5. If any change or addition to the data becomes necessary, the bedside card with the indicated change must be returned at once to the admitting office for correction. After correction, the bedside card must be returned immediately to the ward.
- 6. If the patient be transferred to another ward in the hospital the Physician or Surgeon making the transfer must sign the bedside card in the place provided therefor.
- 7. The bedside card and the history must accompany the patient when transferred from one ward to another.
- 8. The House Surgeon or Physician shall ascertain as soon as possible the alleged character of the violence in all cases of injury and indicate this character by placing a circle around the appropriate printed number on the reverse of the bedside card.

- 9. The diagnosis of the Visiting Physician or Surgeon shall be recorded upon the bedside card and history. The nomenclature hereinafter contained must be undeviatingly followed.
- on the bedside card the medical and surgical data, including the International Number of the principal disease, immediately upon the discharge of a patient, or in the event of a patient's death, as soon thereafter as possible. In the latter case the terms on the bedside card and on the death certificate must correspond.
- 11. The Nurse in charge of a ward shall cause the bedside card to be delivered to the Assistant Superintendent's Office immediately upon the discharge or death of a patient.
- 12. The Assistant Superintendent shall cause the bedside card to be delivered to the Record Clerk within twenty-four hours after the discharge or death of a patient.
- 13. All histories and other records made upon the charts must be written legibly, in black copying ink, on one side of the paper with as much economy of space as possible. The writing must not extend across the margins for binding and must be signed by the Physician or Surgeon making the record.
- 14. The House Physician or Surgeon shall record the complete diagnosis on the history upon the discharge or death of a patient. This diagnosis must correspond with that on the bedside card.
- 15. The Day Nurse must use black copying ink on the medication chart, the Night Nurse must use red copying ink. Nurses must write on both sides of this chart, economizing space as much as possible.

- 16. The Nurse in charge of a ward shall be responsible to the House Physician or Surgeon for the manner in which the temperature and medication charts are kept. Only black copying ink must be used on the temperature charts, except for the night hours at the top and the vertical lines separating the calendar days, where red copying ink must be used. The lines showing the temperature range must be carefully ruled and must not be made heavier than the heaviest line printed on the chart.
- 17. The House Physician or Surgeon shall be responsible for the delivery to the Record Clerk of the complete history of each patient immediately after the discharge or death of such patient, except that when a post-mortem examination is to be performed, the history may be retained by the House Physician or Surgeon for a period not exceeding three days.
- 18. The Pathologist shall be responsible for the delivery to the Record Clerk of a copy of the record of each post-mortem examination.
- 19. When the anatomical diagnosis of the principal disease does not agree with the clinical diagnosis, the Acting Member of the Committee on Clinical Records shall cause the diagnosis on the bedside card and history to conform to the post-mortem finding unless the clinical evidence is stronger than the pathological evidence.
- 20. The Record Room and its contents and the Record Clerks shall be under the immediate charge of the Superintendent of the Hospital and of the Committee on Clinical Records.
- 21. The Record Clerks shall be directly responsible to the Committee on Clinical Records for the proper performance of their duties.

- 22. The Record Clerks shall number each history serially in its group and shall record this number on each page of the history, on its cover, and on the bedside card.
- 23. The Record Clerks shall arrange the separate sheets of each history in the following order: History, Physical Examination, Clinical Pathology Charts, Temperature Charts, Medication Charts, Post-Mortem Record. The Record Clerks shall place the history sheets in a cover provided for the purpose, and write the necessary data on the outside of the cover.
- 24. The Record Clerks shall file the bedside cards from each division of the Hospital separately in drawers provided for the purpose. The cards shall be filed alphabetically according to the name of the patients. At the end of each year, all the cards shall be redistributed alphabetically and permanently preserved.
- 25. The Record Clerks shall label the drawers of the filing cabinets and the guide cards within the drawers, in accordance with the nomenclature.
- 26. The Record Clerks shall file the histories of each Division in their respective cabinets.
- 27. The Chief Record Clerk shall record on the Cross Reference and Complication sheets such complications as the Committee on Clinical Records shall direct. These sheets shall be filed in the proper cabinets.
- 28. The Chief Record Clerk shall prepare the histories for binding, when, and as directed by the Committee on Clinical Records, and shall keep the bound volumes in the same order as the unbound histories.
- 29. No original history or other original record shall be removed from the Record Room under any circumstances except upon the order of a Court, but copies

of such histories or other records may be made for any member of the Medical Board or at the discretion of the Superintendent of the Hospital or of the Committee on Clinical Records.

- 30. The Chief Record Clerk shall compile a monthly statistical report on sheets provided for the purpose, as the Committee on Clinical Records may direct, for presentation to the Medical Board.
- 31. The Chief Record Clerk shall compile annual reports of statistics from the monthly reports as the Committee on Clinical Records may direct.
- 32. The Chief Record Clerk shall compile an annual report of operations from the data recorded on the bed-side card.
- 33. Copies of all photographs shall be delivered unmounted to the Record Clerk, to be filed with their appropriate histories.

THE NOMENCLATURE

The numbers, words and phrases in bold-faced type, e. g., 79A, Valvular Disease, Chronic Cardiac, are the exact terms in which the diagnosis of the principal disease or injury must be stated upon the bedside card and history. The complications must not be numbered. No other words must be used on the bedside card or history for this purpose. In the case of injury, the proper International Number denoting the character of the violence, is prefixed to the diagnosis or is in the list printed at the beginning of Injuries on page 108.

When an operation has been performed it must be stated upon the bedside card, using the appropriate word or phrase printed in bold-faced type in the Nomenclature of Operations beginning on page 130.

The words in *italics* are for purposes of classification only: e. g., *Parasite* of Lung is not to be used as a diagnosis, but for the word *Parasite* the variety of parasite must be substituted, as 98 Cysticercus of Lung, etc.

The words and phrases in Roman type are suggestions to physicians using the nomenclature in diagnosis and instructions to record clerks for filing the histories.

When the entrance of a foreign body has caused external traumatism the term will be found under Injuries. On the other hand when such entrance has been by way of a natural body passage the term will be found under Diseases and Conditions.

The following rules must be adhered to in stating the relation between the principal disease and the complicating or concurrent disease.

- A. Of two independent affections the choice should be made in favor of:
- 1st. An infective disease; e. g., 92 Lobar Pneumonia and Atrophic Cirrhosis of Liver.
- 2d. The graver affection, e. g., 42A, Carcinoma of Uterus and Nephroptosis.
- 3d. The disease for which the patient applies for treatment, e. g., 145C Zoster and Acute Rhinitis.
- B. When the disease for which the patient enters the hospital is dependent upon another co-existing disease, the latter should be named as the principal disease and the former as the complication; e. g., 79A Chronic Cardiac Valvular Disease and Chronic Cardiac Valvular Disease and Chronic Cardiac Dilatation; (the reverse is often written); 28 Chronic Pulmonary Tuberculosis and Serofibrinous Pleurisy, and not the reverse; 59 Chronic Morphine Poisoning and Colitis.
- C. When a surgical condition complicates a medical case the former should be named as the complication and not (as is usually done) as the principal disease when the diagnosis is completed on the Surgical Division; e. g., 50 Diabetes Mellitus, and Gangrene; 92 Lobar Pneumonia and Suppurative Pleurisy, and vice versa when a medical condition complicates a surgical case the former should be named as the complication and not (as is usually done) as the principal disease when the diagnosis is completed on the Medical Division, e. g., Fracture of Femur and Alcohol Poissoning, and not the reverse.

INJURIES

The statement of the nature of the injury must be supplemented by an indication of the character of the violence in accordance with the scheme given below.

The house surgeon must specify the alleged cause of the injury by assigning the number to correspond with the following classification of causes, except where a number has already been assigned.

Conflagration takes precedence over all other causes of injury. If a patient is injured directly or indirectly, in or about a conflagration, the number 166 must be assigned to the diagnosis, e. g., a fracture of the femur produced by the fall of a passenger elevator in a burning building must receive the number 166 and not 174B.

The International Numbers are given without reference to possible judicial determinations as to the cause of violence, namely, whether accidental, suicidal or homicidal—therefore, the International Numbers 153, and 155 to 163, and 182 to 184 are omitted.

NOMENCLATURE OF OPERATIONS

Rules for Recording Operations*

- When a patient has been operated upon, this fact must be recorded on the bedside card in the place provided therefor.
- In recording operations on the bedside card the House Surgeon must undeviatingly follow the nomenclature hereinafter contained.
- 3. When an operation is performed for a single condition and its immediate complications, one operation only shall be recorded on the bedside card; e. g., an operation for strangulated inguinal hernia, in which the procedures include relief of the strangulation, excision of a gangrenous portion of intestine, lateral anastomosis of intestine, and a radical cure of the hernia, must be recorded on the bedside card as Operation for Inguinal Hernia, Strangulated.

4. When several operations have been performed for several distinct conditions each operation must be recorded separately on the bedside card; e. g., inguinal hernia, varicocele and varicose vein of the leg, the operations must be recorded on the bedside card as: Operation for Inguinal Hernia; Operation for Varicocele and Operation for Varix of Saphenous Vein.

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
