UNIQUE. A splendid original record of gifts made by King Edward I while he was at Berwick, The Tower, Dover, Quenington, Devizes, Gloucester, Westminster and other places. The names of the recipients occur, with the amount given, the reason for which the gifts were made, etc. Affording an interesting picture of the services rendered by those about the King and Court. Among the many important people mentioned are :

The King's sister, BEATRICE, EDMUND MONTFORT, the Bishops of BANGOR, BALS, the COUNT OF SAVOY, the KING of SPAIN, the ABBOT of RIEVAUX, EDMUND cousin of the King, the Q. of ARAGON, JOHN DE BRETON Gentleman of the Chamber to the QUEEN MOTHER, widow of HENRY III, ROBERT, Chaplain to the King, MAGLOTTI, bearer of a letter from the Pope, the KING of ARAGON, the BP. of ST. ASAPH, the DUCHESS OF BURGUNDY, WILLIAM POLSHANKS, Jester, the NURSE of BERENGARIA, duc. of EDW. I, JOHN, fool to the QUEEN OF NAVARRE, and hundreds of other distinguished personages.

There are numerous entries as to the different minstrels of the King, the K. of SCOTLAND, the COUNTS of SAVOY, the Duke of BEAUMONT, gifts to JOHN DE RAPER [for riding an obstinate horse of the King], to SIMON the doctor, for attending for 108 days, by the King's command, the sick in LONDON, also for visiting the Count of SAVOY, at MARLBOROUGH to man at BROKESBROOK, for the burning of his house when the King was there, to W. PEYNELL and certain Knights who accompanied the Duke of BURGUNDY, for expenses at the tournament, to the PRINCESS of WALES for a "Couverchof", to a Welshman who brought four hounds to the King from LLIWELLYN PRINCE OF WALES, etc. There are many entries relating to eminent Welshmen, notices of the King playing dice and chess; grants to Falconers, Huntsmen, and to a man who found a gyrfalcon and hundreds of other entries.

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
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


