was at Harsted, The Tower, Dover, Gosington, Devizes, Gloucester, West-
minster and other places. The names of the recipients occur, with the
amount given, the reason for which the gifts were made, etc. Affording
an interesting picture of the services rendered by those about the King
and Court. Among the many important people mentioned are :

The King's sister, BEATRICE, EDWARD MORTIMER, the BISHOPS of BANGOR, BALE, the
COUNT OF SAVOY, the KING OF SPAIN, the ABBOT OF BENEVAULT, EDWARD cousin
of the King, the C. of ABERGAVON, JOHN DE RUDENE Gentleman of the Chamber to
the QUEEN MOTHER, widow of HENRY III, ROBERT, Chaplain to the King, MACLOTTI,
bearer of a letter from the Pope, the KING of ABERGON, the B. of ST. ASAPH,
the DUCHESS OF BURGUNDY, WILLIAM POLESHERKES, Jester, the NURSE of BERENGARIA,
dau. of EDW. I, JOHN, fool to the QUEEN OF HAVARNE, and hundreds of other
distinguished personages.

There are numerous entries as to the different minstrels of the King, the
K. of SCOTLAND, the COUNTS OF SAVOY, the Duke of BERRANT, gifts to JOHN
DE HARBE (for riding an obstinate horse of the Kings), to GILME the doctor,
for attending for 108 days, by the King's command, the sick in LONDON, also
for visiting the Count of SAVOY, at MARIBORO, to men at BROKESWORTH, for the
BUYING OF HIS HORSES when the King was there, to W. FRYNELL and certain
Knights who accompanied the Duke of BERRANT, for expenses at the tourna-
ment, to the PRINCESS OF WALES for a " Couvercheif ", to a Welshman who brought
four hounds to the King from LLEWELLYN PRINCE OF WALES, etc. There are many
entries relating to eminent Welshmen, notices of the King playing dice and
chess; grants to Falconers, Huntsmen, and to a man who found a gyr falcon
and hundreds of other entries.
