THE WHAT. By "Internal Baths," we mean what is usually designated, "flushing the colon," and "rectal irrigation," but *not* what is known as "taking an injection." Mere injections of a pint to a quart or two of water are not only insufficient but may lead to the formation of bad habits; they are certainly not internal *baths*.

To take an "internal bath," properly, four or five quarts of clean. antiseptic water are scientifically sent into the colon or large bowel (see illustration of large intestine and explanation further on).

This gutter is capable, when fully distended, of holding (in a large person), 5 quarts. It is the receptacle for the waste matter of the system. Whenever this physiological sewer or guttter is washed out and cleansed, we may describe the process as taking an "internal bath." THE WHY. All sewers should be flushed, cleansed, disinfected. Do we need to argue such a reasonable proposition? Civilized man is the subject or victim of very bad habits, practices and misfortunes : irregularity in going to stool ; irregularity in rising and retiring; irregularity in taking his meals, etc.; overfeeding; improper food ; undue excitements ; undue depressions ; worries ; rectal lacerations from hard substances swallowed (such as pieces of nut shells or bones), etc; inner scratches that result in piles, ulcers, fissures, etc.; inflammation from neglect in having the diaper changed in childhood, (bringing on in later years hemorrhoids, etc., which in turn bring on constipation or diarrhœa); indolence; too little exercise; too much exercise; sedentary habits; nervous exhaustion; sensitiveness to heat and cold, and many other departures from the normality of nature;-

all these bring upon him the penalty of disobedience by interrupting or suspending or rendering inadequate the great protective and self-preservative function of elimination or discharge of rejected material. In consequence of this retention, in all of us, of some quantity, much or little, of the offscourings of the system, the blood becomes corrupted; and the immediately-related functions of the small intestines, of the liver, and of the stomach, are thwarted, which in turn thwart functions closely related to them, and so on and on. As an outcome, the weakest organ becomes the first noticeable victim, which in one person may be the kidneys, in another, the lungs, in another, the stomach, the liver, the brain, etc., thus furnishing the hot-bed for the growth of the multitude of diseases that necessitate doctors and drugs, the shame of our sham culture. The surcharged sewer becomes stagnant, and soon a crust forms on the inner walls (even among those that have a passage daily), which no cathartics will ever wholly remove. A hole through the centre of this incrustation may permit of a gradually lessened passage daily of effete substance, but the absorbant glands keep up their incessant work on the incrusted poisonous mass,

Even persons that believe themselves to be in good health, should take an internal bath occasionally, *as a preventive measure*. Surely, if it is "natural" to take an external bath, it must be equally so to take one internally.

Cathartics, purgatives, liver medicines, etc., irritate the coating of the stomach and urge it to hasten out its contents. These drugs (like the spur to a jaded horse) subject the system to unnatural strain and excitement, in the endeavor to excrete a small quantity of fluid to dissolve the accumulated mass, while the reaction is even more trying. Thus, the whole system becomes deranged and weakened. The relief is temporary, the mischief lasting.

Why, if the seat of the trouble is local, should we get at it by the roundabout way of swallowing drugs, and thus compel the glands and nerves, swamped by these drugs, to wallow in intestinal mire, when we may use a few grains of reason mixed with a few quarts of water, to wash out the waste matter and clean the sewer passage?

THE WAY. But the *way* we indicate in this little pamphlet. It is described and prescribed (for special cases) more fully in Prof. Chas. A. Tyrrell's book, "The Royal Road to Health." (See notice of the latter near the end of this pamplet). But read what follows concerning the *Cascade*,—the scientific appliance for taking an "Internal Bath."

The following is from the pen of the well-known Dr. H. T. Turner:

In 1880 I lost a patient with inflammation of the bowels, and I requested of the friends the privilege of holding a post-mortem examination, as I was satisfied that there was some foreign substance in or near the Ileo Cœcal valve, or in that apparently useless appendage, the Appendicula Vermiformis (see explanation of the engraving).

The autopsy developed a quantity of grape seed and pop corn, filling the lower enlarged pouch of the Colon, and the opening into the Appendicula Vermiformis. This, from the mortified condition of that part of the Colon alone indicated that my diagnosis was correct. I opened the Colon throughout its entire length of five feet, and found it filled with fæcal matter, and encrusted on its walls and into the folds of the Colon, in many places dry and hard as slate, and so completely obstructing the passage of the bowels as to throw the patient into violent colic (as his friends stated) sometimes as often as twice a month for years, and that powerful doses of physic were his only relief; they further stated that all the doctors had agreed that it was bilious colic,

I observed that this encrusted matter was evidently of long standing, the result of years of accumulation, and the remote eause—not the immediate cause—of his death. The Sigmoid Flexure (see engraving) or bend in the Colon on the left side, was especially full and distended to fully double its natural size filling the gut uniformly, with a small hole, the size of one's little finger, through the centre, through which the fæcal matter passed. In the lower part of the Sigmoid Flexure, just before descending to form the Rectum, and also in the left-hand upper corner of the Colon, as it turns toward the right, was a pocket eaten out of the hardened fæcal matter, in which were eggs of worms, and quite a quantity of maggots, which had eaten into the sensitive mucous membrane, causing serious inflammation of the colon and the adjacent parts and were the cause of the hemorrhoids or piles, which I learned were of years standing. The whole length of the Colon was in a state of chronic inflammation, and still this man had no trouble in getting his life insured in one of the best companies in America, and was considered a strong and healthy man by his family and neighbors.

As I retired to my room that night, not to sleep, but to meditate upon the revelation revealed in that human privy, I naturally went to my eminent medical authorities for causes of disease, to learn if any had given this new revelation and discovery as a cause of disease. I found not even a hint that the etiology of any disease de seribed was found in the Colon. My memory went back during the years of education and college life, and followed along down the after years of study of journals and text books of reference to see if perchance, among all the multiplicity of causes of diseases some eminent author had not referred to this human privy, whose vault was ever full to overflowing, as the immediate or remote cause of disease, but all were as silent as the grave, so silent that one would suppose that they were, ignorant even of the existence of a Colon.

Owing to this fact, the prevailing fear of digression from the opinion of authorized authority took possession of me, and for years I practised my hygienic treatment in silence, only telling a few of my most intimate friends of the conviction of truth that continually revealed itself to me, until my mind and whole being became absorbed with the wonderful truths (although in contradiction to all medical authority) evolving into actual existence from continued experience until the continued demand of friends and patrons induced me to publish the experience of my life as a result of hygienic and sanitary science, developed in my daily experience. One Mr. G. W. Bradbury, after being entirely relieved from years of suffering from rheumatism, given up to die at times by the profession, or to eke out a miserable existence with no hope, the hygienic treatment completely restored to health and a new lease of life. He demanded of me that I publish my treatment to the world. Laying aside all feaso of the profession, and with prayerful trust in God that I do my whole duty, I presenthis to a sensible people, praying that God would bless its truths to the benefit of my fellow, and that the people may further understand the nature of this discovery, and its wonderful success in curing disease, by removal of the cause, I will explain in the following lines:

I have been thus explicit in this description from the fact that recent investigation, has developed the fact, that in the discovery described above I had found a prototype, as the cause of all diseases of the human body, that I had found the foundation of premature old age and death; for, surprising as it may seem, out of two hundred and eighty-four cases of autopsy held (they representing nearly all the diseases known to our climate), but twenty-eight Colons were found to be free from hardened adhered matter, and in their normal healthy state, and the two hundred and fifty-six were all more or less as described above, except perhaps, the grape seeds and pop corn. Many of them, as described by the writer, where distended to nearly double their natural size throughout their whole length, with a small hole through the centre, and almost universally those last cases spoken of had regular evacuations of the bowels each day, many of them (the Colons) containing large worms from four to six inches long, producing epilepsy, spinal irritation and extreme nervousness.

My experience from day to day develops startling disclosures in the form of worms, and the nest of eggs, that we daily get from patients, accompanied with blood and pus. As I stood there looking at that Colon and reservoir of death, I expressed myself as my patients do daily, in wonder that any one can live a week, much less for years, with this cesspool of death and contagion always with him. The absorption of this deadly poison back into the circulation can but cause all the contagious diseases. The recent treatment of hemorrhage of the bowels in typhold fever has shown it to be caused from maggots and worms eating into a sensitive membrane and tapping a vein or artery. In fact, my experience during the past ten years had proven, by the rapid recovery of all diseases—especially so-called chronic diseases—that in the Colon lies the cause of nearly all human ailments. Here is the breeding ground, and a fertile soil for disease-breeding germs to be carried from the Colon and emptied directly into the lungs, through the portal veins, lacteals and lymphatics, by way of the thoracic duct, [see common high school hygienic physiology for Washington, pp, 165, 88 and 800].

It is a well-known fact, that physic will not remove this encrusted matter, or even loosen it, but by increased action of the small intestines they are emptied for the time being, giving temporary room for the overloaded stomach and duodenum, and empty ing and rinsing out the small passage-way through the crusted matter in the Colon and it is the writer's opinion that calomel and other forms of mercury, morphine, and a thousand other death-dealing drugs in use by the so-called science of medicine, should be dispensed with.

But why, you ask, has not this discovery been made before? There are two main reasons. The first is, in holding post-mortems, this organ was avoided, cut off, if in the way, and thrown in the slop bucket. In the dissecting room, the student, taking it for granted that the Colon was like the rest of the intestinal canal, cut it off and threw it away on account of its scent-bag propensities and nastiness. As a result, the profession knows the least about this important organ of any in the human body. The other reason is of a regular nature and full of selfish bigotry and motive, for a knowledge as given above would revolutionize the whole science of so-called medicine, and stop, to a great extent, medication by way of the stomach, and any digression from the regular established teachings is quackery, and always has been since Hippocrates first promulgated a system of medicine. Recent investigation has also developed the fact that all cases of tuberculosis or consumption have their origin in one or more tubercular ulcers in the Colon, located as a sequel of above described pockets of maggoty worms, and that hereditary consumption is a myth.

The question is often asked. "Why is this unnatural accumulation in the Colon ? The horse or ox promptly obeys the call of nature, and knows no time or place, and ane blessed with a lean Colon. So are the natives of Africa. But the demands of civilized life insist upon a time and place. Business, etiquette, opportunity, and a thousand and one excuses, stand continually in the way, and Nature's call is put off to a more convenient season. The fæcal discharge as it is pressed through the Ileo Cœcal valve into the Colon is (if natural) of the consistency of paste, and should be but a triffe harder at its final evacuation ; but if allowed to remain in the Colon longer than three hours, it settles into the folds of the Colon, and a little remains there while the remainder becomes hard, and we call it constipation, for its fluid particles have been absorbed back into the circulation. This little continuing to adhere in the folds, causes inflammation, and its dryness attracts more accumulation. Now this process, going on from day to day, from week to week, from year to year, the Colon becomes completely lined, losing its nerve, elastic power and sensibility. Then the fæcal matter passes through the five feet of Colon by force of pressure from above like a shoemaker's punch-the first round piece cut is the first piece out. That which passed to-day should have passed one or two week's ago. Many times it is small round balls, hard and apparently moulded; one lady said she thought it was the relics of each mouthful of food. But this moulding is in this wise. At the terminus of the small intestines the last six inches terminate in a pouch, at the terminus of which, where it enters the Colon, it is called the Ileo Cœcal valve, which when the pouch is full, open and discharges its contents into the Colon, when it closes, thereby forbidding any return of the contents of the Colon. Now, if there is any obstruction to the free discharge from this pouch, the valve closes for fear of return of the contents. Now suppose the Colon is full at this point, or nearly so, the moment the substance touches the obstruction, the valve closes, biting of a piece the size of the ball spoken of, then the pouch demands to be emptied and again forces open the valve, until again it strikes the obstruction, when the valve again closes. So it goes on acting spasmodically, moulding the ,contents of the pouch into small round balls until it is empty. and in a week or two these balls of fæcal matter pass off, which should have passed within three hours, forcing their way through the small passage in the Colon, for Nature is bound to keep an opening or we would all die.

Do you wonder, dear reader, that men die of premature old age, apoplexy, paralysis, dropsy, consumption, dyspepsia, so-called liver complaint, or biliary derangement, Bright's disease or any other kidney trouble ? Catarrh (which if left alone fertilizes a field for consumption), epilepsy, rectal disease, syphilis, rheumatism, female diseases of all kinds of names, spinal irritation, peritonitis, all kinds of skin diseases, and impurity of the blood, old sores, cancers, and, lastly all kinds of fevers of a malarial or contagious nature, all have their origin in the Colon.
