EIGHTH

MORTUARY REPORT.

FOR THE YEAR BEGINNING 1ST FEBRUARY 1855.

THE Registration of last year was carried on with the usual steady regularity that has been observed since its commencement, and there was a little improvement in the proportion that the written bore to the oral reports received at the funeral-places, those being one-eighth of the whole. The most unsatisfactory part of the Returns is that showing the Causes of Death. It was hoped, perhaps too sanguinely, that the better educated of the people would take interest in the object in view, and would give their aid to make the registration useful to medical science ; but the hope has been disappointed. Even the Grant Medical College Graduates in practice in Bombay have, as if with one accord, withheld the aid that was confidently expected from them, and during the year scarcely one report of death was received from them, except what was obtained on the special requisition of the Superintendent of Police. It is known that in their practice there are difficulties in the way of reporting fatal cases, from the hurried funeral that takes place, and from the friends of the dying patient frequently changing the medical attendant ; but notwithstanding these impediments, it is in their power to give valuable aid to the registration, and this has been pointed out to them ; but, apparently through apathy, they will not take the little trouble that it would involve to forward medical science in this point.

2. It is not medical men only who can help in the registration : much may be done by all who, from their rank or education, are influential in their

respective classes of the people ; for many now in sickness employ the aids of European medical science, and have it in their power to obtain from a skilled medical attendant the exact name of the disease causing death. Among other ways of improving the registration, it may be suggested that the Parsees, who preferred to collect by their own servants the Death Reports for the Police, should place at their cemetery a man who would take the trouble to obtain from the funeral parties correct information as to the cause of death, either through written or oral reports. This they engaged to do ; but there is too great reason to think that the work might be more efficiently performed than it now is.

3. The causes of death among Europeans are almost invariably reported in writing, and as that portion of the Returns may be considered on that account more accurate and more complete than what is obtained by oral report, it may be useful to exhibit it in a separate form, as in Table I^A, as well as in the general Table I.

4. The deaths registered were 14,928, which is 3,082 less than in the preceding year, and 295 above the average of the preceding seven years. The reported still-births were 281, or in the ratio of 1·88 to the whole.

5. Of the 14,647 deaths that occurred after birth, 8,064 were males, and 6,583 females, or in the ratio of 122·5 males to 100 females, the mean proportion for the previous years being about 124. There was a slight preponderance of female deaths among the Parsees and among the Jews, but the latter race is here so few in number, that great fluctuations are to be expected in it : the male deaths were in excess in every other ethnological class of the population.

6. The ages recorded are only approximative, and in the present state of the community they cannot be exactly known. From the registry of the year, the mean age at death was $23\frac{3}{4}$ years ; but, in stating this result, it must be repeated that there is a great influx of adults, and a tendency, also, to exaggerate the ages of the old.

7. A Table arranged according to Occupations has been given annually ; but as there are in it so many headings among which the mortality has to be distributed, the number under each of these in any one year is small. From the wife and children often helping, but to a varying and uncertain extent, in

the trade of the head of the family, it is difficult to state correctly how many persons are actually engaged in the different occupations, and it is thought more useful, for statistical purposes, to note the numbers that derive their subsistence from each branch of industry, than to restrict the table solely to an attempt, which would at present be most unpromising, to show how occupation influences disease.

8. The subdivisions of the Hindoo castes and Jain *Nat* that occurred in the Registers, have again been tabulated, but the male and female deaths are now shown separately. The Moosulman races also are specified, so far as they were ascertained. Both this Table and that of Occupations will be chiefly useful in the elucidation of future Population Returns.

9. Of the 14,647 deaths, exclusive of Still-born, that were registered, 2,753 were from epidemic causes, which number is in the ratio 18·8 per cent. and falls short of the annual mean by 458. The Cholera deaths were 1,739, or 677 less than the average of the preceding seven years. The months in which they chiefly occurred were April, May, June, and July. The Sarcophagous tribes suffered more than the Asarcophagous, and of the former the Hindoos more than the others. But locality of residence seems to have a more uniform influence on this disease than other observed circumstances; and taking, as in former years, in the absence of Population Returns, the deaths from all causes except epidemics, for comparison, the Cholera deaths were in excess of the due proportion in Mazagaon, Oomburkharee, Colaba, Dhobee-tulao, Girgaon, Chaoputee, Walkeshwur, and Mahaluxmee; the sections with houses closely built in dry streets, although densely peopled, being, as usual, proportionally freer from the disease than where there is much water, or there are irrigated gardens. Division F, occupying the northern end of the island, again affords an exception to this. There were 1,014 Small-pox deaths reported, that being 701 more than in the preceding year, and 300 more than the yearly mean hitherto registered. The mortality in each of the eight years through which the record has been kept has, with one trivial exception, had its minimum in October, and its maximum in April. There was no death from Measles registered.

10. The deaths registered as from Fever were 6,685, a number greater than half of that from all causes except Cholera and Small-pox, and forming $46\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of the total mortality. There is little room to doubt that the

entries in the Register under this head are more numerous than they would be, were the diagnosis between Idiopathic and Symptomatic Fever correctly made, or even were the friends to report more faithfully the observed cause of death. That the mortality from Endemic Fever is in reality great is undoubted, and it is of grave importance that the causes of the disease should, if possible, be removed or lessened.

11. Science has not yet decided what are the causes of Remittent or Intermittent Fevers, such as produce so great mortality in this place,—whether they are altogether telluric, or only partly so and partly atmospheric : that a certain condition of the surface of the ground and periodic fever are connected, as cause and effect, is generally admitted ; and such a condition seems present in the salt marshes that lie between Trombay and the north end of Bombay, and along the south and south-eastern shores of Salsette, where they have a surface of probably not less than thirty square miles, and which also fringe the western side of the last named island. It is possible, also, that the powerful febrific influences present in the uncultivated valleys of Salsette may extend in some degree to Bombay.

12. Another probable source of febrile disease is present in the Flats, that were at one time salt marsh, over which the sea at high tide flowed, insulating the higher portions of this island from one another, until it was excluded by the embankments or *vallades* at Dharavee, Wurlee, and Mahaluxmee. Much of the recovered land has been brought under cultivation, and most of it must have become greatly purified by the annual rains ; but the soil, even in these portions, is not yet totally freed from organic matter, and as, from neglected drainage, a large surface continues moist until long after the end of the south-west monsoon, it is still likely to give out unwholesome exhalations.

13. There is a portion of the Flats lying between the drain and the Mahaluxmee Vallade, measuring about 189 acres, which is kept in the state of salt marsh by the sea-water passing through the foundations of the vallade. This last evil might be remedied by the engineer's skill ; and the noxious influences of the Salsette marshes would gradually lessen were these brought under cultivation.

14. The deaths from Disease of the Nervous System were 572, a number somewhat greater than in the preceding year. From Disease of the Respiratory System there was a recorded mortality of 1,265, which is 211 less than

in the year 1854 ; but in both years the ratio of this to the mortality in the other classes of disease is the same. Under Class VIII. or Disease of the Alimentary System, there were 1,925 entries, or 278 less than in the former year.

15. Diseases of the Vascular and Urinary Systems, not being always easily recognised by the unskilled, probably, in reality, occurred oftener than is shown in these Returns. From the former there were recorded last year but 14 deaths, and from the latter but 10.

16. There was a considerable diminution of casualties under Class X. but an increase under Diseases of the Locomotive and Tegumentary Systems, and also under the too vague term Debility. From Leprosy there were 40 deaths, and 79 from Dropsy, and there were 14 from unknown and unspecified causes.

17. The deaths from Accident and Violence were 151, which is 47 fewer than in the preceding year. Drowning, as usual, was the cause of much of the mortality in this Class. The funerals of 52 drowned were recorded : of these 13 perished in the sea, and 39 in fresh waters ; and of the latter 23 were reported as having been drowned by accident. Of the total drownings 5 were homicidal, and 16 suicidal.

18. Of the 14,928 registered, 10,282 bodies were buried, 3,862 burnt, and 784 exposed. The place of birth of 7,235 was said to have been Bombay, that of 7,639 elsewhere, and of 54 to be unknown. The country to which the family belonged was in 3,103 instances stated to be Bombay, in 11,772 to be elsewhere, and in 53 to be unknown.

19. From the Meteorological Observations supplied from the Observatory, the mean Barometric Pressure was 29·832 inches, its mean range ·116, and its extreme range ·974 : these results closely correspond with those of the preceding year. The mean Temperature of the air was 80·9, which is 0·9 greater than the average of the preceding seven years ; the mean range was 11·4 ; and the absolute range of the year but 29·6. The Hygrometric states of the air, as furnished from the Observatory, give results that it is difficult to understand* : the Humidity of the year has progressively fallen from 94 per cent.

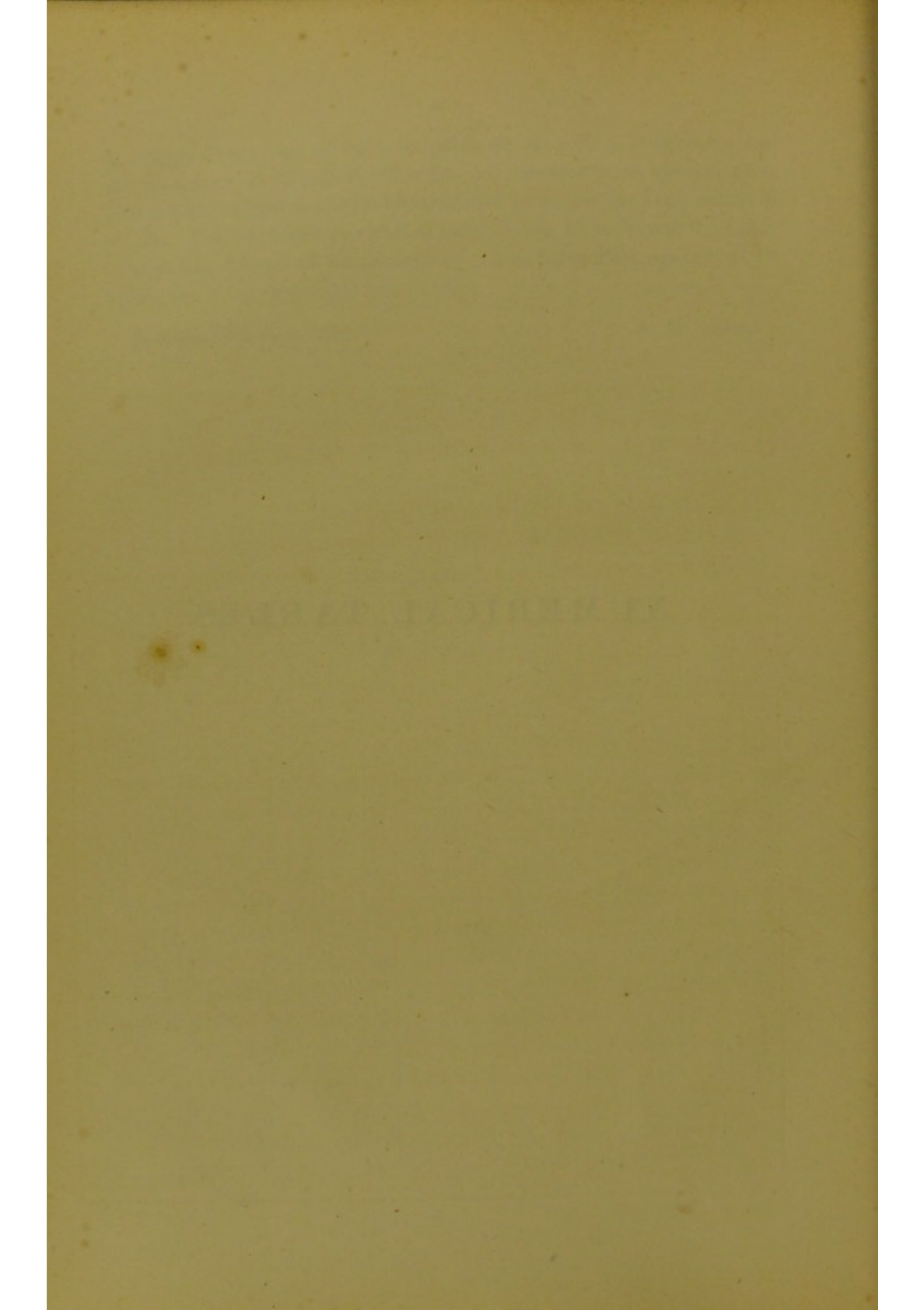

in 1848 to 77 per cent. in 1855, and while the per-centage of Humidity has decreased from '91 in 1853 to '77 in last year, the Dew-point has risen from 70°9 to 72°1, and not in exact conformity with increase in the Temperature of the air. The Sea-breeze prevailed as usual during 19 hours, and the Land-wind during 5 hours of the twenty-four. The fall of Rain was only 41·18 inches, but it was distributed over 91 days.

To the MEDICAL BOARD.

Letter from the Acting Secretary to the Medical Board, No. 1809, dated 5th July 1856, submitting Mortuary Report for the Year 1855, and making certain observations and recommendations with reference thereto.

Resolution of Government on the above, dated 17th July 1856.

The Medical Board should be requested to convey to Dr. Leith the best acknowledgments of Government for his valuable Mortuary Return for the past year, which, it is gratifying to observe, proved less unhealthy than the preceding one.

2. The fact of Medical Practitioners having evinced apathy in aiding Dr. Leith in his laudable endeavours to promote the very important branch of statistical knowledge adverted to in the 4th paragraph of the Medical Board's letter is much to be regretted; but Government hope that a better state of things will arise, when their sentiments on this subject shall have been made known, which should be done in the manner suggested by the Board, namely by a Public Notice in the *Government Gazette*. The Medical Board should be requested to prepare and submit the draft of a suitable Notification on the subject.

3. The course proposed by them in the concluding paragraph of their letter is approved.

4. The Governor in Council also resolves that a representation, on the subject of the latter part of paragraph 2 of Dr. Leith's Report, should be made to the Parsee Punchayet, through their President, Sir Jamsetjee Jeejeebhoy.

5. The subject of the first part of paragraph 13 of Dr. Leith's Report will be referred for the early consideration of the Board of Conservancy.

6. The Mortuary Report, with its Appendices and the above Resolution, should be printed on account of Government.

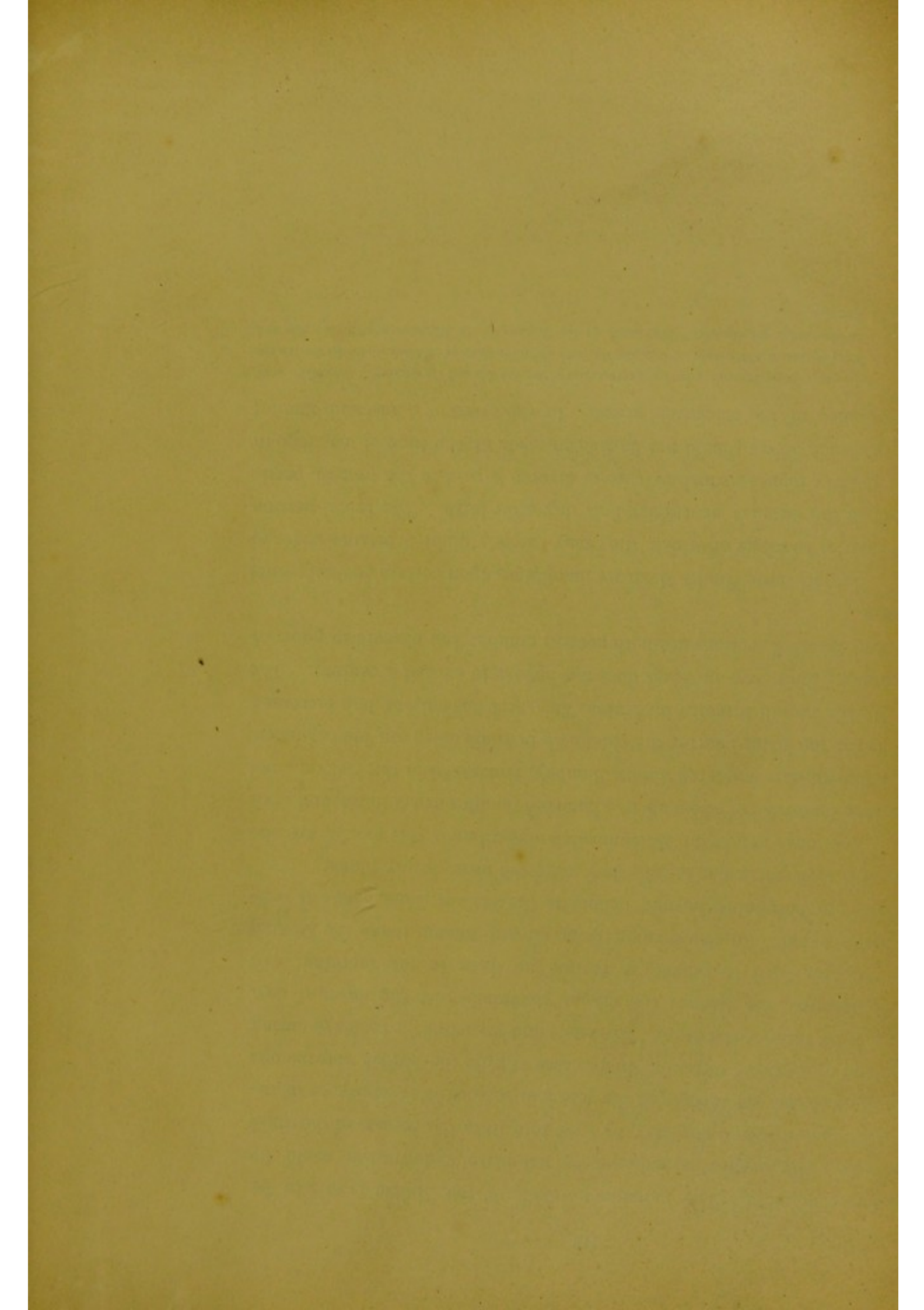
