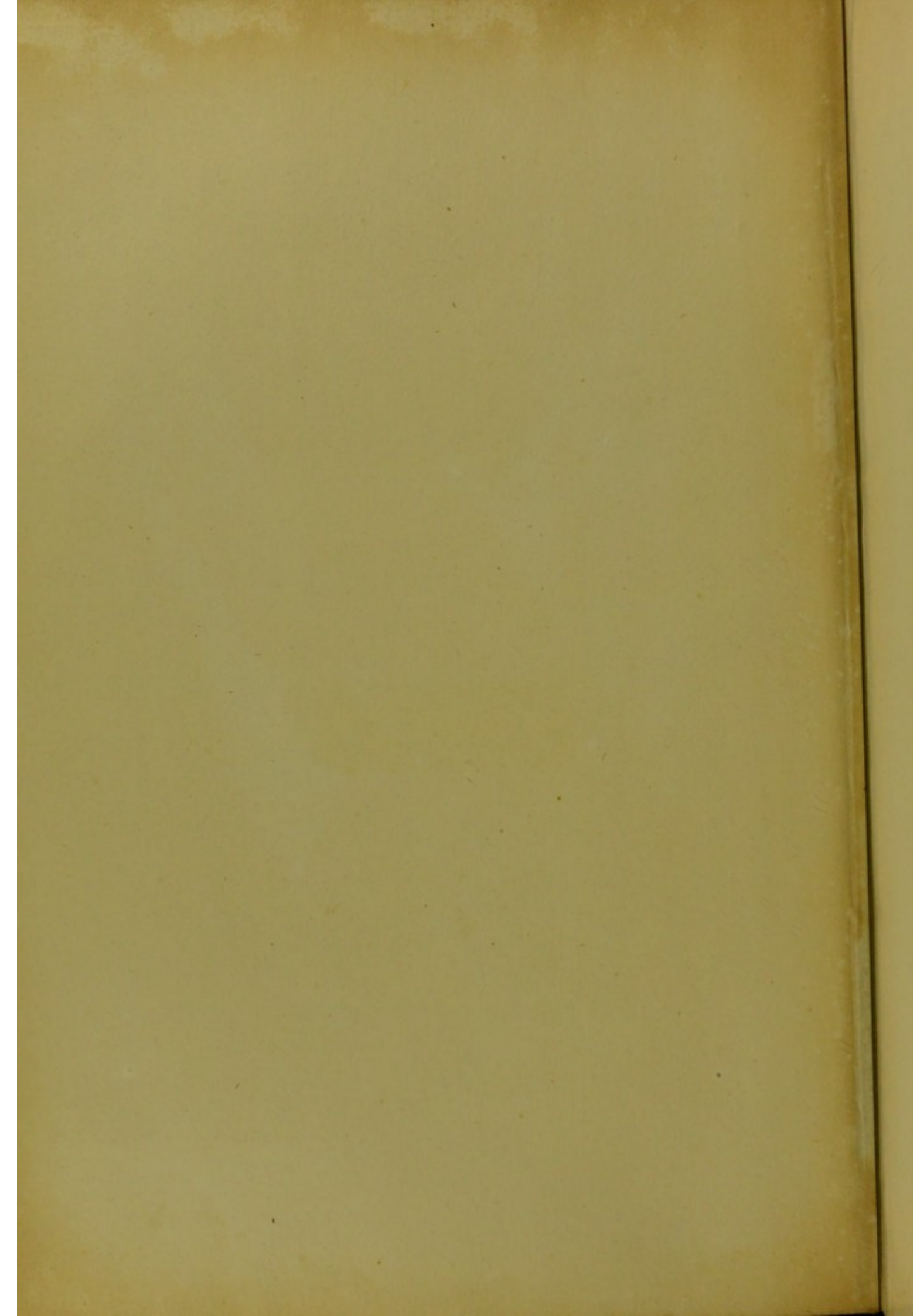

# TENTH

## MORTUARY REPORT.

---

FOR THE YEAR BEGINNING 1<sup>ST</sup> FEBRUARY 1857.

---

DURING the year which ended 31<sup>st</sup> January last, the registered deaths from all causes were 17,543, or, exclusive of Still-born, they were 17,210; of which 9,544 were males and 7,666 were females, being in the proportion of 124·5 of the former to 100 of the latter. The Still-born were 191 males and 142 females, or 333 in all.

2. Bombay was reported to have been the birth-place of 8,663, while 8,835 were said to have been born elsewhere, and of 45 the place of birth was unknown. The families of but 3,620 were stated to belong to this Island, those of 13,878 belonged to other places, and of 45 the families were unknown. There were buried 10,976; burnt 5,751; and exposed to Vultures 816.

3. The increased aid of the Medical Practitioners, which was given at the close of the year 1856 in response to the Government Circular, was continued for a few months, and the proportion of written Reports of Death is again one-seventh; had the effort been sustained, they would have been nearly a fifth of the whole.

4. The high mortality was participated in by all the various classes of disease, excepting those of Cholera, Small-pox, and diseases of the Respiratory Organs, in which the fatal casualties registered were below the average. The year's mortality was chiefly marked by a severe epidemic visitation of Measles. This disease was rapidly increasing in prevalence at the close of



the preceding year; it advanced to its maximum in March, and then declined, until September, when it became extinct, having, from the 1st February, carried off 1,609 persons, or altogether 1,772 from the outbreak of the Epidemic at the close of the preceding year. As is usual in Measles, its severity was greatest at the lower ages, and 86 per cent. of the deaths were in children below seven years of age, and 96 per cent. below the age of fourteen years.

5. The deaths from Cholera were 1,741, and from Small-pox 396, both numbers being much below the mean of former years. The total mortality from the three Epidemic classes was 3,751.

6. From the common or sporadic causes there were 13,459 deaths, of which 7,884 were attributed to Fever; 621 to diseases of the Brain and Nervous System; and 34 to those of the Heart and Vascular System. The number under diseases of the Respiratory Organs was 1,031, the lowest that has been registered—of course this does not include the cases in which Bronchitis or Pneumonia supervened on Measles; the deaths in all such were entered under the head of the primary disease. The deaths (2,078) from Ailments of the Bowels and other Alimentary Organs were above the mean number; still the reported deaths in Class IX were few. From diseases of the Sexual System and Child-bearing there were 139; and from Class XI there were 99. The great increase in the entries under Debility gives reason to suspect a want of diligence on the part of those who receive the Reports of Death at the funeral-places; the whole number in Class XII was last year 1,154, or 430 above the average. There were 29 deaths from Leprosy, 179 from Dropsy, 175 from Violence and Accident, and 19 from causes undetermined.

7. Ten years of the Registration are now completed, and much that is interesting and of importance to Medical and Statistical Science is recorded. Exclusive of Still-born, 147,950 deaths have been registered, and from the facilities afforded by insular position, and from the plan of registration followed, such is believed to be nearly the true mortality. A small deficiency in the Death Reports of young infants was detected, and was mentioned in former yearly Reports; but now the Police are empowered, by a recent Act of the Legislative Council, to put a stop to domiciliary interments.

8. The information recorded as to Sex, Caste and Race, Occupation,



and Locality of Residence, are believed to be accurate; that as to Age is only approximatively so.

9. The reports of "*Cause of Death*" are, in many points, unsatisfactory, as from time to time has been stated. The mortality from Cholera, Small-pox, and Measles is thought to be given with near approach to accuracy, and the entries in Class XV, that of Accident and Violence, are correct. Class IV doubtless contains much more than Idiopathic Fever, and the numbers are, consequently, too low in Classes V, VII, and VIII. It is probable that Tetanus and Convulsions are sometimes confounded together. In referring to the specific diseases in Class VII it must not be supposed that Bronchitis and Pneumonia are of rare occurrence, from the small numbers that are opposite these headings; many cases are most probably included under the general term *Respiratory Disease*. From the Mortuary Register it is seen that the climate of Bombay, with its mean temperature of 80° Fahr., and a mean daily range of 11½° Fahr., gives considerable immunity from Pulmonary Disease; but the impure air of the small, unventilated, and often crowded sleeping-places of the majority of the Native part of the population, must act prejudicially, and lessen, it is thought, the advantages that temperature would otherwise give. In Class VIII also the deaths specified as from Dysentery are not all that occurred from that disease; many cases that had become chronic were most probably returned under the designations Diarrhœa and Bowel Complaint. The smallness of the numbers met with in Classes VI and IX has several times, in former Reports, been alluded to, and reasonably attributed to inability, on the part of those reporting the deaths, to detect the diseases belonging to those classes. Class X is probably deficient, through dislike in some to state the true cause of death when it is of this class. Were the diagnosis more carefully made, there would be fewer deaths of children returned under the slovenly term *Debility*. It is probable that Class XIII does not contain so many as it ought, as the termination of Leprosy by Diarrhœa or Dysentery is likely to be the occasion of some deaths which belong to it having been referred to Class VIII.

10. Success has not yet attended the attempts that have been made to trace a connexion between meteorological movements and the variations in the amount of mortality here in different years. That atmospheric changes



do affect the health is obvious, and that sickness thus produced may terminate fatally, does not admit of reasonable doubt; but from the varying duration of many diseases thus produced, and their liability to modification and to complication by other than atmospheric influences, it is not easy, from ordinary Mortuary Registers, to determine truly the effects on mortality of variations in different years in the temperature, moisture, movement, or pressure of the air. A perfect knowledge of the effects of the vicissitudes of weather on the progress of diseases as they occur in this climate, would, doubtless, be a valuable addition to the Natural History of Disease, and although this can be best prosecuted by observing the diseases in their beginning and progress, the attempt to trace their connexion with the fatal issue from the information registered at the funeral-places may still be persevered in.

11. What is of more immediate local and practical importance is, to find out the localities in the Island where endemic and epidemic disease is most prevalent, that these places may be avoided, or that proper means may be used for their sanitary improvement. The minuteness with which these Mortuary Tables have been prepared has had reference to this; and when it is ascertained how many lives, at different ages, are at risk in each district, then at once can be answered the questions so often asked as to the insalubrity or otherwise of different localities. Information regarding the mortality in each Street, as well as District, is contained in the Registers, and, when called for, can be reduced to Tables. The boundaries of the Districts of the Island, as they have existed during the past ten years of this Registration, are given in an Appendix to this Report.

12. However desirous one may be to place the figures of the Mortuary Registration in juxtaposition with Population Returns, it is better yet to wait in expectation of a trustworthy Census, than to promulgate error, by basing calculations on either of the notoriously incorrect Censuses of 1849 and 1851. The hopelessness of deducing any sure approximation to the total number of the inhabitants from the number of Deaths is manifest, as a slight difference in the assumed rate of mortality produces a great discrepancy in the results; as for example, if the rate of mortality at different ages, and in different sexes, for the whole of England, be applied to the mean of the last five years' deaths here, it gives a population of 987,086; or, if thinking that rate too favourable to adopt, the mean rate in very unhealthy Liverpool



during the seven years, 1838 to 1844, be used, it gives here a population of only 670,290, the difference between the products being nearly 317,000.

13. During the ten years the annual mortality has been increasing, and in comparing the mean of the first five with that of the last five of those years, it is found that there is an excess in the latter of about 2,000, which belongs, not to the fluctuating Epidemic classes, but to the more permanent causes of death. This increase accords with many other circumstances, which indicate a rapid increase in the population.

14. The Tables of Occupations are made with reference to general statistics, rather than to show the effect of various trades and professions on health, which, in a former Report, was stated to be here almost impracticable. In those Tables the deaths are arranged according to the trade or occupation which was *the source of livelihood*, whether the deceased laboured personally in that occupation, or was maintained by a parent or other relative deriving the means of the maintenance from that occupation.

15. Taking the comparative number of deaths as indicative of the comparative number of lives at risk, we find progressive increase during the ten years in the various trades likely to be in demand in an increasing city: it is found in the Labourers, Masons, Workers in Wood and in Iron; in those furnishing the means of conveyance, as Bullock-drivers, those employed about Horses, and Porters; in the maritime population also, and those deriving their livelihood from the Book-trade and the Press,—perhaps it is in relation to this that the “*Writers and Accountants*” have not increased. The Grain-dealers and the Retailers of Tobacco, Opium, and Gunja have increased, but the number connected with the production and sale of Spirits has diminished. The Butchers have remained stationary, and the Bakers, Grain-parchers, and Confectioners have diminished; Beggars and Vagrants are among those who have increased in numbers.

16. After arranging the deaths that have been reported during the last two years, according to the languages spoken by those of the various Castes and Races to which the deceased belonged, it has been roughly estimated that in every 1,000 of the inhabitants, Murathee is spoken by 480; Guzerathee and its dialects by 244; Hindoostanee or Hindee by 205; Canarese, Telingee, &c. by 16; Arabic, Persian, Beloochee, &c. by 7; Portuguese and its *patois*, by 26; and English, or other European languages by 22.



17. If, to facilitate the examination of the results of the ten years' Mortuary Returns, the numbers be laid down in linear projection, it is seen that in the curve delineating the deaths from All Causes, there are two maxima: the first in January and the second and greater in April; while the minima are—the first in February, and the second, which is by far the lower, in October.

18. If, after eliminating the deaths belonging to the three Epidemic classes, the delineation of the remaining mortality be made, there are found to be three maxima, which fall respectively in January, May, and August; and three minima, which are in February, June, and September. These three waves are produced by great Fever mortality in May, towards the close of the hot season; from numerous deaths in August towards the close of the Rains, from Cachexiæ and diseases of the Alimentary Organs, which latter class, along with Fever, contributes to form the third and greatest wave in January, or towards the close of the season when miasmata are supposed to be most active, and when the diurnal ranges of temperature and humidity are greatest.

19. When the deaths from Small-pox (which amounted in ten years to 6,610) and those from Measles, 2,362, are severally projected in a linear form, it is seen that there is one maximum of mortality in April, and a minimum in October in the former, and one maximum in March and one minimum in September in the latter, and that the rise and fall of the curves are very regular; and it is seen, on laying down the yearly deaths, that the curves in them correspond with those of the decennium. This yearly regularity is best seen in Small-pox, of which the cases registered have been the more numerous. A linear table of the Small-pox deaths is appended to the end of this Report.

20. The periodicity observed here in these diseases is very remarkable, and its cause is worthy of being sought for. Similar periodicity in Small-pox and Measles mortality is not found in all countries; for on examining the Reports of the Registrar General of England, it is found that the 6,860 Small-pox deaths in London in the nine years—from 1846 to 1854—were distributed as follows:—in the quarter ending 31st March 1,619 deaths; in that ending 30th June 1,721 deaths; in that ending 30th September 1,651; and in the quarter ending 31st December 1,879; or, in the six months,



from 1st January to 30th June, there were 3,340 deaths, and in the other six months 3,520 deaths. The deaths from Measles in London during the same nine years were 10,126, and were distributed in the successive quarters of the year :—thus first 2,483 ; second, 3,772 ; third, 2,030 ; and fourth 2,841.

21. If, from different quarters of the world, there is any precise information on the subject on record, it does not appear to be at present accessible in Bombay. In the Parliamentary Returns on the Health of Troops on the West Coast of Africa in the Sierra Leone Command, there is mention made of two Epidemics of Small-pox, both of which were present in the Spring months; the Latitude was about  $8^{\circ}$  N.

22. It is worthy of inquiry whether the periodicity now mentioned always accompanies the disease in tropical climates, and whether there is any regular ratio in which the manifestation of periodicity diminishes on receding from the Equator; and also whether the law effects the time of prevalence of the disease in the Southern Hemisphere. No precise information on this latter point has been found; but from meagre incidental notices that have been met with in books of travels in South Africa and South America, it is probable that our seasons of increase and decrease are not there reversed.

23. The progress of the disease is not affected by temperature, for its advance is not impeded by the increasing cold of November, December, and January, nor by the rising temperature of the succeeding month. Nor is the periodicity dependent on the changes in the Sun's declination, as the disease advances while the southern declination is increasing, and does not cease to advance at the Solstice, but is still progressive while the southerly declination is again diminishing, and attains its maximum when the declination is near Zero.

24. In recent investigations connected with terrestrial magnetism, it has been observed that a marked influence attends the passage of the Earth through the points in its orbit, at which the plane containing the Sun's axis is perpendicular to the Ecliptic, and the times of that passage are about ten days before the Equinoxes: the poles of the sun lean more towards the Earth at those than at other epochs. It is to this annual period that the Small-pox mortality conforms itself, although the solar influence produces in it but



one maximum and one minimum; while, in the magnetic variations, it causes two of each, one of the minima coinciding in time with the maximum of Variola. The power retarding the prevalence of Small-pox (and of Measles also) is coincident in time with the Earth's approach to the Sun's pole in September. This retarding or adverse power is found to be greatest at the Autumnal Equinox, and, after regularly progressive diminution, to be least at the Vernal Equinox, when the Earth approaches the other pole of the Sun, from which time the retarding influence increases, until it has again, in September, reached its maximum. In the Mortuary Tables we have only the date of death, but the Registers from which these Tables are compiled, give also the duration of the fatal attack in each case; and the mean duration during a short period has been elaborated and found to be ten-and-a-half days, which, added to the days that may be allowed for the incubation of the disease, would bring the maximum of attacks to very near coincidence with the Sun's periods.

25. It is likely that the periodicity of Fever, both in its seasonal prevalence and in its diurnal phenomena, may yet be found to be due to influences connected, or concomitant, with the magnetic changes in the Earth and the atmosphere; and it is probable, also, that the periodicity in Croup, which has its time of accession and its critical hours, synchronous with the waves of the barometric tide, may find in the magnetic changes of the atmosphere, a predisposing cause more satisfactory than the mere variations in the pressure of the air. These latter points, however, require clinical observation for their elucidation.

26. In the Cholera mortality there are no regular annual times of maxima and minima; and in looking at the Returns of the successive years, the outbreaks or exasperations of the disease, as indicated by the deaths, are seen to have taken place at apparently irregular periods. If, however, the aggregate of the deaths in the ten years be taken, there are found to be two maxima and two minima, and these nearly coincide with the maxima and minima of the Fever mortality, and one of the maxima and one of the minima agree nearly with those of Small-pox and Measles.

27. In several of the epidemic visitations of Cholera, a very minute examination of the daily Meteorological Observations was made with reference to the progress of the mortality from the disease, but no causal connection between them was detected. The influence of locality of residence on the mortality from this disease has often been pointed out in former Reports.

28. The deaths from diseases of the Brain and Nervous System during the ten years amounted to 5,659, and there was not any well-marked regularity in either their annual or monthly fluctuations. The mortality, 14,053, from diseases of the organs of Respiration, was distributed with much equality through the different months, although the sum, in various years, varied considerably; the proportion to the total mortality was 9·5. The fatal casualties from diseases of the Alimentary Organs were 19,579, or about 1,958 a year, or 13·2 of the total deaths, the maxima falling, as before stated, in January and August. The numbers recorded during the ten years in Classes VI, IX, and X, were 169, 153, and 1,114; and, as was before mentioned, these are below the reality. The number from diseases of the integuments, muscles, bones, and joints, was about 61 a year, or 609 in all; and of these 159, or nearly 25 per cent., were from Guinea-worm. If



those in Class V, under Traumatic Tetanus which originated from this parasite of the integuments, be added, there appear 194 deaths from this cause. From diseases of the General System, such as Scurvy, Beriberi, Rheumatism, Cancer, Syphilis, &c., and the doubtful cases included under the term *Debility*, there were 7,244 reported deaths. The yearly mean would, of course, be 724, but the entries during the last two years of the decennium greatly exceed the average. From Leprosy there were 425, from Dropsy 1,772, and from Other and Unknown Causes 237, in the ten years. This last number is made up chiefly of cases of infants and strangers found dead, those reported by the Coroner "Natural Death," "Sudden Death," and a few in which the persons furnishing the report had omitted to state the disease that preceded death, and had in its place written "*Old Age*," or the more learned, but equally uninformative term "*Senectus*," which was superfluous, as the age was at the same time particularly given, as usual, in another line of the same Report.

29. In Class XV, that of Violent Deaths, there were 1,488, or about 149 a year. Of these some were from causes peculiar to this country, such as the 29 instances of Snake-bite, and the 46 deaths from falls from Palmtrees—these latter occurring among men whose occupation it is to tap the trees. There were 17 deaths reported as having resulted from Mercurial Ptyalism, probably through the abuse of mercury by Native Medical Practitioners.

30. There were 77 reported to have died from having been run over, or injured in the streets, by carriages and carts. There were 606 drowned, of which number 180 were so in the sea, and of these 47 lost their lives in the Harbour during the hurricane of 1st and 2nd November 1854. In tanks, wells, and pools there were 426 drowned, many of them by suicide. The Suicides recorded in the ten years were as follows:—

31. From this table it appears, as was stated in the Report for 1852, that Suicides are increased by the facilities afforded by ill-fenced or ill-guarded tanks and open wells, as it is in the months when the water in these is most abundant that Suicides are most numerous.

32. The violent deaths reported as Homicidal were 71, and were inflicted by the following means :—

33. In reviewing the ten years' deaths in reference to the Races and Castes of the deceased, there is seen no reason for supposing that any have absolute exemption from any of the forms of disease. The liability, however, to certain diseases seems to differ in different classes of the people. The Tables of Caste and Race were, from the beginning of the Registration, arranged with a view to obtain information on this point; and although after the first three years' alterations were made in these Tables, the distinction between those allowed by their religion to eat flesh and those forbidden



to do so, has been strictly observed from the first. Those who religiously abstain from eating the flesh of animals are the Jains, Brahmuns, Lingaets, and Bhatias; the deaths among these *Asarcophagous* tribes were, exclusive of Still-born, 12,532, or  $8\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. of the whole. There is no religious obligation on the other Castes or Races of the people to abstain from animal food, and they are all classed together as *Sarcophagous*; but, although their religion does not enforce it, many of the Hindoos of other castes are, from the constraint of poverty, strangers to the use of animal food, and, like those of the *Asarcophagous* class, make use of various pulses in their diet, to supply the demand of the body for nitrogenous aliment. For this reason the distinction between the two classes is less strict than could be wished, and, perhaps, the contrast between the two is less marked than it would otherwise have been.

34. Among the *Asarcophagous*, the deaths from Cholera were 7·1 per cent. of the whole, from Small-pox 3·1 per cent., and from Measles 0·7 per cent. While among the *Sarcophagous*, 135,427 in all, the percentage from Cholera was 16·0, from Small-pox 4·6, and from Measles 1·7. It has to be borne in mind, while making this comparison, that as Small-pox and Measles are diseases that chiefly affect children, the difference may possibly be owing, in some measure, to a difference in the proportion of children in the different tribes residing in Bombay with their parents, for many adults sojourn here while their families remain at their distant homes.

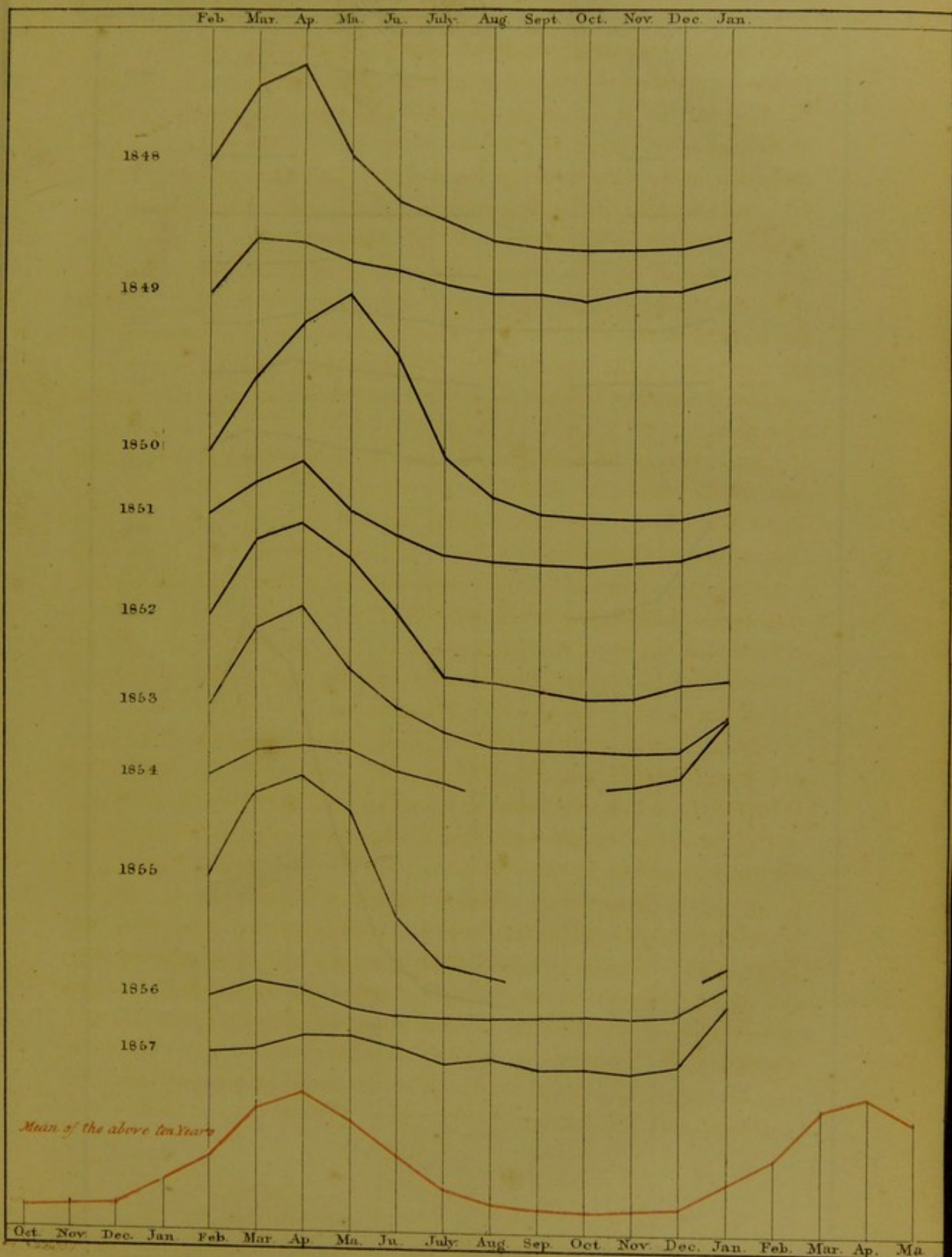
35. If the deaths from Cholera, Small-pox, and Measles be put aside, and those from All Other Causes be examined, we find among the 11,162 Pulse-eaters 63·1 from Fever; while among the 105,280 Flesh-eaters, the proportion is but 54·1 per cent.; from diseases of the Nervous System in the *Asarcophagous* 4·1, in the *Sarcophagous* 5·0. The *Asarcophagous* class seems more subject, than the other, to Pulmonary diseases, the deaths in the former being 13·3, and in the latter 11·9; while, on the other hand, the *Sarcophagous* had 17·5 per cent. from diseases of the Alimentary System, and those who do not eat flesh only 10·4. The deaths from Cachexy and Debility were 4·8 among the *Asarcophagous*, and 6·4 among the *Sarcophagous*.

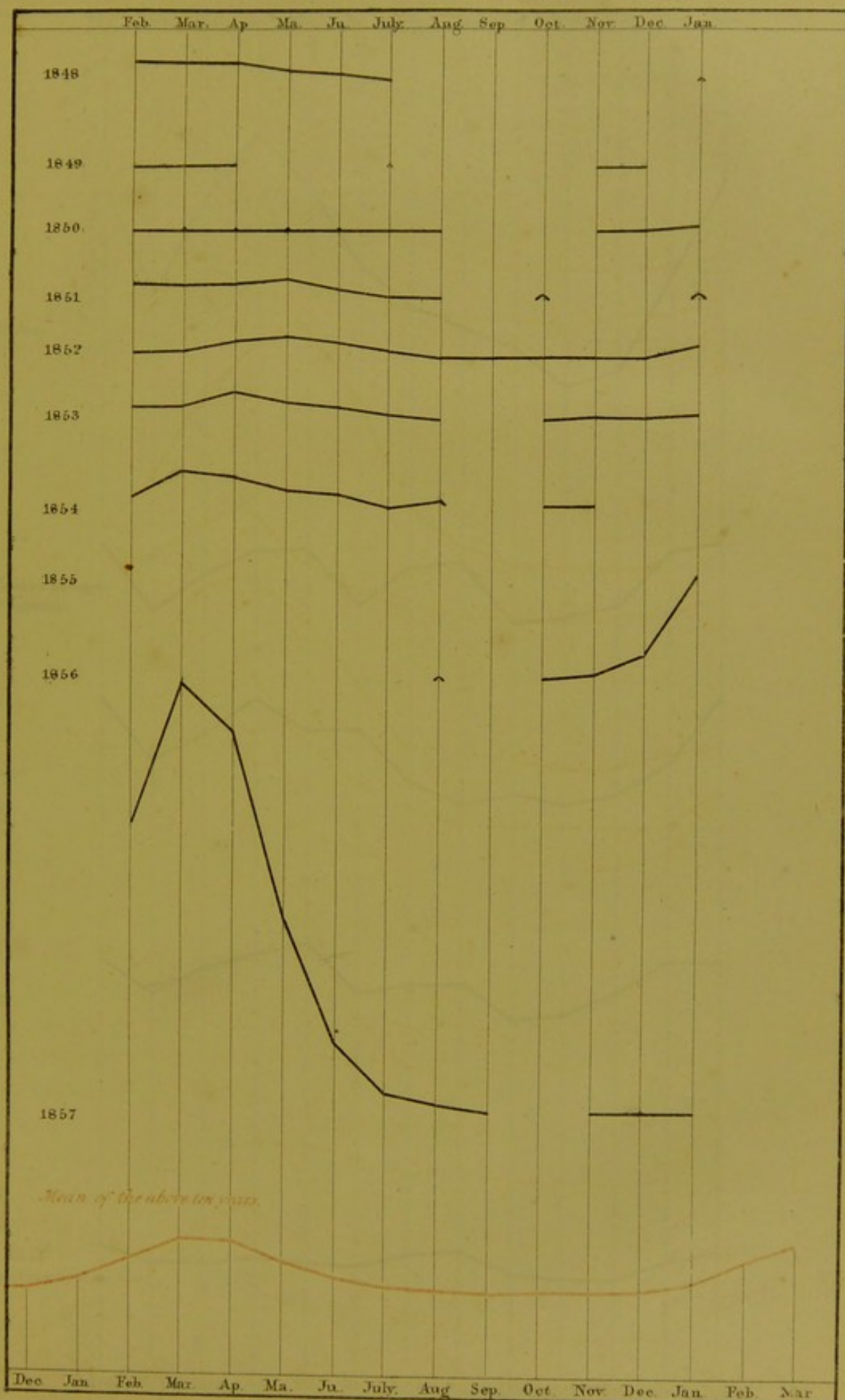

LINEAR TABLE OF MORTALITY IN TEN YEARS

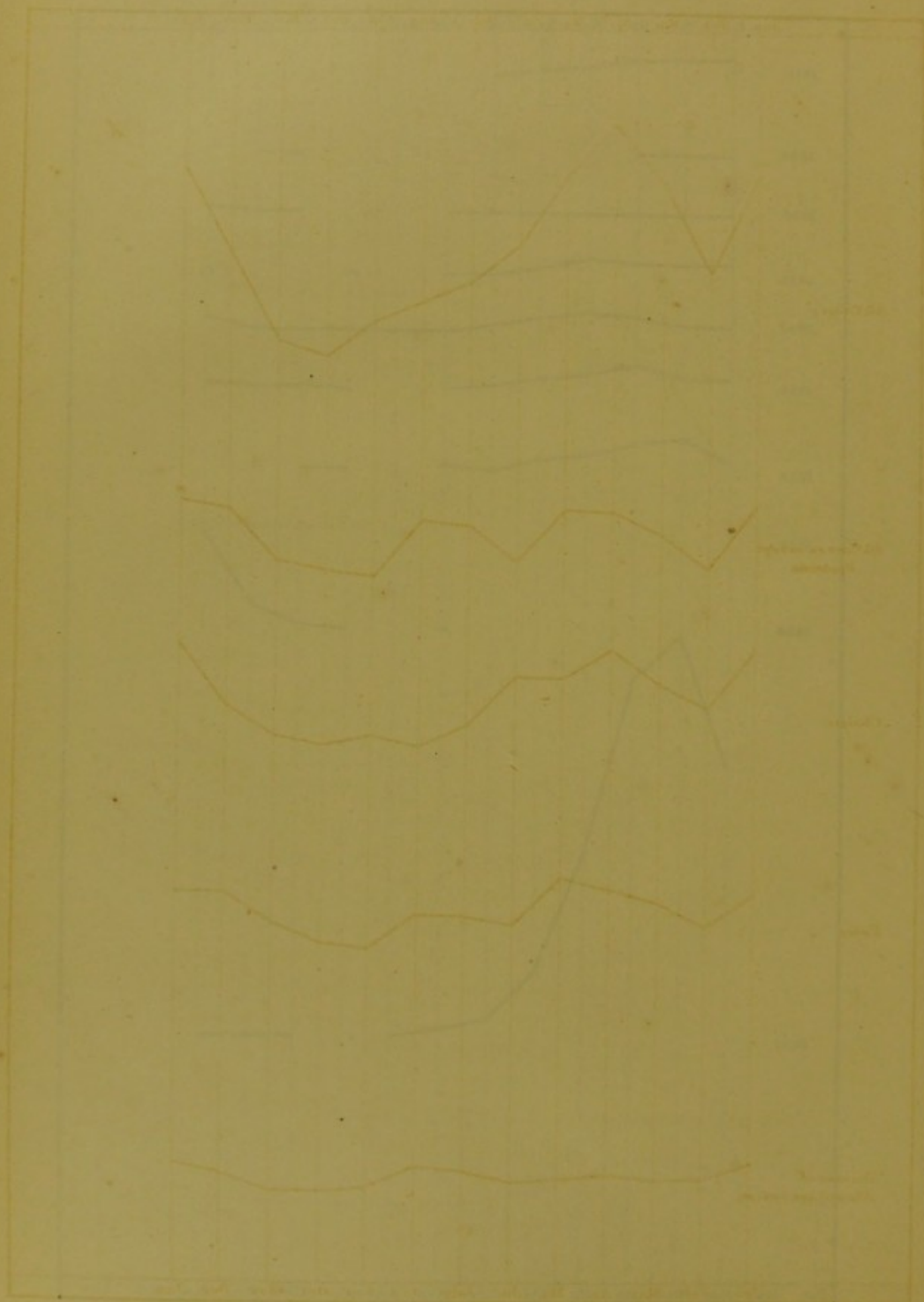
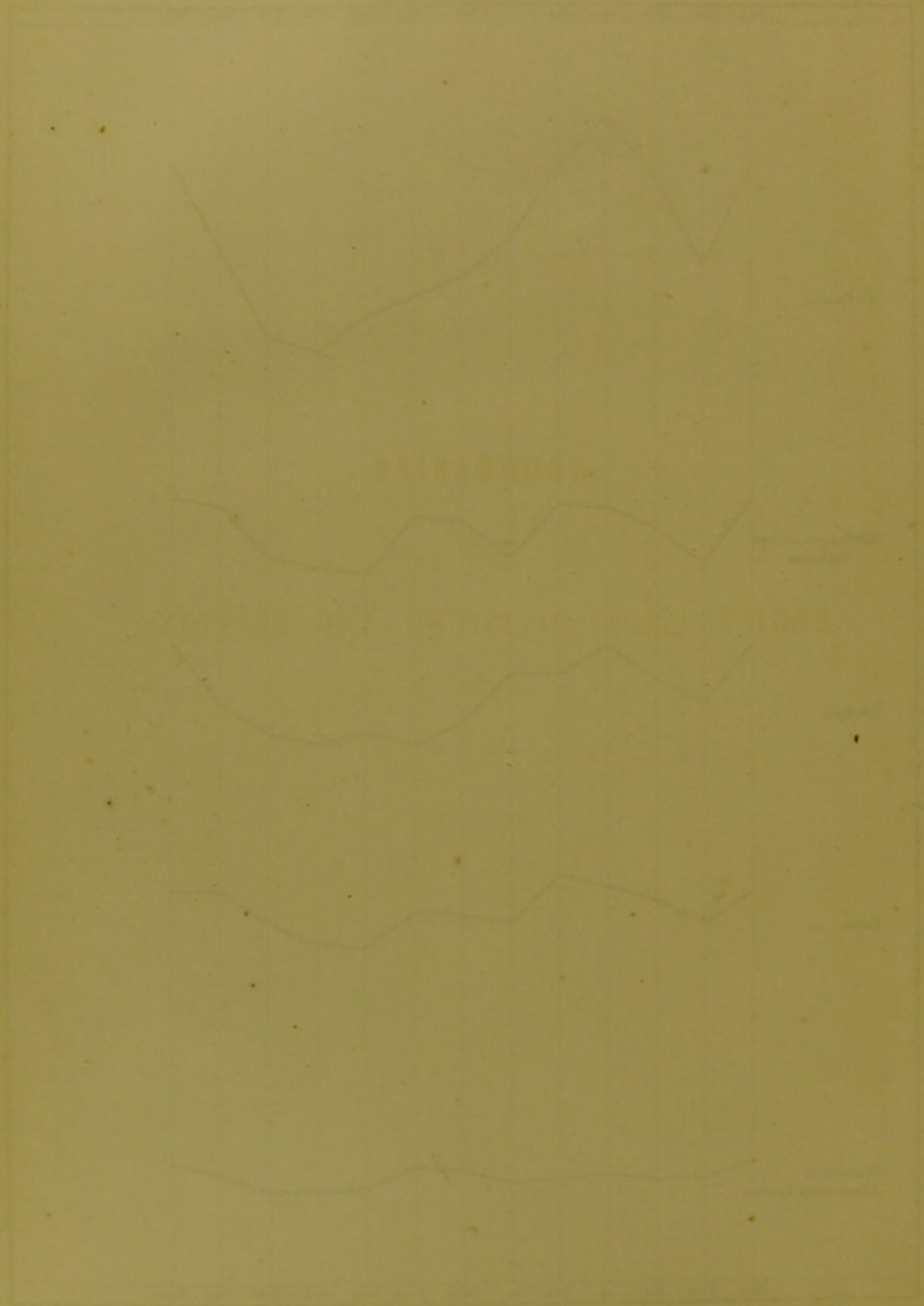






TABLE OF MEAN MONTHLY TEMPERATURES

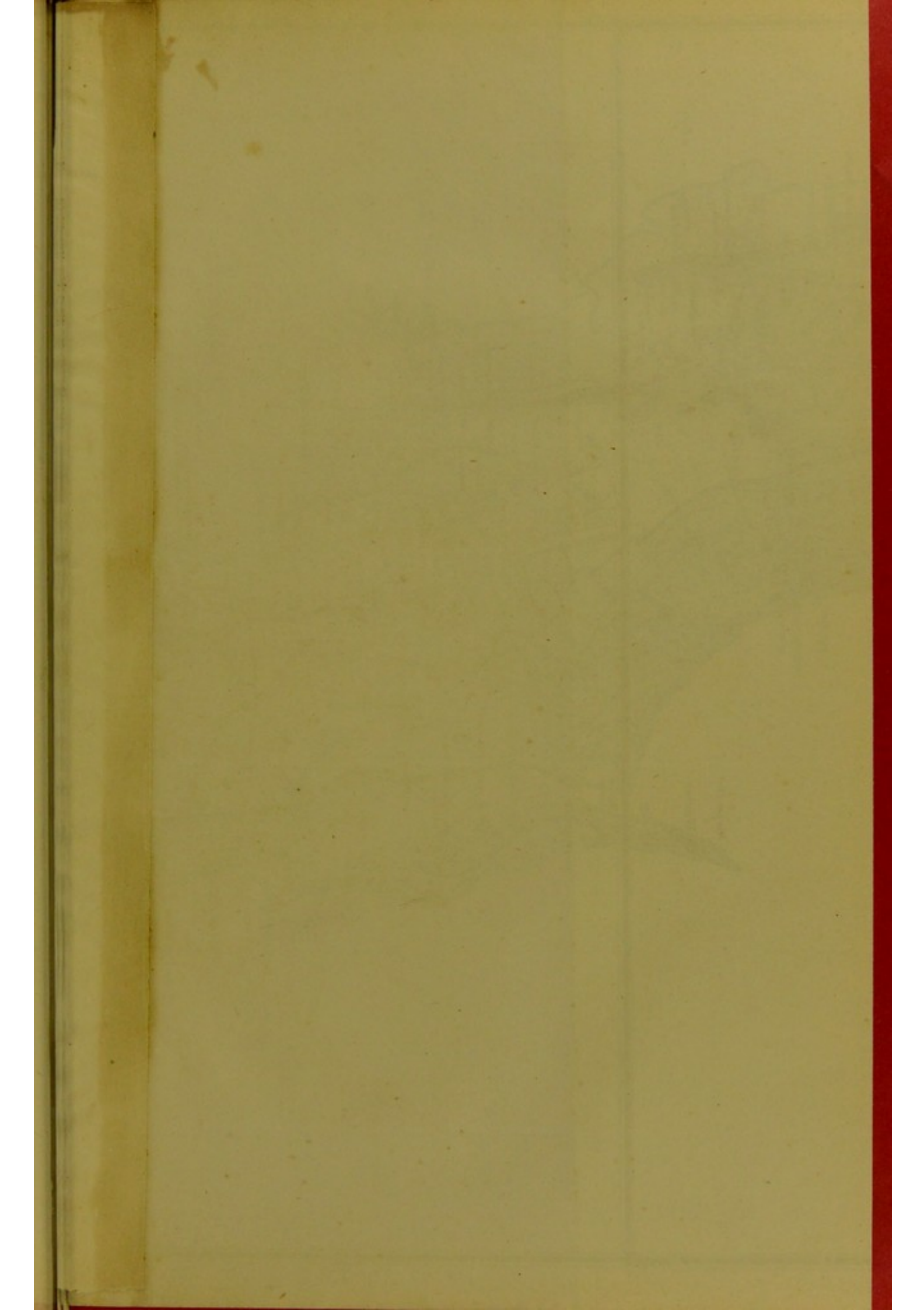

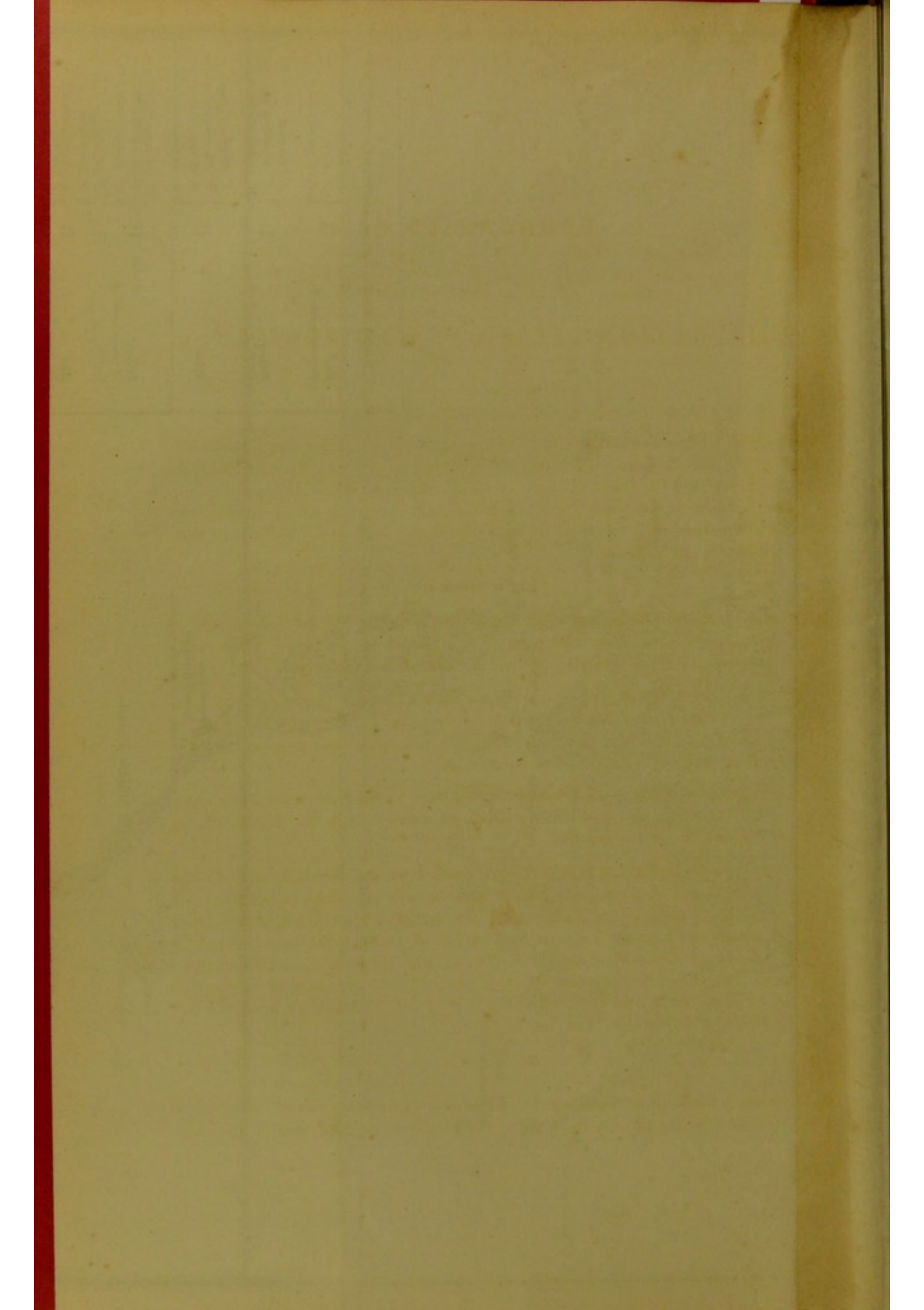














## BOUNDARIES

OF THE

## REGISTRATION DIVISIONS AND SECTIONS.

The united Islands of Bombay and Colaba are parted, for Police and Registration purposes, into six *Divisions*, which are distinguished severally by the six first letters of the Alphabet; and the Harbour forms a seventh, called the *Water Division*.

The six lettered Divisions into which the land is divided, are subdivided into *Sections*, or Districts, each of which is both named and numbered. There is no subdivision of the *Water Division*.

**A** DIVISION includes Colaba and that part of the Island of Bombay lying South of *Esplanade Cross-Road* and *First Marine Lane*; the former of which roads separates it from Division **B**; and the latter separates it from Division **C**.

SECTION 1st.—**COLABA**—formerly an Island, is still surrounded by sea, excepting on the North, where it is bounded by the *Colaba Vallade* or Causeway, and land recovered from the Sea, which separate it from the *Esplanade*, or Section 2nd of Division **A**.

SECTION 2nd.—**FORT**—is bounded on the East by the Harbour, and elsewhere by the Ramparts and Ditch, which separate it from the *Esplanade*, or Section 2nd of Division **A**.

SECTION 3rd.—**ESPLANADE**—is bounded on the South by the *Colaba Vallade* and recovered land, which separate it from *Colaba*, or Section 1st of Division **A**; on the East by the Harbour and Fort Ditch, which latter separates it from the *Fort*, or Section 2nd of Division **A**; on the North by *Esplanade Cross-Road* and *First Marine Lane*, the former of which separates it from *Market*, or Section 1st of Division **B**, and *Mandwee*, or Section 2nd of Division **B**; the latter separates it from *Dhobee-tulao*, or Section 1st of Division **C**; on the West by the Sea of Backbay.

**B** DIVISION is bounded on the South by *Esplanade Cross-Road*, which separates it from Division **A**; on the East by the Harbour; on the North by *Walpaka-*



*pee Road*, and *Baboola Tank Road*, which roads separate it from Division **E**; on the West by *Kalbadevee Road*, *Mombadevee Road*, and *Bindee Bazar Street*, which separate it from Division **C**.

SECTION 1st.—**MARKET**—is of triangular shape, with the apex to North. It is bounded on the South by part of *Esplanade Cross-Road*, which separates it from *Esplanade*, Section 3rd of Division **A**; on the East and North-East by *Sheik Ibrahim Soobedar Street* (Rungaree Mowla), *Syud Abdool Ruhman Street*, part of *Musjeed Bundur Street*, and *Mombadevee Street*, which separate it from *Mandwee*, Section 2nd of Division **B**; on the West and North-West by *Kalbadevee Road* and *Mombadevee Road*, which separate it from *Dhobee-tulao*, Section 1st of Division **C**.

SECTION 2nd.—**MANDWEE**—is bounded on the South by part of *Esplanade Cross-Road*, which separates it from *Esplanade*, Section 3rd of Division **A**; on the East by the Harbour; on the North by *Mombadevee Road*, also by *Cross-Road* and *Cobard Bowla Street*, the first of which separates it from *Bhooleshwur*, Section 2nd of Division **C**, and the other two separate it from *Oomburkharee*, Section 3rd of Division **B**; on the West by *Sheik Ibrahim Soobedar Street* (Rungaree Mowla), *Syud Abdool Ruhman Street*, portion of *Musjeed Bundur Street*, and *Mombadevee Street*, all which separate it from *Market*, or Section 1st of Division **B**.

SECTION 3rd.—**OOMBURKHAREE**—is bounded on the South by *Cross-Road* and *Cobard Bowla Street*, which separate it from *Mandwee*, Section 2nd of Division **B**; on the East by the Harbour; on the North by *Walpakadee Road* and *Baboola Tank Road*, both which separate it from *Tarwaree*, Section 2nd of Division **E**; on the West by *Bindee Bazar Road*, which separates it from *Bhooleshwur*, Section 2nd of Division **C**, and *Khara-tulao*, Section 3rd of Division **C**.

**C** DIVISION is bounded on the South by *First Marine Lane*, which separates it from Division **A**; on the East by *Kalbadevee Road*, *Mombadevee* and *Bindee Bazar Roads*, all which roads separate it from Division **B**; on the North by *Obelisk Road* and *Grant Road*, which separate it from Division **E**; on the West by the Sea at Backbay, also by *Churnee Road*, *Girgaon Portuguese Church Lane*, part of *Girgaon Back Road*, and *Gaumdevee Road*, which roads separate it from Division **D**.

SECTION 1st.—**DHOBEE-TULAO**—is bounded on the South by *First Marine Lane*, which separates it from *Esplanade*, Section 3rd of Division **A**; on the East by *Kalbadevee Road*, which separates it from *Market*, Section 1st of Division **B**; on the North by *Agiaree Lane*, *Portuguese Church Lane*, and *Thakoorwaree Lane*, the first of which separates it from *Bhooleshwur*, Section 2nd of Division **C**, the last separates it from *Girgaon*, Section 4th of Division **C**; on the West by the Sea at Backbay.



SECTION 2nd.—**BHOOLESHWUR**—is bounded on the South by *Agiaree Lane*, which separates it from *Dhobee-tulao*, Section 1st of Division **C**; on the East by *Kalbadevee Street*, *Mombadevee Row*, part of *Bindee Bazar Road*: the first two separate it from *Mandwee*, Section 2nd of Division **B**, the last separates it from *Oomburkharee*, Section 3rd of Division **B**; on the North by *Erskine Road*, *Cowasjee Patell Tank Road*, which separate it from *Khara-tulao*, Section 3rd of Division **C**; on the West by *Portuguese Church Street*, which separates it from *Girgaon*, Section 4th of Division **C**.

SECTION 3rd.—**KHARA-TULAO**—is bounded on the South by *Erskine Road*, *Cowasjee Patell Tank*, and part of *Girgaon Back Road*, which separate it, the former, from *Bhooleshwur*, Section 2nd of Division **C**, the last from *Girgaon*, Section 4th of Division **C**; on the East by part of *Bindee Bazar Road*, which separates it from *Oomburkharee*, Section 3rd of Division **B**; on the North by *Obelisk Road* and part of *Grant Road*, which separate it from *Kamateepoora*, Section 3rd of Division **E**; on the West by *Trimbuk Purshotum Street*, which separates it from *Girgaon*, Section 4th of Division **C**.

SECTION 4th.—**GIRGAON**—is bounded on the South by *Thakoor-waree Lane*, which separates it from *Dhobee-tulao*, Section 1st of Division **C**; on the East by *Ardesir Dady Street* and *Trimbuk Purshotum Street*, the former of which separates it from *Bhooleshwur*, Section 2nd of Division **C**, the latter separates it from *Khara-tulao*, Section 3rd of Division **C**; on the North by part of *Grant Road*, which separates it from *Kamateepoora*, Section 3rd of Division **E**; on the West and South West by *Backbay*, *Churnee Road*, *Girgaon Portuguese Church Lane*, *Girgaon Back Road*, and *Gaumdevee Road*, which roads separate it from *Chaoputee*, Section 1st of Division **D**.

---

**D** DIVISION includes all between *Malabar Point* and the middle of *Hornby Vallade*, it has the sea on its South, West and North, and is bounded on the East first by *Churnee Road*, *Girgaon Portuguese Church Lane*, and *Girgaon Back Road*, which separate it from Division **C**; and then by a line along *Tardeo Road*, as far as *Bellasis Road*, and from thence Northward by the Main Drain, which line separates it from Division **E**.

SECTION 1st.—**CHAOPUTEE**—is bounded on the South by Sea of Backbay; on the East by *Churnee Road*, and *Girgaon Portuguese Church Lane*, which separate it from *Girgaon*, Section 4th of Division **C**; on the North by part of *Girgaon Back Road*, which separates it from *Girgaon*, Section 4th of Division **C**; on the West by *Gaumdevee Road*, which separates it from *Walkeshwur*, Section 2nd of Division **D**.

SECTION 2nd.—**WALKESHWUR**—is bounded on the South by the Sea; on the East by Sea and *Gaumdevee Road*, which latter separates it from *Chaoputee*, Section 1st of Division **D**; on the North by *Gaola-tulao Road*, which separates it from *Mahaluxmee*, Section 3rd of Division **D**; on the West by Sea.



SECTION 3rd.—**MAHALUXMEE**—is bounded on the South by *Gaola Tank Road*, which separates it from *Walkeshwur*, Section 2nd of Division **D**; on the East by *Tardeo Road* Northward, as far as *Bellasis Road*, and thence further Northward by the Main Drain, which separate it from *Kamateepoora*, Section 3rd of Division **E**; on the North by Sea and the boundary line of division running Northward from middle of *Hornby Vallade*, which separate it from *Wurlee*, Section 3rd of Division **F**; on the West by Sea.

---

**E** DIVISION is bounded on the South by *Walpakadee Lane*, *Baboola Tank Road*, and by *Obelisk* and *Grant Roads*. SECTION 2nd.—**TARWAREE**—is bounded on the South by *Baboola Tank Road*, which separates it from *Oomburkharee*, Section 3rd of Division **B**; on the East by *Mount Lane*, which separates it from *Mazagaon*, Section 1st of Division **E**; on the North by *Mount Road*, which separates it from *Parell*, Section 4th of Division **E**; on the West by part of *Parell Road*, which separates it from *Kamateepoora*, Section 3rd of Division **E**.

SECTION 3rd.—**KAMATEEPOORA**—is bounded on the South by *Grant* and *Obelisk Roads*, the former separating from it *Girgaon*, Section 4th of Division **C**, the latter separating it from *Khara-tulao*, Section 3rd of Division **C**; on the East by the *Parell Road*, which separates it from *Tarwaree*, Section 2nd of Division **E**; on the North by line drawn from West end of *Mount Road*, which line separates it from *Parell*, Section 4th of Division **F**; on the West by South part of *Tardeo Road*, and North part of Main Drain, which separate it from *Mahaluxmee*, Section 3rd of Division **D**.

SECTION 4th.—**PARELL**—is bounded on the South by *Mount Road*, and a line from thence drawn Westward, which road separates it from *Tarwaree*, Section 2nd of Division **E**, and which line separates it from *Kamateepoora*, Section 3rd of Division **E**; on the East by *Gorupdevee Road* and *Parell Tank*, which separate it from *Seoree*, Section 5th of Division **F**; on the North by line from *Bhoeewaree*, North of *Parell Tank*, to *Parell Road*, which line separates it



from *Seo*, Section 1st of Division **F**; on the West by North part of Main Drain and line drawn from middle of *Hornby Vallade* to *Parell*, the part of the Drain separating it from *Mahaluxmee*, Section 3rd of Division **D**, and the line mentioned, separating it from *Wurlee*, Section 3rd of Division **F**.

SECTION 5th.—**SEOREE**—is bounded on the South by a line along North boundary of *Powder Works* to *The Mount*, which line separates it from *Mazagaon*, Section 1st of Division **F**; on the East by the Harbour; on the North by line from *Bhoeewaree* to north of *Seoree Fort*, which line separates it from *Seo*, Section 1st of Division **F**; on the West by *Gorupdevee Road* and road leading on to *Parell Tank*, which separate it from *Parell*, Section 4th of Division **E**.

---

**F DIVISION** includes all that part of the Island north of a line drawn from the middle of *Hornby Vallade* by *Parell*, *Bhoeewaree*, north of *Seoree Fort* to the Harbour, which line separates it from the **D** and **E** Divisions.

SECTION 1st.—**SEO**—is bounded on the South by a line drawn from *Bhoeewaree Road* to the Harbour, which line separates it from *Seoree*, Section 5th of Division **F**; on the East by the Sea; on the North by Sea and Causeway, which separate it from Island of Salsette; on the West by *Parell Road*, and a line northward, along the Drain to *Dharavee*, which separate it from *Mahim*, Section 2nd of Division **F**.

SECTION 2nd.—**MAHIM**—is bounded on the South by a line from *Parell* to *Wurlee Sluice*, which line separates it from *Wurlee*, Section 3rd of Division **F**; on the East by *Parell Road* and Drain running northward to *Dharavee*, which separate it from *Seo*, Section 1st of Division **F**; on the North by Sea, which separates it from *Salsette*; on the West by the Sea.

SECTION 3rd.—**WURLEE**—is bounded on the South and East by a line from middle of *Hornby Vallade*, which line separates it from *Mahaluxmee*, Section 3rd of Division **D**, and from *Parell*, Section 4th of Division **F**; on the North by a line from *Parell* to *Wurlee Sluice*, which line separates it from *Mahim*, Section 2nd of Division **F**; on the West by the Sea.

**WATER DIVISION** includes all the Shipping in the Harbour.

*Bombay, 9th July 1858.*

SIR,

In forwarding, for submission to the Right Honorable the Governor in Council, Dr. Leith's Annual Mortuary Returns and Report for 1857, dated 5th instant, I have the honour, by desire of the Director General Medical Department, to request that, as heretofore, permission to have printed the usual number of copies, and in the usual manner, may be granted.



2. On the present occasion Dr. Leith has enhanced the value of his Annual Report by reviewing some points of interest and importance, which the completion of ten years' Registration has enabled him to summarise.

3. It is unnecessary for the Director General to allude to the several important topics discussed, as they cannot but arrest the attention of the reader. The approximate estimates of the population of the Island of Bombay, based upon a knowledge of the yearly mortality, is interesting, and the increase of the population during the last ten years is shown by the annual increasing rate of mortality.

4. The 11th para., regarding the healthiness or otherwise of the several localities in the Island, is full of interest, and the usefulness and practical bearing of the Tables clearly developed.

5. The remaining portions of the Report, from the 15th para. onwards, relate to matters of great importance to Medical Science and to the welfare of the community. The researches of Dr. Leith concerning the periodicity of Disease, and its accession and decline at the Vernal and Autumnal Equinoxes, are matters of great interest, and will be highly valued by the medical profession; whilst the connection between Meteorology and Disease has been elucidated by the Mortuary Statistics in a novel and striking manner.

6. It is gratifying to find that, from the experience of the past ten years, there is every reason to believe the Registrations of the number of deaths are correct, and that the true mortality of the Island is ascertained, also, that on some points, as Sex, Caste, Race, Occupation, &c. the Returns may be depended on; whilst, however, others, as "Age" and "Cause of Death," are but at the present day bare approximations.

7. The remark made in the 31st para., regarding the unprotected tanks and wells as temptation to suicide, will, doubtless, meet with attention from the Authorities.

8. With respect to the year 1857, it will be seen that Bombay suffered severely from Measles in an epidemic form, but that the mortality from Cholera, Small-pox, &c. was below the average.

9. It must be a matter of regret that greater assistance to the correct Registration of Death is not spontaneously furnished by the Resident Medical Practitioners of Bombay, and that Dr. Leith should have again so early to complain, as he does in the 3rd para., of want of cordial co-operation, so



much so, indeed, that the written reports have fallen again this year to about one-seventh of the whole.

10. It may be, perhaps, considered by the Right Honorable the Governor in Council a fitting opportunity to republish the Government Notification on the subject, of 10th September 1856, after an interval of nearly two years.

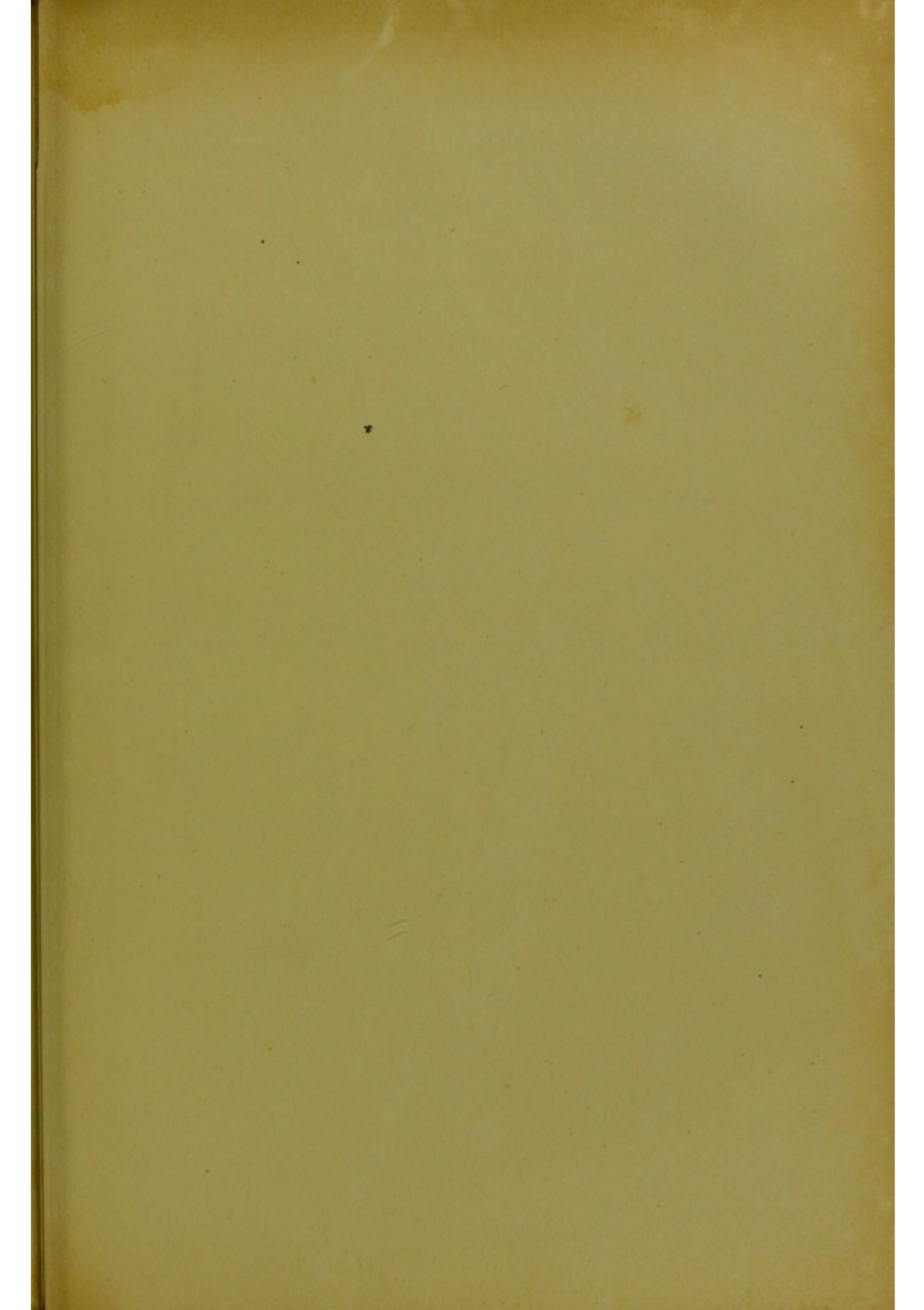
