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
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

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
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PREFACE TO THE FIRST EDITION,

For perfecting the statistical registration of diseases, with a view to the discovery of statistical truths concerning their history, nature, and phenomena, the want of a generally recognised Nomenclature of Diseases has long been felt as an indispensable condition.

The advantages accruing from accurate statistics of disease are likely to be the greater and the surer in proportion as the field of investigation is the wider.

The statistics of a single town may be instructive; but more instruction will be obtained from the compared statistics of various and many towns. This is alike true of different districts of the same country, and of different countries and climates: and the most instructive sanitary statistics would be those which related to the whole of the inhabited portions of the globe.

For the registration of such statistical facts it is clearly requisite that there should be a uniform Nomenclature of Diseases, co-extensive with the area of investigation; and taking the largest area, the universal globe, the Nomenclature would need to be one that can be understood and used by the educated people of all nations.

Among the great ends of such a uniform Nomenclature must be reckoned that of fixing definitely, for all places, the things about which medical observation is exercised, and of forming a steady basis upon which medical experience may be safely built. Another main use of the statistical registration of diseases on a wide scale, is that it must tend to throw light upon the causes of disease, many of which causes, when duly recognised, may be capable of prevention, removal, or diminution.

When a general and uniform Nomenclature of Disease has once been carefully framed, when we are sure that medical observation is occupying itself everywhere with the selfsame diseases, the value of statistical tables becomes very high, as representing the course of events in disease under various circumstances of time, place, season, climate, manners and customs, age, sex, race, and treatment.

This general, or common, or standard nomenclature need not be imposed upon every nation and people as its proper nomenclature. It could not. It would be unintelligible by the people at large, and embarrassing to those by whom the necessary returns must be made. But the nomenclature proper or peculiar to each country, and which may be called its national nomenclature, should be readily convertible into the standard nomenclature.

The one, or the other, of these standard and national nomenclatures may first be framed by an English (or by any other) Committee, or the two may be framed simultaneously.

The Committee appointed by the Royal College of Physicians of London have prepared a Nomenclature suitable to England, and to all countries where the English language is in common use. For each name they have supplied the corresponding Latin term, which is the language of ancient science, and probably the fittest language for a nomenciature common to all the world; and also the equivalent term in the three modern languages which are the richest in medical learning and literature, the French, the German, and the Italian languages: and in this way they hope to have laid the foundation for a Nomenclature of Diseases in any language extant on the earth.

In the English list of names, it seemed desirable that as little deviation as possible should be made from those employed by the Registrar-General of England; otherwise his settled plans and his forms of returns, which have been followed for thirty years, would require to be remodelled; the comparison of future with past returns would be made difficult and perplexing, if not impossible; and a damaging break would be caused in evidence which becomes more and more trustworthy and valuable, in proportion as it is prolonged and continuous.

Again, it is desirable that all lists should consist, as much as may be possible, of short names—names comprised in one word, or in the fewest words; also, in the nomenclature proper, or national, that they should be names in common and popular use, especially when these are single, or short, and distinctive, and imply no erroneous or doubtful theories.

Names are not necessarily to be excluded, however, merely because they may seem to express only vague or imperfect knowledge; such names as Dropsy, Convulsions, Palsy—disorders which may severally depend upon various and different morbid changes within the body, not always easy of recognition. It has been well observed by Dr. Farr, whose aid has been of great value to the Committee, that the refusal to sanction such terms as these in the registration of diseases, "would have an

obvious tendency to encourage reckless conjecture" in making returns.

Some names (as SMALL-POX) speak for themselves: many (as DIPHTHERIA) require to be defined, for the sole purpose, however, of identification: to others (as BRIGHT'S DISEASE) it is expedient, for the same purpose only, to append synonyms.

When fixed names have been given to diseases, their classification becomes a matter of some importance.

A good classification aids and simplifies the registration of diseases; helps towards a more easy comparison and knowledge of them, and towards the storing of experience respecting them; and facilitates the discovery of general principles from the collected, grouped, and compared phenomena.

But a good classification is a very difficult matter.

Diseases might be classified according to their symptoms; to their causes; to their intimate nature; to the tissues, or to the systems, of the body that are affected; or to the parts of the body as they lie anatomically.

After much consideration, the Committee have resolved "that the proposed classification of diseases should be

" based upon anatomical considerations."

In subservience to this anatomical distribution, diseases may also be grouped as being general or local.

General diseases are such as affect the whole frame rather than any special part of it. Local diseases are such as occupy special parts of the body.

General diseases may be conveniently sub-divided into two sections, A. and B.

Section A. comprehends those disorders which appear to involve a morbid condition of the blood, and which present for the most part, but not all of them, the following characters. They run a definite course, are attended with fever, and frequently with eruptions on the skin, are more or less readily communicable from person to person, and possess the singular and important property of generally protecting those who suffer them from a second attack. They are apt to occur epidemically. Of these epidemic visitations, Dr. Farr observes, that they distinguish one country from another, one year from another, have formed epochs in chronology, have decimated armies and disabled fleets, have influenced the fate of cities—nay, of empires.

Section B. comprises, for the most part, disorders which are apt to invade different parts of the same body simultaneously or in succession. These are sometimes spoken of as constitutional diseases, and they often manifest a tendency to transmission by inheritance.

The construction of this Nomenclature has been so long in hand, that it may be proper and not uninteresting to record the circumstances of its origin and progress.

The idea which led to the formation of a general Nomenclature of Diseases originated in a correspondence between Dr. Dumbreck, of the Medical Department of the Army, and Dr. Sibson, respecting the need of such a Nomenclature for use in the Army Medical Service.

But at the Comitia majora of the Royal College of Physicians, held on the ninth day of July, 1857, it was resolved, on the motion of Dr. Nairne, in consequence of a letter addressed to the College by the Hospitals Committee of the Epidemiological Society, "That a "Committee be appointed to prepare a Nomenclature of

" Diseases, and that such Committee have full power to co-operate with other bodies."

MEMORANDUM OF THE SUB-COMMITTEE ON CLASSIFICATION.

The general plan of the Nomenclature remains the same as in the last edition, but some considerable changes have been introduced.

GENERAL DISEASES.

For the section called in the last edition "Diseases of "the whole body and diseases which may be distributed "in several parts at one time," the term formerly used, and indicated in the last edition, "General Diseases" has been restored. This division, however, includes not only diseases properly so called, but morbid conditions affecting either the whole body or more than one part.

After careful consideration, it has been decided to omit the division into groups employed in the former edition, on the ground that accuracy of nomenclature rather than pathological classification is the object of this work.

The disease called in the last edition Epidemic Rose Rash, is now in deference to the views of physicians specially conversant with the diseases of children, called Rubella, other names being admitted as synonyms.

In consequence, more especially, of representations made by officers of the Medical Department of the Army,

Mediterranean or Malta Fever has been admitted as a distinct disease.

Other new names in this division are Tetanus (as a general disease), Actinomycosis, Foot and Mouth Disease, Pellagra, Hodgkin's Disease and Diabetes Insipidus.

Horse Pox, Parangi, and Glycosuria are omitted from the list of general diseases.

The term Anthrax is now employed only for the disease called in the last edition Splenic Fever, and is no longer used in the sense of Carbuncle.

LOCAL DISEASES.

In this division every part of the Nomenclature has been subjected to the most careful revision, and numerous changes of detail have been introduced. In some sections more considerable alterations have been made.

The section of Diseases of the Nervous System has been entirely re-cast, and arranged mainly on an anatomical basis. Separate sub-sections have, however, been retained for functional diseases (including those of which the anatomical seat is uncertain) and for mental diseases.

The sections of Diseases of the Larynx, Diseases of the Digestive System and Diseases of the Skin have received important additions.

The section of Poisons has been removed to the Appendix as referring rather to the causes of disease than to the actual diseases.

APPENDIX.

The section on Surgical Operations has been entirely re-arranged, and has undergone considerable alteration.

The section on Malformations has been entirely rewritten.

The enumeration of Tumours and Morbid Growths has undergone equally fundamental alteration, in order to bring it into harmony with modern classification. The class Cysts has been retained in deference to usage, and the needs of Registration, though it necessarily overlaps some of the other divisions of the Nomenclature.

The section of Animal Parasites has been carefully revised with a view to more accurate zoological classification, and greater importance has been assigned to Parasitic Protozoa.

The section of Vegetable Parasites has been much enlarged and the portion relating to Bacteria is entirely new. In this part it has not been attempted to give a complete enumeration of all the known species of Parasitic Bacteria, but only to mention the more important forms, both Saprophytic and Pathogenic; and it has been thought better to err, if at all, on the side of omission rather than to include forms of which the specific distinctness or the significance is still doubtful.

It has been decided, on careful consideration, to omit the Italian version, since it is found that the Italian names of diseases do not as a rule differ greatly from the Latin on the one hand, or the French on the other hand.

INDEX.

In the Index, the strictly Latin equivalents of vernacular names as employed in the Latin version have been arranged in a separate list. This change will, it is believed, make the general English Index more convenient for reference.

The English Index, which is in some senses the real Nomenclature, includes every name, and, of compound names, every part. Many names now expunged from the List of Diseases are retained in italics; and several names still to some extent in use, but not included in the general list, are also inserted in italics, with references, in each case, directing the return of the conditions covered by the disused or not recognised name under the now recognised name.

The Latin Index includes the terms used in the Latin version of the Nomenclature: and is intended as a guide to this portion of the book for readers not conversant with the English language. Not being intended for purposes of registration, it is less complete than the English Index, but includes the names of all distinct diseases and references to the chief divisions and subdivisions of the work.

MEMORANDUM BY DR. GREENHILL, THE REVISER OF THE LATIN SYNONYMS IN THE SECOND EDITION.

With respect to the Latin Synonyms, as one of the main reasons for introducing them was to render the Nomenclature more accessible to foreigners, it was thought better to endeavour to make them as useful as possible, by employing the terms that are commonly accepted as

constituting the current medical language of the present day. By adopting this method, a very heterogeneous collection of words has been put together; one set being genuine Greek or Latin terms, of which some still retain their original meaning, while others are used in a sense altogether different; another set of words has been introduced in a more or less Latinized form from other languages; a third has been legitimately formed chiefly on the Greek model, to represent diseases that were unknown in ancient times; and a fourth has been barbarously formed with the same object, and has now obtained such a degree of popularity that it would be practically impossible to expel them from the medical vocabulary. But, notwithstanding the medley of words thus introduced, which must necessarily be offensive to scholars, it was believed that the utility of this Nomenclature would be seriously lessened if any other method should be adopted. At the same time it is hoped that the careful reader will be able to notice, that, when two or more words, or forms of the same word, presented themselves for adoption, every care has been taken to select that which seemed most in accordance with classical usage. An occasional want of uniformity in words and forms of expression will be noticed, which, however, is believed to be of no real importance, and which, in a work of this kind, is almost unavoidable.

In the third edition the same principles have been followed and the whole version has been carefully revised, while it has been necessary to introduce some new terms.

EXPLANATIONS.

THE following Explanations are offered for the guidance of personsusing the Nomenclature for purposes of registration of diseases:—

The name of the disease to be registered should first be sought in the Alphabetical Index at the end of the book. It will be observed that the names in the Index are printed, for the most part, in Egyptian type, a smaller number being printed in Italics. The Egyptian type denotes names which are recognised in this Nomenclature; the Italic, names which are not recognised. To the names in Italics are added references showing under what recognised names the disease supposed to be indicated should be returned. The numbers not included in parentheses show the page on which the name under which the return should be made is to be found. The numbers included in parentheses show other pages on which the name is recorded, for purpose of cross-reference, but not for ordinary returns.

In referring from the Index to the body of the book it will be observed that the name of every disease is preceded by a number, and that some names are printed in Roman type, others in *Italics*. The names printed in Roman type are to be returned just as they stand; the names printed in *Italics* are not to be returned as they stand. To each of them is prefixed a number included in brackets marking the position of the proper return. The names in *Italics* indicate, for the most part, local manifestations of general diseases, and the references are intended to ensure the return of such local manifestations under their common causal name—to aid, in fact, the primary classification of registered names of diseases.*

It will be obvious that the names in *Italics* are placed in the several sections of local diseases in order to effect completeness of classification, and ultimately to help reference.

Where it is thought necessary to mention varieties or special forms of disease, they are indicated by their being "indented"—i.e., printed below

^{*} For example in the list of diseases of the Stomach, on page 137, Malignant New Growth of that organ is included, but is printed in *Italics*. In making return, it should be placed among other Malignant New Growths, to which the prefixed number (64) in brackets refers it.

and somewhat to the right of the principal heading. Such lists are given by way of example, and are not to be regarded as exhaustive.

Diseases should only be returned under such general names as "Dropsy," "Convulsions," "Palsy," when the morbid conditions upon which they depend are unknown, but when the cause has been ascertained, the case should be registered under the head of the primary disease, the secondary affections being also specified.

New Growths are to be returned under Nos. 63 and 64 among "General Diseases." For the sub-division of New Growths the List of Tumours at page 335 is to be consulted, and the return should always include the particular New Growth and its anatomical position.

Cysts are to be returned among "Local Diseases" except when they form part of a New Growth or of a Congenital Malformation, or are due to a Parasite. But in any of these three cases they must be returned under the corresponding head of New Growth, Malformation, or Parasite respectively.

Surgical Operations, Malformations, the list of Cysts and New Growths (Tumours), Poisons, and Parasites, are placed in an Appendix.

Arrangement of Local Diseases.

The attention of persons making use of this Nomenclature is especially called to the "Enumeration" on pages 3 to 7. That list includes nearly all the important morbid states and processes which affect the various organs, and is, therefore, a key to the general arrangement of such states and processes which is adopted throughout the book.

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

CLASSIFICATION OF TUMOURS,

COMPREHENDING MALIGNANT AND NON-MALIGNANT NEW GROWTHS, AND CYSTS.

In deference to the needs of the various Registration-authorities, a distinction has been made in the general and local tables between Malignant and Non-malignant New Growths. The Tumours are, however, here classified according to their structure and the type of normal tissue they most closely resemble. To facilitate returns under the general tables, the Malignant Growths are here marked by two asterisks. In certain cases Malignant and Non-malignant Growths are unavoidably associated under one head, as, for instance, under Sarcoma; the name is then marked with one asterisk.

Cysts are placed in a separate class, and may be returned severally among the local affections of organs; or among new growths (if connected therewith); or as malformations (if congenital); or as parasites (if parasitic).

EXTERNAL AND INTERNAL.

SCHIZOMYCETES OR BACTERIA.

- I. Micrococci. (Pathogenic and Saprophytic.)
- 1. Staphylococcus pyrgenes aureus (Ogston, Rosenbach).

Occurs in abscesses, pustules, and deep inflammations (the microbe most commonly found).

2. Staphylococcus pyogenes albus (Rosenbach).

Occurs in abscesses, &c., as S. aureus; also in ulcerative Endocarditis.

3. Streptococcus pyogenes (Ogston, Rosenbach, Passet).

Occurs in acute abscesses and in Pyæmia.

4. Streptococcus erysipelatis (Fehleisen). Morphologically very similar to Streptococcus pyogenes.

Occurs in the lymphatics and lymph-spaces and abscesses in the skin and subcutaneous

tissue in cases of Erysipelas.

 Micrococcus vel Diplococcus Gonorrhoeæ (Neisser, Bumm).

Occurs in the epithelium and pus-corpuscles in Gonorrhœal urethritis and Ophthalmia.

6. Diplococcus Pneumoniæ (Fränkel, Weichselbaum).

Occurs in the mouth and lungs; in sputum
from Pneumonia, and in cerebro-spinal
fluid.

^{*} In this list it is not proposed to enumerate all the species of the lower plants which have been found living parasitically in or upon the human body. It is intended only to include (1) the chief of those which have been clearly shown to be the cause or the constant accompaniment of specific diseases; and (2) the more common and important of the harmless parasites or saprophytes. The recognition and determination of these species as human parasites is quite independent of any opinion as to their being or not being the cause of disease, that is, being pathogenic or saprophytic; and therefore no attempt has been made to draw a sharp distinction between the two groups just mentioned. When found in any specific diseases their presence should be noted.

7. Pneumonia - micrococcus (of Friedländer).

Synonym, Friedländer's Pneumonococcus or
Pneumococcus.

Occurs in the mouth; sometimes found in sputum from Pneumonia.

8. Micrococcus lanceolatus (Talamon, Sternberg).

Occurs in the mouth and lungs; sometimes in sputum from Pneumonia.

9. Sarcina ventriculi (Goodsir).

Occurs in the contents of a dilated stomach.

10. Micrococcus ureæ.

Occurs in the urine in cases of Cystitis.

II. BACILLI. (Pathogenic and Saprophytic.)

11. Bacillus Anthracis (Davaine).

The cause of Anthrax or Splenic Fever.

12. Bacillus Typhi abdominalis (Eberth). Synonym,
Bacillus febris entericæ.

Occurs in the lymphoid tissue of the intestines, lymph-glands, and spleen in Typhoid Fever.

Bacillus Tuberculosis (Koch).
 The cause of Tuberculosis.

14. Bacillus Lepræ (Hansen).

Occurs in the tissues in Leprosy.

Bacillus Mallei (Löffler, Schütz).
 The cause of Glanders and Farcy.

Bacillus Diphtheriæ (Klebs, Löffler).
 Occurs in the local lesions of Diphtheria.

17. Bacillus Tetani (Nicolaier, Kitasato).

Occurs in the local lesions of Tetanus.

18. Bacillus Pestis (Kitasato. Yersin.)

Occurs in the local lesions, organs, and excretions in cases of plague.

19. Bacillus Pyocyaneus.

Occurs in blue pus.

20. Bacillus coli communis (Escherich). Synonym,
Bacterium coli commune.

Occurs in the intestines; sometimes in inflamed neighbouring parts.

Bacillus acidi lactici.

Occurs in the contents of the stomach.

22. Bacillus butyricus.

Occurs in the stomach.

23. Leptothrix buccalis (Wedl, Robin).

Occurs in the mouth and in carious teeth.

III. SPIRILLA. (Pathogenic and Saprophytic.)

24. Spirillum Choleræ Asiaticæ (Koch). Synonym, Comma bacillus.

Occurs in the intestinal epithelium and contents in Cholera.

Spirillum vel Spirochæte, Obermeyeri (Obermeyer).
 Occurs in the blood in Relapsing Fever.

26. Spirochæte plicatilis (Miller?).

Occurs in the tartar of the teeth.

27. Spirillum sp. (Lewis).

Occurs in the mouth (with numerous other bacteria).

HYPHOMYCETES OR MOULDS.

28. Actinomyces (Johne). Synonym, Ray-Fungus (Leptothrix and Ray form).

Occurs in the tissues and pus of abscesses in

Actinomycosis.

29. Aspergillus flavescens vel flavus.

Occurs in the external auditory meatus in cases of aural mycosis.

30. Aspergillus nigrescens vel niger.

In the same situations as the last.

31. Aspergillus fumigatus.

Occurs in old vomicæ of the lung.

32. Mucor Mucedo.

Occurs in the ear.

33. Chionyphe vel Streptothrix Carteri.

Occurs in the deep tissues and bones of the hands and feet in Mycetoma or Madurafoot.

34. Achorion Schönleinii (Remak).

Occurs in Favus or Tinea favosa.

35. Trichophyton tonsurans (Malmsten).

Occurs in the epidermis, hairs, and nails in Tinea tonsurans, Ringworm.

36. Microsporon furfur (Eichstadt, Robin).
In the epidermis in Tinea versicolor.

BLASTOMYCETES OR YEASTS.

37. Torula cerevisiæ? (Turpin, Meyer). Synonym, Cryptococcus cerevisiæ? (Kützing).
Occurs in the contents of the stomach bladder, &c.

38. Saccharomyces albicans (Robin). Oidium albicans (Link).

Occurs in the mouth in cases of Thrush. Found also on other mucous and cutaneous surfaces.

39. Saccharomyces capillitii. Synonym, Saccharo-

myces ellipsoideus.

Occurs in the scurf on scalp in Seborrhæa sicca or Pityriasis, and in other scaly conditions of the skin.

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
