# MEMORANDUM.

Section 2 (1) of the Vaccination Act, 1898, provides that no parent or other person having the custody of a child shall be liable to a penalty under the Vaccination Act, 1867, if, within four months of the birth of the child, he satisfies two Justices, or a Stipendiary or Metropolitan Police Magistrate, that he conscientiously believes that vaccination would be prejudicial to the health of the child, and within seven days thereafter delivers to the Vaccination Officer for the district a certificate by such Justices or Magistrate of such conscientious objection. The Section came into operation on the passing of the Act, *i.e.*, the 12th August 1898, but in its application to a child born before the passing of the Act there was substituted for the period of four months from the birth of the child the period of four months from the passing of the Act.

A Parliamentary Return (No. 89, H. C., Session 1899) showed that between the date of the passing of the Act and the 31st December 1898 the number of certificates of conscientious objection received by the Vaccination Officers was 203,413, and that the number of children to whom such certificates related was 230,147.

The present Return (Part I.) shows that the numbers of certificates of conscientious objection received by the Vaccination Officers and dated between 1st January and 31st March, 1st April and 30th June, 1st July and 30th September, and 1st October and 31st December in the year 1899, were 6,703, 8,403, 9,082, and 8,153 respectively, making a total of 32,341 certificates. They related to 32,357 children.

The increases in the numbers of vaccinations for the half-years of 1899 as compared with the corresponding half-years of 1898 were, therefore, 77,713 and 91,322 respectively, a total increase for the year of 169,035, or 33.8 per cent.

The number of births registered in England and Wales during 1898 was 923,265, and during 1899 was 928,640. The ratios per cent. of successful primary vaccinations to births registered were 54.2 in 1898 and 72.1 in 1899, an increase in ratio of 33 per cent. in 1899 as compared with 1898.
