1. SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS.

To signalize the fiftieth year of Lord Kelvin's tenure of the Chair of Natural Philosophy in the University, celebrations organized by the University and the City of Glasgow were held in the month of June, 1896. On the evening of Monday, 15th June, a conversazione was held in the Bute Hall of the University, to which about 2,500 ladies and gentlemen were invited, embracing the representatives of Universities, Societies, and Institutions, and other distinguished visitors in the lists appended at pp. 7-22, many of whom were accommodated in the houses of citizens and others; the members of the University Court and Senate, about 450 members of the General Council. and fully 200 Students; the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and members of the Town Council, and many prominent citizens of Glasgow and residents in the West of Scotland and other parts of the country. The Bute Hall, the Museum, and the upper hall of the Library were lit by electric light for the occasion, and in the latter there was an exhibition of mechanical, electrical, and scientific apparatus and contrivances designed by Lord Kelvin; and of the diplomas and certificates of membership, as well as medals, presented to him by Universities, Colleges, and Institutions. In the upper hall of the Library the Eastern, the Anglo-American, and the Commercial Cable Companies had fitted up syphon-recorders in connection with their cables, and a large number of congratulatory telegrams from all parts of the world were received in the course of the evening, and suitable replies transmitted.

After the Conversazione the Students held a Gaudeamus and a reception of delegates from other Universities in the large hall of the Union.

On the forenoon of Tuesday, 16th June, a meeting took place in the Bute Hall for the purpose of presenting addresses to Lord Kelvin, and of conferring the Honorary Degree of LL.D. on him and on a number of foreign and colonial visitors selected by the Senate to receive that honour. Professor Gairdner, in the absence of the Principal on account of illness, occupied the chair in the earlier part of the meeting during the presentation of Addresses, and also conferred the Degree of LL.D. upon Lord Kelvin, who then took the chair and conferred the Degree of LL.D. on the following:

Lord Kelvin afterwards spoke in acknowledgment of the honour done to him by the University and the City of Glasgow, and of the interest shown in the celebrations by the presence of so many distinguished visitors from all parts of the United Kingdom and from abroad, as well as by the large number of congratulatory addresses which he had received.

In the evening a Banquet, presided over by the Lord Provost and attended by about 600 guests, was given in the St. Andrew's Halls. In the course of the evening the Lord Provost received and read to the assembled company a message of congratulation to Lord Kelvin sent by command of Her Majesty. The toast of Lord Kelvin's health was proposed by the Lord Provost,

and Lord Kelvin returned his acknowledgments, as he also did later in the evening to the toast of Lady Kelvin's health, proposed by the Rev. Professor Story.

On Wednesday, 17th June, there was an Excursion on the Firth of Clyde. On the invitation of the Senate, a company of about 250, including Lord and Lady Kelvin and a large number of the delegates and visitors attending the celebrations, as well as the officials of the University, assembled at St. Enoch's Station, and were conveyed by two special trains to Prince's Pier, Greenock, where they embarked on board the steamer "Glen Sannox." The route followed was by Largs and Millport, and then northwards along the western coast of the Island of Bute, through the Kyles, and thence homeward to Prince's Pier.
